BATTLE OF THE BIRDS: Palm Beach has taken the first three games of the battle of the birds, and the Blue Jays have dropped seven straight games. Dunedin is in search of their first win since Saturday, June 28 vs. Bradenton. It's their longest losing streak since last year when Jays dropped nine straight games from April 19-28, 2024.

DOWN BAD: The Blue Jays offense plated six runs in Thursday's loss, their highest total since June 21 at Clearwater. Their nine hits marked their most since June 28 against Bradenton, highlighted by a four-hit night from JR Freethy and a two-run homer from Alexis Hernandez. Despite the offensive outburst, Dunedin couldn't overcome an early 8-0

JOBU NEEDS A REFILL: Over their seven game skid, Dunedin is batting .171 as a team with a .509 OPS. Entering play Thursday, the Blue Jays had scored three runs in their last 46 innings spanning five games, and had been shut out in three of those five contests.

BEACH BIRDS BITE: On Wednesday night, Dunedin took an early 1-0 lead in the 2nd inning on a Kendry Chirinos RBI single, and it would remain that score until the 9th inning, when Palm Beach was down to its final out. Deniel Ortiz, who singled then stole second and third with one out, scored on a wild pitch to tie the game. Christian Martin then delivered the walk-off RBI single in the 10th. In Tuesday's series opener, the Blue Jays were shut out for the seventh time this season, falling 7-0 to Palm Beach. It marked the third time over a four game span they'd been held scoreless. On the mound, Braden Davis dominated with six secretares inching and 11 stillcouts.

TIGERS CAN FLY?: Dunedin was swept in a rain shortened four-game set by Lakeland last week, in which the Flying Tigers outscored the Blue Jays 24-4. Three of the Jays four runs came on homers, a Manuel Beltre two-run shot on Tuesday, and a JR Freethy leadoff homer on Sunday. Freethy's leadoff blast on the second pitch in Sunday's series finale snapped a 22 inning scoreless streak by Lakeland pitchers, which included shutouts in back-to-back games in the middle two of the series. The Flying Tigers limited the Jays to one run over the final 31 innings of

he series.

NEW HALF, NEW JAYS?: The D-Jays concluded the first half 33-31, fourth place in the FSL West. The Lakeland Flying Tigers clinched the FSL West first-half championship and the St. Lucie Mets took the FSL East. After Dunedin went 4-13 from May 14-June 1, they fell from two games up in first place on May 13, to as far as 5.5 games out of first place in

ATLANTA BOUND: Blue Jays No. 2 prospect Trey Yesavage will represent Toronto's farm system at the 2025 MLB All-Star Futures Game in Atlanta on Saturday July 12 at Truist Park. Yesavage began 2025 in Dunedin and struck out 55 batters in 33.1 innings across seven starts. He earned a promotion to High-A Vancouver on May 20 and posted a 17.13 K/9 and 1.56 ERA then was promoted to Double-A New Hampshire

NEW GOLD: Baseball America updated their top 30 Blue Jays prospects last week. Current Dunedin players ranked include LHP Johnny King (No. 7), RHP Landen Maroudis (No. 11), C Edward Duran (No. 18), and INF Sam Shaw (No. 30). Shaw and Duran are both making their debut's on the list. Former D-Jay RHP Gage Stanifer jumped from unranked to No. 5

to No. 5.

SCOUTING PALM BEACH: Similarly to Dunedin, the Cardinals got off to a hot start to the 2025 season, going 14-8 over their first 22 games and ending the month of April at the top of the FSL East standings. However, Palm Beach has since April 30th gone 22-35 (.385%), the second worst record in the FSL behind only Fort Myers over that span. Palm Beach is led by Cardinals No. 4 prospect INF Rainel Rodriguez and reigning FSL Player of the Month for June, INF Deniel Ortiz. They took two of five last week from Jupiter and dropped the final two of the set.

First-year Manager Gil Kim provides a wealth of experience as a player, coach, and executive to Dunedin. Hired in 2016 as the Blue Jays Director of Player Development, Kim transitioned from the front office to a coaching role with the organization in 2020 when he joined Toronto's major league field staff under the same job title, before becoming the Blue Jay's major league field coordinator in 2022, a position he held until 2024. Before joining Toronto, Kim spent seven seasons with the Texas Rangers in several scouting roles, culminating as Director, International Scouting. A native of Pottsville, PA, Kim also had a six-year international professional playing career as an infielder, which included stops in the Netherlands, China, Australia, Spain and Venezuela. He played one season of collegiate baseball at D3 Middlebury before transferring to Vanderbilt, where he played under Tim Corbin. In 2008 while playing in Venezuela, Kim slept on a mattress in the bathroom in the locker room to save money and learn Spanish.

Cory Riordan | Pitching Coach Year with Toronto: 5 | Year with D-Jays: 3 | Born: Killingworth, CT

Cory Riordan enters his third season as Dunedin's Pitching Coach, after he held the same role with the FCL Blue Jays in 2021-22. He joined the Blue Jays organization in 2020, where he spent the 2020 shutdown assisting with the club's pitch design framework. Riordan pitched collegiately at Fordham University and went on to play 13 professional seasons, spending time with the Colorado Rockies and Detroit Tigers organizations, reaching as high as Triple-A. He also spent time in the independent Atlantic League, and played internationally in South Korea and Taiwan, and three winter ball seasons in Venezuela and the Dominican Republic.

Nash Knight | Hitting Coach Year with Toronto: 2 | Year with D-Jays: 2 | Born: Denton, TX

Nash Knight enters his second season with the Dunedin Blue Jays and Jays' organization. Under Knight's guidance in 2024, Dunedin ranked among the Florida State League leaders with 101 HR (3rd), 34 3B (T-1st), and a .359 SLG (3rd). Knight made the transition to coaching following a seven-year playing career where he spent six seasons in Toronto's farm system, reaching as high as Triple-A. He also spent time with the Rangers and Twins in his final season on the diamond 2022. A Dallas Baptist University product, Knight hit .245/.350/.352 while playing in 556 career minor league games. Ashley Stephenson | Position Coach Year with Toronto: 3 | Year with D-Jays: 1 | Born: Mississauga, ON.

Stephenson is in her first season as Position Coach, after she spent the prior two seasons with the High-A Vancouver Canadians in the same role, helping to claim a 2023 Northwest League championship. Inducted to the Canadian Baseball Hall of Fame in 2024, Stephenson has enjoyed a storied multi-sport career. Initially a star hockey player at the collegiate level at Wilfrid Laurier, she claimed four conference titles and a CIS National Championship, before joining the pro ranks in the original National Women's Hockey League and the Canadian Women's Hockey League. On the diamond, Stephenson starred for Canada's women's national baseball team from 2004 to 2018. She was twice named the team's MVP, earned an All-Star nod at third base in the 2008 IBAF World Cup Tournament and won the 2011 Baseball Canada Jimmy Rattlesnake Award, which was renamed in her honor. She was tabbed as the 2022 recipient of the Baseball Canada Lionel Ruhr Elite Coach of the Year Award after she became the first woman to manage a Canadian national baseball team when she led the women's national team to two wins over Team USA in the Friendship Series then coached Ontario teams at the Women's Invitational and 16U Girls Championships ahead of joining the Blue Jays organization. Became the second female coach in the Jays system, following Jamie Lever.

Jonathan Davis Ast. Hitting Coach Year with Toronto: 1 | Year with D-Jays: 1 | Born: Camden, AR

Davis enters his first season as a coach after retiring from an 11-year professional playing career this offseason. Davis spent parts of six seasons in MLB, including three with the Blue Jays, and one with the Yankees, Brewers, and Marlins. Davis was initially drafted by the Blue Jays in 2013 and made his MLB Debut in 2018 for the Jays. He spent parts of two seasons with the Dunedin Blue Jays in 2015 and 2016, where he played in a career 167 games for Dunedin with 15 HR, 72 RBI, and 38 RBI. Davis played in 2017 Arizona Fall League, where he hit .295 and helped the Peoria Javelinas win the AFL Championship on a team that included 19-year-old Ronald Acuna Jr. Hit the first cycle in Double-A New Hampshire history on June 16, 2017. He's spent the past 24 years working as a pitching coach at the lower levels of the farm system, mentoring stars over the years including Aaron Sanchez, Noah Syndergaard, Joe Musgrove, Jordan Romano, Daniel Norris, and Roberto Osuna. Has served as Pitching Coach under Dennis Holmberg for 10 seasons, also working under current Blue Jays coaches Brent Lavallee, Jose Mayorga, Cesar Martin, Dallas McPherson, and current Miami Marlins Manager Clayton McCullough.

Abraham Lincoln first called VMI "The West Point of the South" because of its role during the American Civil War, the nickname has remained because VMI has produced more Army generals than any ROTC program in the U.S. All VMI cadets must participate in the Army's ROTC programs, but are not required to serve, although approximately 65% of VMI graduates enter the military upon graduation.
