Tonight's Game

The Clippers will send RHP **Zack Godley** to the mound tonight, followed by RHP **Kevin Herget**. Indianapolis will counter with RHP **Luis Oviedo**. The Clippers are 22-24 (.478) against right handers this year. Oviedo has never pitched against the Clippers in his career, as he was previously in the Cleveland organization (Rule 5 pick by New York last December, traded to Pittsburgh).

vs. the Indians

Columbus was 15-9 against Indy in 2019, despite scoring just 10 more runs on the season, 132-122 (more wins, fewer runs than Indy in each of three seasons from 2016-18). This year, the Clippers are again getting beat in the run column (36-23) and it shows in the record (4-5). The Clippers have 8HR in the series, but all have been solo shots (only two multi-run innings in 75 times at bat).

Pummeled Pitching

Huntington Park is near the top of the IL in HR per game (3rd, 2.93). Unfortunatley, 34 of the last 57 have been allowed by Columbus (154HR allowed in last 80G in the regular season at HP). After consecutive homerless games to start this series (first time since 4/17-4/18/18 vs. Pawtucket), both teams hit a pair last night with all of them coming in innings 2-4.

To the Top

Trenton Brooks will be batting leadoff for the third straight night tonight (primarily leadoff batter in 2016-17; has only one other start since beginning of 2018 season, 6/11/19 with Lynchburg, 1x3, 2R, BB). Brooks batted solely at cleanup for Akron this season (23G) and had not started above sixth for Columbus before Wednesday (hitting .324, 11x34, batting eighth; .220, 13x59 higher than eighth).

Work to Do

Owen Miller is batting .220 (13x59) since returning from a three week stint in Cleveland, turning in eight hitless games in 17 chances (four hitless games in first 16). Miller is hitless in his last 9AB (hitless in 14AB from 6/18-6/22), sinking from .342 to .317 (lowest of the season). He has only 5XBH during the cold spell, including just a double from 6/18-7/1 (.194SLG in 36AB).

Take Two

The double from **Nolan Jones** Saturday night was his IL-best 19th of the year (**Oscar Mercado** is 6th, 13). Jones is slugging .525 over his last 29G, collecting 14 doubles, a triple, 3HR (6XBH through first 26G) and only 26K (had 43K in first 26G). Thanks to his current tear, he is on pace for 44 doubles, a number that would set the franchise record (42 by **Kurt Bierek** in 1999; Bierek played in 135G).

Three Left Turns

Gabriel Arias crossed the plate last night, after a 2G scoring drought (has scored in 19 of 25G since an 8G drought from 5/29-6/6). Beginning with a 3-run game on 6/12 at Iowa, Arias has scored 23 runs in his last 21G, leading the IL in that time (hitting .321, 25x78, since 6/12). On the season, Arias is tied for 4th in the IL in runs (36) and is on pace to score 83 (most since **Kevin Reese's** 92 in 2005).

A New Oscar

Oscar Gonzalez followed up a hitless Triple-A debut with a pair of 2x3 games (has not gone hitless in consecutive games since three straight from 5/29-6/4). At the time of his call up, on 7/6, Gonzalez was the only player in the Eastern League to rank among the top three in the Triple Crown, placing 3rd in each (.330, 13HR, 41RBI), and he had a hit in 21 of his last 23 with Akron (.383, 36x94, 6HR, 24RBI).

Big Time Slumps

Gavin Collins knocked a single in his only AB last night, giving him hits in back to back games (3x4, 2RBI) after a 3x41, 3RBI stretch from 6/1-7/2. **Alex Call** was 4x9 with a pair of homers through his first 2G in Triple-A, but has just one hit in 23AB since (bunt single on 7/3 at Toledo, hitless in last 14AB). Call scored 34 times in 43G for Akron, compared to three times in 9G with Columbus.

Group Effort

The bullpen provided 6.0IP of scoreless work Tuesday night (3H, 2BB, 8K), marking the ninth game this season, with at least 5.0IP and 0ER (only six such games in all of 2019). After giving up at least 1ER in 12 straight at home, from 5/27-6/23 (62.1IP, 48ER), the bullpen turned in five 0ER outings over 6G at home (26.0IP, 2ER), until last night's blowup (5ER in 6.2IP, all charged to **Kyle Nelson**, 0.1IP).

This Date in Clipper History

7/9/1988

The Clippers blew out the PawSox 10-3 at McCoy Stadium thanks to a rare offensive explosion by the lowest scoring team in Clipper history. **Hal Morris** led the way, going 3x5 with a HR and 4RBI. Morris would lead the IL in hitting with a .326 mark, now good for 9th best in Clipper history, and he was also named Clipper of the Year. Two years later, Morris helped the Cincinnati Reds beat Oakland in the World Series.

Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 years since the move downtown, Huntington Park has ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game, totaling 2.25 per contest (1,763HR, 783 games). In 2019, HP averaged over three per game for the first time ever (seventh time averaging over a pair), as the Clippers surrendered a record 127HR and just missed out on triple digits themselves (97HR was second highest team total). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (969 to 927).

Deadball Era

The franchise record for homers was destroyed in 2019 (213, +31 from '83), as was the record for homers allowed (198, +42 from '98). This season's Clippers are homering at a rate of 1.14 per game, putting them 22 off the pace of the pre-2019 record (adjusted for 140G). However, on the mound they are allowing 1.34 per game, enough to beat the pre-2019 record by 17, even with the shortened season.

Ain't Over 'Til It's Over

From 2014-19, no team had more come from behind victories than the 210 posted by Columbus and no team produced a better winning percentage when trailing than the .353 of the Clippers (Scranton/WB was 2nd in percentage, .338, and wins, 192). This year has seen the Clippers go 10-30 (.250) in games in which they trail, ranking 11th.

Not Close

The Clippers have the 2nd most losses by at least a grand slam in the IL (17, Memphis leads with 21) and rank 13th in wins by at least that many (8, one ahead of Memphis). That poor ratio has led to a -40 run differential, a figure that places them 11th in the IL (Memphis is securely in the basement at -92).

Get What You Pay For

Columbus was the last team in the IL to play free baseball this season, playing 85 straight games, including the postseason, between extra-inning rumbles on 7/31/19 vs. Louisville (11-8 loss in 11) and 6/26/21 vs. St. Paul (6-4 loss in 10; two straight extra-inning losses following nine straight wins, 8/21/18-7/3/19). The regulation-inning streak was the longest for Columbus dating to the 1984 season (as far back as the day by day records go) and 45 straight to start the season was also a record.

Trending Downward

The current staff ERA of 5.03 is on pace to be the 2nd worst in franchise history (5.08, 1983) and anything over 4.71 will mark the fifth straight season in which the ERA has gotten worse. From 2011-16, the Clipper staff turned in a sub-4.00ERA five times in six seasons (zero such seasons from 1993-2010), including the best two ERAs of the past 32 years (3.33 in 2015 and 3.65 in 2016). The 5.52ERA at Huntington Park is the worst ever (5.29 in 2019, only time ERA has ever been over 5.00 at HP).

Free Swingers

After three straight seasons leading the IL in strikeouts, the Clipper lineup is threatening for a fourth, as they currently rank 6th (542K, 37 off the pace, Charlotte). The 2019 squad obliterated the franchise record, as they struck out 95 more times than the previous high (1,392; each of last three seasons rank among franchise's three worst, totalling 3,979K in 422G). While the record appears safe due to the truncated schedule, this year's version is averaging 9.68K per game.

Night and Day

When playing errorless baseball, the Clippers have a winning percentage that is almost 200 points higher (.560, 14-11) than when they make a mistake in the field (.387, 12-19). After an exceptional defensive run from 2015-2019, in which the fielding percentage was never below .983 and the team never committed more than 88E, the 2021 team is on pace to botch 105 plays (adjusted for 140G season, have not had triple digits in errors since six straight seasons from 2009-14) with a fielding percentage of .979.

One On, No Out Success

When the leadoff batter of an inning reached base in 2019, the Clippers plated him nearly 60% of the time (over 51% only once in the last six seasons, 55% in 2016). Getting more than one base was a specialty of Clipper hitters, as they led the IL with 136XBH to lead off the inning, including 54HR (led the IL, had 28 leadoff homers in 2018). So far in 2021, the Clippers are scoring the leadoff batter 52% of the time he reaches, with the leadoff batter scoring himself 13 times (on pace for 30HR).

Good Baseball

Oscar Mercado advanced a runner with a sac bunt on 6/26 vs. St. Paul and the runner came around to score in the loss (3-1 when advanced runner scores). During 2019, the Clippers struggled in the bunt department, but when the advanced runners scored, they were 7-1. During 2018, Columbus was 23-2 in games in which a run was scored after a good bunt attempt.

International Accolades

Bobby Bradley was named International League Player of the Month for May 2019, reaching base in 24 of 25 games during the month while hitting .302/.374/.740 with 12HR (led IL) and 28RBI. **Brandon Barnes, Eric Haase, Josh Smith** and **Asher Wojciechowski** were named to the 2019 IL All-Star Team and Bradley, Barnes and Haase were selected to the postseason squad.

Manager Profile

Andy Tracy makes his Clippers debut in 2021, following **Tony Mansolino's** championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; **Gene Michael**-'79, **Joe Altobelli**-'80, **Frank Verdi**-'81, **Bucky Dent**-'87 and **Mike Sarbaugh**-'10). This season marks Tracy's second year as a manager (first with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 56-76 (.424), 26-30 with Columbus (.464).

On the Dotted Line:

When Cleveland signed **Zack Godley** to a minor league deal, he became the fifth pitcher picked up by the organization since the season started (**Matt Koch**, **Kevin Herget**, **Heath Fillmyer** and **Brad Peacock**). All five of those pitchers have started at least two games (with Godley's start tonight).

Travelling Man:

Godley is currently with his sixth organization in the last three years (seventh overall). After starting his career in the Chicago (NL) system, he was dealt to Arizona prior to the 2015 season. He reached the Majors shortly thereafter and spent part of every season with the D-backs until Toronto claimed him in 2019. From there, he signed with Detroit in early 2020, then with Boston at the start of the MLB season. This year saw him sign with Milwaukee in spring training, before latching on with Cleveland.

Before Columbus:

To start 2021, Godley was at Milwaukee's alternate training site. He had his contract purchased for a spot start vs. Miami on 4/28 and was forced to leave in the 4th inning due to a right index finger injury. After a brief stint on the DL, he was DFA'd and outrighted to Nashville, where he made one appearance out of the bullpen before entering the rotation. A successful run, including a scoreless start against the Clippers on 5/27 (6.0IP), led to a second one game stint with Milwaukee (0.1IP, 3ER in relief at Colorado on 6/20). Godley was DFA'd a second time, choosing free agency over his outright assignment on 6/24.

Huntington Park Effect:

Herget has started four games in Huntington Park this season, getting blistered to the tune of a 9.00ERA (19.0IP, 19ER). He has allowed 8HR to 90BF in Columbus, compared to 2HR to 85BF elsewhere in the IL (13 of 23 runs allowed at home have come via the long ball). In two starts at home from 6/16-6/22, he allowed three leadoff homers, with all of them coming immediately after the Clippers put up runs.

Returning Champion:

Though 5/26 marked Herget's International League debut, he had pitched in Huntington Park once before, as a member of the Memphis Redbirds against the Durham Bulls in the 2018 Triple-A National Championship (W, 14-5). Herget started and picked up the win for Memphis (5.1IP, 5H, 2R, 2ER, 0BB, 4K), outdueling future Clipper **Chih-Wei Hu** (2019).

That Was Fast:

Starting the season with Fargo-Moorhead in the American Association, Herget made only one start, on 5/19 vs. Cleburne (W, 7.0IP, 3H, 1R, 1ER, 1BB, 10K), before Cleveland signed him to a minor league deal on 5/25. While Herget became the first RedHawk to play for Columbus, six former Clippers have suited up for Fargo-Moorhead: **Jalal Leach**, **Mike Figga**, **Randall Simon**, **Donzell McDonald**, **Yurendell de Caster** and **Yhoxian Medina**.
