THINKING 'BOUT LAST NIGHT: The Quad Cities River Bandits left eight men in scoring position and struck out 16 yesterday afternoon as they took their first loss of the season to the South Bend Cubs ... the Bandits recorded just two hits with runners in scoring position, both singles, and grounded into three double-plays with two occurring in bases loaded situations.

HOT AND TRESH: In his first two games at the High-A level, Bandits' catcher Luca Tresh has gone 5-for-9 at the plate with back-to-back multi-hit games, including a three-hit performance on Opening Night where he drove in three runs and the game-winning tally in the tenth inning.

THE BOYS ARE BACK IN TOWN: After claiming the first and only High-A Central championship, their 12th league title in team history, the River Bandits return to South Bend and Four Winds Field for Opening Day for the second time in as many seasons.

<u>I KNOW YOU</u>: The River Bandits return 15 players from their 2021 championship squad ... Steve Luebber (pitching coach) and Andy LaRoche (hitting coach) also return to the Quad Cities in their respective roles.

NEW SHERIFF IN TOWN: With Chris Widger, Baseball America's 2021 Minor League Manager of the Year, now at the helm of the Royals' Double-A affiliate in NW Arkansas (AA), 2021 Columbia Fireflies (A) manager Brooks Conrad takes over as the 42nd manager in Quad Cities baseball history ... led the Lexington Legends to a South Atlantic League Title in 2019 and was honored with the Dick Howser Award, which is given annually to one Royals player development employee for outstanding contributions to the organization ... coaching career follows a playing career in which he played parts of six seasons in the Majors with Öakland (2008), Atlanta (2009-11), Milwaukee (2012), Tampa Bay (2012), and San Diego (2014). He was selected in the eighth round of the 2001 Draft by Houston, where he played seven seasons in the minors.

PROSPECTING: The River Bandits 2022 Opening Day roster features four prospects in MLB Pipeline's Royals' top 30 with infielder Peyton

Wilson leading the way at No. 15, right hander Noah Murdock at No. 25, catcher Luca Tresh at No. 28, and outfielder Tyler Gentry ranking No. 29.

A TEAM TO REMEMBER: The River Bandits' 2021 championship squad featured four High-A Central postseason all-stars in Michael Massey, Vinnie Pasquantino, Logan Porter, and Anthony Veneziano ... Quad Cities also collected seven High-A Central Player of the Week awards and one Player/Pitcher of the Month award with Massey earning the honors for July ... on June 18, Zach Haake and Dante Biasi combined for the 12th no-hitter in Quad Cities Baseball history, blanking Wisconsin in a 9-0 victory.

Q.C. CONNECTIONS: River Bandits' bench coach, Eddie Rodriguez makes his return to Modern Woodmen Park after serving as the manager of the 1988 and 1989 Quad City Angels ... infielder Cam Williams' father Reggie, played four seasons with the California/ Anaheim Angels and the Los Angeles Dodgers and spent the 1989 season in the Midwest League with the Clinton Giants (A) prior to winning a Midwest League title with the Quad Cities Angels (A) in 1990.


