The Whitecaps are a Detroit Tigers affiliate in their 28th season in professional baseball, while the Captains are in their 19th year of professional baseball affiliation with the nearby Cleveland Guardians.

### STORYLINES AND HEADLINES

**LAST TIME OUT:** Wenceel Perez delivered a grand slam home run as the West Michigan Whitecaps enjoyed dominant pitching in an 8-0 shutout victory over the Lake County Captains Wednesday morning at Classic Park. Perez becomes the second Whitecap to hit a grand slam this season, as West Michigan drew ten walks, a new single game-high, in the resounding win. Meanwhile, starting pitcher Carlos Guzman tossed five shutout innings with three strikeouts as the Whitecaps held Lake County to a 2-for-8 mark with runners in scoring position. Perez drew a bases-loaded walk in the top half of the second inning before Jake Holton was hit by a pitch, putting the 'Caps on top 2-0. In the bottom half, Lake County loaded the bases with just one out before Perez turned an unassisted double play to keep the lead at 2-0. In the fifth inning, Ulrich Bojarski blasted a solo home run to extend the advantage to 3-0. West Michigan plated one run in the sixth inning before Perez added his grand slam in the seventh, expanding the lead to 8-0. The Captains advanced three runners into scoring position in the seventh and eighth innings. Still, they failed to capitalize, as Andrew Magno, Michael Bienlien, and Angel Reyes combined to strike out five Captains hitters through for shutout frames to earn the win. Guzman (2-4) picks up his second win as Captains starter Aaron Davenport (2-3) suffers his third loss, allowing two runs through three innings while walking six 'Caps hitters. The Whitecaps improve to 21-26 as the Captains fall to 24-22. Perez becomes the first Whitecap to drive in five runs in a game as manager Brayan Peña secures his 150th career victory.

**COLT'S STAMPEDE TO SUCCESS:** Infielder Colt Keith, the Detroit Tigers No. 12 prospect, collected the Midwest League's Player of the Week award on Monday, May 9. Keith hit .407 with 11 hits and 17 total bases during the team's trip to Laning from May 4-8.

**2,000 SECURED:** The West Michigan Whitecaps opened the 2022 regular season with a 5-1 victory over the Great Lakes Loons for their 2,000th win in club history at Dow Diamond on April 8. The Whitecaps finished the 2021 season one victory short of the franchise milestone, but wasted no time hitting the mark in 2022. West Michigan recorded their 1,000th win when they beat the Clinton LumberKings 5-0 in Comstock Park on April 14, 2007.

**BACK TO THE MIDWEST:** The Midwest League, founded in 1947 and temporarily ceased in 2020, has returned as the name of the 12-team league, replacing the infamous High-A Central moniker given to the league for one season.

**PROSPECTS APLENTY:** The Whitecaps hold five of the Top 30 Detroit Tigers prospects, via MLB Pipeline. Players include those mentioned above on this page.

**HEALTH REPORT:** The 'Caps injured list holds six players in pitchers Marco Jimenez, Chris Mauloni & Cleiverth Perez, plus catcher Eliezer Alfonzo, infielder Chris Meyers and outfielder Bryant Packard.

A Top-10 Prospect in the Detroit Tigers farm system, Smith entered the 2022 season ranked as the no. 9 prospect per MLB Pipeline. After being shut down following his selection in the MLB Draft, Smith returns to the mound with the Whitecaps top become the first Whitecaps player from the University of Alabama since Tigers pitcher Spencer Turnbull, who threw a no-hitter in May of 2021, threw in West Michigan during the 2015 Midwest League championship season. .

**LAST START:** Smith enjoyed his best start this season, tossing a Whitecaps single game-high six innings without allowing a run on one walk and one hit and striking out seven in a 3-0 extra-innings defeat to the Dayton Dragons on May 27 at at LMCU Ballpark.

**2021:** Went 2-8 with a 3.84 ERA in 16 starts in a breakout season at the University of Alabama. Struck out 113 batters in 98.1 innings on the mound.

**MORE:** An outstanding athlete, Smith played basketball, soccer, ran track, and was good enough to warrant Division 1-football scholarships before deciding to play baseball at the University of Alabama.

Throws: 4-seam sinker, slider, curveball, changeup

Projected to have plus-command in the future by FanGraphs.

Once drafted by the San Diego Padres in the 18th Round of the 2018 MLB Draft, but did not sign.

Was ranked as the #58 overall 2021 MLB Draft prospect by Prospects Live.
