The Lugnuts are 91-67 all-time vs. the Timber Rattlers, 44-25 at home and 47-42 in the Fox Cities.

The Lugnuts went 5-1 at Neuroscience Group Field last year, 3-2 in 2023, and 4-2 in 2022, with zero meetings between the two clubs in 2024 and 2021. Wisconsin has not visited Lansing since 2019.

Today: The Lansing Lugnuts, High-A affiliate of the Athletics, and the Wisconsin Timber Rattlers, High-A affiliate of the Milwaukee Brewers, conclude their six-game series, their only meetings this season. Wisconsin has won four of the first five games between the two clubs, sweeping a doubleheader yesterday to clinch a series victory.

Game 1: Timber Rattlers 9, Lugnuts 0. Josh Knoth and Jose Nova combined on a four-hit shutout, Braylon Payne homered, and the Timber Rattlers used a Daniel Bucciero fielding error to score five unearned runs in the fifth inning to rout the Nuts in the opener.

Game 2: Timber Rattlers 6, Lugnuts 4. Gunner Gouldsmith erased a 4-0 deficit with a two-run single and a two-run double, but Luis Lameda's two-run double in the 6th lifted the T-Rats to the win in the night cap

2026 Twinbills: The Lugnuts have been swept in all three of their doubleheaders this season, previously swept at home on April 17 by West Michigan, 6-4 and 4-1, and at home on April 29 by Dayton, 5-2 and 7-0.

MLB Trade Deadline: Former Lansing outfielder **Lane Thomas** was traded by the Kansas City Royals to the Atlanta Braves in a four-player deal yesterday, returning prospect pitchers Lucas Braun and Carter Holton to Kansas City. Thomas, batting .232/.326/.393 in 97 games for the Royals, played 90 games for the Lugnuts between 2015 and 2016, batting .205 with seven homers.

Good as Gould: The Nuts' most successful batsman this series has been **Gunner Gouldsmith**, who went 3-for-4 with a double and an RBI single in the series opener, drew a walk in three plate appearances on Thursday, and went 2-for-3 with a single, double and four RBIs last night. All told, Gouldsmith is batting .555 (5-for-9), reaching base six times in 10 plate appearances, and has knocked in five of the Lugnuts' 11 runs in five games.

July's Best: With July concluded, the Nuts were led by...

- **Jared Sprague-Lott** posted an .847 OPS, batting .306/.423/.424, with a team-leading 20 runs, 36 total bases, 8 steals and 17 walks in 22 games.
- **Ali Camarillo** hit a team-leading .313, tying Sprague-Lott with 26 base hits in 22 games, drawing 12 walks compared to nine strikeouts.
- **Abel Mercedes** recorded a 0.00 ERA, allowing two unearned runs in seven appearances while giving up just two hits in 27 batters faced.

Against the West: With last night's losses, the Nuts are 14-14 (and 5-12 on the road) against West Division teams this season: 4-1 vs. Cedar Rapids, 7-5 vs. Quad Cities, 2-4 at South Bend, and 1-4 at Wisconsin. Lansing's overall 41-55 record has been weighed down by a 4-13 record vs. West Michigan and 3-9 mark vs. Lake County.

Major League Lugnuts: Nine former Nuts have made their MLB debuts this season: **Daniel Susac** for the Giants, **Junior Perez** for the White Sox, **Eduardo Rivera** for the Red Sox, and **Henry Bolte**, **Gage Jump**, **Kade Morris**, **Joshua Kuroda-Grauer**, **Tommy White** and **Yunior Tur** for the Athletics. Bolte, Jump and White join **Brady Basso**, **Hogan Harris**, **Luis Morales**, **Jack Perkins**, **Jacob Wilson**, **Lawrence Butler** and **Tyler Soderstrom** on the Athletics' current roster, meaning that former Lugnuts comprise 40% of the A's 25-man roster.

Induction Day: A member of the very first Lugnuts lineup on April 5, 1996, **Carlos Beltrán** was inducted Sunday into Cooperstown alongside Jeff Kent and Andruw Jones. In his 11th game with the Lugnuts (batting .143, 6-for-42, with one walk and 11 strikeouts), Beltrán suffered a right knee in an outfield collision. He flew back to the Royals' complex in Florida and never returned to Lansing, making his MLB debut on September 14, 1998, against the Oakland Athletics. A year later, Carlos was voted 1999 American League Rookie of the Year, and was on his way to a 20-year MLB career with 2,725 hits, 565 doubles, 78 triples, 435 homers, 312 homers, nine All-Star appearances, three Gold Gloves, two Silver Sluggers, the Roberto Clemente Humanitarian Award, and a 2017 World Series ring as a member of the Astros.

AUGUST 2 IN LUGNUTS HISTORY

2010: The Bowling Green Hot Rods scored six runs in the bottom of the 8th inning to seize a 9-7 lead, and then closer Alex Koronis retired the first two batters in the ninth. With two strikes, Brad Glenn homered. With two strikes, A.J. Jimenez singled. And then Kevin Ahrens homered as well, catapulting the Lugnuts to an unexpected 10-9 victory at Bowling Green Ballpark. Sean Ochinko finished the game 4-for-5 with a three-run HR and five total RBIs.

2022: Denzel Clarke beat out an inside-the-park home run to left field and Cooper Bowman homered in his first Lugnuts game, but the Nuts were outslugged by West Michigan, 15-8, at Jackson Field. Earlier in the day, 20-year-old Tyler Soderstrom was promoted to Double-A Midland. In 89 games with the Nuts, Soderstrom hit .260/.323/.513 with 19 doubles, three triples, 20 homers and 71 RBIs, departing as the MWL leader in RBIs and tied for first in homers.

What a Year! As a senior at Westbrook Christian H.S., 1) threw four no-hitters, one a perfect game, as a senior, going 9-0, 0.40 ERA, 53 IP, 14 H, 5 BB, 117 K, and 2) batted .515 with .612 OBP, 4 HR, 39 RBII, leading Warriors to 2021 state title (first title in school history)... named Collegiate Baseball First Team All-American.

College - From Tiger to Tiger: Spent three years at LSU, one year at Auburn... ascended to Game 3 starter as true freshman at LSU in 2022, spent 2023 as reliever and was named SEC Academic Honor Roll (sport administration), majority reliever in 2024 (tossing 1 1/3 scoreless IP vs. Tennessee in SEC championship game)... transferred to AU for senior season and was named Second Team All-SEC (first Auburn player to earn All-SEC since 2018) and ABCA First Team All-Southeast Region... led Auburn in wins (7) and strikeouts (95), the most strikeouts for a Tiger since 2019... played with older brother Andrew at Auburn; Andrew had been at Birmingham-Southern for four years, forced to transfer when they shut their baseball program; he transferred in to Auburn for 2025 and blasting a home run in his only plate appearance of the year.
