July 2: RubberDucks 7, SeaWolves 6: Petey Halpin singled in the bottom of the ninth to give Akron the walk-off win over Erie for the second night in a row.

June by the numbers: The Akron RubberDucks finished the month of June 5-1 in the second half of the season and 42-33 overall. The Ducks went 13-13 in the month. Akron batters hit .250/.329/.402 with 23 home runs and 110 RBI. Micael Ramirez led the team with a .375 average during the month. On the mound, Ducks pitchers worked to a 4.25 ERA striking out 224 over 222.1 innings. Akron relievers recorded eight saves with Lenny Torres Jr. and Jack Leftwich each picking up three.

Pitching dominance: The Akron RubberDucks pitching staff has been one of the best in baseball all season. During the final three games in Altoona, the RubberDucks starters took dominance to the next level. Austin Peterson struck out 10 over six innings in his Double-A debut. Parker Messick followed the next night striking out 10 over four and two thirds' innings. Ryan Webb finished the series off with a career-high 11 strikeout performance. RubberDucks starters have now punched out 342 this season. On Saturday, June 29 the RubberDucks shut out the Curve for their 11 shutout this season. These 11 shutouts are second in all of affiliated baseball behind the Rome Emperors (13).

Kayfus keeps hitting: CJ Kayfus has been a hitting machine in 2024. At the time of his promotion from High-A Lake County, Kayfus was one of the Midwest League's leading hitters with a .338 average. In 21 games with Akron, he is batting .333/.433/.667 with six home runs and 23 RBI. Since joining the Eastern League, Kayfus ranks top 10 in average (sixth), homers (second), RBI (second), OBP (fifth), slugging (tied first), OPS (second, 1.100), extra base hits (second, 12) and total bases (fourth, 50). He also has his first two career multi-home run games since joining Akron with one on June 21 against Binghamton and the other on June 26 in Altoona.

Ramirez rakes: Micael Ramirez has been on fire since the calendar flipped to May. On May 2, Ramirez's season average was .091, since that date, he is hitting .330. The red-hot stretch by Ramirez has raised his season average to .273. In the month of June, the catcher led the RubberDucks with a .375 average.

RubberDucks host the SeaWolves: Akron and Erie will face off for the second series of the season and final meeting at Canal Park. The SeaWolves took the first meeting between the clubs 4-2. Top prospects in this series include:

Peterson pitches way to Double-A: Austin Peterson has been promoted from Lake County to Akron. The Guardians ninth round pick in 2022 out of UConn was 7-2 with a 2.44 ERA and 87 strikeouts over 85 innings. Peterson was among the top 10 in the Midwest League in ERA (second), wins (first), starts (14), average against (third-.208), strikeouts (first), innings pitched (first) WHIP (first-0.84), winning percentage (third-.778) and quality starts (first-8) at the time of his promotion. He is the only pitcher in MiLB with 85+ strikeouts and 6 or fewer walks at the time of his promotion.

Messick makes his way to QuAkron: Parker Messick has been promoted from Lake County to Akron. The Guardians second round pick (54th overall) in 2022 out of Florida State was 5-5 with a 3.57 ERA and 80 strikeouts (third most in the Guardians organization) over 68 innings pitched at Lake County this season. Messick was among the top 10 in the Midwest League in ERA (tenth), wins (seventh), strikeouts (second), starts (second-13) and innings pitched (fourth) at the time of his promotion to Akron. His 155 strikeouts since his Captains debut on June 29, 2023, are the most in High-A. The left-hander struck out 216 batters over 189.2 career minor league innings (39 games) prior to Double-A.

Former RubberDucks make MLB debuts: Rouglas Odor (Akron manager 2019-2023) and Brad Goldberg (Akron pitching coach 2023) each made their MLB coaching debuts on Opening Day 2024. Cade Smith (2022-23) made his MLB debut on March 30 for the Guardians striking out five over two scoreless innings against the A's. Chris Roller (2021-22) made his MLB debut for the Milwaukee Brewers on May 15. Johnathan Rodriguez (2022-23) made his MLB debut for the Guardians on May 21 against the Mets. Trenton Brooks (2019, 2021) made his MLB debut for the San Francisco Giants on May 28. Daniel Schneemann (2021-22) made his MLB debut for the Guardians on June 2 against the Nationals. Angel Martinez (2022-23) made his MLB debut for Guardians on June 22 against the Blue Jays. Jhonkensy Noel (2022) made his MLB for Cleveland on June 27 against Baltimore.

Opened the season with High-A Lake County going 7-2 with a 2.44 ERA and 87 strikeouts over 85 innings pitched (14 starts) before being promoted to Akron on June 24. Last start with the Captains, the Indiana native went 8.2 innings in South Bend (third longest outing by a Lake County pitcher since 2005). Led the Midwest League in strikeouts, innings pitched, WHIP, wins and starts at the time of his promotion. Only pitcher in MiLB or MLB with 85+ strikeouts and 6 or less walks. Tied Captains' single-game record with 13 strikeouts at Cedar Rapids on May 29.

2024 RUBBERDUCKS FIELD STAFF

#26 Manager Greg DiCenzo enters his fourth season with the Guardians organization. The 2024 season will be DiCenzo's first as RubberDucks manager, and third as a manager in the Guardians organization. He becomes the 19th manager in Akron franchise history (since 1989).

Prior to becoming Triple-A Columbus' bench coach in 2023, DiCenzo spent the 2021 and 2022 seasons as the manager in High-A Lake County. He guided the Captains to a 141-108 record in his two seasons including a Midwest League finals appearance in 2022.

A native of Duxbury, MA, DiCenzo was the head baseball coach at Holy Cross for 12 seasons prior to joining the Cleveland organization. The Crusaders went 137-109 in Patriot League play during his tenure, including a 2017 Patriot League Championship, and posted 20-win seasons in 10 of those 12 years.

#38 Hitting Coach Jordan Becker enters his fifth season with the Guardians and first with the RubberDucks. In 2023, Becker served as the hitting coach for Lake County.

Becker joined the Cleveland organization in 2019 after a collegiate coaching career that saw stops at Riverside Community College and New Mexico State University.

#50 Assistant Hitting Coach Amanda Kamekona enters her second year with the Guardians organization and first season with [Akron](#). Kamekona spent 2023 as the hitting development coach on the Arizona Complex Academy staff.

Kamekona is the first female on-the-field coach in RubberDucks history. She played professional softball on the PFX Tour from 2010-2011 and the NPF tour from 2011-2019 where she was a three-time National Champion. Kamekona started her coaching career as an assistant softball coach at Limestone College before becoming the head softball coach at Brevard College. She also has head coaching stops at Bishop Amat High School and CA Bombers Fastpitch.

#48 Pitching Coach Cody Buckel enters his sixth season in the Guardians organization and first season with the RubberDucks. Prior to coming to Akron, Buckel was the pitching strategist for the Columbus Clippers for the 2022 and 2023 seasons.

After starting his coaching career as a pitching coach in the Seattle Mariners organization, Buckel has spent time in the both the dugout and front office for Cleveland serving as the pitching resource coordinator and assistant director of pitching development before joining the Clippers field staff in 2022.

#32 Assistant Pitching Coach Michael Poole enters his second season in the Guardians organization and first season with the RubberDucks. Prior to joining the RubberDucks, Poole was the pitching development coach on the Arizona Complex Academy staff.

A native of Akron, Poole played at Cuyahoga Community College and Lake Erie College before starting his coaching career at Inspiration Academy (FL) in 2019. Poole was an assistant coach at LSU-Eunice for the Bengals D2 JUCO World Series Championship season in 2021.

#28 Bench Coach Kyle Lindquist enters his fifth season in the Guardians organization and first season in Akron. Prior to coming to Akron, Lindquist spent 2023 as the bench coach for Lake County.

A native of Columbus, Lindquist played at Marietta College (Ohio) and was a three-time All-OAC selection, 2012 All-American and member of the back-to-back National Championship teams in 2011 and 2012. After starting his coaching career at Marietta, Lindquist spent five seasons as an assistant coach at Denison University and one season at Davidson before joining the Cleveland organization.

#45 Bullpen Coach Seth Caddell enters his first season as a coach in the Guardians organization after spending the last three seasons as a catcher in the Cleveland organization. Signed out of East Carolina, Caddell last played for the RubberDucks in 2023.

Athletic Trainer Derrik Diaz enters his seventh season in the Guardians organization and first season with the RubberDucks. Prior to coming to Akron, Diaz served as the head athletic trainer for the Dominican Republic Complex in 2023. Named the 2021 PBATS Athletic Trainer of the Year for the Dominican Summer League. Also serves as the Assistant DR Medical Coordinator.

Assistant Athletic Trainer Karina Gonzalez enters her second season in the Guardians organization and first season in [Akron](#). Prior to joining the RubberDucks, Gonzalez served as an athletic trainer at the Arizona Complex. Gonzalez graduated from Sonoma State University (CA) in 2012 with a degree in kinesiology and earned a Master's degree in athletic training from Thomas Jefferson University (PA) in 2020. She earned a doctorate in athletic training from Indiana State University in 2022.

Strength and Conditioning Coach Mo Cuevas enters his ninth season with the Guardians organization and second season in Akron. Prior to joining the RubberDucks, Cuevas served as the rehab strength and conditioning coach in 2022. Earned a Bachelors and Master's degree in Exercise Science at East Stroudsburg University.

Tech Assistant Henry Haracz enters his first season in Akron after spending last season in Lake County.

We Are the RubberDucks

On October 29, 2013, team owner **Ken Babby** and general manager **Jim Pfander** stood before a capacity audience at the Akron Civic Theater and announced that the team would be known henceforth as the **Akron RubberDucks**. In addition to being symbolic of the fun, family-friendly brand of entertainment offered by minor league baseball, the name also honors Akron's long history as the "**Rubber Capital of the World.**" Brandiose Marketing of San Diego, California designed the team logo, colors, and various marks and insignias. Please note that for print coverage, *RubberDucks* is spelled as one word with a capital "D." In broadcast coverage, referring to the team as "*the 'Ducks*" is an acceptable variation of the team's nickname.
