YESTERDAY: The Flying Squirrels lost to the Curve, 8-2. Altoona scored its first two runs without collecting a hit. In the second, Konnor Griffin was hit by a pitch, advanced to third on two groundouts and scored on a wild pitch. In the second, Griffin was hit by a pitch with the bases loaded. In the third, Omar Alfonzo hit an RBI ground-rule double in the third and Javier Rivas plated a run with a sacrifice fly to give the Curve a 4-0 lead. **Nate Furman** scored on a wild pitch in the fourth and **Victor Bericoto** hit an RBI single in the fifth to cut the deficit to 4-2. After a two-hour, 28-minute rain delay, Javier Rivas hit a solo homer in the sixth and Nick Cimillo added a three-run homer in the seventh for an 8-2 Curve lead.

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels play the fourth of a six-game series against the Altoona Curve, Double-A affiliate of the Pittsburgh Pirates. This is the third series between the two teams this year. From June 18-22, the Flying Squirrels went 3-2 in an abbreviated five-game series in Altoona. The Curve won four-of-six at The Diamond from August 12-17. Altoona leads the Southwest Division second-half standings over Richmond by 5.5 games with nine games remaining in the regular season.

PACKING THE HOUSE: This season the Flying Squirrels are averaging 6,578 fans per home game, which leads Double-A and ranks eighth among all 120 MiLB clubs. Their average of 7,290 in the season's first month was the highest April attendance in franchise history. Last year, the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A teams in average (6,595) and total (435,295) attendance. Among the 120 MiLB teams, the Flying Squirrels were 10th in average attendance. It was the third straight year the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A clubs in average and total attendance, which had not been done prior to 2022. Last year's total attendance was the highest since 2013 (434,769) and the fourth-highest average in team history.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS are in third place in the Southwest Division second-half standings, 5.5 games behind first-place Altoona. They won the final five games of last week's six-game series against Akron at The Diamond. After going 5-9 over 14 games from August 10-22, the Flying Squirrels have gone 7-4 in their last 11 games since August 23, but have lost the first three games of this week's series. Of Richmond's 75 losses this season, 41 of them have been by two runs or less (25 by one, 16 by two). Their 25 one-run losses are second-most in the EL, one less than Reading.

THE CURVE are in first place in the Southwest Division second-half standings, 5.5 games ahead of Richmond for the second-half postseason spot from the division. In their current six-game win streak, Altoona has outscored Harrisburg and Richmond, 56-17. Altoona's roster features seven of Baseball America's top-30 Pirates prospects, including SS/OF Konnor Griffin (No. 1), 2B Termarr Johnson (No. 7), RHP Antwone Kelly (No. 12), RHP Wilber Dotel (No. 13), OF/INF Mitch Jebb (No. 20), OF/1B Esmerlyn Valdez (No. 22) and C Omar Alfonzo (No. 25). MLB.com's top-30 Pirates prospects list features six Altoona players, including Griffin (No. 1), Johnson (No. 6), Valdez (No. 15), Jebb (No. 18), Alfonzo (No. 19) and Dotel (No. 28). Griffin is rated by both Baseball America and MLB.com as the No. 1 prospect in baseball.

FOR RICHMOND: Left-hander **Jack Choate** makes his 23rd start of the season and fifth outing of his career against the Curve. He started against Akron last Saturday and allowed two runs over four innings, striking out four. In his four previous career outings against the Curve, Choate is 1-2 with a 4.70 ER (8 ER/15.1 IP). Choate ranks fifth in the Eastern League in strikeouts (118) this season. Among EL pitchers (min. 90 IP), he ranks second in K/9 (11.02), second in K% (28.9%) and fifth in ERA (3.27). In his last 13 outings, including seven starts, since July 1, Choate has gone 3-0 with a 1.83 ERA (8 ER/39.1 IP). Last year, Choate spent most of the season with High-A Eugene, going 1-3 with a 2.90 ERA in 19 outings (18 starts). He was promoted to Double-A Richmond in August and made eight starts for the Flying Squirrels, posting a 1-4 record with a 5.82 ERA to close the season. Choate finished 2024 ranked first among qualified, full-season Giants minor-league pitchers in BAA (.231) and WHIP (1.21) while ranking second in ERA (3.79). Choate was selected by the Giants in the ninth round of the 2022 MLB Draft out of Assumption University. He entered 2025 ranked by Baseball America as the No. 28 Giants prospect and No. 27 by MLB.com. **For more on Choate, see page two.**

FOR ALTOONA: Left-hander Dominic Perachi makes his seventh Double-A start of the season and the third of his career against the Flying Squirrels. He last pitched on Saturday at Harrisburg and threw six scoreless innings, allowing two hits, in his second consecutive win. In his three previous career starts against Richmond, Perachi is 1-0 with a 5.52 ERA (9 ER/14.2 IP). He pitched at The Diamond on August 13 and allowed six runs over 3.2 innings in a no-decision. Perachi was selected by the Pirates in the 11th round of the 2022 MLB Draft out of Salve Regina University in Rhode Island.

DON'T RUN ON RICHMOND: The Flying Squirrels' catching unit of **Adrián Sugastey**, **Zach Morgan**, **Onil Perez** and **Drew Cavanaugh** have combined to catch 67 stolen base attempts this season, which first among the 30 Double-A teams and leads the Eastern League. Sugastey leads all Double-A catchers with 46 runners caught stealing. Sugastey has set a franchise record for the most caught stealing in a season in Flying Squirrels history, passing **Jackson Williams'** mark of 35 set in 2015 with his 36th on July 26 against Portland. For his career with Richmond, Sugastey's 59 runners caught stealing for his career is tied for the most in franchise history, even with Williams (2010-11, '15).

BERI BOMBS: **Victor Bericoto** has 11 homers this season, which leads all Richmond players for the year. He has 33 home runs in his Flying Squirrels career, which is tied for second-most in team history with **Jacob Heyward** (2019, '21-22) and four behind **Ricky Oropesa's** (2013-16) franchise record of 37. Bericoto now has 136 career RBIs with Richmond, trailing only Oropesa's record of 165. In his last 30 games since August 1, Bericoto is batting .337 (35-for-104) with three homers, three doubles, 16 walks and 19 RBIs.

IT'S BO TIME!: **Bo Davidson** is batting .306 (15-for-49) with four homers, a double and six RBIs in his last 11 games dating back to August 23. His nine-game hit streak was snapped on Wednesday night. Last Friday against the RubberDucks, he had his second two-homer game at Double-A and drove in three runs. Davidson has reached base in 17 consecutive games dating back to August 15, which is the longest streak by a Flying Squirrels player this season.

SECOND-HALF SABIN: In his last 17 games since August 9, **Sabin Ceballos** is batting .393 (24-for-61) with three homers, seven doubles and 18 RBIs. For the season, he leads the team lead with 47 RBIs. He had four consecutive multi-hit and multi-RBI games to close last week's series against Akron. In his last 40 games since July 3, Ceballos is batting .312 (44-for-141) with five homers, 11 doubles and 27 RBIs.

TAKE A WALK: **Diego Velasquez** has worked 65 walks this year, which is the third-most in a season in Flying Squirrels franchise history. Jacob Heyward set a new record with 80 walks in 2019 and Hayden Cantrelle moved into second on the list with 66 walks in 2023. Velasquez is tied for second in the Eastern League in walks this season.

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, **Diego Velasquez** is ranked tied for second in walks (65), seventh in hits (111) and 10th in OBP (.355). **Turner Hill** is tied for ninth in triples (5). **John Michael Bertrand** is first in ERA (2.94), third in innings pitched (125.2), sixth in BAA (.249) and sixth in WHIP (1.33). **Jack Choate** is fifth in strikeouts (118). **Joe Whitman** is sixth in strikeouts (115) and eighth in innings pitched (106.0). **Tyler Myrick** is tied for first in saves (10).

TOP SKIPPER: Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 255 wins in his career, which is a new franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23. From 2011-2013, **Dave Machemer** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship.

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster features four players are ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including **Bo Davidson** (No. 3), **Diego Velasquez** (No. 10), **Joe Whitman** (No. 11) and **Jack Choate** (No. 30). **John Michael Bertrand** is rated as having the best control in the Giants system. **Adrian Sugastey** is ranked as the top defensive catcher. **Aeverson Arteaga** is rated as the best defensive infielder and best infield arm. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features three Richmond players, including Davidson (No. 5), Whitman (No. 14) and Velasquez (No. 21).

THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

1967: The Richmond Braves beat the Rochester Red Wings, 2-0, in Rochester in a one-game playoff to determine the winner of the International League pennant. Mike Page drove in the game's only two runs with a single. Jim Britton started for Richmond and allowed two hits before starting the ninth inning. With two on, Skip Guinn worked to end the game. **1983:** The Richmond Braves beat the Charleston Charlies, 4-1, at Parker Field in Game 3 of the Governors' Cup semifinals to cap a three-game sweep. There was some confusion pregame, leading to the two teams sending 18 players to the field at once. Charleston was under the impression that, after offering Richmond the first three games at home because of a scheduling conflict, they would be the home team for Game 3. Richmond GM Richard Andersen did not have that understanding. IL President Harold Cooper was called and determined that Richmond would be the home team. After a half-hour delay to sort it out, the game began. In the bottom of the first, Larry Whisenont hit a solo homer for a 1-0 Richmond lead. Karl Pagel tied the score with a solo homer in the second. Richmond went ahead, 2-1, on a single by Chico Ruiz. Richmond starter Bob Walk escaped bases-loaded jams in the third and fourth. **1989:** The Richmond Braves beat the Syracuse Chiefs, 4-3, at MacArthur Stadium to clinch the Governors' Cup championship series in four games. Ron Gant brought in a run with a groundout in the first inning. Mark Lemke added an RBI single in the fifth for a 2-0 lead. Sal Campusano hit a two-out single to cut the score to 2-1 in the bottom of the fifth and tied the game in the sixth on a groundout by Otis Green. In the bottom of the eighth, Barry Jones belted a two-run homer to give Richmond a 4-2 lead. Syracuse scored a run in the ninth before Dwayne Henry worked a game-ending lineup. Tommy Greene allowed five hits over 7 2/3 innings. **2011:** The Flying Squirrels beat the Altoona Curve, 2-1, at Peoples Natural Gas Field to clinch their first postseason berth in franchise history on the final day of the regular season. After several innings of heavy rain, Richmond trailed, 1-0, in the top of the eighth inning. Wes Hodges drove a two-run homer to right to give Richmond a 2-1 lead. After the homer, the umpires called for a rain delay. After 89 minutes, the game was called official. The Bowie Baysox, who had won earlier in the day, finished a half-game behind the Flying Squirrels.
