Tonight's Game

The Clippers will send LHP **Kirk McCarty** to the mound tonight, looking to pull even with the Tribe in the IL West. Indianapolis will counter with RHP **Steven Wright**. The Clippers are 22-23 (.489) against right handers this year. Wright, a Clipper from '09-11, has pitched against Columbus three times in his career, going 2-0 with a 1.02ERA (17.2IP, 10H, 3R, 2ER, 8BB, 13K).

vs. the Indians

Columbus was 15-9 against Indy in 2019, despite scoring just 10 more runs on the season, 132-122 (more wins, fewer runs than Indy in each of three seasons from 2016-18). This year, the Clippers are again getting beat in the run column (26-20), but have an even 4-4 record. The homer battle is tied at 6-6, but there are no Clippers in the lineup that have homered against Indianapolis this year.

Going for Four... Again

A win tonight would give the Clippers their first four game win streak at Huntington Park since a five game run (8/19-8/23/19) that culminated with an IL West Title. Twice before the Clippers have gotten to three straight wins and twice before **Kirk McCarty** started the chance for four. The Mud Hens dealt him his only loss on 6/20 (8-0) and St. Paul claimed victory in 10 innings (6-4) on 6/26.

Pummeled Pitching

Huntington Park is near the top of the IL in HR per game (3rd, 2.88). Unfortunately, 32 of the last 53 have been allowed by Columbus (152HR allowed in last 79G in the regular season at HP). Last night's completely homerless affair was the fourth of the year and second in a row (last time with consecutive homerless games in HP: 4/17-4/18/18 vs. Pawtucket; last with three: 7/26-7/28/13 vs. Durham).

To the Top

Trenton Brooks will be batting leadoff for the second straight night tonight (primarily leadoff batter in 2016-17; has only one other start since beginning of 2018 season, 6/11/19 with Lynchburg, 1x3, 2R, BB). Brooks batted solely at cleanup for Akron this season (23G) and had not started above sixth for Columbus before last night (hitting .324, 11x34, batting eighth; .236, 13x55 higher than eighth).

Yu's On First

Yu Chang will get the start at 1B tonight, marking his first appearance there at the minor league level (made pro debut at 1B on 4/1 with Cleveland at Detroit, played 26G before option). Chang split 2014 between SS and 3B, then was exclusively at SS from 2015-17 with Lynchburg, Lake County and Akron. In 2018, with Columbus, Chang debuted at 2B on 7/14, beginning his transition to utility infielder.

Take Two

The double from **Nolan Jones** Saturday night was his IL-best 19th of the year (**Oscar Mercado** is 6th, 13). Jones is slugging .547 over his last 28G, collecting 14 doubles, a triple, 3HR (6XBH through first 26G) and only 23K (had 43K in first 26G). Thanks to his current tear, he is on pace for 45 doubles, a number that would set the franchise record (42 by **Kurt Bierek** in 1999; Bierek played in 135G).

Backstop Shop

Wilson Ramos will get the start behind the dish tonight, becoming the sixth different catcher to start a game for Columbus (most since six in 2016; have had two other catchers on the roster: **Rene Rivera** and **Gianpaul Gonzalez**). Clipper catchers not named **Ryan Lavarway** have struggled mightily at the plate, slashing .142/.278/.179 with 0HR and 11RBI (have scored only eight times).

A New Oscar

Oscar Gonzalez followed up a hitless Triple-A debut with a 2x3 game last night (has not gone hitless in consecutive games since three straight from 5/29-6/4). At the time of his call up, on 7/6, Gonzalez was the only player in the Eastern League to rank among the top three in the Triple Crown, placing 3rd in each (.330, 13HR, 41RBI), and he had a hit in 21 of his last 23 with Akron (.383, 36x94, 6HR, 24RBI).

Group Effort

The bullpen provided 6.0IP of scoreless work Tuesday night (3H, 2BB, 8K), marking the ninth game this season, with at least 5.0IP and 0ER (only six such games in all of 2019). After giving up at least 1ER in 12 straight at home, from 5/27-6/23 (62.1IP, 48ER), the bullpen has turned in five 0ER outings in the last six at home (all of at least 2.0IP; last 6G at home: 26.0IP, 2ER, 2-run HR off **Anthony Gose**).

This Date in Clipper History

7/8/1998

Mike Lowell homered and drove in a pair to lead the IL All-Stars to an 8-4 victory over their PCL counterparts in the first ever Triple-A All-Star Game that pitted the two leagues against each other. He garnered the IL's "Star of Stars" Award as the team's MVP. Lowell went on to be named the Clipper of the Year in 1998 and is one of only two Clippers of the Year to win a World Series MVP (2007), joining **Derek Jeter** (2000).

Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 years since the move downtown, Huntington Park has ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game, totaling 2.25 per contest (1,763HR, 783 games). In 2019, HP averaged over three per game for the first time ever (seventh time averaging over a pair), as the Clippers surrendered a record 127HR and just missed out on triple digits themselves (97HR was second highest team total). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (967 to 925).

Deadball Era

The franchise record for homers was destroyed in 2019 (213, +31 from '83), as was the record for homers allowed (198, +42 from '98). This season's Clippers are homering at a rate of 1.13 per game, putting them 24 off the pace of the pre-2019 record (adjusted for 140G). However, on the mound they are allowing 1.33 per game, enough to beat the pre-2019 record by 15, even with the shortened season.

Ain't Over 'Til It's Over

From 2014-19, no team had more come from behind victories than the 210 posted by Columbus and no team produced a better winning percentage when trailing than the .353 of the Clippers (Scranton/WB was 2nd in percentage, .338, and wins, 192). This year has seen the Clippers go 10-29 (.256) in games in which they trail, ranking 10th.

Not Close

The Clippers are tied for the 2nd most losses by at least a grand slam in the IL (16, Memphis leads with 21) and rank 13th in wins by at least that many (8, one ahead of Memphis). That poor ratio has led to a -33 run differential, a figure that places them 10th in the IL (Memphis is securely in the basement at -92).

Get What You Pay For

Columbus was the last team in the IL to play free baseball this season, playing 85 straight games, including the postseason, between extra-inning rumbles on 7/31/19 vs. Louisville (11-8 loss in 11) and 6/26/21 vs. St. Paul (6-4 loss in 10; two straight extra-inning losses following nine straight wins, 8/21/18-7/3/19). The regulation-inning streak was the longest for Columbus dating to the 1984 season (as far back as the day by day records go) and 45 straight to start the season was also a record.

Trending Downward

The current staff ERA of 4.93 is on pace to be the 2nd worst in franchise history (5.08, 1983) and anything over 4.71 will mark the fifth straight season in which the ERA has gotten worse. From 2011-16, the Clipper staff turned in a sub-4.00ERA five times in six seasons (zero such seasons from 1993-2010), including the best two ERAs of the past 32 years (3.33 in 2015 and 3.65 in 2016). The 5.35ERA at Huntington Park is the worst ever (5.29 in 2019, only time ERA has ever been over 5.00 at HP).

Free Swingers

After three straight seasons leading the IL in strikeouts, the Clipper lineup is threatening for a fourth, as they currently rank 6th (530K, 33 off the pace, Charlotte). The 2019 squad obliterated the franchise record, as they struck out 95 more times than the previous high (1,392; each of last three seasons rank among franchise's three worst, totalling 3,979K in 422G). While the record appears safe due to the truncated schedule, this year's version is averaging 9.64K per game.

Night and Day

When playing errorless baseball, the Clippers have a winning percentage that is almost 200 points higher (.560, 14-11) than when they make a mistake in the field (.400, 12-18). After an exceptional defensive run from 2015-2019, in which the fielding percentage was never below .983 and the team never committed more than 88E, the 2021 team is on pace to botch 102 plays (adjusted for 140G season, have not had triple digits in errors since six straight seasons from 2009-14) with a fielding percentage of .979.

One On, No Out Success

When the leadoff batter of an inning reached base in 2019, the Clippers plated him nearly 60% of the time (over 51% only once in the last six seasons, 55% in 2016). Getting more than one base was a specialty of Clipper hitters, as they led the IL with 136XBH to lead off the inning, including 54HR (led the IL, had 28 leadoff homers in 2018). So far in 2021, the Clippers are scoring the leadoff batter 52% of the time he reaches, with the leadoff batter scoring himself 13 times (on pace for 30HR).

Good Baseball

Oscar Mercado advanced a runner with a sac bunt on 6/26 vs. St. Paul and the runner came around to score in the loss (3-1 when advanced runner scores). During 2019, the Clippers struggled in the bunt department, but when the advanced runners scored, they were 7-1. During 2018, Columbus was 23-2 in games in which a run was scored after a good bunt attempt.

International Accolades

Bobby Bradley was named International League Player of the Month for May 2019, reaching base in 24 of 25 games during the month while hitting .302/.374/.740 with 12HR (led IL) and 28RBI. **Brandon Barnes**, **Eric Haase**, **Josh Smith** and **Asher Wojciechowski** were named to the 2019 IL All-Star Team and Bradley, Barnes and Haase were selected to the postseason squad.

Manager Profile

Andy Tracy makes his Clippers debut in 2021, following **Tony Mansolino**'s championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; **Gene Michael**-'79, **Joe Altobelli**-'80, **Frank Verdi**-'81, **Bucky Dent**-'87 and **Mike Sarbaugh**-'10). This season marks Tracy's second year as a manager (first with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 56-75 (.427), 26-29 with Columbus (.473).

Winning Ways:

McCarty began the season with wins in five consecutive decisions, after having never won more than two in a row in his career prior. While he had his share of success in the wins (31.0IP, 10ER), he needed the offense to get him off the hook in two of his no-decisions (came back from 7-0 deficit vs. Nashville on 5/28, trailed 3-1 when leaving start vs. Toledo on 6/15).

Off the Board:

Starting with his last 2.0IP in the season opener on 5/4 at Louisville and continuing through his first 2.0IP vs. Omaha on 5/16, McCarty fired 10 straight scoreless innings (4H, 0BB, 4K). Through his first 4GS, McCarty started 24 innings (retired the first batter 20 times) and allowed a single tally in seven of them with zero multi-run innings allowed. In his fifth start, on 5/28 vs. Nashville, McCarty allowed multi-run innings in each of the first three, surrendering 4HR (career high, 6th multi-HR game). In his next 5GS (6/3-6/26), McCarty allowed one multi-run inning in each, while producing scoreless baseball in 22 of 30.0IP.

Lack of Lefties:

Over the course of 140 games in 2019, the Clippers trotted out a lefty starter just 15 times (**Logan Allen**- 5, **Scott Moss**- 4, **Tanner Tully**- 3, **Sean Brady**- 2 and **Kyle Nelson**- 1), as right handers made 68 consecutive starts from 4/18-6/30. Including the bullpen, lefties accounted for 15.5% of the innings pitched for Columbus in 2019 (191.1IP) and only Louisville had fewer. **Josh Smith** led Clipper lefties with 52.2IP in 2019, a total that was surpassed by McCarty on 6/26 (leads IL with 65.2IP).

2019 Season:

Started the year on Lynchburg's DL with a strained lat... activated on 6/12 and threw 42 pitches at Wilmington (3.0IP, 2H, 4K)... gave up 24H in 16.0IP over next 4GS (10ER)... allowed 1H in 6.0IP (2BB, 6K) at Down East on 7/11, then had a brief stint on the DL (7/18-7/23)... returned from the DL and had 7GS to finish the season, posting a 7.37ERA (30.2IP, 25)... had 10K in 5.1IP at Wilmington on 8/13 (also had 5BB, career high 93 pitches)... following the season, pitched in 6G for Mesa in the Arizona Fall League (24.0IP, 17H, 8R, 8ER, 6BB, 19K).
