OKC Enters Fourth Year As Part of Diamond Baseball Holdings

Diamond Baseball Holdings (DBH) acquired the Oklahoma City Comets in December 2021 during DBH's inaugural year and as one of DBH's first 10 teams. Oklahoma City is now one of 42 Minor League Baseball teams that make up the DBH team portfolio.

DBH was founded in 2021 to support, promote and enhance Minor League Baseball Clubs affiliated with Major League Baseball through professional management, best practices, innovation and investment. Oklahoma City was one of the first 10 MiLB franchises acquired by DBH and the organization has continued to experience brisk growth, most recently adding 12 additional teams in 2024.

"Joining DBH is another step toward furthering our commitment to contributing meaningfully to the Oklahoma City community," OKC Comets President/General Manager Michael Byrnes said in a 2021 statement. "Along with DBH, we will continue to deliver a next-level experience in Minor League Baseball, with the same traditions we know and love. I trust that joining DBH will serve everyone well into the future."

As part of DBH, Oklahoma City works closely with Diamond Baseball Holdings' leadership, including Pat Battle, Executive Chairman of DBH, and Peter B. Freund, CEO of DBH, to realize the club's goals.

"Diamond Baseball Holdings will be global in our ambitions and hyper-local in our approach, and creating incredible fan experiences will remain our number one priority," Battle and Freund said in a 2021 statement. "Additionally, we look forward to providing opportunities for growth to the employees of PDL Clubs whose passion and ingenuity have built the sport through the decades."

In 2022, DBH announced that Silver Lake, a global leader in technology investing with professionals based in North America, Europe and Asia, became its new ownership partner and Silver Lake acquired DBH from Endeavor, a global sports and entertainment company.

"Since its launch, DBH has established a leadership position in Minor League Baseball, with its clubs playing a pivotal role in local communities across the U.S.," Stephen Evans, Managing Director of Silver Lake, said in a 2022 statement. "Given the massive live audience and reach of the minor league, we believe there is a large opportunity to invest further to support growth, drive technology-related innovation and offer improved experiences for all stakeholders. We are excited to partner with Pat, Peter and their team to help advance DBH's mission, particularly with investment in digital technologies that are transforming baseball's landscape todav."

As stated on the DBH website, "DBH harnesses the magic of Minor League Baseball through iconic clubs across North America to preserve our national pastime by driving the future of the sport forward through innovation and best-in-class experiences that impact local communities and provide fun, affordable, family entertainment accessible to everyone."

2025 Marks OKC's 11th Year as Los Angeles Dodgers' Triple-A Affiliate

Oklahoma City enters its 11th year as the Triple-A affiliate of the Los Angeles Dodgers with the start of the 2025 season and OKC will remain the Dodgers' top-level Minor League affiliate for years to come.

The teams most recently signed a 10-year Professional Development League (PDL) License agreement in early 2021 that extended the affiliation between OKC and the Dodgers through the 2030 season.

The affiliation between the teams originally began in September 2014 when the Oklahoma City franchise was purchased by Mandalay Baseball, LLC – a partnership between Los Angeles Dodgers ownership and an investor group led by Mandalay Entertainment Chairman and CEO and Los Angeles Dodgers co-owner Peter Guber. A two-year affiliation extension was announced in September 2018 prior to the most recent 2021 agreement which was followed by the OKC franchise being purchased by Diamond Baseball Holdings in December 2021.

"Being part of the Los Angeles Dodgers' organization and family...has been incredible," OKC Baseball Club President/General Manager Michael Byrnes said in a 2018 statement. "There's been an impressive string of onfield success in Oklahoma City and beyond, and the great fans of our city and state now bleed blue."



The Dodgers are the fifth MLB parent club to call Oklahoma City its Triple-A home, following the Houston Colt .45s/Astros (1962-72; 2011-14), Cleveland Indians (1973-75), Philadelphia Phillies (1976-82) and Texas Rangers (1983-2010).

About Professional Development League (PDL) Licenses

The 2021 season brought significant change to Minor League Baseball, as well as an extended partnership between Oklahoma City and the Los Angeles Dodgers.

Major League Baseball and Minor League Baseball previously operated separately and worked together via a Professional Baseball Agreement that expired Sept. 30, 2020. MLB has since taken over running affiliated Minor League Baseball and has reorganized the player development system, working to ensure new sets of standards for facilities and player working conditions throughout the Minors, as well as placing an emphasis on affiliates' geographic proximity to their Major League club partners, reducing in-season travel for players and coaches and increasing player salaries.

Oklahoma City was one of 120 Minor League Clubs to accept invitations in early 2021 to become a Professional Development League (PDL) license holder and OKC signed a 10-year partnership with the Los Angeles Dodgers to remain their Triple-A affiliate through 2030.

In addition, the 11 leagues that make up four levels of the Minor Leagues were restructured and MLB Clubs now have four Minor League affiliates — one at each of the Triple-A, Double-A, High-A and Single-A levels.



2024 WORLD SERIES CHAMPION LOS ANGELES DODGERS



Los Angeles Dodgers Win 2024 World Series; Roster Includes Several OKC Ties

By winning the 2024 World Series, the Los Angeles Dodgers secured their eighth World Series championship and second in five seasons.

During the Dodgers' affiliation with Oklahoma City, Los Angeles has made four World Series appearances since 2015, winning titles in both 2020 and 2024.

Los Angeles' official 26-man 2024 World Series roster included 14 former OKC players and 18 of the players on the Dodgers' World Series roster donned an Oklahoma City uniform at some point since the affiliation between the teams began in 2015, including those who did so as part of Major League Rehab Assignments.

Additionally, a total of 12 players on the Dodgers' 2024 World Series roster played with Oklahoma City at some point during the 2024 season, including eight players who spent time on OKC's Triple-A roster as part of Major League Rehab Assignments.

Throughout the entire 2024 season, 35 players appeared on both the Oklahoma City roster and the Los Angeles Dodgers roster, including those on rehab assignments.

In 2020, the Dodgers' World Series roster had 16 former OKC players, including eight who spent time in OKC during the 2019 season (the 2020 MiLB season was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic).

Comets Era Lands in OKC

The lights dimmed at Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark and an eager crowd of about 3,000 people turned their gaze to the center field video board.



Soon an image of a glowing comet soaring through the night sky illuminated the screen as the next chapter in Oklahoma City's Triple-A baseball history was unveiled.

The Oklahoma City Comets had arrived.

The team's new Comets identity reaches back to Oklahoma baseball history, celebrates the team's current affiliation with the Los Angeles Dodgers and OKC's connections to the aerospace industry, while also looking to the future with a fun and hopeful spirit.

Team officials revealed the new name, look and brand during a free, public event and ceremony Oct. 26, 2024 at Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark. The lively and festive atmosphere included carnival games, a drone show, live band, fireworks, first looks at the team's new uniform sets, the unveiling of a 20-foot-by-20-foot Comets mural, the introduction of the team's new manager for 2025 and access to a revamped team store stocked with new merchandise.

"We wanted our new name and brand to be something that reflects Oklahoma's rich baseball history and our affiliation with the Dodgers, but is also uniquely ours and embraces the future of our city and state," Oklahoma City Comets President/General Manager Michael Byrnes said in a news release.

In addition to being OKC's parent club, the Los Angeles Dodgers were also part of OKC's team ownership group

change and played the 2024 season as the Oklahoma City Baseball Club with the focus on creating an identity that reflected the local community.

Key stakeholders and community members played a significant role in selecting the new team name as the organization hosted focus groups and reviewed a high volume of feedback from fans via social media and email submissions.

The Comets soared to the top.

"We appreciate our community of fans who provided input into the new name and brand and who have supported this team throughout the years — since 1962," Byrnes said in a news release. "Our commitment is to continue to provide the same fun, family-friendly game day experience our fans have come to expect — now with new signage, new uniforms and mascots."

The meaning behind the new name, as well as its many ties to Oklahoma, is significant.

Hall of Fame center fielder Mickey Mantle has always had a key presence at Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark and is one of the greatest baseball players to hail from the state of Oklahoma. He was born in Spavinaw, Okla.,

and grew up in Commerce, Okla, becoming known as the "Commerce Comet" during his legendary career. Mantle slugged 536 home runs and won seven World Series titles during his 18 years with the New



York Yankees and is one of the inspirations behind the Oklahoma City Comets name.

Mantle has been celebrated at Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark for years. A nearly eight-foot-tall bronze statue of Mantle greets fans outside of the Mickey Mantle Gate entrance and his photo hangs in the Legends Lounge. Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark stands on Mickey Mantle Drive and Mantle's likeness can be seen gracing the end of each aisle of seats throughout the stadium.

As the Comets brand developed further, a space theme emerged inspired by the legendary "shooting ball" logo of Oklahoma City's parent club the Los Angeles Dodgers and Oklahoma's impact on and stake in the aerospace industry.

Additionally, space and space exploration encourages looking to the future and consider what is possible similar to the hopeful feeling baseball fans share each spring as



their team takes the field to embark on a new season or the aspirations shared by youth players on baseball diamonds throughout Oklahoma aiming to soar to success like the "Commerce Comet."

"Hearing the whole story behind it and everything, it's freaking awesome," said Tim Jenne, an OKC season ticket member who attended the Oct. 26 event. "The uniforms and stuff look great — the whole concept behind it. This has been a great night."

The Comets name is the sixth in Oklahoma City's Triple-A franchise history, following the Oklahoma City 89ers (1962–97), Oklahoma RedHawks (1998–2009), Oklahoma City RedHawks (2010–2014), Oklahoma City Dodgers (2015–23) and Oklahoma City Baseball Club (2024).

The team remains the Los Angeles Dodgers Triple-A affiliate through at least 2030 under the current Professional Development League license, featuring players one step away from Major League Baseball for years to come. The top talent in the Los Angeles Dodgers farm system will continue to take the field in Oklahoma City.

The stadium will receive a fresh look for next season with updated Comets branding and signage throughout the stadium. New marks, logos and colors will be seen throughout the ballpark and players will take the



players will take the field in Comets uniforms and hats for the first time in 2025. The on-field entertainment crew will receive a fresh identity and uniforms for 2025 and will be joined by new mascots anxiously awaiting the chance to meet with fans.



Pacific Coast League Champions (2023)

The 2023 season ended with Oklahoma City winning the Pacific Coast League Championship.

OKC claimed its first league title since 1996 and fifth league title in the franchise's history after the team also won PCL titles in 1963 and 1965 and American Association titles in 1992 and 1996 as the 89ers.

OKC finished the regular season with a 90-58 record overall and with the most wins for an Oklahoma City team in a single season during the Bricktown era (since 1998). The team's 90 wins were the second-most wins in Oklahoma City's Triple-A history (since 1962) behind only the 1965 89ers, who finished 91-54.

Oklahoma City's 90 wins tied for the most in the Minors in 2023 with



Triple-A National Championship Game opponent Norfolk (90–59) and OKC became just the second PCL team since 2006 to notch at least 90 wins, joining the 2017 Memphis Redbirds (91–50). OKC also became just the fourth PCL team over the last 23 seasons to reach 90 wins.

Oklahoma City finished in first place in the overall PCL standings in 2023, marking the fourth time that has happened during the team's Bricktown era (also 2005, 2013 and 2015). OKC held at least a share of first place in the league standings for all but seven days during the season, first from April 1-Aug. 25 and again from Sept. 2 to the end of the season.

Oklahoma City clinched the Pacific Coast League's first-half championship as well as a playoff berth June 14 with a 46–19 record — 11 days before the first half officially ended June 25. Oklahoma City went on to finish the first half with a 50–23 record, and as first-half champions earned the honor of hosting the PCL Championship Series during the final week of September.

The team went on to sweep Round Rock in two games of a best-of-three PCL Championship Series at Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark.

Oklahoma City proceeded to make its first appearance in a Triple-A National Championship Game and first in postseason interleague competition during the franchise's Bricktown era (since 1998) and PCL history (1963–68; 1998–2023). OKC played International League Champion Norfolk, Triple-A affiliate of the Baltimore Orioles, to close out the season. OKC put together a four-run rally with two outs in the bottom of the ninth inning, but Norfolk held on to defeat OKC, 7–6, in the Triple-A National Championship Game.

Golden Bobblehead - Best In-Game Promotion/Feature (2021)

Between innings on a warm July evening in 2021, Revel: Speed Painter stood in front of a large, black canvas and finessed paint with brushes and his hands. In under two minutes, he completed a portrait of baseball legend Jackie Robinson — live and upside down. He went on to speed paint Los Angeles Dodgers pitcher Clayton Kershaw and a ballpark image as well later in the evening.

The unique performance won Oklahoma City its first-ever Golden Bobblehead award during the December 2021 Baseball Winter Meetings in Orlando. The Golden Bobblehead awards are given annually by Minor League Baseball for the top promotional activities



and events MiLB's 120 teams develop and put on during the year. Six awards were given out for the 2021 season and Oklahoma City won the Golden Bobblehead for Best In-Game Promotion/Feature for Revel's performance.

"Winning our first Golden Bobblehead award is another benchmark for our organization," Oklahoma City Comets President/General Manager Michael Byrnes said in a MiLB release. "I'm proud of our team members for not only devising the idea of having a performance artist be part of our game presentation, but also finding a way to make it work with the unique constraints within a baseball game. We'd also like to recognize Revel, because without his incredible talent and willingness to try something new, this would have never happened."

Best of the Ballparks (2020)

Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark stood tall after toppling the competition and winning the 2020 Triple-A Best of the Ballparks presented by *Ballpark Digest*. The contest involved all 30 Triple-A teams in a bracket-style tournament from June 18-July 10, 2020. Popular vote through the publication's website, ballparkdigest.com, determined winners each round.

"We are honored to have been chosen as the Triple-A winner of the Best of the Ballparks competition," OKC Comets President/General Manager Michael Byrnes said. "This isn't a win for our organization as much as it is for our incredible fans. It speaks volumes about their dedication to send us to victory in a year we were not able to host baseball."

According to Ballpark Digest, the 2020 competition produced a record-setting 145,695 votes cast in the Triple-A phase of the contest, with Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark winning 53 percent of the vote in the finals against Riverfront Stadium in Wichita, Kan.

"Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark is one of the great ballparks in all of baseball, so it's great to see the fans voting it the best in Triple-A ball," said Ballpark Digest publisher Kevin Reichard.

Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark has received numerous accolades, including being named the No. 2 minor league ballpark in the country by Baseball America during its inaugural season. The 2013 10Best Readers' Choice Awards, presented by USA Today, hailed Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark as one of the top 10 minor league stadiums in the United States.



Triple-A Bob Freitas Award (2018)

Baseball America named Oklahoma City the winner of the 2018 Triple-A Bob Freitas Award, presenting the honor during the 2018 Baseball Winter Meetings in Las Vegas.

"The Bob Freitas Award is one of the highest achievements a minor league baseball team can receive, and we are honored to have been selected by Baseball America," OKC Comets President/General Manager Michael Byrnes said. "This award isn't possible without the support of our community, our fans and our passionate and creative team members that drive our success."

The annual award is given to one team in each of the four classifications of Minor League Baseball and the criteria are based on community involvement, long-term business success and consistent operational excellence.

The award's namesake, Bob Freitas, was a legendary minor league baseball operator who also served as an ambassador and promoter of the game. Other recipients of 2018 Bob Freitas Awards were Tennessee (Double-A), Winston-Salem (Single-A) and Spokane (Short-Season).

This marked the first time the Oklahoma City franchise has been named recipient of the award since the honor began in 1989 and the first time since 1995 a Los Angeles Dodgers affiliate at any level has won the award.

"We try to look at the totality of a minor league operation when picking our honorees," Baseball America Executive Editor J.J.

Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark celebrated its 25th anniversary season in 2023.

The ballpark opened in April 1998 and was constructed as part of the original Metropolitan Area Projects or MAPS. MAPS is "Oklahoma City's visionary capital improvement program for new and upgraded sports, recreation, entertainment, cultural and convention facilities" funded by a temporary one-cent sales tax approved by OKC voters in December 1993, according to the City of OKC website.

OKC was considered to be the first city in the United States to undertake a public facility enhancement project of this size. The original MAPS tax expired July 1, 1999 and during the 66 months it was in effect collected more than \$309 million and about \$54 million more in interest on deposited tax revenue, according to the City of OKC website.

The \$34 million Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark was the first project completed under original MAPS, that also included projects such as the Bricktown canal, Paycom Center, Civic Center Music Hall, the Oklahoma River and Cox Convention Center, which is now Prairie Surf Studios. The dedication of the Ronald J. Norick Downtown Library in August 2004 completed the original MAPS projects.

To celebrate the ballpark's milestone anniversary in 2023, the Oklahoma City Triple-A Baseball Hall of Fame was formed and the inaugural HOF class inducted. Also, commemorative city-themed jerseys were unveiled and the organization's 405 area code caps debuted on the field.



Former Oklahoma City Mayor Mick Cornett:

"If you wanted to trace Oklahoma City's renaissance back to a single moment, I think it would be the opening of Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark. We were coming through a rough time in Oklahoma City's history. No one knew what a completed MAPS project would look like and some people wondered whether the city could actually pull this off. But when the public walked into the beautiful ballpark, and it exceeded all expectations, they realized Oklahoma City had — in baseball talk — hit this one out of the park. There was a sense of pride and unity, and the beginning of a momentum that still exists today."

"As I look back over this track record of ours in Minor League Baseball, I would say there is no facility that I can point to, no other facility, that has been a more impressive accomplishment ... Accessibility/ADA Accommodations:

Accessible seating is available throughout the ballpark in all ticket price ranges. Companion seating is also available.

Clubhouses: Home and visiting team clubhouses, as well as additional locker rooms for tournaments, are located below ground on the lower level. The home clubhouse features weight-training facilities, hydrotherapy tubs and aerobic areas. An underground, all-weather batting tunnel is shared with visiting teams. The Comets dugout is located on the third base side of the field and the visiting dugout on the first base side.

Elevators: Located behind first and third base, two elevators provide access to the basement, suite and press levels of the ballpark.

Food and Beverage: Concession stands are located throughout the main concourse and terrace, offering a variety of food and beverage options. Club seat and suite holders receive service at their seats from wait staff.

Cashless: Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark is a cashless facility at all points of sale. All major credit and debit cards as well as Apple Pay and Google Pay will be accepted for purchases throughout the ballpark. Fans who do not have a credit or debit card or other form of digital payment will be able to exchange cash for a Comets Cash card at the main ticket office that can be used at ballpark concession stands.

Bag Policy: Only certain bags meeting the following criteria are allowed into the stadium:

- Bags that are clear plastic, vinyl or PVC and do not exceed 12 inches by 6 inches by 12 inches. A logo no larger than 4 inches by 4 inches may be displayed on one side of a permissible clear bag.
- One-gallon clear, plastic resealable bag (Ziploc bag or similar).
- Small clutch bags, which cannot exceed 7 inches by 9 inches in size.
- Exceptions will be made for diaper bags and medically necessary items after proper inspection.

Customer Service: The Customer Service Booth is located behind section 113. Fans attending an OKC Comets game can text HELP to (405) 218-2121 to communicate with a staff member.

Merchandise: The Team Store is located on the third base side of the ballpark with access from the concourse behind section 102 or from the outside along Mickey Mantle Drive. OKC Comets gear can also be purchased online at okccomets.milbstore.com.

Playing Field: The turf was installed in 2019 and consists of drought-tolerant Bermuda grass called TifTuf. The turf is grown on a 10-inch, sand-based root-zone that tops a web of drainage tiles inlaid in a four-inch layer of pea gravel. This gravity-based drainage system is capable of draining 24 inches of rain per hour.

Volney Meece Memorial Press Box: The press box is located on the third floor, or press level, of the ballpark. The press box is accessible from the elevators and stairs near the first and third base entrances to the suites. Proper credentials are required for admittance.

Single-Game Tickets: All tickets are digital and available for purchase online at okccomets.com. Fans will scan their tickets from their mobile device at touchless scanners. Children ages two and under are admitted free of charge if they do not need a seat. Ticket prices for adults start at \$12.

Suites: The ballpark has multiple suites on two levels. All suites are air-conditioned, have wet bars, televisions, as well as indoor and outdoor seating.

Home Game Times: First pitch for the majority of Comets home games is scheduled for 7:05 p.m. (CDT). A complete schedule is located at okccomets.com. Gates typically open one hour prior to first pitch.

Ticket Office: The ticket office is located on the west side of Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark along South Mickey Mantle Drive.

2025

The 2025 season marks the first for the Oklahoma City Comets to take the field in Bricktown. Along with the new team moniker, new Comets signage, colors, logos and a rebranded Team Store will greet fans at Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark.

A colorful, 20-foot-by-20-foot Comets mural by Oklahoma City artist Barrett Tarr, aka Kid Lennon, dazzles on the concourse floor just inside the home plate Johnny Bench Gate. Additional art by Kid Lennon will be featured in the entertainment suites throughout the club and press levels.

The 10-foot tall, 185-foot long LED board in left field, which was originally installed for the 2011 season, has been replaced with a brand-new, modern version and state-of-the-art technology to enhance the viewing experience of fans and improve the board's entertainment marketing and promotional capabilities. Additions

entertainment, marketing and promotional capabilities. Additional new LED boards were installed along the first base line and near the ballpark's main entry gates.





Behind the scenes, work continued on multi-year HVAC and fire suppression system projects.

2024

Prior to the start of the 2024 season, five new Walker Companies 4Topps tables were added to the top of section 109 near home plate. The premium seating area now stretches from section 107-109 and offers mesh seats and a half-moon table for a group of four to enjoy all-inclusive food, soda, water and two drink tickets for beer or wine as well as in-seat service.

The mechanics of the ballpark's two main elevators, which were original to the ballpark's 1998 opening, were replaced. Work continued on the substitution of the ballpark's 1998 opening, were replaced.

multi-year HVAC system project, while the fire suppression system was inspected and flushed and the left field hospitality deck adjacent to the home bullpen was rebranded as the Miller Lite Landing.



Prior to the start of the 2023 season, the extensive offseason improvements made may not have been visible to fans, but resulted in more modern and comfortable facilities for OKC players and field staff.

With the signing of Professional Development League (PDL) licenses in 2021 between MLB and Minor League Baseball teams, MLB implemented new standards for facilities and player working conditions throughout the development system. Teams must meet certain standards each season and the OKC Comets continue to work closely with the City of Oklahoma City to ensure Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark remains compliant and up to date.







The home and visiting clubhouses were completely transformed following the end of the 2022 season. The clubhouses were renovated, redesigned and expanded, creating updated and larger kitchen facilities, a dining area, new office spaces for coaches, new (and more) locker stalls, an expanded weight room, new athletic training equipment, updated batting tunnels with new lighting, flooring, netting and addition of a social space, new laundry equipment and a new home video room. A women's locker room was also redesigned and upgraded for 2023.

The green wall pads that surrounded the inside of the ballpark's playing field and were original to the ballpark's opening in 1998, were replaced and additional padding was added in select areas to increase player safety. The home and visiting bullpens were reworked to assist with loose material containment and reduce tripping hazards. The overhang of the home bullpen was expanded to help better shield OKC players from inclement weather. The slope of the stadium's crowned infield was eliminated creating a flat infield surface.

The ParTea Pad was added to the right-center field lawn. The yellow shipping container and deck is a new shared social space for fans. Also, updates and renovations to the right field Skyline Deck hospitality area included replacing the railing and reworking the bar service space.

BALLPARK IMPROVEMENTS

Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark has undergone numerous other improvements, additions and renovations in recent years:

and outdoor seating for four guests. Allinclusive food and soft drinks will be delivered to guests in their seats and

Oklahoma City Triple-A Baseball Hall of Fame

The Oklahoma City Triple-A Baseball Hall of Fame was formed in 2023 as part of the 25th anniversary celebration of Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark.

The first six Hall of Fame selections made in 2023 and 2024 were chosen by a five-person committee comprised of media members, baseball historians and civic leaders that worked alongside members of the Oklahoma City Comets front office.

In 2024, first baseman Steve Balboni, infielder Nick Capra and former OKC 89ers co-owner, president and general manager Patty Cox Hampton were inducted. All three inductees played key roles in the team's history during the 89ers era of 1983-97.

In 2023, manager Bobby Jones, pitcher R.A. Dickey and outfielder/designated hitter Jason Botts were inducted as part of the inaugural class. Each played key roles in the team's history during the franchise's Bricktown era, which began in 1998 and was celebrated throughout the ballpark's 25th anniversary season in 2023.


"As we began to think about how we wanted to celebrate the 25th anniversary of the ballpark, it became clear that recognizing the extraordinary talent and personalities that have spent time here in Oklahoma City would be an important element of our celebration," Comets President/General Manager Michael Byrnes said in 2023. "This Hall of Fame will ultimately have representation from the full history of the franchise. Triple-A baseball began in 1962 here in Oklahoma City, but this year it felt particularly special to honor the Bricktown era as we celebrated this great ballpark."

The Oklahoma City Triple-A Baseball Hall of Fame also includes the re-enshrinement of 24 individuals who were selected as part of the Oklahoma City 89ers Hall of Fame between 1981–89.

A temporary display showcasing all of the Hall of Fame honorees is currently posted along the right field concourse near the Warren Spahn Gate entrance at Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark, available for all fans to see.

OKC Comets Rookie League

The OKC Comets Rookie League is celebrating its seventh season in 2025.

The Rookie League formed in 2018 in partnership with Oklahoma City Parks and Recreation to increase youth baseball participation in the community, as well as foster an environment that emphasizes leadership, teamwork and sportsmanship.

The OKC Comets help provide resources and reduce costs in order to make baseball more accessible to area youth.



The league consists of five T-ball, baseball and softball divisions to accommodate boys and girls in multiple skill levels and age groups. Teams compete in divisions of 4U T-Ball, 6U T-Ball, 8U Coach Pitch

baseball or softball, 10U Kid Pitch baseball or softball and 12U Kid Pitch baseball or softball.



Registration fees help cover operation expenses such as umpires and field maintenance. The OKC Comets provide a jersey, hat and belt for each participant as well as equipment for each team thanks to partnerships with Academy Sports + Outdoors, Casey's, Oklahoma City Police Athletic League and Oklahoma Highway Safety Office.

Practices are held once per week and the Rookie League season includes seven games in April and May, while some divisions compete in the fall. Baseball games are played at Wheeler Park, while softball games take place at Stars and Stripes Park.

Rookie League participants are invited to a closing ceremonies event at Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark each spring, including a pregame parade on the field prior to an Oklahoma City Comets home game.

The Rookie League is committed to enriching the lives of our youth and fostering a love of the game. The league provides a developmental, fun, and safe environment for the enjoyment of the game of baseball. The Rookie League intends to help youth set and work towards common goals, and to build the citizens of tomorrow through character, leadership ability and confidence.





Additionally, the Rookie League emphasizes four core values through P.L.A.Y. — participation, leadership, accessibility and youth education.

Cielo Azul de Oklahoma City

The OKC Comets will take the field as Cielo Azul de Oklahoma City presented by OG&E Sept. 9-14, 2025 as the team continues participation in Minor League Baseball's "Copa de la Diversión™" or "Fun Cup™."

MiLB.com describes Copa de la Diversión as "a seasonlong event series specifically designed to embrace the culture and values that resonate most with participating teams' local U.S. Hispanic/Latino communities."

"During ¡Celebración Cielo Azul! we aim to create a gameday experience and atmosphere that encompasses the vibrancy and uniqueness of our Cielo Azul identity," OKC Comets President/General Manager Michael Byrnes said. "We have worked closely with leaders in our local Hispanic and Latino communities on how we can best celebrate our city's diversity during

these series."



Copa de la Diversión began with four teams in 2017 and has expanded to 98 teams in 2024 — the program's seventh season. Oklahoma City debuted its Cielo Azul identity in 2018 and went on to be named one of five finalists for the inaugural Copa de la Diversión by MiLB that season. The trophy is now awarded annually by a panel of industry experts and civic leaders based on a club's

ballpark experience during Copa nights, community engagement and philanthropic impact.

In addition to players and coaches wearing Cielo Azul jerseys and hats, the gameday environment during ¡Celebración Cielo Azul! has included Latin music, specialty concession items, festive concourse decorations, unique entertainment, live performances, a Spanish-speaking public address announcer and bilingual game programs. Cielo Azul merchandise is available for purchase in the Team Store.





Community initiatives have also been a key component of ¡Celebración Cielo Azul!, including a kickoff event at Supermercados Morelos during its initial season, pregame recognitions of leaders in OKC's Hispanic and Latino communities, as well as partnering with the Latino Community Development Agency (LCDA). The LCDA's mission is to improve the quality of life in the Latino community through education, leadership, services and advocacy. The organization has received donations from tickets sold to groups and as part of a special ticket package in previous seasons.

Cielo Azul translates to "Blue Sky." The concept started with the idea of creating a brand that celebrated the richness and depth of Hispanic and Latino culture in the United States, linked to the team's identity as a Los Angeles Dodgers affiliate and connected with our home state of Oklahoma.

Pitcher Fernando Valenzuela, a hero within the Dodgers organization and beyond, would look into the sky as part of his windup. From this, the idea of Cielo Azul was born.

The primary blue color within the logo recalls the expansive view of the blue sky in Oklahoma. Having "azul" in the name creates a connection to Dodger blue. The blue sky also reflects the diversity of the Hispanic and Latino community in Oklahoma and the U.S. living under that shared blue sky. The accent colors of red, gray and cream reflect the landscape that the team and community call home. The primary and secondary Cielo Azul logos feature the scissor-tailed flycatcher design as an additional tribute to the state of Oklahoma.



OKC Comets Reading Challenge

The Oklahoma City Comets Reading Challenge presented by Energy Transfer recently kicked off its third year and encourages students in kindergarten through 12th grade throughout Oklahoma to log at least 20 minutes of reading per day to receive Comets game tickets, pregame field access and chances to win additional prizes.

To participate, students only need to select a reading challenge timeframe, download an official reading log, update the log each time they read and submit the completed log (including at least 500 total minutes of reading) by the challenge's required deadline.

Students who complete a challenge receive two complimentary tickets to a Reading Challenge Night baseball game at Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark and receive early access to play catch on the field with their family. Students can participate in up to three challenges per season. Logs can be downloaded and submitted at okccomets.com/reading-challenge or submitted by emailing reading@okccomets.com.

The first reading challenge of the season requires students to read at least 500 total minutes prior to April 3 to receive tickets to the Comets' game April 4. The second reading challenge of the season runs April 5-May 24 to receive tickets to the Comets' May 25 game. The third reading challenge of 2025 runs May 24-July 11 to receive tickets to the Comets' July 12 game and the fourth reading challenge runs July 13-Aug. 30 to receive tickets to the Comets' Aug. 31 game.

The OKC Comets Reading Challenge is made possible thanks to Energy Transfer, which specializes in the transportation, storage and terminalling of natural gas, natural gas liquids, crude oil and refined products. Since its founding in 1996, the company has made itself one of the largest infrastructure companies in North America with nearly 120,000 miles of pipelines and related assets traversing 41 states, and international offices in Beijing, China and Panama City, Panama.

The OKC Comets also encourage Reading Challenge participants to take part in the OKCPS ReadOKC and Metropolitan Library System Summer Reading challenges for chances to win additional prizes for their time spent reading.

ReadOKC is the district-wide literacy initiative of Oklahoma City Public Schools to instill the love of reading among its students and surrounding community. The program's primary goals include hosting reading challenges during every school break, increasing access to reading materials and recruiting caring adults to serve as Reading Buddies.



For more than 80 years, the Metropolitan Library System has offered a summer reading program that promotes reading for fun and lifelong enrichment while creating a motivational framework for learning for all ages during the summer.

To kick off the program's inaugural season, officials from the OKC Comets and Energy Transfer visited Adams Elementary School in southwest Oklahoma City for a special reading event that included volunteers reading baseball stories and visits from team mascots.



OKC Comets MVP Program

The OKC Comets MVP Program: Encouraging STEM Education is in the midst of its ninth year thanks to partner Devon Energy.

Oklahoma elementary school teachers in second, third and fourth grade are eligible to register for the free, statewide Oklahoma City Comets MVP Program that incentivizes teachers and students to participate in science, technology, engineering and math (STEM) curriculum. The program rewards students for their STEM achievements both inside and outside of the classroom.

The MVP Program impacted more than 22,000 students during the 2023-24 academic year and has experienced tremendous growth since the program began in 2016.

Participation in the MVP Program was initially only open to Oklahoma City Public Schools third- and fourth-grade classrooms in 2016-17. After a successful start, the program expanded in 2017-18 to include additional metro-area classrooms in the Mid-Del, Putnam City, Edmond and Norman school districts. The MVP Program became available statewide in 2018-19 and added second-grade classrooms for the 2021-22 academic year.

Participating teachers receive all necessary MVP Program materials free of charge, as well as tickets to an OKC Comets game honoring MVP teachers and students. MVP students receive tickets to an OKC Comets game recognizing their participation and success throughout the school year and also receive an exclusive MVP baseball hat.

The MVP Program culminates each summer with MVP Field Day at Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark — an exclusive event for participating MVP students and teachers, as well as their families, featuring numerous STEM activities.

Hennessey previously served as manager of Double-A Tulsa - a fellow Dodgers affiliate - from the middle of the 2017 season through 2024. With 455 career wins with the Drillers, including 16 playoff victories, he is the second-winningest manager in Tulsa professional baseball history since

In 2018, Hennessey led the Drillers to the team's first Texas League title in 20 years. The team also advanced to the playoffs four times under Hennessey, including to the Texas League Championship Series in 2017 and 2019.

Hennessey's squads in Tulsa finished with a winning record in six of his seven seasons and advanced to the postseason four times. The six consecutive winning seasons by the Drillers from 2017-23 is the

longest streak in franchise history.

During the 2023 season, Hennessey was diagnosed with squamous cell carcinoma and spent most of that year receiving chemotherapy treatments but returned to the dugout prior to season's end. He is now cancer free.

Hennessey has been a member of the Dodgers organization since 2007, first serving as an amateur scout in Florida before transitioning to coaching in player development in 2017.

Hennessey also has coaching experience at the high school and junior college levels. He helped Cowley College in Kansas to back-to-back Junior College World Series titles in 1997 and 1998 as an assistant coach and has since been inducted into the Tiger Scott Hennessey participated in the Comets brand reveal Athletic Hall of Fame.

Hitting Coaches Manny Burriss and Dylan Nasiatka

Manny Burriss enters his fifth season as the team's hitting coach and was part of the team's Pacific Coast League Championship in 2023. In 2022, OKC set club records with 949 runs and 731 walks. OKC's walks lead the Minor Leagues and were the most by any Triple-A team since 2004.

Burriss joined the Dodgers organization in 2019 as a roving hitting instructor. The Washington, D.C., native played professionally from 2006-18, including parts of seven seasons





Oklahoma City Posts Fourth Straight Winning Season and 20th During the Franchise's Bricktown Era



Second Place, Pacific Coast League East Division • 79-71 Record Overall 40-35 First Half Record • 39-36 Second Half Record

Oklahoma City continued its winning ways in 2024 as the team competed as the Oklahoma City Baseball Club throughout its Pacific Coast League schedule.

OKC wrapped up 2024 with a 79-71 record, marking the 20th time in 26 seasons during the Bricktown era that an OKC team finished with a winning record, including 11 of the last 12 seasons, eight of nine seasons as a Dodgers affiliate and for a fourth consecutive season.

Season highlights:

• Outfielder Ryan Ward led the Pacific Coast League with 33 home runs, finished second with 62 extra-base hits and finished third with 101 RBI.

Ward became just the third player in OKC's Bricktown era (since 1998) to hit 33 or more homers in one season and the first to do it since Mike Hessman hit 35 home runs in 2012. Including a home run hit in the Arizona Complex League during a rehab assignment in May, Ward has hit 34 home runs this season — second-most in the Minors. Ward also became just the fourth player during the Bricktown era to reach the century mark in RBI.

He went 9-for-19 over five games during Oklahoma City's April road series in Albuquerque, hitting five home runs and a double, while also scoring eight runs and racking up 11 RBI to be named PCL Player of the Week.

• Fellow OKC outfielder Drew Avans paced the PCL with 105 runs scored, finished third with 147 hits, second with 80 walks and with eight triples.

Avans surpassed Kelly Dransfeldt (1999-2002) as OKC's all-time Bricktown-era career hits leader, finishing his time with OKC with 462 career hits in four seasons

(since 2021). In addition to hits, Avans has established new Bricktown era career records for runs scored (345), walks (261) and triples (26). He now ranks second all-time in the Bricktown era with 471 career games and 117 stolen bases, while ranking third in doubles (86). He also set a new OKC single-season Bricktown-era record for 105 runs, passing Esteban Germán's 103 runs scored in 2005.

He was named the final PCL Player of the Week after he batted 14-for-22 (.636) with seven RBI over five games in Salt Lake to close the season. He set a career high with five hits Sept. 18 at Salt Lake and tied his career high with five RBI as he went 5-for-6 with a home run, double and four runs scored.

- Trey Sweeney hit six home runs and had 14 RBI over six games in Albuquerque in late May and early June. He went 11-for-28 (.393) and scored 10 runs, while leading the Minors with six homers, eight extra-base hits and 32 total bases to be named PCL Player of the Week.
- Infielder Andre Lipcius tied for first in the PCL with 152 hits in 140 games.
- Oklahoma City's pitching staff allowed the fewest home runs in the league as well as the second-fewest hits and runs in the league throughout the season, finishing with a 4.49 ERA — second-lowest in the PCL.
- May 9 in Sugar Land, Oklahoma City scored 22 or more runs in a game for just the fourth time in the franchise's Bricktown era (since 1998). It was also the second time during the season OKC scored at least 21 runs in a game, joining a 21-9 victory at Albuquerque on April 25.
- Jon Duplantier fanned an OKC season-high 12 batters over six perfect innings Sept. 18 in Salt Lake on his way to being named PCL Pitcher of the Week for the final week of the regular season.



Playoff Notes

- In 2023, Oklahoma City won its first PCL Championship since rejoining the league in 1998. Previously, Oklahoma City won first-round series and advanced to the PCL Championship Series in 1999, 2008 and 2016, but lost.
- Prior to 2023, Oklahoma City last won a baseball championship in 1996 when the Oklahoma City 89ers won the American Association championship. Additionally, the 89ers won PCL titles in 1963 and 1965. OKC won the 2023 and 1963 titles on its home field.
- OKC's 2-0 sweep of Round Rock in the 2023 PCL Championship Series became the first playoff series sweep by an OKC team during the Bricktown era.
- Prior to a Game 1 win in the 2023 PCL Championship Series, OKC had lost the first game of each of its previous 12 playoff series. The team's lone other opening win in a playoff series (since 1998) came in the first round against Omaha in 1999 at Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark.
- In 2023, Oklahoma City made its first appearance in a Triple-A National Championship Game and first in postseason interleague competition during the franchise's Bricktown era (since 1998) and PCL history (1963–68; 1998–2023).

Triple-A Championship Format

The 2025 Triple-A National Championship Game will feature the winners of the International League and Pacific Coast League meeting in a single game to be played Saturday, Sept. 27 at Las Vegas Ballpark in Las Vegas, Nevada. Championship game participants will be determined through a best-of-three League Championship Series.

The Triple-A seasons in both the Pacific Coast League and International League will be split into halves for a third consecutive season, with the first half ending June 22. The second half will begin June 24 and the regular season will conclude Sept. 21. The first-half winners will host the second-half winners in a best-of-three LCS slated to begin Sept. 23 in both the PCL and IL. The two LCS winners will advance to Las Vegas for the Triple-A National Championship Game.

The PCL has won 10 of the 17 winner-take-all games against the IL since the championship game's inception in 2006. Last season, the Sugar Land Space Cowboys defeated the Omaha Storm Chasers, 13-6, in the 2024 Triple-A National Championship Game in Las Vegas.

2025 Experimental Rules for Triple-A (from MLB)*

- Pitch Clock: The pitch clock will continue to be utilized to improve pace of play at the Triple-A level with the guidelines remaining the same as those in place during the 2024 season. Pitchers must begin the natural movement associated with the delivery of the ball to the batter within 15 seconds when the bases are empty and within 18 seconds if there is a runner on base. The designated times between batters (0:30) and for inning breaks/pitching changes (2:15) also remain the same. Batters will be required to be in the batter's box and alert to the pitcher with eight or more seconds remaining and catcher's must be in the catcher's box with nine or more seconds remaining. A violation by the pitcher results in an automatic ball, a violation by the catcher results in an automatic ball and a violation by the hitter results in an automatic strike. For mound visits, the clock will be set to 30 seconds and begin counting down when the manager or coach has exited the dugout of when a defensive player leaves their position to confer with the player and the umpire has granted time out for a mound visit.
- ABS Challenge System: The automated strike zone, known as ABS, returns to Triple-A in 2025 along with the challenge system. Umpires will call balls and strikes during games, but players can challenge the result of the pitch by tapping the top of their heads or batting helmets. The challenge will be resolved by the ABS system, which will either uphold the initial call or overturn it and the results will be displayed on the videoboard or scoreboard. The umpire will announce which player is challenging and the pitch call. Following the video playout of the challenge result, the umpire will announce the result of the challenge and the revised count. Each team has two challenges per game, which are retained when used successfully.
- Infield Positioning: There will be a slight modification to the shift rules established in 2023 that require the defensive team to have no more than two infielders on either side of second base prior to a pitch being thrown and each infielder must be standing on the infield. For 2025, when an illegally positioned infielder is the first player to touch a batted ball, the batter will be entitled to first base and all runners will advance one base. If the defensive team violates the rule in any other circumstance, a ball will be added to the count. In all cases, the manager of the team at bat has the option to accept the appropriate penalty or the result of the play.
- PitchCom: Clubs will be responsible for ensuring that the PitchCom device is functional prior to the beginning of each half inning and following any mid-inning pitching change. The pitcher and catcher must test PitchCom prior to the first pitch of each inning and before the first pitch thrown by a pitcher who enters the game mid-inning to ensure the devices are working properly. If play must be stopped to address a PitchCom issue at any point during warmups or during the first batter the pitcher faces, the umpire will assess a Pitch Clock violation (i.e. automatic ball). Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Club may use a mound visit to address the PitchCom issue (in which case the Club will not be assessed a Pitch Clock violation). This provision applies to device malfunctions, breakage, and accidentals turnoffs, as well as pitchers who forget to bring a PitchCom receiver to the mound with them.



Requests for daily credentials and credentialed media workspace must be requested online at okccomets.com/pressbox at least 24 hours in advance and include signed acceptance of Minor League Baseball's 2025 Credential Agreement.

The OKC Comets cannot issue a credential until the MiLB agreement form has been signed and completed.

Additional Info/Reminders:

- Credentials permit access to the Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark, Volney Meece Memorial Press Box, camera wells and platforms, playing field (pregame only; prior approval required) and the Joe Carter Parking Lot.
- Credentialed media are prohibited from requesting autographs.
- Credentials are not transferable and no guests, spouses or children of media members will be issued passes.
- Credential bearer assumes all risks incidental to the game of baseball, whether occurring prior to, during or after the game, including but not limited to the risk of being injured by or in connection with any thrown bat or thrown or batted ball. Bearer agrees that the Oklahoma City Comets, its agents and affiliates, are not liable for resulting injuries.
- Credential bearer grants the Oklahoma City Comets and its designees unrestricted right to use holder's name, voice, image and likeness in any recording taken at the game, for any purpose and in any media known or subsequently developed.

Covering the Oklahoma City Comets:

Credential Pickup: Credentials can be picked up at the ticket office located on the west side of Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark along South Mickey Mantle Drive typically starting four hours before first pitch. Please bring a photo I.D. to pick up your credential. You must also complete a MiLB Credential Agreement form prior to receiving your credential.

Parking: Parking will be available in the Joe Carter Lot located at the northeast corner of Joe Carter Avenue and Reno Avenue east of Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark. Please show your credential for admittance into the lot.

Entrance: If arriving at the ballpark prior to gates open (one hour prior to first pitch), please use the first base gate on the south side of the ballpark along Reno Avenue. If arriving after gates open, use any open gate. Allow bags and equipment to be searched as requested by ballpark security officials.

Volney Meece Memorial Press Box: The press box is located on the third floor of the ballpark and is accessible from the elevators and stairs near the first and third base entrances to the suites. Proper credentials are required for admittance. Please submit requests for reserved workspace in advance.

Interviews and Team Access: Credentialed media may have player/coach access on the field for interviews during batting practice, pregame and postgame. Please contact OKC Comets Communications to help coordinate with the team's daily schedule.

Photographers/Videographers: Limited space is available at field level, as each camera well on the outfield side of each dugout is occupied by in-house television and staff photographers. Photographers are also allowed to shoot from the platforms near the elevators on the second or third levels or from the outfield lawn seating area, Please contact OKC Comets Communications if additional access is needed.

Meals: A buffet-style meal will be served in the press box starting two hours prior to first pitch and will be available until first pitch. A soda machine will be available in the press box throughout the game.

Alex has been the Director of Communications and Broadcasting for the Oklahoma City Comets since 2012. Earlier in his career, he spent three seasons as the Director of Broadcasting & Media Relations for the High Desert Mavericks, the former High-A affiliate of the Seattle Mariners.

Since coming to Oklahoma City, Alex has been named the winner of the Oklahoma Association of Broadcasters award for "Best Play-By-Play" two times. He has also been recognized by *Ballpark Digest* for an outstanding achievement in Minor League Baseball play-by-play.

In 2020, Alex handled play-by-play duties for the Perfect Game All-American Classic held at Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark that was broadcast to a national audience on SiriusXM Radio.



Outside of baseball, Alex has also covered football, basketball, hockey, softball, and volleyball at different levels, ranging from high school to NCAA Division I. He primarily spends his current baseball offseasons working with the men's and women's basketball programs at Mid-America Christian University and covering other collegiate sports.

Alex is originally from St. Louis and graduated from Northwestern University, where he majored in both journalism and political science.

Frequently occurring transactions and how they are defined*:

- Player Recalled A player is called up by his Major League club. A player is recalled (rather than having his contract selected) if he is already on the MLB club's 40-man roster.
- Contract Selected A player is called up by his Major League club. A player has his contract selected (rather than being recalled) if he is not already on the MLB club's 40-man roster.
- Injured List MLB has varying injured lists based on the player's position and injury. The 7-day Injured List is limited to players who have endured a concussion or concussion-like symptoms. For other injuries, position players must remain on the Injured List for a minimum of 10 days and pitchers must remain on the Injured List for a minimum of 15 days. When a player is placed on the Injured List, he does not count against a club's active roster limit. When a player is placed on the 60-day Injured List, along with having to sit out for 45 extra days, he is no longer counted against an MLB club's 40-man roster. The Minor Leagues have a 7-day Injured List for both position players and pitchers.
- Assigned A player is assigned to a new team within his organization or to his organization's extended Spring Training. A player is not considered "assigned" to a Major League club. It generally refers to a player being assigned to a Minor League team, a Spring Training camp or extended Spring Training.
- Optioned A player is sent from his Major League club to one of its Minor League affiliates. When a
 player is optioned, he remains on the MLB club's 40-man roster. Position players must remain
 with a Minor League affiliate for a minimum of 10 days after being optioned and a pitcher must
 remain with a Minor League affiliate for a minimum of 15 days, unless he is recalled to replace a
 member of the Major League roster who has been placed on the Injured List.
- Sent Outright ("Outrighted") A player is sent from his Major League club to one of its Minor League affiliates. When a player is outrighted, he is removed from the MLB club's 40-man roster.
- Designated for Assignment When a MLB club designates a player for assignment, it allows the club to open up a roster spot while it figures out what to do with the player. Most often a player is designated for assignment so the club can open up his roster spot while it waits for him to clear waivers. A club may also designate a player for assignment while it tries to trade him to another club. A club's 40-man roster must be full before a player can be DFA'd, and the player is immediately removed from all rosters when he is designated.
- Released An MLB club removes a player from its organization. Some players need to clear waivers
 before they can be released, hence they would be designated for assignment first. Other players,
 particularly those released from Minor League affiliates, need not clear waivers.
- Claimed Off Waivers There are various situations in which a player may end up on waivers. It is
 usually a precursor to the player being released, traded or reassigned to a Minor League club.
 Any other team can put in a claim on a waived player within a certain time frame. If more than
 one team claims the same player, the team winning the claim is determined by which claiming
 team had the worst record in the same league (American or National) as the team that waived the
 player and then, if no one in the same league claims him, the claiming team in the other league
 with the worst record.
- Traded A player has been traded from one Major League organization to another. Minor Leaguers
 are not traded from affiliate to affiliate but rather MLB organization to MLB organization. The new
 MLB organization can then assign the player to one of its affiliates.
- Restricted List The restricted list is for players who are suspended because of failure to adhere to
 the Minor League Drug Prevention and Treatment Program. It also may be used if a player
 violates contract terms or fails to appear for a team or camp assignment. An example of the
 latter is a foreign player who cannot join his team because of visa problems.
- Suspended A player is suspended, usually for an on-field incident, and is not allowed to play. He still
 counts against a team's active roster limit.
- Temporarily Inactive List If a Minor League player is away from a team for a few days because of a
 personal matter, travel to an All-Star game, etc., and is not placed on the IL, he is placed on the
 Temporary Inactive List for a minimum of three days.
- Bereavement List A player is temporarily inactive to attend to a personal matter like a family medical emergency or a death in the family. This can last from three to seven days.
- Development List A healthy player is placed on the Development List and temporarily removed from game action to allow them to focus on development, conditioning or to create flexibility with a team's active roster.
