WELCOME BACK: Today the Patriots welcome back two familiar faces in Venezuelan infielders Jesus Bastidas and Eduardo Torrealba. Bastidas spent all of the 2022 season with Somerset, playing in 111 games and helping lead the Patriots to their first Eastern League Championship. Bastidas set career-highs in every offensive category including HR (18), RBI (55) and R (56). Following the season, Bastidas was awarded a Rawlings Minor League Gold Glove for his excellence in 92 games at second base. Torrealba began this season on Somerset's break-camp roster and played in 14 games to start the season with the Patriots.

HARDMAN'S HARDWARE: After dominating during the month of July, today Tyler Hardman was named the Eastern League Player of the Month. During July, Hardman batted .237/.352/.645 and led the Eastern League in HR (10), RBI (20), R (19) and TB (49), while ranking second in SLG (.645) and third in OPS (.997). Hardman becomes the fifth Somerset Patriot to be awarded Player or Pitcher of the Month honors in three years of Somerset's affiliation with the Yankees, joining INF Diego Castillo (June 2021), RHP Janson Junk (June 2021), RHP Hayden Wesneski (September 2021) and RHP Sean Boyle (July 2022).

MARTIAN MADNESS: On Wednesday, Jasson Dominguez extended his season-best on-base streak to 12 games. During the streak, Dominguez is 16-for-52 (.308/.379/.346) with 9 RBI, 7 R, 6 BB and 5 SB. RHP #30 YOENDRYS GOMEZ

CAREER: (9-9, 3.17 ERA, 241.0 IP, 250 K, 106 BB)

2023: Began the season on Somerset's 7-day injured list, rehabbing from an injury at the Yankees' minor league complex in Tampa until his season debut on 5/28/23 @ERI (3.0 IP, 0 R, 0 H, 1 BB).

2022: After having undergone Tommy John surgery in August of 2021, Gomez made his season debut on 6/9/22 in a rehab appearance for the FCL Yankees. He was then promoted to High-A Hudson Valley on 6/17/22, where he started 10 games for the Renegades, compiling a 1.93 ERA and 27 K over 28.0 IP. Gomez was promoted to Somerset on 8/31/22 and in his second Double-A start on 9/8/22 @HFD, he started the second no-hitter in Somerset Patriots franchise history with five hitless innings. Gomez allowed only one baserunner in the game, a two-out walk in the fourth inning after he had retired the first 11 batters of the game. On 9/27/22, Gomez started the second game of the Eastern League Championship Series at TD Bank Ballpark for Somerset. He was the winning pitcher in a 9-2 victory vs. Erie that forced the decisive third game of the series, when the Patriots won 15-0 to score their first Eastern League Championship.

2021: A shoulder injury held Gomez out for the beginning the season, before he debuted on 6/2/21 and spent all of 2021 with Single-A Tampa, posting a 3.42 ERA (23.2 IP, 14 H, 29 K, 9 BB) in 9 starts.

2020: During the COVID-19 shutdown in 2020, Gomez spent time working remotely with Yankees minor league pitching coach Dustin Glant, when he worked on adding a slider to his repertoire.

Following the 2020 MLB season, the New York Yankees added Gomez to the 40-man roster.

2019: Began 2019 with six starts for Advanced-Rookie level Pulaski, going 4-2 with a 2.12 ERA, before a promotion to Single-A Charleston, where he started six games and went 0-3 with a 6.08 ERA.

2018: Split his second pro season between the DSL (two starts) and GCL Yankees East (10 games, nine starts). Combined to appear in 12 games (11 starts), going 4-1 with a 2.08 ERA.

2017: Spent his pro debut season mostly in the DSL (10 games, eight starts), before one start in the GCL. Combined to appear in 11 games (nine starts), going 0-3 with a 5.40 ERA.

Personal Notes: Signed by the Yankees for \$50,000 as an international free agent at 16-years-old on 7/2/16. Gomez was added to the Yankees' 40-man roster following the 2020 season.

RAUL DOMINGUEZ: Manager (1st year)

Dominguez begins his 1st season as manager for the Somerset Patriots, 9th overall as a manager and 17th overall coaching in the Yankees organization. He spent the past two seasons (2021-2022) as a defensive coach for Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre and was assigned to the same post for 2020, before the minor league season was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Dominguez becomes the 5th manager in Patriots franchise history and the 3rd since becoming the Yankees Double-A affiliate. He succeeds 2022 Eastern League Manager of the Year Dan Fiorito. Dominguez also previously served as the defensive coach for Trenton (2018-2019) and Tampa (2017). The Panama City, Panama native has managerial experience with the GCL Yankees East (2016), DSL Yankees 1 (2011-15) and DSL Yankees 2 (2009-10). From 2012-2015, his teams finished at least 10 games over .500, including reaching the DSL semifinals in 2012 and 2015. An outfielder during his playing days, Dominguez signed with the Yankees as an undrafted free agent in 2001 and spread four minor league seasons for New York between the DSL and the GCL. 


