TONIGHT'S GAME: The Quakes continue a crucial six-game road trip today, with the fifth game of a six-game set against the Fresno Grizzlies (COL) at Chukchansi Park in Fresno. After this six-game set, the Quakes will return to LoanMart Field for the final three games of the first half, as part of a six-game series against the Inland Empire 66ers on Tuesday, June 18. VS THE GRIZZLIES: Today's game is the fifth of 12 against the Grizzlies in 2024 and the fifth of six at Chukchansi Park in Fresno. Last season, the Quakes went 5-7 against the Grizzlies, just 1-5 here in Fresno. Last night's win is their second of the series and just the sixth for Rancho in 22 games in Fresno since they joined the Cal League in 2021.

LAST GAME: Juan Alonso snapped a scoreless tie with a two-run eighth-inning homer, as the Quakes shut out the Fresno Grizzlies by a final of 2-0 on Friday night at Chukchansi Park in Fresno. Alonso's homer was his second in as many nights and third of the year, as his round-tripper gave the Quakes a 2-0 lead against Fresno reliever Kannon Handy (1-1). Christian Zazueta (3.2 IP), Roque Gutierrez (3.1 IP) and newcomer Pedro Santillan (2 IP) combined on the five-hit shutout, with Santillan earning his first save in his Rancho debut. The Quakes had just five hits on the night, with Kendall George getting two of the five. Grizzlies' starter Jack Mahoney tossed six shutout innings, taking a no-decision. The win for the Quakes is their second straight in the series and the shutout is their fifth of the year.

WARMING UP?: After dropping 13 of 14 and falling from first place, the Quakes have now won five of their last ten games overall. Back-to-back wins for the Quakes in this series gives Rancho their first two-game winning streak at Chukchansi Park in team history, dating back to Fresno's first year in the Cal League in 2021. The Quakes had also not won consecutive games in a full month, since they downed Inland Empire in back-to-back home games on May 14 and 15, respectively. Consecutive wins keep Rancho two back of first-place Lake Elsinore, now with five to go in the first half. Rancho's last five games of the first half will be on the road at Fresno (2), then finishing at home with Inland Empire (3). The Storm are at home against Stockton (2) and then at Visalia (3) to end the half.

MORE ROSTER MOVES: On Saturday, the Quakes added tonight's starting pitcher, Sean Linan, as he fills a vacant spot on the roster. Infielder Jordan Thompson was promoted to Great Lakes of the High-A Midwest League on Friday. Thompson left the Quakes tied for the team lead in homers (8) and first on the club with 30 RBIs. Taking his spot on the roster is outfielder Jose Meza, who joins the team from the Arizona Complex League, where he was hitting .368 with three homers and 25 RBIs in just 26 games. Left-hander Garrett McDaniels was placed on the Injured List on Tuesday and right-hander Gabe Emmett hit the Injured List on Wednesday. Taking one of those two spots on the roster is right-handed reliever Pedro Santillan, who joins the club from the Arizona Complex League.

SEAN PAUL LINAN: Right-hander Sean Linan makes his Rancho debut tonight, as he'll start for the Quakes. Linan has made six appearances (one start) in the ACL this year, going 3-0 with a 2.08 ERA, allowing three runs on nine hits over 13 innings with 21 strikeouts and only two walks. Linan is from Columbia and signed with the Dodgers in 2022.

MCCADE BROWN: Right-hander McCade Brown makes just his second start for the Grizzlies and his first against the Quakes. In his lone start for Fresno, he allowed two runs on three hits with two walks over three innings in a no-decision at Modesto on June 8. Brown appeared in five games (three starts) to open the year in the ACL, going 1-1 with a 3.24 ERA over just 8.1 innings. Brown was a third-round selection by the Rockies in 2021 out of Indiana.
