LUGO LAND: INF William Lugo was red hot over the last several weeks of the 2023 season and it has carried over to 2024...Lugo has reached safely in 17 consecutive games dating back to last August 23 and is 20 -for-60 at the plate (.333) with 9 runs scored, 5 doubles, 11 RBI, and 11 walks...Since last August 15, Lugo is slashing .329/.414/.435 with a .849 OPS.

Became the youngest manager to win a championship in LIDOM history and the second-youngest manager to win a game in Caribbean Series history...Gómez's younger brother, Dariel, played at Double-A Binghamton in the Mets' organization last summer and is currently with the Charleston Dirty Birds of the MLB Partner Atlantic League...Older brother, José, is a scout for the Tampa Bay Rays and general manager for LIDOM's Leones del Escogido... Older brother, Héctor, is a well-known baseball reporter...Gómez also played seven years in New York's farm system, posting a . 662 OPS in 537 games.

FAMILIAR FACES: Out of the 30 players on the Cyclones' preliminary roster, 16 of them have previous experience playing on Coney Island...Jeffrey Colón, Joshua Cornielly, Felipe De La Cruz, Jordan Geber, Josh Hejka, Joey Lancellotti, and Jordany
