BAYCARE BALLPARK INFORMATION



ANNOUNCEMENTS

PA and video board announcements can be arranged for a nominal fee by visiting Guest Services behind Section 106 before the end of the second inning.

ATIV

The ATM is located on the first base side of the concourse behind section 105.

BAGS & BACKPACKS

Bags can be no larger than 16"x16"x8" and will be subject to inspection upon entry in accordance with Major League Baseball security regulations. Guests may discard or return the prohibited items to their vehicle.

BATS

Full-size baseball bats are prohibited from entry by guests to the ballpark.

BERM SEATING

Berm seating is limited and ticketed. Blankets are permitted to be brought into the park for berm seating. Chairs, folding chairs, camp chairs, and the like, are not permitted to be brought into the park.

CHILD TICKETS

Children 13 and younger qualify for the child's ticket price. For children 4 and younger, please see the BayCare Box Office or a ballpark gate attendant for a complimentary ticket.

CUSTOMER SERVICE & ADVANCE TICKETS

The Customer Service/Advance Tickets window is located on the first base side of the main concourse behind Section 106. Guests can report problems, check for lost and found items and claim prizes at this location. Tickets for future games may also be purchased here.

FIRST AID

The First Aid office is located on the first base side of the main concourse behind section 106. Guests can either report to this office or contact an usher if in need of medical assistance.

FOOD AND DRINK POLICY

No food, bottles, coolers or cans may be brought into the ballpark. The Threshers reserve the right to search any medical or diaper bags entering the ballbark.

FOUL BALLS

Any foul ball hit into the stands may be kept. Guests are not permitted on the field or to reach into the playing area. Foul balls may be dangerous, so please be alert at all times and aware of the potential hazards.

GATES OPEN

Ballpark gates will open one hour prior to scheduled game time

HANDICAPPED SEATING

Disabled seating is available all throughout the ballpark. Limited wheelchair seating is available through the ticket office in person or on the telephone. One companion seat is available for purchase with each wheelchair space. An elevator is available for disabled use on the first base side of the stadium (South Parking Lot). Drop-off is available on the West Side of the ballpark (no elevator access here). Please contact an usher for assistance entering and exiting the ballpark.

KIDS ZONE

The left-field concourse features a playground and Kids Zone for our younger guests.

LOST AND FOUND

Located at Customer Service behind Section 106. **SENIOR TICKETS**

Seniors 55+ may purchase discounted tickets. **SMOKING**

Smoking is prohibited in most areas of the ballpark. Special smoking sections are marked. Smoking is permitted only on the concourse bridge by the right field foul pole and the Tiki Pavilion in left field. For resources to help quit smoking, call 1-877-U-CAN-NOW (1-877-822-6669).

TEAM STORE

The Threshers Team Store, Diamond Outfitters, is located next to the ballpark's west entry, and features hats, apparel and collectibles to satisfy Threshers fans of all ages. Merchandise available 24 hours a day on-line at ThreshersBaseball.com.

TIKI PAVILION

The Frenchy's Tiki Pavilion is located beyond the left field wall. It features a variety of mixed drinks, beer and wine for guests 21 and over. Seats in this section are first-come, first-serve during Threshers season.

WEAPONS

Firearms, weapons, knives, tasers and other dangerous or hazardous devices or substances (collectively "weapons") are prohibited at BayCare Ballpark, unless carried by an onduty police officer or otherwise expressly approved by The Threshers. Anyone bringing such a weapon to the premises must return it to their vehicle immediately.




MARTY MALLOY MANAGER



Scoring Basics...

Different fans have different methods of keeping a scorecard, and many use their own notations. But here's a simple method...

If the hitter grounds out to shortstop, for example, write in "6-3." which shows the shortstop threw him out at first base. If the hitter flies out to left. field, write a "7."

If the batter gets a hit, write in the hit according to which base he reached. Each corner of the box represents a base, with the lower-right corner being first.

If he singles, put a "-" in the lower right, If he doubles, write a "=" in the upper right, and so on. For a walk, use "BB" in the lower right. As the runner advances, mark the appropriate symbol in the appropriate corner.

If a runner scores, put a circle at the bottom of the box, and inside the circle put the symbol of the play and/or the player that drove him in. For example, if the No. 5 hitter drives in two runs with a single, mark his single in the bottom right of his box and mark a circle with the number "5" in it in the boxes of the runners who score (Some people like to use uniform numbers here, so you can tell who did what, even after lineup changes).

At the end of each inning, total the hits and runs for that inning only. At the end of the game you'll be able to add the innings total to get the game score.

Clearwater's Mr. Worldwide

Gabriel Rincones Jr.'s Journey Across Three Continents to Professional Baseball

The journey to professional baseball is always interesting, full of twists and turns, and never the same from player to player. One commonality is how difficult it is for players to make it through high school, college, or any international ranks to get drafted or signed by a major league organization. Long hours in the cage or the bullpen, road trips to camps, and many hours in the gym perfecting one's body and craft to prepare them for arguably the hardest sport to excel in.

Millions of children across the world share that same dream of becoming a professional athlete, but only a select few can achieve it. Fewer still can keep up the sport while crossing hemispheres three times. Gabriel Rincones Jr. spent his childhood in Venezuela, Scotland, and the United States before going to college and getting drafted by the Phillies in 2022. It was not an easy journey, but certainly one he is proud of.

Gabriel was exposed to baseball at an early age in Venezuela, where he and his family lived until he was six years old. Baseball is engrained in the culture of Venezuela, and in Gabriel's blood as well, since his father and namesake, Gabriel Rincones Sr. is a former professional baseball player as well.

Rincones Sr. was signed as an international free agent and pitched one season in Rookie Ball for the Seattle Mariners in 1997. Eager to follow in his father's footsteps, Rincones Jr. was quickly enrolled in little leagues in Venezuela where he played until he was six years old, and his family moved to Scotland.

Not only was the language barrier a challenge to learn, but Scotland does not have a passion for baseball like Venezuela does. "In Venezuela it is what you see. Everybody is hype and always ready to go" said Gabriel of playing baseball in Venezuela. "Growing up in Scotland, even though I had six years without playing, no exposure to baseball. With many kids my age didn't even know what baseball was growing up...it just stuck with me the entire time I was in Scotland."

Rincones Jr. played in Sunday leagues and in more casual settings while in Scotland, getting

on a diamond as much as he could, but it wasn't until he was a teenager that he was able to fully rededicate himself to the game and start playing high school ball in Florida. The Rincones family switched continents for the second time and moved to Florida so Gabriel could pursue baseball in the United States.

However, it was not an easy transition for Gabriel to change countries again and jump right back into baseball after some time removed from the game. He hit around .280 his senior year and only had one offer coming out of high school, which he took, and began his collegiate career in junior college at St. Petersburg. Despite living far away from his family, who had returned to Scotland, Rincones Jr. emerged as a star at St. Pete, averaging over .400 in his two seasons in junior college and was named the top Florida Junior College player after his final season.

In addition to the accolades, he was selected in the 19th round of the 2021 MLB Draft by the San Diego Padres. Despite the offer from San Diego to turn pro, Rincones Jr. wasn't satisfied, and chose instead to transfer to Division I Florida Atlantic University.

Rincones Jr. wrestled with the decision to stay in school and put off his dream of becoming pro so he could get a better offer coming into a major league organization. Despite pausing a surefire opportunity to go pro, something he hoped would happen coming out of high school, Gabriel is steadfast on FAU being the best move for him. "If I didn't go to FAU, I definitely wouldn't be in the same mind space. Everything is just so good now."

He dominated the competition at FAU, increasing his home run total to 19, after hitting six for St. Petersburg in the season prior, with a .348 batting average and 69 RBI. He was named to the First-Team All-Conference USA and awarded the CUSA Newcomer of the Year award for his spectacular season.

When he was drafted again in 2022, Rincones Jr. leapt at the chance to turn pro, and signed with the Phillies after he was selected in the third round in the draft with the 93rd overall pick. In just one season, Rincones Jr. went from being picked in the second-to-last round to inside the top 100 picks.

In what he says is "definitely not a coincidence." Rincones went back to the Bay Area to train with the Phillies close to where he played his junior college ball. "I remember seeing some of the Threshers guys walk to the field while I was driving back from practice at St. Pete" Rincones Jr. said of his time at St. Petersburg, "I would watch them and being like 'alright, those guvs are there now but I'm going to get there eventually.' It's crazy for everything to come full circle." So much of the early portion of Gabriel's baseball career had taken place in this area, from junior college to recruitment camps, he knew that this was where he would begin his major league journey.

Coming off an injury after the 2022 Draft, Rincones Jr. entered 2023 incredibly motivated to make an impression with the Phillies. He began the season at number seven on MLB.com's Phillies Top 30 Prospect List and earned playing time in all but one game in the Threshers' first two series in 2023. He credits his confidence, along with the support of his parents, in overcoming adversity to sign his first contract and begin his professional baseball career. "I go up to the plate with the mentality that I'm the best guy on the field. and this pitcher has nothing on me," Gabriel states. "If your confidence is through the roof going into any level jump, you're going to adjust and compete and excel eventually."

Rincones Jr. has already shown flashes of how good he can be, stealing his first five bases without getting caught and reaching base in over half of the games he played through the Threshers first nine contests of 2023. His confidence and skills have him as a mainstay in the Threshers' lineup at the beginning of the season, and give him a high ceiling as he continues to improve his game in his quest to reach the majors.

Reliving the No-Hitter

The Battery from Clearwater's First Win of the Season Goes In-Depth on the No-Hitter

Getting the first win of the season is inevitable, but for some teams and players, the game can be more than just a win. Whether it is a debut, the first time back on the field in a while after an injury, or just a special way to begin a season on the right foot. For the 2023 Clearwater Threshers, the first win of the season was not just a celebration because of the victory, but because it came in rare form.

On April 8th, the Threshers earned their first win of the season with their fourth nine-inning no-hitter (fifth overall) since 2005, beginning the season with one of the rarest feats in baseball, holding the Marauders hitless in Bradenton for a 3-0 win in the second game of the season.

The season opener for the Threshers was a hard-fought game. They fell behind 3-0 in the fourth inning and worked their way back to within one run in the late innings. Cade Fergus doubled in a run and later scored on an error to put the Threshers within one. Clearwater put both the tying and go-ahead runs on base in the ninth inning, but were unable to overtake the home team for a comeback win on Opening Day. "There are so many games in the season, it's really easy to see a first-game loss," said lefty reliever Andrew Walling. "The guys did a great job of sticking to the process and playing their best ball, and I think that's a big reason that game two turned out the way it did."

There is certainly nothing bad about a one-run, tightly contested loss after not playing a minor league game in over 200 days, but the Threshers players all play to win every day. The team came out of the season opener confident that they could bounce back quickly, and they did so even better than they could have imagined.

Game two started as well as it possibly could, thanks to starter Samuel Aldegheri coming out perfectly in his first start of the season. Perfection was no hyperbole, as Aldegheri retired all 12 batters he faced in the first 4.0 innings with seven strikeouts. "I wanted to pitch more but I don't make the rules" he said, jokingly. "I did my job out there and I'm just glad I put the team in position to win." He exited the game with a lead on top of a perfect start, as Freylin Minyety gave the Threshers a 1-0 lead in the third after he scored on a throwing error.

The Marauders got their first baserunner on a leadoff walk in the fifth and drew four walks in the game. With each Thresher striking out at least one-third of the hitters they faced and the few scattered walks, the potential of the no-hitter was lost on almost everyone involved. Obviously, the catcher, Caleb Ricketts, knew that the team hadn't allowed a hit but none of the pitchers knew when they were entering the game. "The way the bullpen is set up [at LECOM Park] you can't see the scoreboard" said Wesley Moore, who earned the save and recorded the final out of the no-hitter, "After Aldegheri had his seven Ks, we were just counting up the Ks after that." There were plenty of strikeouts to count, as the Threshers staff combined for 16 strikeouts, the highest mark for the staff through the first two series


No one can complete a no-hitter without help from the defense, and the Threshers got that in spades. Ricketts and the entire staff lauded the infield, particularly Bryan Rincon, for making difficult defensive plays without an error throughout the game.

Perhaps the best defensive play of the game, however, came late in the seventh inning. Walling struck out the first two batters of the frame, but walked Marauders catcher Wyatt Hendrie with two outs. On a 1-1 pitch, Bradenton's centerfielder Tres Gonzalez hit a high fly ball

near the foul line in the left field corner, and the hearts of Threshers fans (and broadcasters) stopped for a second, "He threw the barrel at it. got enough on it and I saw it tailing towards the line. You almost have that little bit of heart drop like 'oh no..." said Walling of the at-bat.

It was up to Emaarion Boyd, the speedy 11thround pick of the Phillies in last year's draft to step up and make the play. "As soon as I saw Boyd out of the corner of my eye I didn't even look anymore," said Walling. "As soon as I first saw him take that route, I started walking off the field once I heard everyone clapping, I knew he made the play." The applause came from fans of both teams, as Boyd made an impressive sliding catch to corral the baseball and preserve the nohitter. With Hendrie off-and-running on contact, there's a chance he didn't just save the no-hitter, but perhaps a run as well.

Clearwater's bats carried the momentum into the eighth inning, responding to the defensive brilliance with two insurance runs on a throwing error by the Marauders, and Gabriel Rincones Ir.'s first career RBI that made it 3-0.

Late in the game, the Threshers hurlers weren't even aware that they had a no-hitter going. "[Aldegheri] told me in the dugout, he kind of motioned towards the scoreboard" said Walling after he left the game. "He didn't say anything about it and I couldn't figure out why he was so excited other than the fact that I knew he had a great outing. Then I looked up and said 'oh, ok, let's keep this going." They did just that, with Orion Kerkering striking out the side in the eighth to set up Wesley Moore for the Thresher's first save opportunity of the season with Bradenton still hitless heading into the final frame.

Like the other four pitchers who preceded him, Moore didn't know that he was closing out a no-hitter when he came in. "I didn't know until guys were running up to me [after the game], so I wasn't even thinking about it" said Moore of the beginning of his outing. "I was just thinking about getting ahead of the first hitter. Once I did I was just thinking about putting him away and going for the strikeout." He retired the first two hitters before allowing a walk with two outs. But with a runner in scoring position for the Marauders, Moore got Javier Rivas to swing at strike three and secure the first win of the season, and the no-hitter.

For a group of five pitchers and a catcher, none of whom had been a part of a no-hitter in their entire baseball careers before April 8th, they were quite non-chalant about achieving one of the rarest feats in baseball. Between most of the pitchers being unaware of the no-hitter until it was secured and it being the second game of the season, the whole squad really treated it like another game.

For Eduar Segovia, the win felt extra special. The 22-year-old right-hander was pitching in his first competitive game since 2021 after missing 2022 due to injury. He struck out two in 2.0 innings to earn the win in his first game in almost two years. "It feels really good," said Segovia of earning the victory. "I lost a year and eight months where I wasn't able to play, and to come back with these guys and earn the win in a nohitter, I just felt so happy."

The game sparked a four-game win streak, and helped the Threshers finish their first six-game series of the season in a tie for the West Division lead and the overall best record in the Florida State League.

Clearwater's entire team reveled in the win, with celebrations lasting well into Bradenton's

post-game fireworks display. But one thing that was on the minds of everyone involved was that this was just a great start to a long season. "It was one game" stated Kerkering of his mindset during the no-hitter. "If we lose, then we lose and we learn from our mistakes…just keep going hard every day and learn from it."

Though it is important to celebrate milestone victories such as this, the Threshers are united in the fact that there must be many more victories to come, no-hitters or not. It was a special start to the season for the Threshers, and now this team is set to continue showing how special they are.









Hard Work and Sacrifice: The Journey of Bryan Rincon

How Bryan Rincon Persevered Through Adversity to Begin His Professional Career

How far would you go to achieve your goals? There is sacrifice in every story in which someone pursues and achieves a dream. A prime example is the goal of being a professional athlete and reaching the highest level of professional sports. It is a dream shared by many kids across the world and achieved by very few. The hard work and training required is usually well-chronicled across various media outlets, but sometimes the journey itself can get lost in the shuffle.

Some players have to uproot their entire lives to pursue opportunities and open doors so that they can get to the highest levels of baseball. This is certainly the case for Phillies infield prospect and Threshers shortstop Bryan Rincon, who left his home country of Venezuela when he was 16 years old to chase his dream of becoming a professional baseball player in the United States. He overcame a lot of adversity to reach the Philladelphia Phillies organization and begin his career and his journey to the major leagues here in Clearwater.

Initially born in New York, Rincon and his family moved to Venezuela when he was just three months old. Ever since Bryan was a child, baseball was a constant presence in his life. Though his family did not play baseball at a high level, Rincon began learning the game from his father at three years old in Caracas, Venezuela, and began playing organized baseball at five years old. "In Venezuela, there were no days off, no vacations, just baseball," Rincon said of his time growing up in the youth baseball ranks in Venezuela.

He joined an elite baseball academy over two hours away from his family when he was 13 to pursue his dream of playing professional baseball. Between practice and games, Rincon played baseball seven hours a day, six days a week as he trained and honed his skills. But when he was unable to ink a pro contract at 16, he had to explore other options.

Becoming a professional baseball player was always a dream of Bryan's, and he was willing to make any sacrifices necessary in pursuit of that goal. An option presented to him was to move in with his uncle in Pittsburgh and play high school baseball in the United States. "I think I was a really good player, but I didn't physically have the right tools [to sign a pro contract] at that moment," said Rincon. "I decided to come here [to America] because my dad and I knew that it would be easy for me to play baseball here and get to the pros."

Despite only knowing his uncles, and not knowing much English, Rincon moved to the United States in 2020, right around his sixteenth birthday. He began attending Shaler high school in the winter of 2020, starting at the end of February. Fifteen days after his first day of school at Shaler, as he was preparing to join the baseball team, the COVID-19 Pandemic hit, and school was closed indefinitely.

The pandemic was a trying time for everyone, and it certainly wasn't easy for Bryan to be shut in at the beginning of his journey in a new country.

He came to the United States to further his hasehall career and train to eventually turn pro. but options for that were limited with any training facility closed and not knowing any coaches. who were scarcely available anyways, to begin training within the US. So, Rincon adapted, and he and his uncles dedicated themselves to training. "I used to run the hills every day, hit off the tee with two balls, throw into the net and then run to get it back." Not knowing anyone aside from his uncles, neither of whom had extensive backgrounds in baseball in any playing or coaching capacity, Rincon relied on his strong work ethic and did whatever he could to practice and perfect his craft until organized baseball was able to come back

When in-person schooling resumed in 2021. Rincon was ready to attend Shaler again and play baseball for the Titans. This time, however, he had a friend in his class. His cousin Miguel Hugas, a two-way outfielder, joined Bryan in Pittsburgh and at Shaler to pursue their shared dream of turning pro. They attended the same academy in Venezuela and played two seasons of high school baseball before Bryan was drafted in 2022. Finally having someone to train with, the work intensified for Bryan and Miguel during Shaler's baseball and on the college recruiting trail as well, Furthermore, Brian Junker, the head baseball coach at Shaler, saw how hard the two worked and helped them train and practice as they were recruited by collegiate and professional scouts alike.

Bryan discribed Coach Junker as a second father, constantly working extra drills after practice with him and Miguel. "My coach said I was crazy because I was doing too much, but he helped me a lot. He was like my father in the



United States." Having that extra father figure proved to be a big help for both Miguel, an Alabama commit in the class of 2023, and Bryan in their path to the pros. Bryan is off to a solid start, especially in the field in Clearwater. Miguel is expected to be drafted in the 2023 MLB Draft this coming July.


Draft day in 2022 proved to be one last hurdle for Bryan. He was told he would be drafted between the third and tenth rounds by multiple different teams, but after the first day of the draft, he had vet to receive a call. On summer break and already committed to play college baseball at San Jacinto, Rincon decided to take a rare day off to ease his mind. "On the third day of the draft I went to Jupiter to take a few days off with my uncle," Rincon said of his draft experience. "I remembered it was still the draft while I was in the shower. When I got out, I looked at my phone and saw that I got picked." Bryan was selected in the fourteenth round (422nd overall) by the Philadelphia Phillies, his dream of turning pro had finally come true.

His family was emotional, moved to tears of joy when celebrating with Bryan over the phone, but Bryan himself didn't know how to react. He had achieved the first step of his goal, but he knew the work was about to increase as his journey from the minors to the majors began.

Rincon debuted in the Florida Complex League (FCL) in 2022, slugging two home runs with nine RBIs in 12 games at the Carpenter Complex adjacent to BayCare Ballpark in his debut season. But beginning his first full season as a pro with the Threshers, he focuses on improving his game, learning everything he can, and continuing to grow as a player and professional. "I just want to play and show the people what I can do," states Bryan regarding his goals for the season. "Every day I work hard and try to be my best." Just a month into the season, the results are starting to show for the 19-year-old,

with clear signs of improvement both at the plate and in the field. But there is plenty of room for development in the early stages of his career.

Rincon is far removed from the 16-year-old kid in unfamiliar terrain. Navigating a difficult journey to the bigs will surely have some ups and downs, but Bryan knows it's on him now to keep working hard and achieve his dream. With a strong work ethic and resilience in overcoming adversity, all signs point to a long pro career for Bryan Rincon.


