THINKIN' 'BOUT YESTERDAY: The River Bandits staved off a ninth-inning rally to defeat the Captains 3-1 at Classic Auto Group Park ... Drew Beam completed his second and Quad Cities' second consecutive scoreless 6.0-inning start, allowing just three base runners and striking out a season-high matching six en route to his third win of the year ... Juan Martinez earned his second hold with a scoreless seventh and eighth innings, before Jesus Rios worked around an error and unearned run in the ninth to close out his first High-A save ... Carter Frederick led the offense with a two-hit performance, including an RBI-double, while Trevor Werner chipped in a solo home run, his third of the year.

YOU SHALL NOT PASS: Quad Cities' pitching staff has not only held Lake County hitless with runners in scoring position through the week's first two games, but has only allowed four total at bats with Captains at second and/or third (0-for-4) ... Quad Cities has also had its own issues at the plate with men in scoring position, starting the series just 1-for-15.

FIRE ME UP FREDDY: Including a pair of doubles yesterday and his first home run of the season Tuesday, all four of Carter Frederick's May hits have gone for extra bases ... the outfielder owns a 1.056 OPS and five RBIs through his first five games of the month.

AHOY, CAPTAINS: This week marks the River Bandits' first and only regular season series against the reigning Midwest League champion Lake County Captains and just the second since Quad Cities became a Royals affiliate in 2021 ... the last time the Bandits visited Eastlake was in 2023, when the clubs split a six-game set (5/30-6/4) ... Lake County's last trip to Modern Woodmen Park was in May 2018 for a three-game series that included the likes of future Major Leaguers Jake Myers, Cristian Javier, and Luis Garcia for Quad Cities and Nolan Jones, Oscar Gonzalez, and Ernie Clement for Lake County.

HE GETS ON BASE: Callan Moss enters tonight riding a team-best 18-game on base streak, which is the Midwest League's second-longest active mark (Tommy White, LAN, 19 games) and tied for the fourth-longest in the league this season ... over the stretch, Moss not only owns 19 walks (including a MiLB-high nine last week in Midland), but has driven in 19 RBIs.

ARMED AND DANGEROUS: Through 27 games, the River Bandits' pitching staff has been one of the best in Minor League Baseball ... entering Thursday, Quad Cities leads all full-season MiLB teams in ERA (2.31), WHIP (1.06), and opponents batting average (.182).

IT'S NOT ABOUT HOW YOU START (OR IS IT): Quad Cities' starting rotation leads all of Minor League Baseball with a 1.92 ERA (31 ER in 145.1 IP) and a 0.94 WHIP ... the rotation's 145.1 IP are also the most of any Single-A, High-A, or Double-A club and even more than 23 Triple-A clubs.

PROSPECTING THE RIVER: The River Bandits roster features six of the Royals' top 30 prospects (MLB Pipeline): **Frank Mozzicato** (12), **Drew Beam** (14), **Austin Charles** (15), **Felix Arronde** (18), **Carson Roccaforte** (21), **Daniel Vazquez** (27).

HALL OF BANDITS: Following Joe Mauer's induction in 2024, former River Bandits left-hander Billy Wagner was elected to the National Baseball Hall of Fame alongside CC Sabathia and Ichiro Suzuki as part of the class of 2025 ... the 12th overall pick in 1993 (Houston), Wagner was named a Midwest League All-Star in 1994 posting a 3.29 ERA in 26 starts with 204 strikeouts, just four behind Thomas Newton (1961) for the most in a single season in Quad Cities' history.

A CENTURY AND COUNTING: The 2025 season marks the 102nd year of professional baseball in Davenport, dating back to the 1897 Davenport Brown Stockings of the Northwestern League ... since then, the franchise has been part of nine different leagues, affiliated with 12 different Major League clubs, and sported 18 different monikers.

THE ROYAL FAMILY: 2025 marks the River Bandits' fifth season as an affiliate of the Kansas City Royals ... since joining the Royals organization, 14 River Bandits have made their Major League debuts with Kansas City: **Angel Zerpa** ('21), **Michael Massey** ('21), **Vinnie Pasquantino** ('21), **Nate Eaton** ('21), **Maikel Garcia** ('21), **John McMillon** ('23), **Nick Loftin** ('21), **Logan Porter** ('21), **Anthony Veneziano** ('21), **Will Klein** ('21), **Walter Pennington** ('22), **Tyler Gentry** ('21/'22), **Tyler Tolbert** ('21/'22), and **Noah Cameron** ('22/'23).

MANAGER JESUS AZUAJE

Azuaje enters his 11th season—third managerial—in the Royals’ organization and takes the reins in Davenport after managing the Columbia Fireflies (Single-A) to a 68-63 record in 2024 and the ACL Royals (Rookie) to a 31-25 record in 2023. He spent the previous eight seasons serving as hitting coach in Burlington (2015-2016), Lexington (2017-2020), and Columbia (2021-2022). Prior to joining the Royals, Azuaje spent six seasons as a manager and coach in the Seattle Mariners organization, including a stint in the Midwest League as hitting coach for Clinton (Single-A) in 2009, and as Latin America Field Coordinator for the Los Angeles Dodgers in 2014.

2023-24: Pitched two seasons at Louisiana State University, making 37 career appearances (7 starts) and posting a 4.76 ERA (39 ER in 73.2 IP) with 95 strikeouts (11.6 SO/9) ... named to the 2023 SEC First-Year Academic Honor Roll as a sports administration major ... made professional debut with Quad Cities, tossing 9.0 scoreless innings and holding opposing hitters to a .074 batting average over five relief appearances.

2020-22: Played two seasons at Eastern Oklahoma State College and totaled 89 strikeouts in 58.2 innings (15.0 SO/9) with a 1.77 ERA (17 ER in 86.2 IP) and a 0.83 WHIP as a Mountain-eer ... made nine appearances (6 starts) for the Bluefield Ridge Runners (West Virginia) in the Appalachian League in 2021, allowing just two earned runs in 27.1 innings (0.66 ERA) ... graduated from Owasso High School (Oklahoma) where he played on the defensive line for the football team as a freshman.
