Highlights

Trenton Denholm dominated on the mound (7.0IP, 3H, 0R, 0ER, 0BB, 6K), picking up his IL-best 12th win. At the plate, Kyle Manzardo doubled twice and drove in a run.

End of the Regular Season

Today's Game

The Clippers will send RHP **Ben Lively** to the mound today, looking for his first win of the season (reached 5.0IP for first time in last start). The Saints will counter with LHP **Aaron Rozek**. Columbus is 18-27 (.400) versus left handers this year. Rozek has pitched against Columbus nine times in his career, going 1-2 with a 4.34ERA (37.1IP, 35H, 21R, 18ER, 11BB, 33K).

vs. the Saints

Columbus is 5-6 against the Saints in Ohio this year, producing a 10-13 series record, and has won 56 of the last 94 overall opposing the Saints (512-422 run differential; 17 of 38 losses by a single run, only 13 losses by more than two runs). Individually, **Kody Huff** has hit .298 (31x104) with 6HR and 21RBI in 31G against St. Paul in his career (**Kahlil Watson** has 6HR and 20RBI in 25G).

Keep It Steady

Four Clippers in the finale lineup (**Cooper Ingle**, **Kahlil Watson**, **Milan Tolentino** and **Dayan Frias**) also suited up in the opener, while **Kody Huff** was on the bench and **Ben Lively** was injured (**Ralph Velazquez** and **Alex Mooney** were in Akron, **Kyle Manzardo** was in Cleveland and **Blake Perkins** was in Milwaukee). For the year, Huff and Tolentino were joined by **Steven Perez** as the only Clippers to remain active for every game (second straight season for Huff; Tolentino had a brief DL stint last year), as Columbus used a total of 69 players (73 last year), plus one on the injured list for the entire season (**Aaron Davenport**). However, the Clippers shuffled those players on only 170 roster moves (221 last year), the fewest since 169 in 2021 (averaged 215 from 2022-25).

There's a Chance

Thanks to a pair of shuouts this week (zero shutouts in previous 17G), sandwiched around a 16ER game on Thursday, the pitching staff has seen the cumulative ERA drop from 5.37 to 5.34 (23ER in 5G). If the Clippers allow 2ER or fewer today, they will drop below the franchise high of 5.32, set in 2023 (spent 30G below that mark this year). Last time St. Paul was in town, Columbus gave up 41ER in 6G.

Bombs Away

Despite hitting 2HR in the last 5G (**George Valera** and **Kody Huff**), Columbus still leads all of pro baseball in homers hit since 7/28 (85), entering today with the 2nd most in franchise history (202; club record is 213 in 2019). The 287 runs scored by Columbus in the last 45G (24 in last 7G) are 3rd most in pro ball (leads IL). The Clippers are 25-20 (.556) in those 45G, but 3-8 since the start of last week.

Always On

Cooper Ingle has lost 33 points on his average over his last 33G (.223, 27x121) and 82 points from his slugging, with only 9XBH (7XBH in last 12G), but his OBP has dipped only 14 points (34BB in 155PA) and he still leads the IL in OPS by 26 points (.946). Ingle made it the entire season without being kept off the bases in consecutive games, ranking 2nd in the IL in walks (86) and 1st in walk rate (18%).

Power and Speed

Kahlil Watson is sitting at 19HR, as the Clippers have five batters with at least 19HR for the second time (2019). His next bomb will not only give them five players with at least 20HR for the first time ever, but will mark the third 20-20 season in franchise history (**Milan Tolentino** has done so twice, 2025-26). Unfortunately, he is homerless in his last 45AB (1RBI; hit 3HR with 8RBI in 12AB prior).

King Ralph

Dating to 7/28, **Ralph Velazquez** leads the IL in HR (18, +4), RBI (45, +5) and SLG (.778, +135) and, aside from going 0x21 at St. Paul (7/21-7/26), is hitting .332/.411/.664 since 6/18 (21HR, 59RBI). Those leads held up despite Velazquez missing 7G with a lower body injury (9/8-9/15) and a relative power slump (2HR in 59AB since 3HR game on 8/22 vs. St. Paul; 9BB in last 48PA, 9BB in prior 122PA).

Kentucky Blues

Kyle Manzardo has hit .190/.261/.262 with 0HR and only 4RBI in 10G since the start of last week's roadtrip to Louisville (went into trip on a 19G hit streak: .347/.412/.587 with 3HR and 23RBI). Since 8/30, Manzardo has advanced only one base on 13 of his last 17 hits (HR on 9/3 vs. Iowa, three doubles this week), as his Columbus single total has crept to 65 (72XBH, slugging has dipped from .562 to .532).

Finishing Strong

In his last 22G, **Kody Huff** is hitting .333 (27x81) with 4HR and 14RBI (.593SLG on 12XBH). Huff slumped heavily after leaving St. Paul with an 0x4 on 7/26 (.134, 9x67 in 19G), but he still managed 5HR in that time, as he enters today's contest with 23HR. He reached 80RBI Friday night (scored 80th run on 9/13), becoming the third IL player with at least 80 runs and 80RBI (14G fewer than other two).

This Date in Clipper History

9/20/2011

After giving up a 3-run 1st inning to the Omaha Storm Chasers in the Triple-A National Championship, **Joe Martinez** blanked them over the next six innings and **CC Lee** followed up with a pair of scoreless frames. On offense, **Luke Carlin** tied the game with a majestic 3-run blast in the 2nd inning and the Clippers put up three more in the 3rd. **Beau Mills** capped the 8-3 victory with a solo homer in the 8th.

First Half Wrap

Despite being eliminated from playoff contention on the penultimate Sunday of the first half, the Clippers were 41-33 and finished with their first winning record in the front half since the season was split in 2023 (averaged 32 wins from 2023-25, topping out at 34-38, .472, last season). From 4/22-6/17, they spent every day between 3.0 and 6.0 games off the lead, while occupying anywhere between 4th and 13th in the standings. A late push (15-6 from 5/16-6/9) got them to within 2.5 before derailing with a 3G losing streak at Indy to seal their fate. On the back half, Columbus has posted just one winning record, clinching a playoff berth in 2024 with a mark of 48-26 (.649).

Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 seasons after the move downtown (2009-19), Huntington Park ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game. With the arrival of six new parks to the IL in 2021, Huntington Park finished 4th, 6th and 10th from 2021-23, respectively. The 2024 season saw a return to the top (2.96; 108HR hit by the Clippers, most for the home team in HP's existence), but it dropped back to 7th last year (2.31). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (1,499 to 1,452).

Challenging Times

The Clippers are 202-159 (.560) in pitch reviews, with batters going 102-94 (.520) and pitchers/catchers going 100-65 (.606). They have run out of challenges in 51G and have not challenged in 8G. Last season, they were correct 43.1% of the time (2nd worst in the IL).

Extras, Read All About Them

Columbus is 5-4 in extra innings this year, after having gone .500 in each of the last two seasons. Since the start of the 2018 season, when baserunners started appearing at second base, the Clippers are 55-37 when playing past regulation (.598, best in the IL; no other team above .570), including 27-17 at home (.614; 5-7 in last 12G). Of the 92G to require extra play, 73 have been resolved after one frame (including nine DH games) and only one has gone past the 12th (5-4 loss in 13 on 9/20/22 at Toledo).

On the Runs

Starting with the embiggened 150G schedule in 2022, the Clippers scored over 800 runs in three consecutive seasons from 2022-2024 (855, 808 and 805 runs, respectively; accounting for the 3rd, 4th and 5th best totals in team history). Following a steep decline last season (670, fewest scored in a full season since 2018), Columbus has topped 800 again this year (on pace for 829, would rank as 4th most all-time; record is 898 scored in 1983).

On the Run

On the basepaths, the Clippers are making a run at the franchise mark in stolen bases, with 174 through 145G (on pace for 175SB). The team record was set in 2024 when Columbus swiped an even 200, but the team speed was throttled last year (129SB; still, the 2nd highest total since the Cleveland affiliation started in 2009). However, with 53CS so far, the Clippers have the most times caught stealing of the Cleveland affiliation (2024; on pace for 53CS).

Crazy Eighths

From the 8th inning on, the Clippers have scored an IL-best 196 runs while crafting a .877OPS (over 60 points better than all other teams). On the flipside, Columbus has given up 140 runs from the 8th on, resulting in a +56 run differential (Clippers are getting outscored 327-213 from innings 5-7).

Juiced is Loose

In the Huntington Park Era (since 2009), Columbus leads the IL with 81 grand slams and 2,005RBI (led IL in RBI in 2010, '11, '12, '17, '18 and '22). Collecting an IL-best 10 grand slams last season, it marked their fifth straight season with at least four (118RBI last year; had only 97RBI in 2024, worst in a 140+G season since 2016).

In Big Trouble

The Clipper pitching staff is trending toward the worst ERA in club history, sitting at 5.34 through 146G. Since the reorganization of the minor leagues in 2021, Columbus has twice finished the season with a 5+ ERA (current record is 5.32, set in 2023), after having done so just once in the first 43 seasons (5.08 in 1983). Additionally, the staff is pacing to give up 193HR (would be 4th most in franchise history; 214HR allowed in 2023).

Department of Defense

The Columbus defense is sitting at 5th in the IL this year (.981), following a 2025 that saw a franchise record (.985, led the IL). On 4/10 at Worcester, the defense collapsed for the first 5E game since 8/27/24 (topped out at 3E in a game twice last year and had fewer than 5E in 21 of 26 series). The Clippers have played flawlessly in 82G this season (46-36, .561), after doing so in nearly 60% of games last year (44-42, .512), including 16 straight from 6/20-7/8/25 (longest streak in the IL over the last 20 years).

Good Baseball

CJ Kayfus bunted a runner into scoring position with a single on 7/5 vs. Louisville, with that runner kicking off a 5-run inning that led the Clippers to victory. Since the start of the 2018 season, Columbus is 90-23 (.796) in games in which a run is scored after a good bunt attempt, including a 7-2 mark this season (.778, blew 7-run lead in one of the losses; went 23-2 in 2018).

To the End

The Clippers have the 11th most last at bat wins this year (15, six off the lead) while playing in the 14th most games decided in the last at bat (29, Norfolk has 42). Since the start of the 2024 season, Columbus has played in 104G decided in the last at bat (3rd most in the IL), going 49-55 (.471, 18th best winning percentage; 6th most wins, 3rd most losses).

Manager Profile

Andy Tracy made his Clippers debut in 2021, following **Tony Mansolino's** championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; **Gene Michael**-79, **Joe Altobelli**-80, **Frank Verdi**-81, **Bucky Dent**-87 and **Mike Sarbaugh**-10). This season marks Tracy's seventh year as a manager (first was with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 463-475 (.494), 433-429 with Columbus (.502).
