Fort Wayne topped Lake County, 5-4, in a back-and-forth game that featured three ties (1-1, 2-2 and 4-4). Bryan Lavastida opened the scoring in the top of the first with an RBI double to extend his hitting streak to 11 games, but Tirso Ornelas tied the score in the bottom of the first with his first home run since April 13, 2019. Fort Wayne took the lead in the bottom of the third on a force out at second base that scored Reinaldo llarraza from third. Lake County tied the score again in the top of the fourth on a sacrifice fly by Aaron Bracho. Fort Wayne plated two runs in the bottom of the sixth to take a 4-2 lead. A wild pitch by reliever Nick Gallagher brought home Kelvin Alarcon with the go-ahead run and llarraza knocked in Grant Little with a sacrifice fly. The Captains responded with two runs in the top of the seventh to tie the game at 4-4. Quentin Holmes drove home Raynel Delgado with a double and Will Brennan plated Holmes with a sacrifice fly. The TinCaps scored the eventual winning run in the bottom of the seventh. Seamus Curran hit a hard grounder to shortstop with one out and the Captains tried to turn an inning-ending double play, but the pivot throw from Delgado at second sailed wide of first and Chris Givin scored on the error to give the TinCaps a 5-4 lead. The Captains threatened in the ninth, but Brayan Rocchio lined out to right field with two aboard to end the game.

SEASON SERIES: The Captains are 10-5 in the season series against Fort Wayne and have outscored the TinCaps, 84-57 (+27 run differential). Five different Captains have an OPS of .900 or greater against Fort Wayne - Mike Amditis (1.397 - 5 games), Will Brennan (1.068 – 13 games), Brayan Rocchio (.998 – 12 games) and Quentin Holmes (.963 – 7 games) and Victor Nova (.925 - 11 games). In addition, five Captains have hit .300 or better against Fort Wayne - Amditis .500), Brennan (.380), Holmes (.370), Rocchio (.306) and Bryan Lavastida (.300).

BRENNAN BASHING: Captains OF Will Brennan has crushed Fort Wayne pitching. In this series, Brennan is 6-for-11 with a home run, a double, three walks, three RBI, five runs scored and three stolen bases. During the season series, Brennan is hitting .380/.448/.620 (1.068 OPS). Seven of Brennan's 18 doubles and seven of his 10 steals this season have come against Fort Wayne. Brennan enters today at second in the High-A Central League (HAC) in doubles, second in hits (56), fifth in extra-base hits (22), sixth in batting average (.298), tied for 10th in total bases (85) and 12th in on-base

THAT WAS WEIRD: In game one of Saturday's doubleheader against South Bend, the Captains won on a walk-off error when Cubs reliever Samuel Reyes dropped the throw back from catcher Harrison Wenson and Bryan Lavastida raced nome to score in the bottom of the eighth inning. The Cubs entered that inning pitching a combined perfect game with six perfect frames by starter Ryan Jensen and one by Reyes. Lavastida broke up the perfect game with a leadoff double.

HOME COOKIN' TASTES BETTER: The Captains are 18-6 at home, compared to 13-20 on the road. Captains pitchers have experienced the biggest home/road disparity. Lake County has a 3.01 ERA at Classic Park and a 4.96 ERA on the

HOT LAVA: Bryan Lavastida is riding an 11-game hitting streak, during which he has hit .500 (20-for-40) with three nomers and five doubles. Lavastida has six multi-hit games during the streak, including three three-hit performances.

PATIENCE IS A VIRTUE: George Valera and Joe Naranjo have both increased their walk-rate recently. Valera walked at an 8.9% rate in June, but has walked at a 17.2% rate in July. Naranjo walked at a 7.6% rate in May, but has walked at a

OPPO: José Tena has been among the league's best at hitting the ball to the opposite field. Entering today, Tena has hit the ball the other way 38.8% of the time, which is the fifth-highest oppo% among qualified hitters in the High-A Central .eague (HAC).

LAST TIME OUT: Burns took the loss against South Bend last Friday at Classic Park, despite allowing three earned runs over a season- and career-high 6.1 innings. Burns surrendered a two-run homer to Nelson Velazquez in the first and an RBI single to Josue Huma in the fifth. Through six, however, the score was tied at 3-3. The game was still tied at 3-3 when Burns was pulled in the seventh inning with one out and runners on second and third. After reliever **Nathan Ocker** struck out Jake Washer, a passed ball by catcher **Joe Donovan** allowed Yonathan Perlaza to score from third and an errant toss home by Donovan allowed Jake Slaughter to score from second on the play. The frantic play put the Cubs ahead, 5-3. They held on to win by that score, saddling Burns with the loss.

COLLEGE ACCOLADES: After a solid freshman campaign, Burns broke through in 2019 and was named a third team All-American by *Perfect Game*. Prior to the 2020 season Burns was Named Preseason All-SEC, Preseason All-America by *Baseball America*, *Collegiate Baseball*, *D1 Baseball* and *Perfect Game*. In just four games in 2020 Burns was off to a hot start striking out 12.9 per nine innings and had a 3-1 record with a 2.42 ERA.

TEAM USA: In 2018, Burns was selected to the USA Collegiate National Team. Burns appeared in four games allowing five runs over 7.2 innings. He allowed nine hits, struck out six and walked one. Also on the team were back to back first overall draft picks Adley Rutschman (2019) and Spencer Torkelson (2020).

2020 DRAFT: Cleveland selected Burns in the CBA round (36th overall) of the 2020 draft, which was shortened to five rounds. Burns was Cleveland's second selection in the draft, following SS Carson Tucker (1st Round – 23rd overall).

PREVIOUSLY DRAFTED: Originally drafted by the New York Yankees in the 37th round of the 2017 draft out of Decatur High School (Decatur, AL).

MR. ALABAMA: Burns was named Mr. Alabama his senior season of high school. Along with being one of the top pitchers in the state he hit .467 with 16 homers, 10 doubles, four triples and 46 RBI as a senior in High School.

RECRUITING BATTLE: A highly sought after recruit in Alabama, Burns originally committed to the University of Alabama but decided to weigh other options when Crimson Tide Head Coach Mitch Gaspard resigned in 2016, eventually committing to Auburn. Burns grew up an Alabama fan and only committed to the Tide's arch-rival Auburn due to Head Coach Butch Thompson's experience developing pitchers. He says he took a lot of heat for committing to Auburn from friends he grew up with.

STAR MENTORS: While at Auburn, Burns had a variety of people with great track records to learn from. Auburn Head Coach Butch Thompson has had 16 of his former pitchers make the big leagues including 10 since 2014. He previously worked as the Associate Head Coach and Pitching Coach at Mississippi State. Among the stars coached by Thompson is 2018 number one overall pick Casey Mize. Burns worked closely with Mize at Auburn, and was throwing partners with Mize during his freshman year of 2018. He took over the premier role in the rotation from Mize, operating as the teams Friday night starter in 2019 and 2020. Tim Hudson joined Thompson's staff in 2020 as a volunteer assistant and pitching coach, also getting the chance to mold Burns' game. The former Auburn great and 17 year MLB veteran worked with Burns for a short time in 2020 before the season was shortened but Burns says the two will have a relationship for the rest of his life.

FUTURE DEVELOPMENT: Kevin Goldstein of *FanGraphs* says Burns brings "big stuff out of a small package" with good secondary pitches to go with solid velocity (sits 93-94) on his fastball. Eric Longenhagen, also of *FanGraphs*, describes Burns as "an org based bet." Longenhagen sees Burns as someone who's future value mostly revolves around Cleveland's recent ability to develop pitchers. "I've always been a little lower on him due to his middling velocity and projectionless frame, but he executes his secondary stuff very consistently" Longenhagen said. *Baseball America* sites Burns offspeed pitches as potential plus pitches, especially his curveball and slider. Burns earns praise for his dedication, makeup and desire to learn.
