

Every year, the Quad Cities community opens their homes to players from around the world as part of the Quad Cities River Bandits/Kansas City Royals host family program. These families have helped hundreds of young men adjust to life as a professional baseball player by providing them with a welcoming home for the season as they continue their journey to the big leagues. All players on the Quad Cities River Bandits are either drafted or signed as a free-agent and are under contract with the Kansas City Royals. Host families are not financially compensated but will be given season tickets to come watch their player(s) develop during their time in Quad Cities. If you are interested in hosting a Royals player(s) for the season, please see the details below.

Ideal Host Families:

Committed to the entire season (April 1 – September 30).

Provide free room and board in a safe and clean environment.

Players will need to have their own room and have access to a bathroom, laundry, and refrigerator. If hosting more than one player, two can share a room as long as they have their own beds.

Players are required to provide food for themselves, but a home cooked meal every now and then is always appreciated.

Assistance with transportation may be helpful for some players, but this is not required.

The host family should have their own set of house rules that the player will be required to follow but should be aware that players often arrive home late at night after games or after a road trip.

Why do we request host families:

Players make a low salary and may be promoted to the next level at any point. Quad Cities is typically a player's first or second step in professional baseball.

Due to frequent organizational transactions, some players might be in Quad Cities for a brief amount of time and then leave on short notice. Finding a short-term apartment lease is very difficult and players spend very few hours at home.

Typically, all players are signed right out of high school or college. Host families help players adjust to life as a professional baseball player.

MLB Requirements to be a Host Family:

- 1. Host Families: Players may be housed by the Club with host families that meet the minimum standards described herein; provided, however, that all adult members of the host family are required to submit to and pass a background check before providing accommodations to a player.
- 2. Location: All housing accommodations must be located at a reasonable, commutable distance from the ballpark (15 miles or less).
- 3. Standard Rooms: Housing accommodations shall include, at a minimum, a bedroom, bathroom, kitchen, and shared living space.
- 4. Sleeping Accommodations: Bedrooms must contain a single bed per player, and there shall be no more than two beds per bedroom.
- 5. Appliances: Housing accommodations shall include access to typical appliances (e.g., refrigerator, microwave, etc.). Additionally, such accommodations should include air conditioning, if necessary, based on the summer climate of a given location.
- 6. Furnishings: Housing accommodations shall include access to large furniture (e.g., table and chairs, sofa, TV, etc.), as well as access to smaller furnishings (e.g., cookware, utensils, linens, towels, etc.).
- 7. Utilities: Housing accommodations shall include access to utilities including electricity, water, Wi-Fi, etc.
- 8. Fees/Costs: Under no circumstance may a host family require a player to pay for any portion of the cost for meeting the minimum standards established by the Host Family Housing Policy. Being a host family is voluntary.

background check from the Kansas City Royals. Once the background check is approved, the Quad Cities River Bandits will request to do a brief 5-minute walk-through of your home at your convenience.
