


CELEBRITY FIRST PITCHES



It was surreal, and I feel like even now it hasn't settled in. My life has just been onthe-go ever since. College baseball, draft, marriage, kids, my life has just been on-thego so I haven't had any time to really settle in, but here I am.

BRIAN MILLER

Brian Miller, a native of Raleigh, North Carolina, grew up just minutes away from North Carolina State's campus, but that didn't stop him from dreaming of what it would be like to play for the University of North Carolina.

"I always wanted to play at UNC," Miller said. "I grew up watching them in the years when they were consistently making it to Omaha. However, you have to be really good to play there, so I never put as much importance on baseball."

Instead, Miller turned his focus toward other things. A tri-sport athlete at Millbrook High School, playing football, baseball and basketball, Miller had the athletic capabilities to make an impact anywhere he so chose. While playing multiple sports year-round was enjoyable, Miller admits that it prevented him from being able to have access to the same resources that single-sport athletes would.

"I was what you would call a late bloomer," said Miller. "I developed a bit later than some of the other guys. I never got the same exposure that some of the other guys got that were playing showcase ball because I was playing football the whole summer."

Prior to playing baseball at UNC, Miller toyed with the possibility of playing collegiate football and was initially committed to play baseball for the University of North Carolina Asheville. However, when the opportunity to play for UNC came knocking, it was one that he could not turn down.

"I just graduated and got a job at a Carquest for the summer to earn some money before I headed to Asheville in the fall. I had just got my wisdom teeth out, so I was out of commission for physical activity for a week or two," Miller said. "That's right when one of our UNC Asheville coaches who was not going to be retained put himself on the line for me. He got a

call from UNC saying that they were looking to add another left-handed bat to their recruiting class. Can (I) come do a workout for us? So, I said, 'Yes, of course,' but I just got my wisdom teeth out. So, I haven't touched a bat in a couple weeks, but this is a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity, so of course I'm going to tough it out."

Miller buckled down and put on a performance that would inevitably set him up for years to come.


"I don't really remember how the workout went, but I went, and did it and the assistant coach called me that evening asking how quickly I can get my high school transcripts to him. So, my dad and I immediately went to the school to get my transcripts and I think within the span of a couple days I was in Coach Fox's office. He offered me a spot on the team, and I was there starting summer school. So, I had to call Carquest and tell them, 'Hey, I know I just got the job, but I can't come to work, I'm moving into summer school."

All of these events transpired for Miller within a week's time. And even years later, Miller says that it hasn't all soaked it in.

"It was surreal, and I feel like even now it hasn't settled in," said Miller. "My life has just been on-the-

Miller joined the North Carolina baseball team in his freshman campaign as a preferred walk-on. After leading the Tar Heels in hits, runs, on-base percentage and stolen bases his sophomore year, Miller earned a scholarship in his third year. In 2017, the outfielder collected many accolades, including Third-Team All-American and First-Team All-ACC honors.

Miller recorded his first career MLB hit in his first game after by called up by the Marlins during the 2021 campaign

After going undrafted out of Millbrook High School in 2014, the UNC walk-on turned scholarship player, transformed himself into a first-round selection by the Miami Marlins in the 2017 MLB Draft.

Miller credits his development as a player, mentally and physically, to every coach that he has encounter along the way.

"Every coach I have had has been a huge blessing in my career. Coach Fox at UNC has helped me tremendously in terms of the big picture. He helped me understand the game and learn self-awareness of just being able to look at the game and know how to win," Miller said. "As far as hitting goes, coach Scott Jackson at UNC, who is now the head coach at Liberty. After my freshman year, he helped me really tap into some areas of my body and swing that were not originally there. When I went to play in the Cape Cod Summer League after my sophomore season, my hitting coach there, Benny Craig, was tremendous. He really opened a whole new side of the game mentally for me."

`That tutelage helped elevate Miller's game in the pros. Miller reached Double-A in his first full professional season. Following the pandemic, he played with

Triple-A Jacksonville, where everything culminated with a special moment in Miami.

On July 30, 2021, Miami selected Miller's contract and promoted him to the major leagues. In his debut that night, he hit a single off New York Yankees' right-hander James Taillon. However, after the season was over, he was designated for assignment and ended up back in Jacksonville. While his initial stint in the Major's was short-lived, Miller is grateful for the opportunity and the takeaways that came with it.

"It was just a few days of that awesome feeling of making it and then in a way right back to the grind," Miller said. "I finished the year there [in Jacksonville] in 2021, got DFAed, and last year, grinded it out but didn't get a shot. However, here I am again. I'm healthy with a bat in my hand and anything can happen. Even though I've only had a few short stints in the majors, it has shown me that I have what it takes to compete up there and there's not a huge difference between your good Triple-A players and your solid big-league players. With the talent and skill I have, I know that I can compete and I try and instill that in other guys in our clubhouse."

Bragan Field at 121 Financial Ballpark, which opened in 2003, is one of the premier Minor League ballparks in North America.

The ballpark was the first completed project of the Better Jacksonville Plan. Featuring an old-fashioned design, brick facade and a grass seating berm, 121 Financial Ballpark reminds fans of the days of yesteryear and preserves all of the wonderful tradition baseball has to offer. The vivid sight lines capture the action up-close while providing fans with comfortable seating and easy access to concessions and restrooms.

121 Financial Ballpark features 12 luxury skyboxes, four skydecks, HD videoboards in left field and along the out-field walls, and a one-of-a-kind Tiki Terrace at the left field corner.

The ballpark has hosted three Major League Baseball exhibitions (2006, 2010, 2015), four ACC Baseball Tournaments (2006-09) and two Southern League All-Star games (2003, 2013). The 2013 Southern League All-Star game boasted a league-record 9,373 fans in attendance.

In 2016, owner Ken Babby invested \$1.8 million into the ballpark to add a new groups area directly behind the home

bullpen, a Tiki Terrace near the left-field foul pole, renovations to all 12 private suites and expansion of the suite-level, third-floor lounge to give all fans a climate-controlled space to overlook the playing field.

Since 2007, 121 Financial Ballpark has hosted a game in the annual college baseball series between in-state rivals, Florida State and Florida. The annual installment brings capacity crowds to 121 Financial Ballpark for their storied rivalry.

The ballpark features nearly 6,000 stadium-style chairs and can accommodate more than 11,000 fans with berm and bleacher seating. Has 12 luxury skyboxes and four sky decks, each of which having private seating. Ballpark is also completely wheelchair accessible, including the dugouts, camera wells and playing field.

The total estimated cost is \$34 million, paid for by Jack-sonville residents as part of a tax approved in 2000 to fund the "Better Jacksonville Plan," an initiative to improve the city's infrastructure. The adjacent Jacksonville Veterans Memorial Arena was also funded through the plan and was completed in November 2003.

HOW TO KEEP SCORE



BASEBALL BASICS: HOW TO KEEP SCORE

DIFFERENT FANS have different methods of keeping a scorecard, and many use their own notations. But here's a simple method:


If the hitter grounds out to shortstop, for example, write in "6-3," which shows the shortstop threw him out at first base. If the hitter flies out to left field, write a "7."

If the batter gets a hit, write in the hit according to which base he reached. Each corner of the box represents a base, with the lower-right corner being first.

If he singles, put a "-" in the lower right. If he doubles, write a "=" in the upper right, and so on. For a walk, use "BB" in the lower right. As the runner advances, mark the appropriate symbol in the appropriate corner.

If a runner scores, put a circle at the bottom of the box, and inside the circle put the symbol of the play and/or the player that drove him in. For example, if the No. 5 hitter drives in two runs with a single, mark his single in the bottom right of his box and mark a circle with the number "5" in it in the boxes of the runners who score. (Some people like to use uniform numbers here, so you can tell who did what, even after lineup changes.)

At the end of each inning, total the hits and runs for that inning only. At the end of the game you'll be able to add the innings total to get the game score





MARLINS' EMPHASIS ON DEFENSIVE VERSATILITY TRICKLES DOWN TO JACKSONVILLE

When the Miami Marlins acquired All-Star second baseman Luis Arráez in the January blockbuster deal with the Minnesota Twins, the quick question became where the 2022 All-Star would play; In Jazz Chisholm Jr., Joey Wendle, Jon Berti and Jean Segura, the Marlins already had four other second basemen on their roster. And Arráez, who can also play first base, had a spot blocked there by Garrett Cooper.

Soon thereafter, the club's plans began to become clear: Arráez would mainly slot in at second, and Miami could flip Berti and Wendle to shortstop, Segura to third base and Chisholm Jr. to center field. That newfound commitment to versatility has permeated down to the minor leagues and Triple-A Jacksonville as well.

"We have a lot of flexibility with guys that can play all over the field," said Jumbo Shrimp manager Daren Brown. "Even a guy like Xavier Edwards, who is playing some in the outfield, which he hasn't done before. We're really just trying to put them in good spots. putting them in spots that, if called upon, they would be an option to go help at the big-league level."

Thus, through the first 20 games of 2023, that is how Jacksonville's lineup card is seemingly a roulette wheel that Brown can spin each day. Even with just eight infielders on their roster during this opening stretch of the campaign (mostly playing with six but never more than seven at one time), the club has had four different shortstops and three different first, second and third basemen, respectively.

Individually, Jordan Groshans has spent 11 games at third base and eight at first. Charles Leblanc has totaled seven games at first base and five at third. Edwards has spent seven games at his natural position of second base, with another six in center field. Jerar Encarnacion has registered 11 games at his natural right field spot while also logging five at first base.

"If skip (manager Daren Brown) needs you at second one night, well, you've got to be able to play second," Leblanc said. "If our shortstop goes down and nobody else can play short, can you fill in, yeah, I can. Being a ballplayer, being able to play multiple positions, not being a liability out there, especially, is huge."

Even the outfield contains a different permutation each night. While Encarnacion's time in the outfield has been confined to right field, Peyton Burdick has tallied nine contests in left, six in right and four in center. Brian Miller has also played all three outfield spots (six in left, three in right and one in center), with Jake Mangum splitting his time between center field (nine games) and left field (five games).

The end result is allowing players to learn new positions now instead of on-the-fly like is happening this season in Miami.

"I think versatility for us is huge," said Marlins director of minor league operations Hector Crespo. "Having Xavier Edwards now being able to play center field, Groshans able to play first base. It just gives these guys an opportunity so when that time comes in the big leagues, and it might not be at their specific position. Being that they have that versatility, they can make an impact up there because they've played multiple positions down here in Triple-A."

Perhaps most interestingly is how good Jacksonville's defense has been thus far in 2023. One could surmise that with players learning new positions, the defense would suffer in the process, but that has not been the case.

Range factor answers the question of how many plays a given fielder can make and how much range does a fielder has by dividing the sum of a fielder's putouts and assists by his total number of defensive games played. The Jumbo Shrimp's collective 36.25 range factor (at the time of print) ranks second in the International League and fourth in Triple-A.

"If you hit, you might be in the lineup, but what keeps you in the lineup at the end of the day is how well you play both sides of the ball," Leblanc said. "That's what my focus is on."

As the Marlins have pivoted in organizational philosophies, it only makes sense to grow the minor league farm system with that same message. Clearly, thus far in 2023, versatility and flexibility, are buzz words in the system to strive for in reaching the big leagues.

"I think more than anything, the flexibility that we have, we've got a few guys that can move around, and to be honest, makes my job easier," Brown said. "I'm never really worried about if someone gets called up, we can't cover that spot, because we do have that can play a lot of different positions, and that's a nice thing to have."





DAREN BROWN I MANAGER I SECOND SEASON

After eclipsing 1,300 career managerial wins during the 2022 season, Daren Brown returns as Jacksonville's manager for the second consecutive campaign.

In Brown's first year with Jacksonville in 2022, the Jumbo Shrimp finished with an 80-69 (.537) record.

placing third in the International League East Division. After stellar performances throughout the season, the Jumbo Shrimp saw 12 players from their roster make their major league debuts. Brown also juggled a franchise-record 79 players, including Jacksonville highs for both pitchers (39) and starting pitchers (25).

A native of Holdenville, Okla., Brown holds a 1,340-1,325 (.503) record as a minor league manager. The 55-year-old is currently in his third stint as a Triple-A skipper. He piloted Triple-A Tacoma in the Seattle Mariners' organization from 2007-13 and again in 2019, tallying 494 victories. which marks the most wins for any manager in Rainiers franchise history. Brown led Tacoma to consecutive division titles in 2009 and 2010, and during that latter season, helped the Rainiers win the franchise's first outright Pacific Coast League Championship since 1969. Over this time period, Brown also earned a pair of call ups to the Mariners' coaching staff, including a stint as the club's interim manager for the final 50 games of the 2010 season.

After working as Seattle's baserunning coordinator in 2014 and bunting and baserunning coordinator in 2015, Brown steered Double-A Jackson to a 84-55 (.604) record and Southern League Championship in 2016. He skippered Double-A Arkansas during the 2017-18 seasons before returning to Tacoma for the 2019 campaign. In 2021, Brown managed the Kinsport Axmen, a summer collegiate baseball team in the Appalachian League.

The son of former major leaguer Paul Brown, who pitched for parts of four seasons with the Philadelphia Phillies from 1961-63 and 1968, Daren was selected in the 29th round of the 1989 draft out of Southeastern Oklahoma State University. He pitched for five seasons in Toronto's organization from 1989-93, reaching as high as Double-A Knoxville. From 1994-99, Daren served as a player-coach (1994-97) and player-manager (1998-99) for Amarillo of the independent Texas-Louisiana League. He retired as a player following the 1999 season, which saw Brown win the circuit's Manager of the Year and Amarillo take the league championship, and managed the Dillas for one more season.






