**YESTERDAY:** The Flying Squirrels played the inaugural game at CarMax Park and picked up a 3-2 win over the Altoona Curve. **Sabin Ceballos** brought in the first run with a groundout in the bottom of the first inning. The Curve answered with a run-scoring groundout to tie the score in the second. In the third, **Dayson Croes** drove home **Jonah Cox** to open a 2-1 Richmond lead. Altoona evened the score, 2-2, with a solo homer by Titus Dumitru in the top of the sixth. In the bottom of the eighth, Ceballos brought in Croes with a sacrifice fly to give the Flying Squirrels a 3-2 lead. **RJ Dabovich** stranded a runner at second in the ninth to end the game. **Cesar Perdomo** started and allowed one unearned run over 3.2 innings. **Darien Smith** picked up a win in his Double-A debut, allowing one run over four relief innings. **Cesar Perdomo** started, also making his Double-A debut, and allowed one unearned run over 3.2 innings.

**WELCOME TO CARMAX PARK:** This week marks the inaugural series at CarMax Park, the Flying Squirrels' new home stadium. A groundbreaking ceremony was held on September 6, 2024. The announcement of the name, "CarMax Park," was held on September 4, 2024, at The ballpark is situated next to The Diamond, which was home to the Flying Squirrels from 2010-2025 and hosted Minor League Baseball in Richmond dating back to 1985. Professional baseball was played in that spot dating back to 1954 with the opening of Parker Field. CarMax Park can house nearly 10,000 fans and will serve as a year-round events venue for the Richmond region.

**GRAND OPENINGS:** Richmond's professional baseball teams have now called five ballparks home dating back over a century to the 1920s. In the official inaugural games at the previous homes, the Richmond teams went 0-4. Mayo Island Park, which was later named Tate Field, opened with a 6-5 loss by the Richmond Colts, then members of the Virginia League, to the Petersburg Goobers on April 21, 1921. On April 25, 1942, the Piedmont League edition of the Richmond Colts lost to the Durham Bulls, 14-4, in the first game at Mooers Field. Parker Field hosted its first official game on April 20, 1954, with a 5-4 Richmond Virginians loss to the Rochester Red Wings. The Diamond opened on April 17, 1985, and the Richmond Braves lost to the Syracuse Chiefs, 2-1. CarMax Park's opener on Tuesday broke the streak with a 3-2 Flying Squirrels win over the Altoona Curve.

**HOME SWEET HOME:** The Flying Squirrels are now 10-6 all-time in their home openers, including a 3-2 mark against the Curve. Tuesday was the team's first win in a home opener since 2023. All 16 home openers have sold out, with the largest crowds in franchise history coming in the first home games of the 2018 and 2019 seasons at The Diamond with 9,845 fans. Tuesday's inaugural game at CarMax Park drew 9,585 fans.

**TODAY'S GAME:** The Flying Squirrels play the second of a six-game series against the Altoona Curve, Double-A affiliate of the Pittsburgh Pirates, in the first home series of the 2026 season. The Flying Squirrels are looking to extend their winning streak to five games. With a win tonight, the Flying Squirrels would match their best start in franchise history through five games with a 4-1 record, tying starts in 2013, 2021 and 2023. The Curve are looking for their first win of 2026.

**MEET THE TEAM:** This year's season-opening Flying Squirrels roster including 19 players who have previously played in Richmond. There are nine players who have made their Richmond debuts this season, including **Mauí Ahuna**, **Charlie Szykowny**, **Mitch White**, **Darien Smith**, **Greg Farone**, **Logan Martin**, **Cesar Perdomo** and **Dylan Carmouche**. Each of the newcomers also made their Double-A debuts this season. Of the 28 players, 11 were acquired by the Giants in the MLB Draft, five were signed by the Giants as international free agents, five were signed by the Giants from independent teams, four were acquired via trade and three were signed as non-drafted free agents.

**THE FLYING SQUIRRELS** went 56-79-1 in 2025, which was sixth in the Eastern League Southwest Division. They went 21-46-1 in the first half before posting a 35-33 record in the second half, finishing 3.5 games out of first place in the division. This year, they opened the season taking two-of-three on the road against Erie last weekend.

**THE CURVE** had the third-best record in the Southwest Division last season, going 69-68. They went 30-38 in the first half, which was fifth in the division. In the second half, Altoona finished 39-30 in a tie for first place in the division and clinched the second-half's postseason spot, earning a playoff berth for the first time since 2018. The Curve opened this season being swept at home in three games by Harrisburg last weekend. This year's Altoona roster features three players ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Pirates prospects list, including C Omar Alfonzo (No. 13), RHP Khristian Curtis (No. 15) and 2B Duce Gourson (No. 21). MLB.com's top-30 Pirates prospects list features four Altoona players, including Alfonzo (No. 15), Curtis (No. 22), Gourson (No. 27) and 1B Callan Moss (No. 29).

**FOR RICHMOND:** Right-hander **Logan Martin** makes his Double-A debut. It is also his first appearance as a member of the San Francisco Giants organization. Martin was acquired by the Giants from the Kansas City Royals in a trade on November 11, 2025 for right-handed pitcher Mason Black. A native of Peducah, Ky., Martin finished his collegiate career at the University of Kentucky and was selected by the Royals in the 12th round of the 2023 MLB Draft. He spent all of last season with High-A Quad Cities, going 8-4 with a 3.45 ERA in 22 starts. For the year, he ranked second in the Midwest League in wins. **For more on Martin, see page two.**

**FOR ALTOONA:** Right-hander Khristian Curtis makes his second start of the season. He was the Opening Day starter for the Curve last Thursday at PNG Field and allowed one run over five innings, striking out nine. Curtis was selected by the Pirates in the 12th round of the 2023 MLB Draft out of Arizona State University. He spent most of last season with High-A Greensboro, going 8-5 with a 3.98 ERA in 26 starts. He closed the year making his Double-A debut for the Curve on September 14 at Erie and threw 8.1 scoreless innings with 10 strikeouts. Curtis is ranked by Baseball America as the No. 15 Pirates prospect and No. 22 by MLB.com.

**BIG STICKS:** Through the first four games of the 2026 Eastern League season, the Flying Squirrels have scored a league-best 33 runs (8.3/game). The Richmond offense leads the league in hits (42), doubles (11), triples (3) and RBIs (31). The 33 runs scored are the third-most by the Flying Squirrels in their first three games, trailing only 2021 (36) and 2022 (39).

**DON'T RUN ON RICHMOND:** The Flying Squirrels' catching unit of **Adrián Sugastey**, **Zach Morgan**, **Onil Perez** and **Drew Cavanaugh** combined to catch 74 stolen base attempts last season, which ranked first among the 30 Double-A teams and led the Eastern League by 20 over Hartford (54). Sugastey led all Double-A catchers with 50 runners caught stealing. He set a franchise record for the most caught stealing in a season in Flying Squirrels history, passing **Jackson Williams'** mark of 35 set in 2015 with his 36th on July 26 against Portland. For his career with Richmond, Sugastey's 64 runners caught stealing is the most in franchise history, passing Williams' (2010-11, '15) previous mark of 59.

**TAKE A WALK:** **Diego Velasquez** worked 70 walks last year, which was the second-most in a season in Flying Squirrels franchise history, passing Hayden Cantrelle's 2023 mark (66). Jacob Heyward set a the record with 80 walks in 2019. Velasquez was second in the Eastern League in walks last season, trailing only Reading's Aidan Miller (73). This year, he has three walks in his first two games played.

**TOP SKIPPER:** Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 273 wins in his career, which is a new franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23, 2025. From 2011-2013, **Dave Machemer** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship.

**PACKING THE HOUSE:** In 2025, the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A teams in total (446,679) and average (6,768) attendance for the fourth consecutive season. The average attendance was the highest in the franchise's history. Tuesday's inaugural game at CarMax Park had been sold out for more than a month, marking the 16th consecutive home-opener to sell out for the Flying Squirrels.

**IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS:** In the Eastern League, **Drew Cavanaugh** is first in OPS (.727), first in SLG (1.375), first in OPS (2.102), tied for first in doubles (3), second in batting average (.625), tied for second in extra-base hits (4), tied for third in runs (5) and tied for sixth in total bases (11). **Dayson Croes** is first in hits (8), tied for third in runs (5) and tied for sixth in total bases (11). **Mauí Ahuna** is tied for third in runs (5). **Jonah Cox** is tied for third in stolen bases (3). **Greg Farone** is tied for seventh in strikeouts (8).

**PROSPECT WATCH:** Richmond's roster features three players are ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including **Bo Davidson** (No. 3), **Diego Velasquez** (No. 24) and **Joe Whitman** (No. 25). **Adrián Sugastey** is rated by Baseball America as the top defensive catcher in the Giants organization and **Jonah Cox** is rated as the top defensive outfielder. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features three Richmond players, including Davidson (No. 7), **Mauí Ahuna** (No. 20) and Whitman (No. 26).

## THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

**1954:** The Richmond Virginians made their Parker Field debut against the defending World Series champions, the New York Yankees, in an exhibition game in front of a crowd of a Richmond-record 14,724 fans on a windy and rainy day. In the first inning, Yogi Berra singled for the first hit at the new ballpark, one of his two hits in the game. After falling behind early, the Vees closed the score to 3-2 in the sixth inning, but the Yankees pulled away late for a 7-2 win. Hank Bauer had three hits. Bill "Moose" Skowron and Gene Woodling each had two hits. Virginia native Jim Lemon led the Richmond offense. Hall of Famers Mickey Mantle and Johnny Mize were in attendance but did not play.
