Tonight's Game

The Clippers will send LHP **Logan Allen** to the mound tonight, as he attempts to win his first game of the season (has made it to 5.0IP just twice in 8GS). Nashville will counter with RHP **Josh Lindblom**. The Clippers are 27-32 (.458) against right handers this year. Lindblom has pitched against the Clippers three times in his career, going 0-0 with a 1.08ERA (8.1IP, 6H, 1R, 1ER, 0BB, 11K).

vs. the Sounds

Columbus was pulverized in the first series between the two this year (5/25-5/30 in Columbus), going 0-6 (led for only 2.5 innings in the entire series; 5/28: trailed 7-0, led 9-7, lost 13-9) and getting outscored 55-22. The pitching staff served up 17HR (tied for most in a series; at St. Paul, 7/13-7/18), while the lineup produced just 4HR (hit 3HR in first game in Nashville, last night).

Pitching Problems

The Clippers are one of four IL teams to have posted consecutive shutouts this year (Charlotte, Durham, Toledo), blanking Indy from 7/6-7/7, but the 16G since have been a nightmare, with the Clippers allowing 129 runs (worst 16G stretch in IL, no other team has given up more than 125), 171 hits (2nd worst; 10+ hits in 12G) and 34HR (3rd worst; 2+HR in 10G). The team ERA has gone from 4.93 to 5.60.

Can't Do It Alone

Last night saw all the Clipper scoring come from solo homers, marking the eighth time this season that batters drove in only themselves (most such games in the IL; 0-8). It also marked the sixth time the Clipper had multiple solo homers account for all the scoring (rest of the IL has had 13 such games combined; third time with a trio of solo shots: 6/1 at Indianapolis, L 5-3; 6/22 vs. St. Paul, L 8-3).

Hammering Gimenez

Andres Gimenez homered once in six straight (6/13-6/19) and seven of eight from 6/13-6/22, as he now sits at 9HR on the year (tied career high). However, the Clippers are just 6-3 in games in which Gimenez goes deep. On Sunday, he laid down his fifth sac bunt of the year (tied for the IL lead) and the Clippers improved to 4-1 when he plays small ball (3SAC in 4G immediately prior to HR streak).

Luplow Rehab

Jordan Luplow had his 4G hit streak snapped Sunday (4x11; two doubles, 2HR), but has reached base in all 9G of his rehab this year (.464OBP; has reached in 12 straight at MiLB level, dating to 8/29/19). Luplow played his first full game while working back from a left ankle sprain last night (eligible to come off DL as of yesterday) and has played in the field in each of his last eight appearances.

In the Lead

Nolan Jones homered Sunday (4HR, 8RBI in last 7G), but has not doubled in his last 12G (longest drought since 13G from 5/6-5/22; still tied for IL lead with 20 doubles). His RBI surge has given him the team lead at 33 (only Iowa and Louisville have leaders with fewer), but he is hitting only .186 (11x59) with RISP (team is hitting .175, 14x80, with RISP over last 9G, including 3x18 in extras on 7/24 vs. Iowa).

Back in the Mix

Owen Miller is batting .237 (27x110) since returning from a three week stint in Cleveland, turning in 13 hitless games in 31 chances (four hitless games in first 16). Miller is now sitting in 7th place in the IL in batting (.298, only day below .300 this year) and has dropped out of the top ten in OBP (5x33 with 15K in last 8G; .341, 14x41, in 11G prior). He has scored just once in his last 10G.

Three Left Turns

Gabriel Arias has scored in only six of his last 18G, totaling seven runs (zero runs in 5G from 7/20-7/24, longest drought since 8G from 5/29-6/6), following a streak of 22 runs in 15 of 18G (6/12-7/4). Still, beginning with a 3-run game on 6/12 at Iowa, Arias has scored 29 runs in his last 36G, tied for 2nd in the IL in that time (hitting .338, 46x136, since 6/12). On the season, Arias is 5th in the IL in runs (42).

Gone-zalez

Oscar Gonzalez extended his on base streak to 12G (since 7/13, .333OBP) with his 2-hit game last night (has hit in 11 of 12, .292, 14x48). **Nolan Jones** kept pace, extending his to 12G with a walk (since 7/13, .340OBP). **Gabriel Arias** joined Gonzalez in the 8G hit streak club with his 3x4 effort last night (.452, 14x31 since 7/18; second 8G hit streak for Arias, 6/19-6/29, no Clipper has reached 9G).

This Date in Clipper History

7/28/2000

The Clippers shutout the Pawtucket Red Sox 3-0 at McCoy Stadium. **Randy Keisler** picked up the win for Columbus, throwing 8.0 innings and allowing 4 hits and 4 walks with 6 strikeouts. **Mike Coolbaugh** and **Kevin Orie** hit solo homeruns for Columbus. For Coolbaugh, it was his 15th homerun of the season as he would go on to lead the Clippers with 23 round-trippers.

Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 years since the move downtown, Huntington Park has ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game, totaling 2.25 per contest (1,763HR, 783 games). In 2019, HP averaged over three per game for the first time ever (seventh time averaging over a pair), as the Clippers surrendered a record 127HR and just missed out on triple digits themselves (97HR was second highest team total). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (983 to 943).

Homers, Homers and More Homers

The franchise record for homers was destroyed in 2019 (+31 from '83), as was the record for homers allowed (198, +42 from '98). This season's Clippers are homering at a rate of 1.31 per game, putting them one ahead of the pace of the pre-2019 record (adjusted for 140G). On the mound they are allowing 1.51 per game, enough to beat the pre-2019 record by 37, even with the shortened season.

Ain't Over 'Til It's Over

From 2014-19, no team had more come from behind victories than the 210 posted by Columbus and no team produced a better winning percentage when trailing than the .353 of the Clippers (Scranton/WB was 2nd in percentage, .338, and wins, 192). This year has seen the Clippers go 14-40 (.259) in games in which they trail, ranking 11th.

Not Close

The Clippers have suffered the most losses by at least a grand slam in the IL (24; six in 10G from 7/8-7/19) and rank dead last in wins by at least that many (9). That poor ratio has led to a -88 run differential (had a -50 differential over 10G from 7/8-7/19), a figure that places them tied for last in the IL (Norfolk).

Get What You Pay For

Columbus was the last team in the IL to play free baseball this season, playing 85 straight games, including the postseason, between extra-inning rumbles on 7/31/19 vs. Louisville (11-8 loss in 11) and 6/26/21 vs. St. Paul (6-4 loss in 10; current 4G losing streak in extra-innings following nine straight wins, 8/21/18-7/3/19). The regulation-inning streak was the longest for Columbus dating to the 1984 season (as far back as the day by day records go) and 45 straight to start the season was also a record.

Trending Downward

The current staff ERA of 5.60 is on pace to be the worst in franchise history (5.08, 1983) and anything over 4.71 will mark the fifth straight season in which the ERA has gotten worse. From 2011-16, the Clipper staff turned in a sub-4.00ERA five times in six seasons (zero such seasons from 1993-2010), including the best two ERAs of the past 32 years (3.33 in 2015 and 3.65 in 2016). The 5.84ERA at Huntington Park is the worst ever (5.29 in 2019, only time ERA has ever been over 5.00 at HP).

Free Swingers

After three straight seasons leading the IL in strikeouts, the Clipper lineup is threatening for a fourth, as they currently rank 6th (661K, 74 off the pace, Charlotte). The 2019 squad obliterated the franchise record, as they struck out 95 more times than the previous high (1,392; each of last three seasons rank among franchise's three worst, totalling 3,979K in 422G). While the record appears safe due to the truncated schedule, this year's version is averaging 9.31K per game.

Night and Day

When playing errorless baseball, the Clippers have a winning percentage that is almost 150 points higher (.500, 18-18) than when they make a mistake in the field (.371, 13-22). After an exceptional defensive run from 2015-2019, in which the fielding percentage was never below .983 and the team never committed more than 88E, the 2021 team is on pace to botch 95 plays (adjusted for 140G season, have not had triple digits in errors since six straight seasons from 2009-14) with a fielding percentage of .981.

One On, No Out Success

When the leadoff batter of an inning reached base in 2019, the Clippers plated him nearly 60% of the time (over 51% only once in the last six seasons, 55% in 2016). Getting more than one base was a specialty of Clipper hitters, as they led the IL with 136XBH to lead off the inning, including 54HR (led the IL, had 28 leadoff homers in 2018). So far in 2021, the Clippers are scoring the leadoff batter 51% of the time he reaches, with the leadoff batter scoring himself 21 times (on pace for 38HR).

Good Baseball

Andres Gimenez advanced a runner with a sac bunt on 7/25 vs. Iowa and the runner came around to score in the win (4-1 when advanced runner scores). During 2019, the Clippers struggled in the bunt department, but when the advanced runners scored, they were 7-1. During 2018, Columbus was 23-2 in games in which a run was scored after a good bunt attempt.

International Accolades

Bobby Bradley was named International League Player of the Month for May 2019, reaching base in 24 of 25 games during the month while hitting .302/.374/.740 with 12HR (led IL) and 28RBI. **Brandon Barnes**, **Eric Haase**, **Josh Smith** and **Asher Wojciechowski** were named to the 2019 IL All-Star Team and Bradley, Barnes and Haase were selected to the postseason squad.

Manager Profile

Andy Tracy makes his Clippers debut in 2021, following **Tony Mansolino's** championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; **Gene Michael**-'79, **Joe Altobelli**-'80, **Frank Verdi**-'81, **Bucky Dent**-'87 and **Mike Sarbaugh**-'10). This season marks Tracy's second year as a manager (first with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 61-86 (.415), 31-40 with Columbus (.437).
