APRIL 6TH IN LUGNUTS HISTORY

1996: The Lugnuts notch their first ever victory, steamrolling the Rockford Cubbies, 18-3.

2012: Opening Day at Cooley Law School Stadium saw Noah Syndergaard strike out six in three scoreless innings, Anthony DeSclafani strike out four in three scoreless innings, Great Lakes starter Jarret Martin commit three throwing errors (leading to two unearned runs), and Kevin Patterson's RBI single in the eighth inning push the Lugnuts to a 3-2 win over the Loons. It was the first of seven straight wins to open the Lugnuts' season.

2024: 20-year-old Henry Bolte knocked in four runs with a single, double and homer – each at least 108 mph leaving his bat – but the Lugnuts dropped an 8-5 matinee in Dayton.

History: Facing the Cedar Rapids Kernels on June 13, 2024, relieved Jake Garland to open the 6th inning and tossed 2 2/3 hitless innings, walking one and striking out three, as part of the Lugnuts' 8-0 combined no-hitter of the Kernels... it was the 4th no-hitter in franchise history as well as the first home no-hitter since 2003.

Des Moines Register's All-lowa Baseball Player of the Year as both a junior and a senior, 2015 and 2016... 2015 Perfect Game Underclass High Honorable Mention... as a senior: 10-1, 0.64 ERA, 123 K, batting .421 with six homers and 12 steals... as a junior: 11-1, 0.56 ERA, 74 IP, 112 K, 10 BB, batting .520 with 14 doubles, nine triples, 13 homers, 57 RBIs, 51 runs, 15 steals... in his high school career, won 28 career games and totaled 337 career strikeouts.
