## SUGAR LAND SPACE COWBOYS (30-21) AT ALBUQUERQUE ISOTOPES (23-28)

### RHP MIGUEL ULLOLA (2-2, 3.86) vs. LHP MASON ALBRIGHT (0-0, 3.65)

**TODAY'S GAME:** The Isotopes took a 1-0 series lead after an 11-5 win last night ... Albuquerque has plated 41 runs over its last four contests, all wins ... Mason Albright is slated to make the start for the Isotopes while Miguel Ullola is expected to toe the rubber for the Space Cowboys.

**FOUR-STRAIGHT:** The Isotopes have won four-straight games, the most since August 31-September 4, 2024, also four. The club is 7-4 in their last 11 contests.

**MLB REHAB:** Thairo Estrada played his fourth rehab game with the Isotopes Tuesday and went 2-for-5 ... Over four games is 6-for-19 with a double, walk and two strikeouts.

**HOMERS:** The Isotopes have hit 11 homers in their last two games (seven on Sunday at Reno and four last night).

**XBH:** Albuquerque swatted 10 extra-base hits last night (five doubles, one triple and four homers), the most in a game since May 9, 2024, at El Paso (11; five doubles and six homers).

**KNOCKS:** The Isotopes compiled 19 hits yesterday, tied for the second-most in a game this season. Have recorded 17-plus hits in three of their last four games.

**HITS A PLENTY:** All Isotopes position players in the starting lineup recorded at least one hit for the sixth time in 2025 Tuesday and second-straight (also: April 2 vs. Salt Lake, April 23 at Reno, May 16 vs. Tacoma, May 23 and 25 at Reno).

**HITS ALLOWED:** The Isotopes permitted 12 hits last night, the club's fourth win in 2025 after yielding 12-plus (also: April 17 vs. El Paso, 15; May 16 vs. Tacoma, 17; and May 17 vs. Tacoma, 13).

**MULTI-HOMER GAMES:** Keston Hiura and Ryan Ritter tallied the ninth and tenth multi-homer games for the Isotopes in 2025 yesterday. First Isotope players to record back-to-back multi-homer games since Alan Trejo from August 19-20, 2022.

-They are the first pair of Isotopes teammates to record back-to-back multi-homer games in the same contests.

**LEADOFF HOMER:** Ryan Ritter has leadoff blasts in two-straight games (last: Greg Jones, Sept. 11-12, 2024).

**POTW:** Ryan Ritter is the first Isotope to garner league honors in back-to-back weeks ... Went 13-for-30 with five doubles, four homers and eight RBI in six games ... Seventh time since 2005 a player has won two-straight POTW (last: Reno's Jake McCarthy in September 2023).

**RIT:** Ryan Ritter went 3-for-5 yesterday with two homers and a single to extend his hit streak to 12 games, tied for the third-longest active streak in PCL. During streak is slashing .456/.491/1.053 with nine doubles, two triples, seven homers and 20 RBI.

-During stretch leads MiLB in hits, total bases, homers, RBI, doubles and slugging ... Has also reached base in 18 consecutive games, tied for the second-longest active streak in PCL ... Has 10 multi-hit games in his last 11 contests and a team-leading 17 on the season, including four three-hit games (back-to-back).

-First Isotope to register five homers in a two-game stretch.

-In May, slashing .373/.429/.904 with 10 doubles, two triples, 10 homers and 24 RBI after hitting .224 over first 26 games. During month, leads PCL in OPS, slugging, homers, doubles, total bases and tied in hits.

**KESTDADDY:** Keston Hiura extended his hit streak to 12 games with two homers last night. During stretch is slashing .375/.474/.813 with six doubles, five homers and 17 RBI ... Has four homers in his last nine at-bats ... Was his 16th multi-homer game of his pro career. First Isotope to record six RBI in a game since Jameson Hannah on August 1, 2024, at Las Vegas.

-Hiura has a hit in 18 of 19 games played in May ... During the month, is slashing .360/.442/.747 with a triple, six doubles, seven homers and 21 RBI after hitting .141 over first 24 games ... Has 19-game on-base streak, longest active in PCL.

**YF:** Yanquiel Fernandez extended his hitting streak to eight games with two hits last night. During the stretch is slashing .424/.500/.576 with five doubles and four RBI.

**MR. BRUIN:** Sean Bouchard registered four hits last night, one off his career-high (high: five, June 12, 2022). Sixth time in his career with at least four knocks (last: March 31, 2024, four).

**WARMING UP:** Warming Bernabel tallied two knocks yesterday for his 16th multi-hit game of the season and second-straight. Is slashing .421/.489/.605 with four doubles, one homer and six RBI over his last nine games.

**PCL LEADERBOARD:** Ryan Ritter is 1st in homers (14), XBH (28), total bases (111) and slugging (.613), T-1st runs (41), 2nd in OPS (1.018), 6th in RBI (36), T-6th in hits (53) 7th in OBP (.405) and T-9th in walks (30) ... Sam Hilliard is T-1st in triples (5), T-8th in XBH (22), 8th in slugging (.549) and 9th in OPS (.924) ... Warming Bernabel is 7th in doubles (14) ... Sterlin Thompson is T-5th in triples (3) ... Julio Carreras is T-9th in SB (10).

## NUCLEI NOTES

**SKIPPER:** Pedro Lopez enters his 21st year as a minor league manager and third guiding the Isotopes. He is the eighth manager in club history ... Spent 2021 as Albuquerque's hitting coach and 2022 as its bench coach ... Notched his 1,000th career managerial victory June 4, 2023 at Salt Lake, 7-1 ... Managed in the Texas Rangers (2001-05, 2007) and New York Mets (2011-19) organizations while claiming the 2014 Eastern League Championship with Double-A Binghamton. Lopez was drafted in the 21st round by the San Diego Padres in the 1988 MLB Draft and spent 13 years in the minor leagues, reaching Triple-A on four occasions.

**CHRIS MICHALAK:** Begins his third season as Isotopes pitching coach ... Pitched for the Albuquerque Dukes in 2000, followed by stints with the Isotopes in 2004 and 2008 ... Started second-to-last game in Dukes history, giving up two runs in 6.0 innings during Game 4 of a PCL First Round playoff series at Memphis Sept. 9, 2000 ... Appeared in 61 Major League games (24 starts) over five seasons with the Arizona Diamondbacks (1998), Toronto Blue Jays (2001) Texas Rangers (2001-02) and Cincinnati Reds (2006) ... 12th round selection by the Athletics in 1993 ... Has been in the coaching ranks since 2009, including stops as the pitching coach for the Hagerstown Suns (2010-11), Potomac Nationals (2012-13) and Harrisburg Senators (2014-17). He was also the Minor League pitching coordinator for the Miami Marlins from 2018-20 and coached in the Washington Nationals organization from 2021-22.

**MICHAEL RYAN:** Enters his second year with the Rockies organization as the Isotopes bench coach ... The former outfielder played in 33 games for the Isotopes and hit nine homers during the 2008 campaign. He and Michalak were teammates on that squad for four days in late July ... Entered the coaching ranks in 2012 as a coach for the Double-A Altoona Curve (Pirates). He then managed in the Pirates organization at three levels for seven seasons with stops at Single-A West Virginia (2013-14), High-A Bradenton (2015-16) and Double-A Altoona (2017-19), while winning the Florida State League in 2016 and Eastern League in 2017. Ryan compiled a 221-197 managerial record with Altoona—the most wins for a manager in Curve history ... He also managed in the Cubs organization (High-A South Bend, 2021 and Double-A Tennessee, 2022-June 2023) ... A 5th round draft pick by the Minnesota Twins in 1996, played in 149 MLB games over parts of five seasons with the Twins (2002-05) and Angels (2010) ... Last Angels player to wear 27 prior to Mike Trout's call-up in 2011.

**AARON MUNOZ:** Takes over as Isotopes hitting coach after Jordan Pacheco was named one of two new hitting coaches for the Colorado Rockies on May 12 ... Began the 2025 season as the hitting coach for the ACL Rockies ... Spent nine seasons (2016-2024) as the Rockies bullpen catcher ... Was Isotopes bullpen catcher in 2015 ... Originally drafted by the Blue Jays in the 34th round of the MLB Draft ... Played parts of four seasons in the Minor Leagues (2011-14), making it to Double-A.

**SPLIT-SEASON PLAYOFF FORMAT:** For the third-straight year, the Pacific Coast League will use a split-season format to determine playoff participants. With one 10 team division, the first half winner (concluding June 22) will host the second half winner (beginning June 24) in a three-game set. The winner will then face the International League champion for the Triple-A Championship in Las Vegas, NV, on September 27.

**BALLS AND STRIKES:** The Challenge System, in it's third full year in the PCL, will be used exclusively for every game this season. Under this system, the home plate umpire will call balls or strikes while each team has the opportunity to challenge the umpire's call with two challenges per game, retaining one for each successful challenge.
