**Toledo Mud Hens RHP Mason Englert (3-0, 3.51) vs. Worcester Red Sox RHP Justin Hagenman (4-5, 5.02)**

**August Finale (Kinda)** – The Worcester Red Sox look to put a bow on a very successful month of August when they play their August finale today at 4:05 pm in Game Five of their 6-game series against the Toledo Mud Hens (AAA-Detroit) at Polar Park. The WooSox have a 17-9 record in August and thus have already set a new club-record for most wins in a single month. The funny (strange) thing is Worcester’s official August record will not be finalized until September 10<sup>th</sup> at Polar Park when the WooSox and Syracuse complete their suspended game from back on August 11 in Syracuse (the Mets led that game, 4-2 in the top of the 5<sup>th</sup>-inning with the Sox batting). As the Boston Red Sox found out earlier this week, suspended games – no matter when they finish – count for the date they started. Today’s game can be seen live on NESN+ and heard on NASH 98.9 FM and the rest of the WooSox Radio Network.

**This Series** – Toledo has won the past two nights to even this series at two games apiece. The Hens won last night, 2-1 after rallying for a 4-2 victory on Thursday. Worcester rolled in the series-opener on Tuesday, 12-2 and had their own come-from-behind win on Wednesday, 5-4. The clubs will conclude Worcester’s penultimate homestand of the 2024 season tomorrow afternoon at 1:05 pm.

**Two Bad** – Worcester’s back-to-back setbacks the past two nights marked the first time they have dropped consecutive games in more than three and a half weeks since they lost two in a row back on August 4 vs. Buffalo and August 6 at Syracuse. They WooSox need a victory today to avoid their first 3-game losing skid in over a month since they lost 3 straight from July 25-27 at Scranton/Wilkes-Barre. Furthermore, the Sox need a win today to prevent their first 3-game home losing streak since June 23 vs. Columbus and July 4 & 5 vs. Syracuse here at Polar Park.

**Still Winners Overall** – The WooSox have only 5 losses in their last 20 games as they are 15-5 since August 7. Despite the two defeats the past two nights, the Sox have still won 3 of their last 5 games, 10 of 13, and 15 of their last 20 games. They are in the midst of one of their best stretches in franchise-history. Worcester is 15-5 since August 7. Their best-ever 20-game stretch was a 17-3 mark in 2021 (August 21 – September 14) and their best-ever extended stretch beyond that was 19-4 during the 2023 season from June 17 – July 20.

**Monthly Dividends** – As mentioned above, with a 17-9 record in August the WooSox have already set a new club-record for most wins in a single month. Worcester had won 16 games in a month four other times in their nearly four years of existence...they went 16-7 in September of 2021 (their best month ever), 16-10 in June of 2022, 16-9 in June of 2023, and 16-11 in August of 2023. This season the Sox have gone 2-1 in March, 10-14 in April, 14-14 in May, 12-13 in June, and 10-13 in July, along with their current 17-9 mark in August with one and a half games still to be counted towards their August record.

**August Moon** – The WooSox are batting .262 this August (217-for-829) with a 4.24 ERA (104 ER in 221 IP). Worcester has hit 27 HR and allowed 22 HR and they have out-scored the opposition, 148-113 while going 17-9 this month.

**Still Above Board** – Thanks to their 15-5 record since August 7, the WooSox (now 65-64 overall) reached a season-high 3-games over .500 on Wednesday (at 65-62). Worcester had not been 3-games above the .500 mark since they ended last year with a 79-68 record.

**The Rest of the Story** – Boston Red Sox **INF Trevor Story**, on the Red Sox injured list since April 6 with a left shoulder dislocation suffered when he dove for a ground ball while playing shortstop on April 5 at the Los Angeles Angels, is reportedly about to begin an injury rehab assignment as early as tomorrow as the potential WooSox DH when Worcester hosts Toledo at 1:05 pm at Polar Park.

Story has missed the last 128 Red Sox games (including tonight) after suffering his second major injury in his three seasons with Boston. He has appeared in 8 games for the Red Sox this season going 7-for-31, .226 with 4 RBI. Trevor, who underwent internal brace surgery on his right elbow during the 2023 off-season, was on Boston's injured list last season until early-August of 2023 when he completed a rehab assignment with the WooSox (where he hit .313 in 10 games with 3 HR & 6 RBI).

The two-time National League All-Star shortstop with Colorado signed a free agent deal with Boston on March 22, 2022. Story is in his 14<sup>th</sup> professional season after being selected by Colorado in the 1<sup>st</sup> round (#45 overall) of the 2011 June Draft out of Irving, Texas High School. Overall in 890 big league games with Colorado (2016-2021) and Boston (2022-2024), Story has a career average of .265 with 177 HR & 534 RBI along with 124 SB.

**Pennant Race** – Worcester had moved into a 1<sup>st</sup>-place tie in the IL East on Wednesday, but losses the past two nights have dropped them back into a tie for 2<sup>nd</sup>-place in the division with Scranton/Wilkes-Barre (both at 30-24) as the Sox and RailRiders are 1½ games behind front-running Rochester (32-23). While a 2<sup>nd</sup> half IL East pennant would certainly be an impressive accomplishment, please note that only the team with the best overall 2<sup>nd</sup> half record in the entire 20-team International League will earn the 2<sup>nd</sup> half title and playoff berth that comes with that to face Omaha (1<sup>st</sup> half winners) in the IL Playoffs from September 24-26 in Omaha. Columbus of the IL West currently has the best overall record in the 2<sup>nd</sup> half at 36-18, although they had their 5-game winning streak snapped. The WooSox are presently in a tie for 5<sup>th</sup>-place overall in the 20-team league in the 2<sup>nd</sup> half and 6-games behind the Columbus Clippers.

**Winning Numbers** – While winning 10 of their last 13 games, the WooSox have out-scored their opponents, 85-41 while pitches have posted a 3.05 ERA (39 ER in 115 IP). Sox batters are hitting .265 during this stretch (119-for-449) with 23 2B, 6 3B, and 15 HR.

**The Countdown is On** - Including today, the WooSox have 8 home games remaining on the season. First up are these two more vs. Toledo this weekend. Worcester's other remaining homestand is a 6-game series vs. Syracuse from September 10-15 that will actually begin a bit earlier than planned (at 4:05 pm on Sept. 10) when the Sox and Mets conclude a suspended game from August 11 in Syracuse (Mets lead 4-2 with the WooSox batting in the top of the 5<sup>th</sup>-inning). After the completion of that suspended game, the teams will play their regularly-scheduled game but that will become a 7-inning affair. Worcester has 21 total games remaining.

**Rehabbers in Action** – Veteran reliever **Liam Hendriks** pitched another scoreless inning of relief last night allowing just one hit on 11 pitches (7 strikes) in the 8<sup>th</sup>-inning as he continues his 30-day injury rehab assignment and his comeback from Tommy John surgery just over one year ago (August 2, 2023). On Wednesday night he worked a scoreless 8<sup>th</sup>-inning (allowing just a lead-off walk) with one strikeout while throwing 16 pitches (9 strikes). Hendriks had his first official rehab outing on August 18 here at Polar Park vs. Lehigh Valley working a perfect 1-2-3 inning on 12 pitches (10 strikes). He made two relief appearances for Double-A Portland last week/weekend vs. Somerset. On August 22 he threw 12 pitches (7 strikes) - .1 IP, 1 H, 0 R, 0 ER, 1 BB, 0 SO and on Sunday, August 25 he threw 19 pitches (13 strikes) - .2 IP, 1 H, 1 R, 0 ER, 0 BB, 2 SO.

Hendriks, 35, signed a two year free agent deal with Boston this past February and this is his 14<sup>th</sup> season in Major League Baseball. The Perth, Australia native has pitched in 476 big league games (432 in relief) with the Twins (2011-13), Royals (2014), Blue Jays (2014-15), A's (2016-2020), and White Sox (2021-23). His career record is 33-34, 3.82 but he has 116 saves including 114 saves from June of 2019 through the 2022 season which led the major leagues. He also has recorded 727 strikeouts in his 650 career big league innings. Liam was named Mariano Rivera American League Reliever of the Year in both 2020 and 2021. He is a three-time American League All-Star (2019, '21-22). He has also been nominated for the Roberto Clemente Award five different times.

In December 2022, Hendriks was diagnosed with Stage 4 non-Hodgkin's lymphoma, a blood cancer that he believes he had been pitching with during the 2022 season when he posted a 2.81 ERA with 37 saves in 58 games for the White Sox. After undergoing eight rounds of chemotherapy – which began in January of 2023 – and four rounds of immunotherapy, Hendriks completed his treatment on April 3 and announced he was cancer free on April 20, 2023. He began a rehab assignment on May 5 with Charlotte and returned to the majors on May 29. He appeared in five games for the White Sox, earning two wins and one save, before being sidelined with a torn ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow that forced him to miss the remainder of the 2023 season and led to Tommy John surgery on August 2, 2023. Liam is hoping to become the first Australian born player to appear for the Boston Red Sox.

Red Sox LHP **Cam Booser**, on Boston's injured list since August 14 with left elbow inflammation, made an impressive rehab appearance for the WooSox on Thursday night allowing a single but then striking out the side. Booser owns a 3.00 ERA (14 ER/42.0 IP) with 42 strikeouts in 41 games with Boston this season, making his Major League debut on April 19.

**Rolling a Seven** – Worcester's 7-game winning streak from August 16-23 was their season-high and tied the second longest winning streak in WooSox franchise history. The Sox had one other 7-game winning streak and that came during their inaugural 2021 season (from June 8-15, 2021). The WooSox club record for longest winning streak is 8-games from August 31 – September 8, 2021.

**Take Five** – Worcester is coming off back-to-back decisive series victories. Last week/weekend, the WooSox rolled over the Norfolk Tides in Virginia taking 5 of the 6 games. Worcester won each of the first four games by scores of 8-6, 12-3, 5-3, and 8-4 (in 10 innings) before the Tides got on the board with their only victory (6-3) on Saturday. The WooSox put an exclamation point on their series dominance with a 13-0 shellacking of the Tides in the series finale on Sunday. Worcester also won 5 of the 6 games in their previous series here at Polar Park vs. Lehigh Valley from August 13-18. The WooSox are 9-8-6 in their first 23 series this season (9 wins, 8 losses, and 6 splits).

**WooSox Batters Leading the Way** – Worcester leads all 20 International League clubs in a host of team offensive categories. The WooSox lead the league with 739 runs scored (Norfolk is next with 710 runs scored). The Sox also lead the IL with 668 walks as they are the only club with more than 600 walks (Buffalo is 2<sup>nd</sup> with 595 walks). Worcester is tied with Buffalo for most hit batsmen at 86 (a new Red Sox Triple-A record). It all adds up to an impressive .369 on-base pct. as the WooSox are the only team in the IL with an OBP of over .360 (Scranton/WB & Columbus are tied for 2<sup>nd</sup> at .358).

**Runs in the Family** – Worcester has the 2<sup>nd</sup> best run differential in the league overall this season at +89 (739 runs scored and 650 runs allowed). Only Omaha (+120) is better. In the 2<sup>nd</sup> half alone, the WooSox are also 2<sup>nd</sup> best at +55 runs (316-261) behind only Gwinnett at +88 runs.

**Worcester vs. Toledo** – Toledo leads the season-series over Worcester by a 6 games to 4 margin including a 2-2 mark here at Polar Park. These two clubs met for closely-contested series in Toledo four months ago with the Mud Hens winning 4 of the 6 games. Toledo took a trio of 1-run victories and a 2-run win sandwiched around a 2-run WooSox win and then a 3-run WooSox victory in the series-finale on April 28. All six games were thus decided by 3-runs or less. After a rainout on April 23, Toledo swept a make-up doubleheader the next day by 5-3 and 3-2 scores. The Sox won the next night, 7-5 before the Hens earned a pair of 1-run wins the next two nights by 4-3 and 7-6 scores. Worcester did capture the series-finale on April 28, 8-5.

**Holy Toledo!** - Toledo and Worcester have played 22 times since first meeting on May 3, 2022 and the Mud Hens have won 14 of those 22 games including a 6-4 record here at Polar Park and an 8-4 record at Fifth Third Field in Ohio. These two teams (in name only) met for a 6-game series at Polar Park during the 2022 season – that coming from June 14-19, 2022 with Toledo taking 4 of 6 from the WooSox.

**Stats vs. the Mud Hens** – Worcester batters are hitting .245 in the 9 games vs. Toledo this season (79-for-322) while WooSox pitchers are 4-6 with a 4.50 ERA vs. the Mud Hens (41 ER in 82 IP). The Sox have out-homered the Hens, 7-5 and out-scored Toledo, 50-42.

**Hit Me With Your Best Shot** – When Eddy Alvarez was hit by a pitch in Game 1 of the August 10 doubleheader at Syracuse he became the 80<sup>th</sup> WooSox player hit by a pitch this season which is a new Boston Red Sox Triple-A record. The previous Red Sox Triple-A record for Most Hit by Pitch (by batters) had been 79 set by both the Pawtucket Red Sox in 2000 & tied by the Worcester Red Sox in 2022. Worcester now has 86 HB on the year.

**One of a Kind** – Worcester had won their prior six 1-run decisions since July 28 until Friday night's 2-1 loss to Toledo. So the Sox are now 10-15 in 1-run affairs this season after dropping 14 of their first 18 such 1-run games.

**Close Encounters** - In games decided by one run or two runs this season, the WooSox are 19-31 (.380). When games are decided by 3 runs or more, the WooSox are 46-33 (.582).

**Paving the Road** – Worcester has won 9 of their last 12 road games since July 28 and have pulled to within 3-games of .500 on the road with their 29-33 away record. That is compared to 4-games over .500 mark at Polar Park this year with their 35-31 home record.

***The Long Climb Back to Even (or better)*** – The WooSox have clawed their way back to the .500 mark (and then over) with their 65-64 overall record this season. On August 6 (at 50-59) - for only the second time in club-history - they had dropped to 9-games under. On July 27, for the first time this year and the first time in franchise-history, Worcester had fallen to 9-games under .500 (at 46-55). Worcester's low point last year was 6-games under .500 when they were 8-14 on April 26, 2023. Their low in 2022 was also 6-games below on May 15, 2022 at 15-21. And their low point in 2021 during their inaugural campaign was just 3-games under when they started 0-3.

***Daydream Believers*** – Worcester has had more success this season in day games (29-22) than at night (36-42).

***Second Half Adjustments*** – The WooSox are 30-24 in the 2<sup>nd</sup> half of the season (the final 75 games from June 25 through September 22) to reach their 2<sup>nd</sup> half high of 7-games over .500. Worcester went 35-40 during the 1<sup>st</sup> half good for 7<sup>th</sup>-place in the IL East and 11½-games in back of division champ Syracuse who went 46-28 and won the division. However, Omaha from the IL West had the best overall record in the first half and the Storm Chasers earned the one playoff spot as first half champs.

***Rankings*** – Worcester is 7<sup>th</sup> in the IL in team batting with a .259 average while Toledo is 8<sup>th</sup> at .258. On the pitching side, the Sox are 11<sup>th</sup> in team ERA (4.89) while the Mud Hens are 14<sup>th</sup> with a 5.01 ERA. Sox pitchers have allowed the 2<sup>nd</sup> fewest HR in the league (127 while Nashville has 125 HRA). And Worcester is 2<sup>nd</sup> in the IL with 1007 LOB behind only Gwinnett (1039 LOB).

***Series Matters*** – Worcester is 9-8-6 in their first 23 series this season (9 wins, 8 losses, and 6 splits). The WooSox are 4-3-4 in their 11 home series compared to 5-5-2 in their 12 road sets. Worcester finished 13-8-5 in their 26 series last season...13 winners, 8 losers, and 5 splits. The Sox went 8-3-2 in 13 series at Polar Park and 5-5-3 in 13 sets on the road.

***Streaks*** – Worcester's longest winning streak of this season was their recent 7-game winning streak (August 16-23). The WooSox suffered a season-high 6-game losing streak from May 22-28 which was Worcester's longest in over a year since a 6-game losing streak from April 9-14 of last season.

***Comebacks and Last AB*** – Worcester has 34 come-from-behind victories this season including 8 wins in their last at-bat of the game and 2 walk-offs. They have suffered 17 losses during the opponent's final at-bat.

***Goodbye to July*** - The WooSox finished 10-13 in July after going 2-1 in March, 10-14 in April, 14-14 in May, and 12-13 in June. This July the WooSox batted .253 with 31 HR along with a 5.05 ERA while out-scoring the opposition, 129-122. Worcester's best offensive month was June (.284) and their best month on the mound was May (4.88).

***June Over*** – The WooSox finished 12-13 in June. The team batted .284 in June with 30 HR – their best month of the year and the 3<sup>rd</sup> highest average in the league in June. Sox pitchers had a 4.99 ERA during the month with 26 HRA. Worcester out-scored their opponents, 160-137 in June.

***May Be or Might Be*** - The WooSox rallied to win their final three games in May and finish the month even with a 14-14 record. Sox pitchers had a 4.88 ERA with 27 HRA in May while Sox batters hit .256 during the month with 42 HR.

***April Recap*** - The WooSox finished 10-14 in April (after going 2-1 in March) while batting .244 with 22 HR. Sox pitchers were 10-14 with a 5.55 ERA with 25 HRA.

***A Winning Tradition*** – The 2023 Worcester Red Sox went 79-68 to post a winning season for the third time in as many years of existence. Worcester finished with a 43-33 home record compared to 36-35 on the road last year. The 2021 WooSox went 74-54 during their abbreviated inaugural season while the 2022 WooSox finished 75-73.

***You Need a Scorecard*** – The 2023 WooSox built on a pair of all-time Red Sox Triple-A records as they made **271 player transactions** during the 2023 campaign and set a new all-time Red Sox Triple-A record for players appearing in a single season. The WooSox used **79 different players** in 2023 (33 position players and 46 pitchers) to better the mark of 75 different players in 2022 (31 position players and 44 pitchers). Ironically, the 2021 WooSox set the previous mark of 72 different players (31 position players and 41 pitchers).

***Two Dozen to Go*** - 25 different WooSox players were promoted to Boston during the 2023 season (not counting Red Sox rehabbing players) including Jarren Duran, Chris Murphy, Brandon Walter, David Hamilton, Wilyer Abreu, Ceddanne Rafaela, and many others.

**PORTLAND SEA DOGS (AA) UPDATE** – The 1<sup>st</sup>-place Portland Sea Dogs (35-19)/(71-52) beat Harrisburg, 6-3 last night. The Sea Dogs have won 24 of their last 33 games.

Mikey Romero roped his second homer of the series while Elih Marrero launched his fourth of the season in a three-hit night. Tyler McDonough went 3-4 with an RBI.

RHP Robert Kwiatkowski (11-2, 3.26 ERA) earned the win after pitching 3.0 shutout innings allowing one hit while walking one and striking out four. Bryce Bonnin earned the hold with 2.1 innings allowing one run on three hits while striking out one. Reidis Sena notched his first save pitching 1.2 shutout innings allowing one hit while striking out two.

**WOOSOX PLAYER MOVES** – None today as of early this afternoon. Including today, the WooSox have made 46 player transactions in the last 20 days.

Worcester has used 75 players this season (32 position players and 43 pitchers). The all-time Pawtucket/Worcester franchise-record is 79 players employed by the WooSox last year.

**WooSox to BoSox** - The WooSox have sent 23 different players to Boston since the season started (not counting rehab players). The list...INF David Hamilton, INF Romy Gonzalez, LHP Brennan Bernardino, INF/OF Bobby Dalbec, RHP Cooper Criswell, LHP Joe Jacques, LHP Cam Booser, C Tyler Heineman, RHP Zack Kelly, RHP Naoyuki Uwasawa, INF Enmanuel Valdez, INF/OF Jamie Westbrook, RHP Josh Winckowski, RHP Isaiah Campbell, LHP Bailey Horn, RHP Trey Wingenter, INF/OF Nick Sogard, RHP Brad Keller, RHP Chase Shugart, C/INF Mickey Gasper, RHP Greg Weissert, LHP Joely Rodriguez, and LHP Rich Hill. Those 23 do not include OF Rob Refsnyder, INF Vaughn Grissom, RHP Nick Pivetta, OF Tyler O'Neill, OF Masataka Yoshida, RHP Chris Martin, OF Wilyer Abreu, and 1B Triston Casas who were all injury rehab recalls from Worcester to Boston. Uwasawa, Dalbec, Heineman, Campbell, Westbrook, Grissom, Valdez, Shugart, and Horn are all back with the WooSox. Rodriguez and Keller are both currently DFA'd. Jacques was claimed off waivers by Arizona and Wingenter claimed off waivers by the Cubs. The rest of those players are still with the Red Sox although Booser is currently on an injury rehab assignment with the WooSox.

**Sea Dog to Woofsters** – Hunter Dobbins was the 17<sup>th</sup> different player promoted from Double-A Portland to Triple-A Worcester this season. The list: OF Tyler McDonough (April 2 & July 31), RHP Cody Scroggins (April 16), LHP Brendan Cellucci (April 24), RHP Robert Kwiatkowski (April 28), RHP Ryan Zeferjahn (May 2), LHP Zach Penrod (May 26), C Mickey Gasper (June 4), OF Matthew Lugo (June 4), INF Nick Yorke (June 5), INF/OF Karson Simas (June 6), RHP Wyatt Olds (July 23), OF Corey Rosier (August 3), INF Marcelo Mayer (August 13), OF Roman Anthony (August 13), C Kyle Teel (August 13), INF/OF Kristian Campbell (August 20), and RHP Hunter Dobbins (August 22 – although he is currently on the WooSox development list).
