Who's Streaking:

- **Jake Reinisch** went 0-for-1 with three walks last night to extend his team-high on-base streak to 32 games. Reinisch is batting .296 with a .445 OBP and a .509 slugging pct. during the streak, with 32 base hits and 27 walks.
- **Daniel Bucciero** went 0-for-3 with a walks last night to extend his own on-base streak to 18 games. Bucciero is batting .288 with a .413 OBP and a .455 slugging pct. during the streak, with 19 base hits and 13 walks.

Debut Day: Liberty product **Tanner Marsh** makes his professional debut tonight, batting eighth and playing shortstop. Marsh, the A's ninth-round selection in July, was added to the roster on Thursday. He finished 5th in the nation this past season in defensive runs saved, all the while leading Conference USA in base hits, runs and assists... and his 70 runs scored (achieved in 64 games) set a new Liberty single season school record. He is the first Liberty Flame to play for the Lugnuts since 2014 outfielder **Ian Parmley**.

Roll Call: Marsh will become the 1,011th all-time Lugnut and the 51st different Lugnut to suit up this season. No. 1012 / 52 will occur Tuesday when southpaw **José Parra** starts at Great Lakes.

Soaring Seahawk: UNC Wilmington draftee **Bryan Arendt** went 2-for-3 with a walk, single and three-run homer yesterday, his first home run since June 21 in the California League. Arendt opened his time in High-A with just four hits in his first 43 at-bats and five hits in his first 51 at-bats. He's batting .350/.417/.600 (7-for-20) in his last six games.

No Place Like Home: Even with yesterday's loss, the Nuts have won 11 of their last 13 home games and are 6-2-2 in home series. Lansing's overall 32-24 home record trails only South Bend (34-21) among MWL teams.

Major League Lugnuts: Ten former Nuts have made their MLB debuts this season: **Daniel Susac** for the Giants, **Junior Perez** for the White Sox, **Eduardo Rivera** for the Red Sox, and **Henry Bolte**, **Gage Jump**, **Kade Morris**, **Joshua Kuroda-Grauer**, **Tommy White** and **Yunior Tur** for the Athletics, and – on August 9 with two scoreless innings in relief – 2021 Lugnut **Jack Weisenburger** with the NY Mets. In all 48 Lugnuts have appeared in a Major League game this season.

Cooperstownian Nut: A member of the very first Lugnuts lineup on April 5, 1996, **Carlos Beltrán** was inducted on July 26 into Cooperstown alongside Jeff Kent and Andruw Jones. In his 11th game with the Lugnuts (batting .143, 6-for-42, with one walk and 11 strikeouts), Beltrán suffered a right knee in an outfield collision. He flew back to the Royals' complex in Florida and never returned to Lansing, making his MLB debut on September 14, 1998, against the Oakland Athletics. A year later, Carlos was voted 1999 American League Rookie of the Year, and was on his way to a 20-year MLB career with 2,725 hits, 565 doubles, 78 triples, 435 homers, 312 homers, nine All-Star appearances, three Gold Gloves, two Silver Sluggers, the Roberto Clemente Humanitarian Award, and a 2017 World Series ring as a member of the Astros.

AUGUST 22 IN LUGNUTS HISTORY

1996: The Lugnuts became the first Class-A team to ever break the 500,000 attendance mark in their first season.

2016: The Skunk Game! The Dayton Dragons trailed the Lugnuts 10-3 entering the bottom of the seventh at Fifth Third Field, scored five runs in the 7th to make it 10-8, and then made it 10-9 on a Zach Shields RBI single in the 8th. With one out in the bottom of the 9th, a skunk emerged from near the groundskeeper's tarp beyond the Lugnuts' dugout on the first-base side. It scampered to second, wandered into right-center and explored the warning track toward left-field before the grounds crew corralled it (and were sprayed for their trouble) at the left-center fence in a hamper. The game was delayed eight minutes. With two outs, James Vasquez tied the game with an RBI single to center off Dan Lietz and Chris Okey followed with a game-winning RBI single to right-center for an 11-10 Dayton win.

In a Nutshell: Drafted 45th in the Triple-A phase of the 2025 Rule 5 Draft from the Angels' organization... makes his third start of the season today (April 29, Game 2 vs. Dayton: 2 IP, 0 H, 0 R, 3 BB, 0 K | July 24 vs. Great Lakes: 4 IP, 2 H, 1 R, 1 HR, 2 BB, 2 K)... joined the rotation following the promotion of Ben Hansen and Zane Taylor to Double-A... in his finest professional start, Marcheco faced an ACL A's lineup on August 22, 2022, with rehabbers Lawrence Butler, Cody Thomas, and Austin Beck, plus Henry Bolte, and tossed 6 shutout IP with 12 K.
