YESTERDAY: The Flying Squirrels lost a five-run lead and fell to the SeaWolves, 8-7. Turner Hill opened the scoring with an RBI single in the first, but Max Anderson tied the score with a solo homer in the bottom of the inning. In the fourth, Dayson Croes hit an RBI single and Aeverson Arteaga singled in two for a 4-1 Richmond lead. Croes added a two-run single in the fifth to open a 6-1 lead. In the bottom of the sixth, Josue Briceño hit a two-run homer. Two pitches later, Jake Holton hit a solo homer and on the next pitch Chris Meyers homered to cut the lead to 6-5. Shane Rademacher held Erie to one run in his first five innings before allowing the three homers in the sixth. The four homers allowing in the game by Rademacher were a single-game franchise record. Holton tied the game with a single in the seventh, but Carter Howell moved the Flying Squirrels ahead, 7-6, in the top of the eighth with an RBI double. Danny Serretti tied the score with a single in the eighth and later scored the go-ahead run on a wild pitch. Manuel Mercedes was charged with his 13th loss of the season, a new team record.

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels play the fourth of a six-game series against the Erie SeaWolves, Double-A affiliate of the Detroit Tigers. This is the third and final series between the two teams this year. The Flying Squirrels went 2-4 against the Sea-Wolves at The Diamond from May 13-18. They also went 2-4 at UPMC Park from June 3-8.

PACKING THE HOUSE: Last year, the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A teams in average (6,595) and total (435,295) attendance. Among the 120 MiLB teams, the Flying Squirrels were 10th in average attendance. It was the third straight year the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A clubs in average and total attendance, which had not been done prior to 2022. Last year's total attendance is the highest since 2013 (434,769) and the fourth-highest average in team history. April 4 marked the 15th consecutive Opening Night sellout, marking every home opener in franchise history to date. This year, the Flying Squirrels are averaging 6,556 fans per home game, which ranks seventh among all 120 MiLB clubs. Their average of 7,290 in the season's first month was the highest April attendance in franchise history.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS are in second place in the Southwest Division second-half standings, 2.5 games behind Altoona. Last week, they dropped four of six at Somerset. It was their second straight series loss after winning their previous three series. After going 10-2 from July 4-20, they are 5-9 in their last 14 games since July 22. Of Richmond's 63 losses this season, 36 of them have been by two runs or less (23 by one, 13 by two). Their 23 one-run losses are tied for the most in the EL, even with Reading. Richmond's +13 run differential in the second half is third-best in the league.

THE SEAWOLVES won the Southwest Division first-half title to clinch their fourth consecutive postseason appearance. They are in third place in the division's second-half standings. Erie split last week's series at Akron, winning three straight from Thursday through Saturday before dropping the finale on Sunday. The Erie offense leads the Eastern League in batting average (.260), runs (542), hits (898), total bases (1438), doubles, (202), RBIs (498), OBP (.348), SLG (.417) and OPS (.765). The Erie pitching staff is second in the EL in ERA (3.29). Erie's roster features seven of Baseball America's top-30 Tigers prospects, including SS/2B Kevin McGonigle (No. 1), OF Max Clark (No. 2), C Thayron Liranzo (No. 4), C Josue Briceño (No. 5), RHP Jaden Hamm (No. 7), 2B Max Anderson (No. 13) and OF Justice Bigbie (No. 27). There are also four players on Baseball America's top-100 prospects list, including McGonigle (No. 2), Clark (No. 9), Liranzo (No. 69) and Briceño (No. 75). MLB.com's top 30 Tigers prospects list features nine Erie players, including McGonigle (No. 1), Clark (No. 2), Briceño (No. 4), Liranzo (No. 5), Anderson (No. 9), Hamm (No. 10), OF Roberto Campos (No. 20), Bigbie (No. 26) and RHP Yosber Sanchez (No. 30). MLB.com's top-100 prospects list features four Erie players, including McGonigle (No. 6), Clark (No. 10), Briceño (No. 51) and Liranzo (No. 76).

STRONG ARMS: Since June 18, the Flying Squirrels have posted a 3.27 ERA (124 ER/341.0 IP) in 40 games, which is fourth in the Eastern League. The Richmond bullpen has posted a 2.98 ERA (54 ER/163.1 IP) in that stretch. In their last 21 road games since June 18, the Flying Squirrels have posted a 3.02 ERA (61 ER/182.0 IP).

FOR RICHMOND: Left-hander John Michael Bertrand makes his 20th start of the season and the seventh of his career against the SeaWolves. He last pitched last Saturday at Somerset and allowed one run over 4.2 innings in a loss. Tonight marks the 58th start of his Richmond career, which is third-most in franchise history. In July, Bertrand went 2-0 with a 0.51 ERA (1 ER/17.2 IP) in three starts. For the season in the Eastern League, he ranks third in innings pitched (100.0), fourth in ERA (3.06), ninth in WHIP (1.28) and 10th in BAA (.246). After going 0-4 with a 5.91 ERA (14 ER/211 IP) in five April starts, Bertrand has gone 4-4 with a 2.29 ERA (20 ER/18.2 IP) in his last 14 starts since May 4. Since the start of the 2024 season, Bertrand ranks third among all MiLB pitchers in innings (256.0) and double play groundouts (34). Last year, he was named the Flying Squirrels' Pitcher of the Year after going 7-9 with a 4.32 ERA in 28 outings (27 starts). Bertrand also won the team's Community Service Award. He made two starts with Triple-A Sacramento to close the season. For the year, Bertrand led all Eastern League pitchers with 10 scoreless starts, all at least five innings. He also led all MiLB pitchers defensively in assists (31) and ranked second in total chances (38). He finished the season ranked first among all MiLB pitchers in double plays induced (23), five ahead of the next closest pitcher. Bertrand was named Eastern League Pitcher of the Week twice last year, first for throwing seven perfect innings against the Baysox on April 27 and then for working six hitless innings in Bowie on May 23. Entering 2025, he is rated by Baseball America as having the best control in the Giants system for the second straight year. Bertrand began his collegiate career at Furman University in South Carolina before playing his final two seasons at the University of Notre Dame. He was selected by the Giants in the 10th round of the 2022 MLB Draft. For more on Bertrand, see page two.

FOR ERIE: Right-hander Jaden Hamm makes his 14th Double-A start and his fourth against the Flying Squirrels. After going 2-2 with a 4.26 ERA in 13 starts, he was placed on the injured list on June 26. He made two rehab starts with Low-A Lakeland before being reinstated with Erie today. In his last Double-A start on June 18, Hamm threw 5.2 scoreless innings with five strikeouts in a win over the Baysox. Against Richmond this year, Hamm is 0-0 with a 3.95 ERA (6 ER/13.2 IP) in three starts. Hamm was selected by the Tigers in the fifth round of the 2023 MLB Draft out of Middle Tennessee State.

DON'T RUN ON RICHMOND: The Flying Squirrels' catching unit of Adrián Sugastey, Zach Morgan and Onil Perez have combined to catch 54 stolen base attempts this season, which first among the 30 Double-A teams and leads the Eastern League. Sugastey leads all Double-A catchers with 39 runners caught stealing. Sugastey has set a franchise record for the most caught stealing in a season in Flying Squirrels history, passing Jackson Williams' mark of 35 set in 2015 with his 36th on July 26 against Portland. For his career with Richmond, Sugastey's 52 runners caught stealing for his career is third-most in franchise history, trailing Eliezer Zambrano (53, 2010-2017).

BERI BOMBS: Victor Bericoto hit his ninth homer of the season in the second game last Friday's doubleheader, which leads active Richmond players for the year. It was the 31st homer of his Flying Squirrels career, moving him into third place on the franchise's all-time home run list, passing Jarrett Parker (2013-14). He is now two homers behind Jacob Heyward (2019, '21-22) for second place on the list and six behind Ricky Oropesa's (2013-16) franchise record of 37. He also drove the 118th RBI of his Richmond career in the first game of Friday's doubleheader, moving him ahead of Hunter Cole (2015-17) for second place on the franchise's all-time RBI list. Bericoto now has 121 career RBIs with Richmond, trailing only Oropesa's record of 165. In seven August games, Bericoto is batting .364 (8-for-22) with a homer, two doubles and four RBIs.

UNTUCK: Tyler Myrick recorded his 10th save of the season in Wednesday's 6-3 win at Erie. It was his second straight day closing out a save. For the year, he is tied for the league lead in saves. It was the 22nd save of his Flying Squirrels career, moving him into a tie for fifth place on the franchise's all-time saves list with Josh Osich (2013-16). His next save will tie him with Rafael Cova (2010) for fourth on the franchise's all-time saves list with 23. Myrick has converted six of his seven save attempts since July 1 over 11 appearances. He picked up his first win of the season on July 25 against the Sea Dogs, working the final four outs. Since June 28, Myrick has posted a 1.23 ERA (2 ER/14.0 IP) in 12 appearances.

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, Diego Velasquez is ranked sixth in walks (51) and sixth in hits (91). Turner Hill is tied for fifth in triples (5). Seth Lonsway is seventh in ERA (3.52). John Michael Bertrand is third in innings pitched (100.0), fourth in ERA (3.06), ninth in WHIP (1.28) and 10th in BAA (.246). Jack Choate is third in strikeouts (102), sixth in ERA (3.43) and tied for eighth in BAA (.232). Joe Whitman is seventh in strikeouts (95). Tyler Myrick is first in saves (10).

TOP SKIPPER: Flying Squirrels manager Dennis Pelfrey has led the team to 243 wins in his career, which is a new franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 61 win at Binghamton on May 23. From 2011-2013, **Dave Machemer** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship.

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster features four players are ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including Bo Davidson (No. 4), Diego Velasquez (No. 8), Joe Whitman (No. 9) and Jack Choate (No. 28). John Michael Bertrand is rated as having the best control in the Giants system. Adrian Sugastey is ranked as the top defensive catcher. Aeverson Arteaga is rated as the best defensive infielder and best infield arm. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features three Richmond players, including Davidson (No. 5), Whitman (No. 14) and Velasquez (No. 21).

THIS DATE IN RICHMOND **BASEBALL HISTORY**

THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

1955: The Richmond Virginians beat the Columbus Jets, 4-3, at Parker Field. Theodore Del Guercio gave Columbus a 2-0 lead in the second with a two-run single. Richmond tied the score, 2-2, with a single by Allen Barbee and a double-play groundout off the bat of Vic Marasco. In the top of the 11th, Al Pinkston gave the Jets a 3-2 lead with a sacrifice fly. In the bottom of the 11th inning, Marasco singled and Lou Ortiz hit a two-run homer to win the game against Jim Miller. 1964: The Richmond Virginians tied the Buffalo Bisons, 1-1, at Parker Field. The game was called in the top of the 10th for rain. Frank Caprin entered in the 10th and allowed two baserunners before rain stopped play for 28 minutes. As he warmed up to resume play, a hard rain hit and the game was called. After throwing 10 scoreless innings in a no-decision earlier in the week against Toronto, Mel Stottlemyre allowed one run over nine innings in his final Richmond start. He was called up to the Yankees days later to make his MLB debut. With the Vees that year, he went 13-3 with a 1.42 ERA in 30 outings (17 starts) and was named an International League All-Star. He went on to pitch 11 MLB seasons with the Yankees, posting a 2.97 ERA and earning five All-Star selections. He also won five World Series titles as a coach, including four with the Yankees, 1986: The Richmond Braves beat the Maine Guides, 6-3, at The Diamond. Maine scored two in the sixth and John Rabb cut the score to 2-1 in the seventh with a homer. Down, 3-1, entering the bottom of the ninth, Rabb hit an RBI single and Bob Tumpane tied the game with a sacrifice fly, After an intentional walk, Brad Komminsk won the game with a walk-off, three-run homer. Steve Shields pitched a complete game and struck out six, allowing two earned runs. That night, it was reported that he was being traded to the Kansas City Royals for Darryl Motley. The trade was put on what was expected to be a temporary hold. Motley was held with the Royals after Rudy Law was
