QUINT STUDER

PRINCIPAL OWNER

Quint and his wife, Rishy, moved to Pensacola in 1996 and have been investing in the city's future since. A titan in the field of healthcare, he headquartered Studer Group before devoting his career to philanthropy and community building. The Studers have played an integral role in the re-invigoration of downtown Pensacola, building Blue Wahoos Stadium and Studer Children's Hospital and opening numerous businesses including the Bodacious Shops and Bubba's Sweet Spot on historic Palafox Street.

The Studers began their journey in baseball in 2002 with the purchase of the independent Pensacola Pelicans. Over the next seven years, they guided the team through multiple league changes and began construction on a downtown waterfront ballpark. In 2010, the Studers purchased the Carolina Mudcats Double-A franchise and moved them to Pensacola, re-naming them the Blue Wahoos.

Today, Studer is a best-selling author in both business and health care fields, and leads the Studer Community Institute, Studer Foundation, Studer Properties, Vibrant Communities, and the EntreCon and CivicCon conferences while continuing to invest in Pensacola.



RISHY STUDER

PRINCIPAL OWNER

Born and raised in Chicago as the fourth of six children, Rishy Studer quickly learned the meaning of sharing and giving, which she has carried throughout her life. Her mother was a school teacher in the Chicago public school system for more than 30 years. She attended the University of Wisconsin-Whitewater, the same alma mater as her husband, meeting post-graduation while both were working in nearby Janesville, WI. The couple has been married for 36 years and has five children and seven grandchildren. When the Studers moved to Pensacola, Rishy began

working at the gift shop at Baptist Hospital where her husband was president and helped transport patients to Gulf Breeze Hospital. Upon formation of the Studer Group in 2000, Rishy handled finances and hiring for the company until 2010. She created the Bodacious Shops on Palafox and Main Street in downtown Pensacola and a similar brand of shops in Janesville. She serves as CEO of the businesses within that group. She also created the Five Sisters Blues Café on Belmont-DeVilliers Street and helped direct the Southtowne Apartments. Rishy also directs the Studer Foundation and the hundreds of benefactors of the organization.



JOHN LIST

MINORITY OWNER

John is an economist at the University of Chicago, recognized for his pioneering contributions to the field of economics. The author of over 200 academic publications, List served on the President's Council of Economic Advisors as a Senior Economist from 2002-2003 and has been elected to the American Academy of Arts and Sciences. He was a finalist for the Nobel Prize in economics in 2015 and is co-founder of the Thirty Million Words Center for Early Learning with Dana Suskind.



MINORITY OWNER

BUBBA WATSON

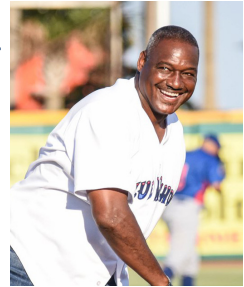
Growing up in the small community of Bagdad, FL, Bubba learned to play golf at a young age from his father, Gerry, who provided a cut-down club so his son could play in the backyard. Without ever taking formal lessons or having a golf coach, he rose to become one of the most remarkable success stories in professional golf history. After playing for Milton High School, where he followed fellow grads and eventual PGA Tour pros Boo Weekley and Heath Slocum, Watson turned pro in 2002 following graduation from the University of Georgia and qualified for the PGA Tour in 2006. He catapulted into world golf fame by winning the Masters Tournament in 2012 and 2014. Those major championships are part of 12 PGA Tour wins for Watson. As one of the few left-handed golfers in professional golf, Bubba has dazzled with his booming tee shots and imaginative shot-making skills. In 2014, Bubba and his wife, Angie, founded the Bubba Watson Foundation to improve and enhance their efforts to assist those in need. Since returning to Pensacola with his family, Bubba has invested heavily in the community, opening Bubba's Sweet Spot downtown, donating generously to the Studer Family Children's Hospital, and becoming a part-owner of the Blue Wahoos with business partner Randall Wells.



MINORITY OWNER

DERRICK BROOKS

Born and raised in Pensacola, Derrick went from youth football with the Pensacola Baby Rattlers to becoming a national High School All-American at Booker T. Washington. He was a two-time All-American linebacker at Florida State before being selected in the first round of the 1995 NFL Draft by the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. In 14 seasons, he was an 11-time NFL Pro Bowl selection and helping lead Tampa Bay to a Super Bowl title in 2003. He was chosen on first ballot to the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 2014 and is one of just 13 outside linebackers in NFL history to reach the Hall of Fame. He was recently named among the 100 greatest NFL players for the NFL's celebration of its 100th season. Since retiring in 2009, Brooks has made an equal name in the worlds of business and philanthropy. Through Derrick Brooks Charities, he has worked to reach socioeconomically challenged children in Tampa Bay with his Brooks Bunch Academies, Youth Programs, and Rites of Passage. He co-founded the Studer/55 Community Athletics program, bringing NFL Flag Football to Pensacola, and joined the Blue Wahoos as a minority owner in 2018.



MINORITY OWNER

DANA SUSKIND

A professor of Surgery and Pediatrics at the University of Chicago Medical Center, Dana is the co-founder and co-director of the Thirty Million Words Center for Early Learning. She is a popular author and the recipient of numerous awards including the 2017 Weizmann Women for Science and Vision and Impact Award. The founder of UChicago's Pediatric Hearing Loss and Cochlear Implant program, she is devoted to treating children born with hearing loss.





ADMIRAL FETTERMAN FIELD AT BLUE WAHOOS STADIUM



On September 23, 2015, the field at Blue Wahoos Stadium was officially renamed Admiral Jack Fetterman Field to honor the memory of Fetterman, a three-star Vice Admiral in the U.S. Navy who retired in Pensacola and became a prominent civic leader, dedicating himself, alongside his wife Nancy, to preserving Pensacola’s history.

A Pennsylvania native, Fetterman graduated from college in 1954 and enlisted in the U.S. Navy. He made his first trip to Pensacola soon after to attend the Aviation Officer Candidate School at Naval Air Station Pensacola.

He rose in rank and was appointed Rear Admiral and then Vice Admiral, assuming command duties of the U.S. Naval Air Force Pacific Fleet in San Diego, a capacity he served in until 1990.

In 1991, Fetterman returned to Pensacola where his Naval career began and assumed duties as Chief of Naval Education and Training before retiring from active duty in 1993. During his illustrious Naval career, he formulated and produced the Core Values Training program, earning him the title of “Father of Navy Ethics.”

He then became president and CEO of the National Naval Aviation Museum at NAS-Pensacola. Under his leadership, the museum grew in capacity and scope, making the facility one of the largest air and space museums in the world.

In addition to his work at NAS-Pensacola and in other U.S. Navy positions, Fetterman served his community in roles that included Chairman of the Pensacola Mayor Community Core Values Board and Chairman of the Pensacola Chamber of Commerce.





STADIUM UPDATES



2019: The Blue Wahoos invest over a half-million dollars in improvements to Blue Wahoos Stadium, most notably by transforming their traditional concession stands into a series of restaurant-style, themed concession storefronts that drive industry-leading Net Promoter Scores for the team and take home Ballpark Digest's Best New Concessions Experience award.

2020: The Blue Wahoos dramatically enhance player amenities and fan safety including adding 250 feet of expanded protective netting and adding \$500,000 in renovations to the home clubhouse area. Player amenity renovations include expanding the clubhouse by 15 feet, all-new lockers, furniture, and carpet, transitioning a family waiting room into a dual-purpose dining room and classroom, and building a strength coach's office inside the weight room.

2022: The playing surface at Blue Wahoos Stadium is transitioned from natural grass to synthetic field turf. The synthetic grass maintains the look and feel of natural grass while bringing the stadium into alignment with MLB facility standards and allowing Marlins prospects to prepare for the Major Leagues on a playing surface nearly identical to the synthetic field at loanDepot park in Miami. Musco LED stadium lights are installed, improving visibility for players, fulfilling MLB facility requirements, and offering the team the ability to add multi-colored lighting shows to fans at games and events. The Blue Wahoos and Pepsi partner to construct the Pepsi Pirate Deck in the centerfield seating area. The 875-square-foot party deck has capacity for approximately 50 fans on game days.

2025: The visitor's clubhouse is expanded to add a weight room and additional space for players and coaches. The home clubhouse is renovated, including new lockers and added space for coaches. New safety padding is added to side walls in foul territory.

2026: A second batting cage and a women's locker room are constructed down the first base line.





IN THE COMMUNITY

The mission of the Pensacola Blue Wahoos is to create memorable experiences. Each season, the team's staff and players participate in a robust community service program, making a profound difference in the lives of thousands across northwest Florida. For their efforts, the Blue Wahoos have won the Southern League Community Service Award five times as a franchise.



KAZOO'S READING PROGRAM

Kazoo's Reading Program reached thousands of elementary school students in local schools prior to the 2026 season, encouraging and rewarding literacy skills. During the course of the program, each school received a personal visit from Kazoo and participating students were given Blue Wahoos bookmarks. Students who read four or more books were rewarded with a free ticket to a Blue Wahoos game.



CHARITABLE DONATIONS

The Blue Wahoos made regular donations to local non-profits during the 2025 season. Beyond direct contributions, the team invites local non-profit organizations to fundraise at the stadium on a nightly basis through the team's concessions and parking programs as well as their 50/50 Raffle.



HOME RUN FOR LIFE

Each month, the Blue Wahoos partner with Ascension Sacred Heart Hospital to grant a local child battling severe medical issues an inspirational Home Run For Life at Blue Wahoos Stadium. During the ceremony, the game is paused midway to allow the participant to take a home run trot around the bases and high five the full roster of both teams while their story is told to the fans. Since 2013, more than four dozen children have participated, raising awareness for Sacred Heart's pediatric specialty care.





NPO FUNDRAISING

In addition to their standard in-stadium fundraising, the Blue Wahoos offer local non-profits opportunities to raise money through volunteer opportunities in the concessions at Blue Wahoos Stadium. Local charities joined Blue Wahoos staff to serve fans and customers at the ballpark during the 2025 season.



BRAIN BAG INITIATIVE

The Blue Wahoos implemented a new fundraising system in their box office in 2019, allowing fans to donate a portion of their ticket purchase to the Studer Community Institute to support their Brain Bag Initiative. Each year, 5,000 new mothers in Escambia County receive an early literacy gift bag from SCI that includes educational resources to help develop their child's brain before they become school-age, significantly improving the child's educational outcomes later in life.



FIELD RENOVATION

Each season, the Blue Wahoos partner with Waste Management to provide a full field renovation to a local ballpark. Most recently, Blue Wahoos staff renovated the Gulf Point Resource Center in Pensacola, helping ensure youth athletes have great places to play in the community.



BASEBALL CAMPS

Blue Wahoos players and Pensacola baseball alumni offered professional instruction to local youth baseball players at four baseball camps during the 2025 season, highlighted by the return of the Fred Waters Youth Camp and the new Blue Wahoos Baseball Camp.





MEDIA INFORMATION

Credentials

Full-season media credentials are issued to legitimate news-gathering organizations that frequently cover the Blue Wahoos throughout the season. Applications are available through the Blue Wahoos media relations department. All working media members must adhere to Blue Wahoos media relations and Blue Wahoos Stadium regulations while working at the stadium.

Single-game media credentials are issued to legitimate news-gathering organizations who cover the Blue Wahoos on a limited basis. Applications are available through the Blue Wahoos media department. All single-game credential requests are reviewed and granted on a case-by-case basis and must be submitted at least 24 hours in advance. Single-game credentials will be available for pick-up with the receptionist in the front office at Blue Wahoos Stadium.

Credentialed media members must still submit interview requests to the Blue Wahoos media relations department before approaching players, coaches, or staff for interviews. Credentials must be worn visibly at all times in the stadium and are non-transferable.

Clubhouse Access

The clubhouses at Blue Wahoos Stadium are closed to the media at all times. Pre-game interviews with Blue Wahoos players and coaches can be arranged through the Blue Wahoos media department. Following each game, Blue Wahoos media relations staff will meet working media members in the first base tunnel and help fulfill post-game interview requests.

Visiting Team Interview Requests

The visiting clubhouse at Blue Wahoos Stadium is closed to the media at all times without prior permission from the visiting team's media relations staff. Interview requests for visiting players and coaches should be directed to the Blue Wahoos media relations staff who will coordinate with that team's media relations department to fulfill the request.

Pre-Game Field Access

Credentialed members of the media may be present on the foul territory warning track during Blue Wahoos batting practice. Media members may attend visiting team batting practice with permission from that team's media relations staff. Field access leading up to the game for content such as ceremonial first pitches should be arranged with Blue Wahoos media relations staff.

Dugouts

Media members should not enter the first or third base dugout while players or coaches are present. Field access is available through the tunnel on the home base side of each dugout.

Press Box

The press box at Blue Wahoos Stadium can be accessed by credentialed media members using the concourse stairwell next to the GoTeez Bait & Tackle Team Store behind home plate or by the elevator in the front office lobby (third floor). Space in the press box is limited and is shared with Blue Wahoos broadcast staff and Southern League gameday staff. Game information and wireless internet is provided in the press box. The press box is a working environment for both the media and Blue Wahoos staff; no cheering is allowed at any point by media members in the press box or in other areas of the stadium.

Online Press Resources

The Blue Wahoos online press box can be accessed at BlueWahoos.com/Media. During the season, the page is updated daily with game notes, roster moves, and pertinent media information. Press releases, interview recordings, game photography, Blue Wahoos programs, and a web version of this media guide are also housed on the site.



Photographers/Videographers

Media members with photography credentials may utilize the camera well at the outfield end of each dugout before and during games. Space is limited in each area and all photographers/videographers must accommodate Blue Wahoos grounds crew and broadcast staff who also utilize the area. Stationary platforms for video cameras on the concourse may be arranged with advance notice. No photographers are permitted on the field during game play. Posed photo requests with Blue Wahoos players and coaches must be authorized in advance by Blue Wahoos media relations staff. Requests for photographs from the Blue Wahoos can be made through the Blue Wahoos media department.

Game Notes

Game notes, rosters, lineups, and other pertinent information is available in the press box at each game. Media information is also posted on the Blue Wahoos online press box prior to each game at BlueWahoos.com/Media.

SOUTHERN LEAGUE CHAMPIONSHIPS



The Pensacola Blue Wahoos won their first Southern League title in 2017, sharing a co-championship with the Chattanooga Lookouts in a playoff format shortened by the threat of Hurricane Irma. On the strength of a first-half South Division title, the Blue Wahoos met the Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp in a best-of-five Division Series. After the midseason promotions of stars Luis Castillo and Tyler Mahle, and a season-ending injury to Nick Senzel, a different cast of Blue Wahoos put the team on their backs and achieved playoff glory. The series-clinching Game Three, moved to Blue Wahoos Stadium to avoid the hurricane, saw Gavin LaValley and Aristides Aquino hit back-to-back homers in the top of the eighth inning to give Pensacola a 4-3 lead. Austin Dean kept Jacksonville's season alive with an RBI single in the bottom of the ninth inning to force extras, but Aquino delivered again in the top of the 12th with an RBI single to score Gabriel Guerrero and send the Blue Wahoos to a series sweep and Southern League crown.



The 2022 Blue Wahoos clinched a playoff spot in June with a first-half South Division championship, but limped into the playoffs with a roster decimated by injuries and promotions. After a road loss to Montgomery in Game One of the best-of-three SLDS, the Blue Wahoos kept their season alive with a comeback Game Two win, capped by a dramatic and unlikely Nasim Nunez eighth-inning homer. Game Three of the SLDS was a classic, with Dax Fulton fanning 13 Biscuits batters over 6.0 innings and Norel Gonzalez delivering an RBI single in the eighth inning for a 1-0 win. The SLCS against the Tennessee Smokies unfolded in much the same way, as the Blue Wahoos lost Game One and came back to win Game Two before a winner-take-all Game Three. Eury Perez fanned the first eight Smokies batters of the game, and Cobie Fletcher-Vance delivered the big hit with a go-ahead grand slam in the fifth inning. Closer Sean Reynolds finished off an 11-4 win, sending the Blue Wahoos to their first outright title in franchise history.

PRO BASEBALL IN PENSACOLA

The Pensacola Blue Wahoos follow a proud tradition of professional baseball in Pensacola dating back to the 19th century. First recorded in the area in 1867 as a growing leisure activity, the sport saw early clubs like the Mallores, Hope, Pastimes, Harwells and Dudes play in Seville Square and other open spaces near downtown. Other “city league” teams, like the East Ends, Eddys, Rounders, Warringtons and Orioles, played regularly against area clubs. Barnstormers, from the famed House of David team to MLB clubs like the New York Yankees, also passed through town regularly to play the various local teams. The Pensacola Flyers, birthed in 1909 just months after the first military flight, found success playing other city teams in the region. The era of modern professional baseball began in earnest with the 1913 Pensacola Snappers, who played one season in the Cotton States League. Below is a wide-ranging list of the professional baseball teams that called Pensacola home prior to the Blue Wahoos:

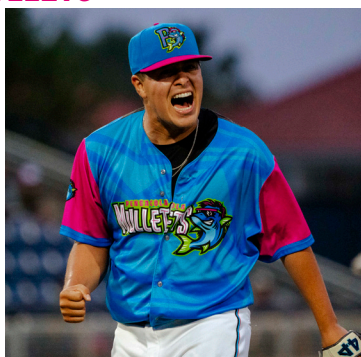

PENSACOLA MULLETS

The mullet - both the fish and the hairstyle - are synonymous with the Florida Panhandle. While “Pensacola Mulletts” was a close runner-up when deciding on a team name in 2011, the Blue Wahoos explored a speculative history when they became the Mulletts for “What-If Night” on May 26, 2016.

The Mulletts returned for one game in 2021, and became a more permanent presence in 2022 when the Blue Wahoos revived the Brandiose-designed alternate identity for every Thursday home game.

PENSACOLA SKY JOCKEYS



Baseball and the military have been closely linked in Pensacola for more than a century. As America went to war in the 1940s, many professional baseball players enlisted in the armed forces and formed amateur clubs while in Pensacola for training. Pensacola’s Air Base All-Star Team, featuring many of the best players from auxiliary base squads, played a traveling series to benefit morale for military personnel. Pensacola’s previous professional baseball teams, like the Pilots, Fliers and Angels, referenced the area’s status as the Cradle of Naval Aviation.

The Blue Wahoos played a “Turn Back the Clock” game as the Ted Williams-led Bronson Bombers in 2022 and unveiled a concourse graphic showing Pensacola’s Navy baseball history. Since 2023, the Blue Wahoos have worn aviation call signs on the backs of their jerseys on Military Appreciation Night.

In 2026, the Blue Wahoos debut a new alternate identity with the colors and stylings of Pensacola’s famed Blue Angels. The Pensacola Sky Jockeys take flight on select home games with the iconic blue and gold livery of the U.S. Navy’s flight demonstration squadron.

PENSACOLA SEAGULLS

In response to the exclusion of black players from white professional baseball, several Negro Leagues were formed across the United States in the 19th and 20th century. Clubs called the Onwards, Giants, Nine Devils, Pirates, Light Crust Dough Boys, Clowns, Arthur Giants and Pepsi-Cola Stars all played to large crowds of both black and white fans in the Pensacola area.

Perhaps best known were the Pensacola Seagulls, who played at Legion Field as a feeder team for the Negro Southern League in the 1940s and continued as a semipro integrated team until the 1970s. Since 2021, the Blue Wahoos have honored the Seagulls with alternate “turn back the clock” replica uniforms.



PENSACOLA POK-TA-POK



Native Americans historically wintered in the temperate climates of the Pensacola area, and were documented by anthropologists as playing the mesoamerican ball game known by many tribes as “Pok-Ta-Pok.”

In 2023, the Blue Wahoos launched an alternate identity to pay tribute to the first sport played in the region. The Pensacola Pok-Ta-Pok are the first club in MiLB’s “Copa de la Diversión” Hispanic event series to honor pre-Columbian indigenous culture.
