"FUN IS GOOD" FACTOIDS

WOODS RICHARDSON SHARP, WALLNER HOMERS AGAIN IN WEDNESDAY WIN: Simeon Woods Richardson turned in his second quality start in as many games since being optioned and Matt Wallner homered for the second straight game and the fourth time in five games on major league rehab as the Saints evened up the series with a 5-2 win over Omaha on Wednesday night. It was the Storm Chasers who grabbed the first lead of the game when Peyton Wilson singled off SWR in the first, aided by a hit by pitch and a St. Paul error previously. Wallner drilled a curveball 406 feet over the right field wall to give the Saints a 3-1 lead in the third they would not relinquish. Following back-to-back singles to lead off the fourth and allowing a run to score on a wild pitch, Woods Richardson retired 9 of the last 10 to finish his night. He struck out five against one walk. Anthony Prato went 3-for-3 from the nine-spot, including driving in a run on a single in the fourth.

KEEPIN' IT IN THE YARD: Despite facing an Omaha lineup that entered the series having hit the second-most home runs in the league with 61 round-trippers on the year, St. Paul's pitching staff have kept the Storm Chasers in the yard the past two nights. The Saints pitching staff had allowed a longball in three straight games to end their last homestand and a total of 7 in the previous three games leading up to Memorial Day. Saints pitching has not gone three games in-a-row without a homer given up since April 6-9, the backend of a run when the St. Paul staff allowed just 1 homer in their first 8 games (65.0 IP) of the season, an average of 0.1 HR/9 innings. Since then, they've allowed 55 homers in the last 42 games (344.1 IP), the most in the league in that stretch, and are averaging 1.4 HR/9 during that run.

RETURN OF MCCRUSHER: Recently returned from his first-ever stint in The Show, Saints outfielder Carson McCusker is crushing the ball to open the season and currently ranks third in Triple-A in average exit velocity (see below). Despite spending the last 12 days on the big league roster and going 1-for-6 with the Twins, he still ranks t-4th in the league in homers (10), t-7th in RBI (36), and leads the league in OPS and slugging%. On Sunday May 11 vs Buffalo, he drilled a 115.0 mph laser over the left field wall, recording the fifth-hardest batted ball in Saints franchise history. McCusker has the three hardest hit balls by a St. Paul hitter this season and five of the top-10, including three batted balls that rank among the top-10 in exit velocity in Saints history. The 6-8 slugger is the first batter in St. Paul Saints franchise history with double-digit homers before the end of May.

THE MERRIMACK MISSILE: Saints UT Mickey Gasper continued to turn heads with a two-homer game in the nightcap of Saturday's doubleheader, his 3rd career multi-HR game. The switch-hitter from New Hampshire now has nine round-trippers in 22 games with the Saints. With a home run in his next game, he would reach double-digit homers in a Saints uniform faster than any other hitter in franchise history in a single season (see below). With the Saints this year, he is averaging a home run every 11.7 PA, the 2nd-best HR/PA average of any hitter in the minors at the full-season level this year with at least 45 homers. A switch-hitter, Gasper is the fourth hitter in Saints franchise history with multiple homers from both sides of the plate in the same season:

PATIENCE IS A VIRTUE: St. Paul OF Emmanuel Rodriguez has now walked eight times in his last seven games. He now ranks 1-4th in the International League in total walks and 2nd in walk-rate, having drawn a free pass in 20.4% of his plate appearances this year, trailing only Omaha's Nick Loftin (21.2%) among qualified hitters in the IL. Rodriguez's 232 walks the past four seasons (2022-pres) are tied for the 16th-most in the minor leagues. With Rodriguez at the helm, the Saints ranks 4th in the IL in walks (225) and are 10th in MiLB in OBP (.365, 2nd IL).

PITCHING PARTICULARS: Despite some recent strong pitching performances, the Saints have struggled on the mound recently as they've yielded 85 runs across their last 103.1 innings of baseball going back to the start of their last series in Iowa. Since the start of May, St. Paul pitching has produced a 6.38 ERA (137 ER, 193.1 IP), the worst mark in Minor League Baseball since the turn of the calendar page. Despite the pitching struggles, the Saints' team OPS of .840 as an offense is the sixth-highest in MiLB in May, and the best in the International League.

GOING, GOING, GONE: After hitting just 7 homers in their first 12 games of the season, which ranked tied for the 2nd-fewest in the International League at the time, the Saints have touched off for 54 round-trippers in their last 38 games since April 14, which ranked 3rd in the minors in that stretch, trailing only Greensboro (60) and the Charlotte Knights (58). St. Paul have left the yard at least once each of their last five games and in 19 of their past 23 contests.

FORGET ABOUT THE CURVEBALL, RICKY. GIVE 'EM THE HEATER!: The Saints have crushed fastballs this season and rank 2nd in the International League in batting average (.307) and 3rd in slugging% (.494) against fastballs as a team this season. 34 of the Saints' 61 home runs as a team have come against the hard stuff. Some of the Saints' best hitters currently on the roster against fastballs are listed below.

TWINS REPORT: The Twins (30-25) were shutout 5-0 in the series finale in Tampa yesterday afternoon. Brandon Lowe broke a scoreless deadlock with a solo homer off Pablo Lopez in the fourth and Junior Caminero also took the Twins starter deep in the decisive inning. Minnesota went 0-for-8 with runners in scoring position in their fourth shutout defeat of the season. Down on the farm, Double-A Wichita (24-23) lost 10-7 in 11 innings at home. INF Tanner Schobel extended his hit streak to 15 straight with a 1-for-4 day. High-A Cedar Rapids (26-20) leaned on a leadoff home run by Twins NO. 4 prospect Kaelen Cline in the 6th of the season, to hang on 1-0 at home vs Lake County (CLE). Cline, the Twins' first-round pick out of K-State last summer, has hits in 13 of his last 14, a stretch where he's hitting .345 (19-55), 4 HR and an OPS over 1.000. Low-A Fort Myers (21-26) lost 8-5 vs Bradenton (PIT). Payton Eeles went 2-for-3 with a double and is hitting .303 in 10 games on his rehab assignment on the Saints' IL.

LAST APPEARANCE: Started on 16 days rest after skipping two start days due to right shoulder fatigue and despite a limited pitch count, matched his season-high with seven strikeouts for a third consecutive start. After allowing a double partially lost in the sun by Emmanuel Rodriguez to start the game, went on to retire 11 of the next 13 he faced. Recorded the first five outs of his outing with the strikeout and fanned at least a batter in all four innings he pitched in. Threw 19 sinkers (35%), 15 sliders (28%), 13 four-seamers (24%), and 7 changeups (13%). Generated 13 swings-and-misses, including five each on the slider and four-seam fastball. Recorded three punchouts on the slider, three on the four-seam, and one on the changeup.

LATE-BLOOMER: A late-adopter to pitching, Festa did not start toeing the slab until his senior year of high school at Seton Hall Prep. He was initially committed as a shortstop to a Division 3 school entering his final prep season, but when his high school ran out of pitchers during a tournament, Festa was handed the ball for the first time and never looked back. He continued to play shortstop for the rest of the year, but also went 4-0 with a 1.50 ERA while striking out 44 over 30 innings on the mound. He chose to walk-on to nearby Seton Hall University as a pitcher instead, getting a good recommendation from his high school head coach Mike Sheppard Jr, who's brother was the head coach of the nearby Big East program. Festa was mostly a fastball-changeup pitcher in college, mixing in an occasional slurve, and credits the Twins development program for helping him develop a slider, which as become his bread-and-butter out pitch, accounting for 65 of his 166 (39%) strikeouts between the Majors and Triple-A last year.

A PERFORMANCE FOR THE AGES: In just his ninth professional pitching appearance, Festa was a major part of a no-hitter. On May 10, 2022 with Fort Myers, he threw 6.0 no-hit innings, striking out a career-high 11 batters in a combined no-hitter for the Mighty Mussels. Jaylen Nowlin followed with 2.0 perfect innings and struck out three. Hunter McMahon tossed 1.0 hitless inning to finish it off, a 3-0 win.

ONE, TWO, THREE, YOU'RE OUT! On July 24, 2022 with Single-A Cedar Rapids, Festa allowed three consecutive singles between the third and fourth innings. The final two batters of the third inning reached, as did the first of the fourth. Festa got three outs, but did not retire a batter because promptly picked off each of the three batters, one after the other.

THE SLIM REAPER IDOLIZING THE deGROMINATOR: While he's worn the No. 58 jersey for both the Twins and Saints so far in his career, Festa came up through baseball wearing number 48, a tribute to his favorite player growing up, Jacob deGrom. The two-time Cy Young award winner had his most dominant seasons in 2018-19, the summers before Festa's first two years of college ball at Seton Hall University, located about 35 miles West of Citi Field in Flushing.

你好: While attending Seton Hall Prep in New Jersey, Festa was a member of the National Chinese Honor Society... The National Chinese Honor Society (NCHS) was established in 1993 to recognize those accomplished high school students who study Chinese as a world language. The National Chinese Honor Society is a scholastic organization that promotes and recognizes students who demonstrate citizenship, leadership, and community service. A member must be a full time high school student (grades 9 – 12) who has studied Chinese for four semesters in high school with an average of B or higher.

BIGGER, FASTER, STRONGER: Festa's goal in the offseason leading up to 2024 was to add some muscle, so he can be prepared to go an entire season. He said it's sort of tough for him to do certain exercises given his height and narrowness. Last season he was listed at 185 pounds and came into Spring Training in 2024 10 pounds heavier at 195.
