<p><b>Today:</b> The Loons open up their 16th season of baseball led by their 10th manager, Daniel Nava. The Loons have dropped five straight season openers brining their overall record on Opening Day to 7-8.</p> <p><b>Roster Notes:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 16 (18 incl. postseason) spent at least a portion of the 2022 season with Great Lakes</li> <li>• 6 Loons appear on MLB.com's top 30 Dodgers prospects list (Dalton Rushing - 7, Yeiner Fernandez - 15, Ronan Kopp - 20, Damon Keith - 26, Alex Freeland - 27, Justin Wroblecki - 30)</li> </ul>	<p><b>Playoff Bound:</b> The Great Lakes Loons have clinched a playoff spot by winning the first half in the Midwest League Eastern Division. The Loons came back from 8 ½ games back with 14 to play, and clinched the spot a day early, gaining 9 ½ games in the standings over a 13 game span. The Loons have won their second first-half title in franchise history (2019) and are in the postseason for the sixth time in the last nine years. It is the eighth playoff berth in franchise history.</p> <p><b>Run It Up:</b> On June 28, the Loons scored a team-record 18 runs for the fourth time in franchise history. Great Lakes has hit that number twice in the last two years. Before September 7, 2021, the Loons hadn't scored 18 runs in a game since the 2009 season.</p> <p><b>Double-Decker Salami Sandwich:</b> Imanol Vargas became the first Loon in franchise history to hit a grand slam in consecutive games, with a slam on June 30 and July 1 vs. Dayton. Vargas is the first Great Lakes player to hit three grand slams in the same season.</p> <p><b>Phi Slama Jama:</b> No Loons team has hit more grand slams in a single season than the 2022 Loons, who hit their eighth slam of the year Thursday night. The previous record was six grand slams, set by the 2021 team.</p> <p><b>Thrice as Nice:</b> On June 3rd, the Loons turned the 5th triple play in franchise history and the first since 7/31/12. It also marked the first time the Loons had turned three at Dow Diamond. The Loons took advatage of numerous base-running errors by the Fort Wayne TinCaps and converted the triple play 8-6-2-4-5-8 (Ismael Alcantara -&gt;Eddys Leonard-&gt;Ryan January-&gt;Max Hewitt-&gt;Jorbit Vivas-&gt;Alcantara).</p> <p><b>Got 'em Looking!</b> The Loons have broken the franchise record for strikeouts, currently with 1,398 Ks through 131 games this season (prev. 1,256 - 2014). The Loons are 3rd in MiLB in Ks and 2nd in MWL history. The Loons look to be just the second team in MWL history with 1,400 strikeouts (2018 Quad Cities - 1,514).</p> <p><b>CYCLE:</b> On June 16th, Alex De Jesus became the second Loon in franchise history to hit for the cycle and the first to do it at Dow Diamond. The 20-year-old started the game with a double, home run, and triple in the first five innings. ## Loons Coaching Staff

### MANAGER

#### **Daniel Nava**

The Los Angeles Dodgers announced Daniel Nava as the Loons' tenth manager in the 16-year history of the franchise. Nava, 39, enters his third year coaching in the Dodgers organization after managing the ACL Dodgers in 2021 and serving as bench coach for Single-A Rancho Cucamonga in 2022. The switch hitting outfielder played parts of seven seasons in the Major Leagues and won a World Series in 2013 as a key contributor for the Boston Red Sox. In that championship season for Boston, Nava finished eighth in the American League in batting average (.303). He famously powered a grand slam on the first pitch he saw in his Major League debut in June 12, 2010 for the Red Sox. Nava, a native of Redwood City, CA, also played in the big leagues for the Tampa Bay Rays (2015), Los Angeles Angels (2016), Kansas City Royals (2016) and Philadelphia Phillies (2017). He finished his Major League career with a .266 batting average, .357 on-base percentage, 29 home runs and 206 RBIs. His final professional season as a player was in 2019 with the independent Kansas City T-Bones. After playing baseball at St. Francis High School in Mountain View, California, Nava enrolled at Santa Clara University. He attempted to walk-on to the baseball team unsuccessfully and became the equipment manager. After two years, Nava enrolled at the College of San Mateo, a junior college, due to no longer being able to afford Santa Clara's tuition. Santa Clara would bring Nava back on a full scholarship after being an All-American at San Mateo. Despite a stellar senior season, Nava went undrafted, and signed with the Chico Outlaws of the now defunct Golden Baseball League in 2007. His 1.100 OPS there led to the Red Sox discovering and signing Nava to a minor-league deal, after Boston paid the one dollar rights fee.

### PITCHING COACH

#### **David Anderson**

David Anderson continues his rise through the ranks of the Dodgers organization as the pitching coach for the Loons in 2022. Anderson, 27, joined the L.A. system as a development coach in 2020, and was assigned as the pitching coach for the organization's Arizona Complex League team last season. He led his staff to the fourth-lowest ERA in the ACL at 4.06, the third-most strikeouts (617 in 488.0 innings pitched), and the second-best walks and hits per innings pitched. Anderson, a 2015 graduate of Muhlenberg College, got his start in coaching at his alma mater, serving as pitching coach for the NCAA Division III school in Allentown, Pa., for two years immediately after his graduation. After that, he became a volunteer assistant for Cornell in 2017 before landing at Atlanta's Emory University, serving as the school's pitching coach and recruiting coordinator. While in the college ranks, Anderson also got head coaching experience in summer collegiate ball as manager of the Watertown (N.Y.) Rapids of the Perfect Game Collegiate Baseball League in 2018, leading the team to a 26-21 record in its inaugural season. He then went on to manage the now-defunct Fayetteville (N.C.) SwampDogs of the Coastal Plain League in 2019. Anderson, a native of Syracuse, N.Y., tossed four seasons at Muhlenberg. As a junior in 2014, he posted a 3.14 ERA over 63.0 innings, all as a starter. He walked just seven batters that season while striking out 28. He served as team captain as a senior, and led the team that year in innings pitched and strikeouts. After college, Anderson tested the waters in independent baseball. He appeared 16 times for the Newburgh Newts of the North Country Baseball League, with a stellar 2.38 ERA and seven saves. He then threw to a 2.67 ERA with the Bridgeport Bluefish of the Atlantic League, an MLB Partner League.

### PITCHING COACH

#### **Richard De Los Santos**

Richard De Los Santos returns for a second year as a member of the coaching staff after serving as Assistant Pitching Coach last season. This year, Anderson and De Los Santos will share the title of Pitching Coach. The 38-year-old De Los Santos had a nine-year minor league career as a right-handed pitcher, mostly in the Tampa Bay system. He played a portion of the 2005 season for the Southwest Michigan Devil Rays in Battle Creek, who would be purchased in 2006 by the Michigan Baseball Foundation and become the Loons in 2007. De Los Santos pitched in 36 games over three seasons for Triple-A Durham, racking up 99 strikeouts in 169 1/3 innings at MiLB's highest level. Over the course of nine seasons in affiliated baseball, the Dominican Republic native accumulated up over 400 strikeouts on the mound.

### HITTING COACH

#### **O'Koyea Dickson**

Dylan Nasiatka moves up to his third team in as many years in the Dodgers' organization, serving as the Loons' hitting coach in 2022. Nasiatka, 32, spent last year as the hitting coach of the Low-A Rancho Cucamonga Quakes, where he led the team to a league-high 6.75 runs per game. His hitters also paced the league in doubles, home runs, total bases, slugging percentage and OPS. The Bakersfield, Calif., native joined the Dodgers system prior to the 2020 season, for which he was assigned to be the hitting coach for the Ogden Raptors. Nasiatka earned a bachelor's degree from Cal State Bakersfield in kinesiology & exercise science in 2014, and achieved his master's degree in exercise science from California University of Pennsylvania the next year. Before joining the Dodgers' organization, Nasiatka worked as an assistant coach at Bakersfield College, a two-year school in his hometown, for seven seasons. Nasiatka played collegiate ball for three different schools, starting at Bakersfield College before moving to Hofstra and eventually South Carolina-Beaufort. He was a versatile player, with reps at catcher and on the infield. Nasiatka set a Bakersfield College record with a .473 batting average as a redshirt sophomore in 2010, belting 17 doubles, two home runs, and driving in 33 runs in 41 games. He was named a Junior College All-American by the American Baseball Coaches Association that season. In his lone season at Hofstra, he continued to rake, hitting .303 with 19 RBIs in 45 games, mostly as a designated hitter. He found more success at USCB, hitting .335 with 18 extra-base hits and 29 RBIs over 53 games.

### BENCH COACH

#### **Elian Herrera**

Former Loon Elian Herrera is back for a third season as the bench coach for Great Lakes. Herrera, a four-year big leaguer, begins his fifth season as a coach within the Dodgers' organization. The second baseman played over 20 games with the Loons in a span of two separate seasons, including the inaugural 2007 Great Lakes Loons, along with nine other future Major Leaguers. He also returned to the Loons for a portion of the 2009 season. From 2012-2018, Herrera played in 324 games at the AAA level, holding a .310 batting average in nearly 1200 plate appearances. Herrera made his major league debut on May 15, 2012 at Dodger Stadium, in a game where Kirk Gibson managed the Arizona Diamondbacks vs. Don Mattingly's Dodgers. Before joining the Loons staff in 2021, Herrera was the bench coach for the Rancho Cucamonga Quakes in 2019, helping lead the team to the playoffs after an 81-57 finish in the regular season, good for first in the South division of the California League.
