Aviators vs. Aces: The Las Vegas Aviators professional baseball team, Triple-A affiliate of the Oakland Athletics, will face intrastate rival, the Reno Aces, Triple-Affiliate of the Arizona Diamondbacks, tonight in game four of the six-game series in Pacific Coast League action at Greater Nevada Field $(9,154)$...Las Vegas is $2-1$ in the series...the road trip against Reno will conclude on Sunday afternoon...following a PCL off day (Monday, July 29), the Aviators will host the Albuquerque Isotopes, Triple-A affiliate of the Colorado Rockies, in a six-game series from Tuesday-Sunday, July 30 - August 4...Las Vegas will then travel to Salt Lake from August 6-11.

Reno defeats Las Vegas 12-3 in game three of series:
The Aces defeated the Aviators 12-3 last night in game three of the six-game road trip before a crowd of 4,063 at Greater Nevada Field.
Las Vegas Offense: The Aviators recorded 10 hits and stranded six runners on base. Left fielder Colby Thomas was 3 -for-4, double, RBI. Designated hitter Jordan Díaz was 2 -for-4, double, RBI and right fielder Ryan Noda was 2 -for4, solo home run in the eighth inning.
Reno Offense: The Aces recorded 11 hits and stranded six runners on base. Reno scored 11 runs in the second inning to take a 11-1 lead. Left fielder Kyle Garlick was 3 -for-4, walk, 2 RBI, two runs scored. Shortstop Blaze Alexander was 2 -for- 5 , double, RBI, two runs scored and catcher Ronaldo Hernández (1-for-4, 5 RBI) hit a grand slam.
Aviators Starting Pitching: Left-hander Austin Briggs suffered the loss. He pitched 1.2 innings and allowed 2 hits, 6 runs and walked 4 on 42 pitches ( 16 strikes).
Aviators Bullpen: Right-hander Adrián Martínez pitched 2.1 innings and allowed 6 hits, 6 runs ( 5 earned), walked 1 and struck out 2. Right-hander Jack Cushing pitched 2.0 scoreless innings and allowed 2 hits and struck out 3 . Righthander Pedro Santos pitched 2.0 scoreless innings and allowed 1 hit and struck out 1 .

Salt Lake defeats Las Vegas 9-8 in 10 innings in series finale (Sunday, July 21): The Bees defeated the Aviators 98 in 10 innings in the finale of the three-game homestand before a crowd of 5,495 at Las Vegas Ballpark.
Las Vegas Offense: The Aviators recorded 10 hits and rallied from a 7-0 deficit to force extra innings. Catcher Carlos Pérez was 2 -for-4, double, HR, 3 RBI. First baseman Armando Alvarez was 2 -for-3, walk, solo home run; shortstop Darell Hernaiz (ML rehab) was 2 -for-3, run scored and left fielder Colby Thomas was 1 -for-2, solo home run.
Salt Lake Offense: The Bees recorded 11 hits and stranded 14 runners on base. Second baseman Jack López was 3-for-6, 2 RBI, two runs scored. Third baseman Michael Stefanic was 3 -for-6, double, stolen base, run scored and right fielder D'Shawn Knowles was 2-for-5, run scored.

Las Vegas defeats Reno 13-12 in 10 innings in series opener (Tuesday, July 23): The Aviators defeated the Aces 13-12 in 10 innings in the opener of the six-game road trip before a crowd of 3,143 at Greater Nevada Field.
Las Vegas Offense: The Aviators recorded 18 hits and stranded 11 runners on base. Las Vegas built a 12-4 lead after $21 / 2$ innings. Six players recorded multiple-hit games: Left fielder Armando Alvarez was 3 -for- 6 , two doubles, HR, 4 RBI, four runs scored. Designated hitter 3-for-5, double, walk, 3 RBI; shortstop Darell Hernaiz (ML rehab) was 3-for-5, double, stolen base, RBI, two runs scored and third baseman Nick Allen was 3 -for-5, walk, RBI.

Las Vegas Offense: The Aviators recorded 9 hits and stranded 11 runners on base. Third baseman Armando Alvarez was 2 -for-5, stolen base, RBI. Center fielder Hoy Park was 1 -for-3, double, walk run scored; second baseman Nick Allen was 1 -for-4, walk, 2 RBI, run scored and left fielder Colby Thomas was 1 -for-4, walk, double, run scored.

AVIATORS INFLIGHT NEWS - Las Vegas is 2-1 in the series against Reno...the Northern Nevada six-game road trip against intrastate rival, the Aces, Triple-A affiliate of the Arizona Diamondbacks, will conclude on Sunday afternoon...Reno and Las Vegas will play each other a total of 21 times in 2024... 51 games are remaining on the 2024 season (24-home; 27-away)...following the road trip, Las Vegas will then host the Albuquerque Isotopes, Triple-A affiliate of the Colorado Rockies, in a six-game series from Tuesday-Sunday, July 30 - August 4 ...the 2024 season will feature six-game series from Tuesday-Sunday and off days on Mondays...the '24 campaign will feature 149 games ( 75 -home; 74-away).

NOTE: The Triple-A season will be split in two halves, with the first half concluded on Sunday, June 23...the second half began on Tuesday, June 25...the first-half winners (PCL and International League) will serve as the hosts of the pair of best-of-three League Championship Series against the second-half winner from September 24-26...the Triple-A National Championship Game, which will follow the best-of-three LCS of the two leagues, will crown an overall winner of the highest level of the Minor Leagues...the winners of the IL and PCL will meet in a single-game format on Saturday, September 28 at Las Vegas Ballpark (Time, TBA)...Sugar Land Space Cowboys won the first half in the PCL (49-26, .653) and the Omaha Storm Chasers, won the first half in the IL (Triple-A best record of 49-24, .671).

2024 PCL PITCHER OF THE WEEK: Right-hander Osvaldo Bido from April 29 - May 5 (defeated Reno on May 2 at Las Vegas Ballpark: season-high 7.0 shutout innings, two hits, one walk, eight strikeouts).

2024 PCL PLAYERS OF THE WEEK: Outfielder Daz Cameron from April 29 - May 5...appeared in seven games vs. Reno and batted .591 (13-for-22) with five doubles, triple, home run, five walks, two stolen bases and 10 RBI...recorded four straight multiple-hit games...Outfielder Seth Brown from June 17-23...appeared in four games against Tacoma and batted .444 ( 8 -for-18) with two doubles, three home runs, 7 RBI, seven runs scored
$41^{\text {st }}$ SEASON IN THE SILVER STATE (1983-2024) - The Aviators are playing in their $41^{\text {st }}$ season ( $42^{\text {nd }}$ calendar season) in the Silver State as a proud member of the Pacific Coast League...the Las Vegas Aviators have the proud distinction of being Nevada's longest enduring professional sports franchise...Las Vegas Triple-A baseball was born on April 10, 1983 before a sellout crowd of 10,622 at Cashman Field (Las Vegas defeated Salt Lake City, 11-8)...catcher Bruce Bochy has the distinction of hitting the first Triple-A home run in Cashman Field history for the Las Vegas Stars on April 10, 1983.

PACFIC COAST LEAGUE: The PCL is in its $121^{\text {st }}$ season (1903-2020, 2022 -) and consists of two divisions for a total of 10 teams. West Division: Las Vegas Aviators, Reno Aces, Sacramento River Cats, Salt Lake Bees, Tacoma Rainiers; East Division: Albuquerque Isotopes, El Paso Chihuahuas, Oklahoma City Baseball Club, Round Rock Express, Sugar Land Space Cowboys. The 10-team league in 2021 was named Triple-A West and returned as the PCL in 2022!

INTERNATIONAL LEAGUE: The IL consists of two divisions for a total of 20 teams. East Division: Buffalo Bisons, Charlotte Knights, Durham Bulls, Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp, Lehigh Valley IronPigs, Norfolk Tides, Rochester Red Wings, Scranton/Wilkes-Barre RailRiders, Syracuse Mets, Worcester Red Sox. West Division: Columbus Clippers, Gwinnett Stripers, Indianapolis Indians, Iowa Cubs, Louisville Bats, Memphis Redbirds, Nashville Sounds, Omaha Storm Chasers, St. Paul Saints, Toledo Mud Hens. The 20-team league in 2021 was named Triple-A East and returned as the IL in 2022.

2023 SEASON - The Aviators compiled an overall record of 75-74 (.503) and finished in third place in the PCL West Division. The Reno Aces captured the West Division with an overall record of 88-62 (.587). Oklahoma City baseball club recorded the best record ( $90-58$, .608) in the 10-team PCL and defeated the Round Rock Express, 2-games-to-0 to capture the PCL Championship. The Norfolk Tides defeated OKC, 7-6, in the Triple-A National Championship game on September 30 before a sellout crowd of 8,556 at Las Vegas Ballpark.

2022 SEASON - The Aviators compiled an overall record of 71-79 (.473) and finished in third place in the PCL West Division. The Reno Aces captured the West Division with an overall record of $85-63$ (.574). The Aces captured the PCL championship and defeated the El Paso Chihuahuas, Triple-A affiliate of the San Diego Padres, 6-2, on September 30 in the inaugural Triple-A Triple Championship Weekend at Las Vegas Ballpark. The Durham Bulls, Triple-A affiliate off the Tampa Bay Rays, captured the Triple-A National Championship and defeated Reno, 10-6, on October 2 at Las Vegas Ballpark. The Bulls defeated the Nashville Sounds, Triple-A affiliate of the Milwaukee Brewers, 13-0, to capture the IL championship on October 1 at Las Vegas Ballpark.

LAS VEGAS 80-WIN SEASONS - The Las Vegas franchise has won 80 or more games in a season six times: 85 (2002, franchise best $85-59$ record (.590); 83 (1983 inaugural season, $83-60$ (.580); 83 ( $83-57, .593$ in 2019); 81 (81-63, . 563 in 2013); 81 (81-63, .563 in 2014); 80 (1986 PCL champions with an $80-62$ mark (.563)...Las Vegas recorded back-to-back 80 -win seasons for the first time in franchise history (2013 \& 2014)...the 83-57 record in 2019 marked a single-season franchise record for winning percentage at .593 (140-game season).

LAS VEGAS BALLPARK HISTORY: Howard Hughes Holdings Inc. (NYSE: HHH) announced on October 10, 2017 its plans to develop and construct a baseball stadium in Downtown Summerlin® on approximately eight acres just south of City National Arena, the National Hockey League practice facility for the Vegas Golden Knights. The announcement on October 10, followed a vote by the Las Vegas Convention and Visitors Authority Board of Directors approving a marketing partnership that gives LVCVA naming rights to the stadium. The Las Vegas Ballpark was designed by HOK, a global architecture firm with an expertise in stadium design and constructed by HUNT/PENTA.

The groundbreaking ceremony took place on Friday, February 23, 2018 before a crowd of several hundred people!
The 8,196 -fan-capacity stadium blends the distinct architectural style of the Summerlin® community with the aviation legacy of Howard Hughes. The ballpark provides a wide range of seating options including 22 suites, club seats, berm seating, party zones and decks, picnic tables, kids' zone, bars and even a pool beyond the outfield wall.
Designed to create a festival-like atmosphere in Downtown Summerlin, the site is landscaped to complement the master planned community. Parking is conveniently located on adjacent sites.
The grand opening took place on Tuesday, April 9, 2019 before a sellout crowd of 11,036 and the Aviators defeated Sacramento, 10-2.

LAS VEGAS AVIATORS LOGO AND INFORMATION: Howard Hughes Holdings Inc. (NYSE: HHH), owner of the city's professional Triple-A baseball team of the Pacific Coast League, and developer of the Summerlin® master planned community and the Las Vegas Ballpark® located at Downtown Summerlin®, announced on December 8, 2018 the team's new name - the Las Vegas Aviators $®_{\text {B }}$.
The name change completed a rebrand that included the team's new two-year Player Development Contract (PDC) with the Oakland Athletics (2018) and the opening of the Las Vegas Ballpark, the state-of-the-art Triple-A baseball stadium, that now serves as the home of the Aviators.
The name change (from $51^{s}$ ) pays homage to the company's namesake, Howard R. Hughes, Jr., one of the twentieth century's most successful businessmen whose passion for aviation and legacy of innovation includes significant aviationrelated firsts and accomplishments. In the $\mathrm{H}-1$ Racer, a plane he designed and built, Hughes set the land speed record of 352 miles per hour in 1935. Hughes went on to set other records, including the fastest coast-to-coast flight in 1937 and the fastest circumnavigation of the globe in 1938, then acquiring and successfully operating major airlines and aviation companies.

Aviators on Radio in 2024: Russ Langer will broadcast the 149 games on Raider Nation Radio 920 AM (selected games on Fox Sports 1340 AM and 98.9 FM) on www.aviatorslv.com. Langer is in his $24^{\text {th }}$ season broadcasting baseball to the Las Vegas Valley and 37th year overall in the business....over his career, Langer has received numerous awards, including being named 1993 Minor League Broadcaster of the Year by the National Association of Professional Baseball Leagues....in 1995 and 2016, he broadcast the Triple-A All-Star game; in 1999, he was named the New Mexico Sportscaster of the Year; and in 2002, he was named Minor League Broadcaster of the Year by Minor League News.com...Langer also is a 12 -time recipient ( 13 overall and seven consecutive years from 2007-13) of the Nevada Sportscaster of the Year award (2003, 2005, 2007, 2008, 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2015, 2021, 2023), which is presented by the National Sports Media Association (NSMA)...Langer's inaugural season in Las Vegas was in 2000, the final year the franchise was known as the Stars....prior to arriving in Las Vegas, Langer called Pacific Coast League games for the Albuquerque Dukes (1996-99) and Phoenix Firebirds (1992-95)...began his broadcasting career with Single-A Springfield Cardinals in 1987 and 1989, sandwiched around a year in Vero Beach (1988)...moved up the ranks to DoubleA, calling games for the Midland Angels in 1990 and ' 91 before advancing to Triple-A Phoenix....he realized his longtime goal of broadcasting Major League baseball when he worked a total of 30 Montreal Expos games during the 2003 and 2004 seasons, followed by nine games for the Baltimore Orioles in $2006 \ldots$ has also broadcast selected spring training games for the Los Angeles Dodgers (2006-08), Toronto Blue Jays (2009-10) and Chicago White Sox (2012-20)...on April 6, 2023, marked his $3,000^{\text {th }}$ broadcast for the Triple-A Las Vegas Stars/51s/Aviators franchise...also in 2023, Langer completed his 12th season as the radio play-by-play voice for the UNLV football team on the UNLV Sports Properties/ Learfield Network.

Matt Neverett will also serve as the play-by-play voice for home games and selected road games...in his fifth season with the Aviators, and his fourth in the broadcast booth....he returned to his birthplace of Las Vegas in 2020 after spending two years with the Bradenton Marauders, Single-A Affiliate of the Pittsburgh Pirates, as the play-by-play broadcaster and media relations director...after graduating from Appalachian State University in Boone, NC in 2017, he spent one season
with the Birmingham Barons, Double-A Affiliate of the Chicago White Sox, as a media relations manager and pre/post game host...also broadcast selected UNLV Runnin' Rebel basketball games, UNLV baseball and UNLV football on SSSEN...on July 10, he was named the radio play-by-play broadcaster for UNLV football for the 2024 season...his father, Tim, is a former play-by-play voice of the Las Vegas $51^{\text {s }}$ and current play-by-play voice of the Los Angeles Dodgers.
