Lehigh Valley IronPigs TBD vs. Worcester Red Sox RHP Blake Wehunt (1-1, 3.86)

Grab a Dozen - The Worcester Red Sox - now a season-high 12 games over .500 for the first time since September 12th of the 2023 season – play the finale of their 6-game series vs. the Lehigh Valley IronPigs (AAA-Philadelphia) this afternoon at 1:05 pm at Polar Park. Worcester has won 4 straight games, 8 of their last 9 overall, 11 of their last 12 home games, has gone 15-2 since July 22, and they are 24-7 since June 28. This impressive run (and their 24-13 record in the 2nd half) has put the WooSox into a tie for 1st-place in the 2nd half with Durham for the overall top spot in the 20-team International League (and the one playoff spot that comes with that). Worcester has 37 games remaining. Today's game is live on NESN+ and can be heard on NASH 98.9 FM

Sunday Funday - Worcester has enjoyed their Sunday games this season going 13-5 to post their best record of any day of the week/weekend. Worcester has also done well on both Wednesdays (13-6) and Thursdays (12-6), while they have suffered losing records on Tuesday (7-9), Friday (8-11), and Saturday (7-11). After today, the WooSox will have just 6 Sunday games remaining (3 at home & 3 on the road).

Halfway Home - While today marks the end of this series, it is only the halfway point to this season-long 12-game WooSox homestand (4-1 thus far) that will continue later this week and next weekend with a 6-game series vs. the Buffalo Bisons starting Tuesday at Polar Park. The WooSox will host the Bisons on Tuesday at 6:45 pm, Wednesday afternoon at 12:05 pm in the final weekday matinee of the season, Thursday & Friday nights (both at 6:45 pm), and then next weekend on Saturday at 4:05 pm and Sunday at 1:05 pm. After that the WooSox will have just a dozen home games remaining on the year.

This Series Thus Far – Lehigh Valley won the series-opener on Tuesday night, 10-5, but the WooSox have taken the next four games by scores of 10-1, 10-4, 5-4, and 19-0 yesterday tying their season-high for runs and establishing a season-high with 19 hits and their largest margin of victory this year yesterday.

Stats This Season vs. Lehigh Valley – Worcester is hitting .330 in the 11 games vs. Lehigh Valley this season (130-for-394) with 14 HR for their best average against any International League opponent. Sox pitchers are 7-4 vs. the IronPigs with a 4.36 ERA (47 ER in 97 IP). The Sox have out-scored the Pigs, 83-47. These two teams will eventually play another 6-game set in Allentown from September 8-13 to close out the WooSox 2026 road schedule.

Series Business - Worcester – up 4 games to 1 in this 6-game set vs. Lehigh Valley – has clinched their 5th straight “extended” series victory in a row. The Sox did lose both games of an abbreviated 2-game set at Scranton/Wilkes-Barre on July 17 & 19 but before and after that they have won 4 of 6 at Syracuse from June 30 – July 5, took 4 of 6 vs. Rochester from July 8-12, swept a 6-game series from Jacksonville from July 22-26, went 5-1 at Norfolk from July 28 – August 2, and are ahead 4 games to 1 now vs. the IronPigs.

High Times - The Worcester Red Sox – at 60-48 have reached a season-high 12 games over .500 for the first time since September 12, 2023 when they were 75-63. The WooSox peaked at 15-games over .500 on August 27 & 28 of 2023 (the latter at 70-55). Those remain their highest level since they finished their inaugural 2021 season with a 74-54 record. The WooSox are bidding for their 6th winning season in this their 6th year in Worcester.

Month to Month - The WooSox – coming off their best July ever (16-7) - remain hot starting August at 6-1.

First Things First – The WooSox – who scored 5 runs while batting around in the 1st inning yesterday – have far and away had their most productive inning all season in the 1st. Worcester has scored a total of 98 runs in the 1st inning. Their next closest inning is 77 runs in the 3rd inning.

The probable pitching match-ups for the upcoming series vs. Buffalo at Polar Park later this week and next weekend are TBD.

Adley Hadly a Really Good Game – Recently-acquired Boston Red Sox catcher **Adley Rutschman** made his Red Sox organizational debut on an injury rehab assignment with the Worcester Red Sox on Saturday going 1-for-2 with a 2-run double, 2 walks, and 2 runs scored while catching 5-innings of shutout ball.

The 28-year-old switch-hitter walked to lead-off the bottom of the 1st inning and eventually scored the game's first run when he alertly scampered home on an RBI single by Romy Gonzalez. Adley flew out to left field to end the 2nd inning and walked again in the 3rd inning. He batted for the fourth time in the first four innings and ripped a 2-run double to rightfield that was 104 MPH off the bat.

Rutschman also threw out a runner attempting to steal 2nd base to end the 1st inning and worked in tandem with starter Gage Ziehl to guide the rookie hurler through 5 scoreless innings in Ziehl's Triple-A debut.

Rutschman, a three-time American League All-Star who was dealt to Boston last Monday, had been on Baltimore's injured list since July 20 with left wrist inflammation.

On Monday at the trade deadline, the Red Sox acquired the three-time All-Star catcher from the Baltimore Orioles, along with catcher Jake Rogers and cash considerations, in exchange for catcher Carlos Narváez, minor league right-handed pitchers Anthony Eyanson and Kyson Witherspoon, minor league outfielder Enddy Azocar, and a player to be named later or cash considerations.

Rutschman, 28, has been selected as an American League All-Star in three of the last four seasons (2023-24, 2026), while winning a Silver Slugger Award and being selected to the All-MLB First Team in 2023.

The switch-hitter has played in 67 games for Baltimore this season, batting .251 with a .331 on-base percentage, .764 OPS, 30 runs scored, 19 doubles, 1 triple, 8 home runs, and 47 RBI while making 49 starts as the catcher and 16 as the designated hitter. He has thrown out 14 of 34 runners attempting to steal (41%), tied for the most in the Majors this season, while ranking fifth among catchers in FanGraphs' WAR (2.3) and strikeout rate (14.1%, minimum 200 plate appearances).

Adley was most-recently placed on the 10-Day Injured List with left wrist inflammation on July 20 and has also been on the IL this season with left ankle inflammation (April 11-20) and with a concussion (from June 18-27).

Selected by the Orioles with the 1st overall pick in the 2019 First-Year Player Draft (KC All-Star shortstop Bobby Witt, Jr. was the #2 pick), Rutschman has hit .254 with 69 HR and 277 RBI in 572 career Major League games, all with Baltimore (2022-26).

Rutschman, an Oregon native, had an outstanding collegiate career at Oregon State University where he led the Beavers to the 2018 College World Series Championship and was named CWS Most Outstanding Player with 17 hits and 13 RBI during the series. In 2019 he hit .411 with 17 HR & 58 RBI to earn the Golden Spikes Award as the nation's top player along with the Dick Howser Trophy and the Buster Posey Award given to the nation's best catcher. In addition, during his freshman year of 2017, Adley was the placekicker for the Oregon State football team.

Can't Beat 'em More Than Once – The WooSox have avoided losing back-to-back games for the past 22 days. The WooSox last lost two in a row on July 17 & 19 at Scranton/Wilkes-Barre by 7-6 and 5-4 scores respectively. Since that point they have won 15 of their last 17 games.

Extended Stay – Between July 22 – August 16, the WooSox will eventually play 18 of 24 games at Polar Park. They are 15-2 thus far overall during this span (10-1 at home and 5-1 on the road). On the year, Worcester is 32-22 at home compared to 28-26 on the road.

An Impressive Stretch – While winning 15 of their last 17 games since July 22, Worcester's stats during this stretch have been outstanding. The team is batting .302 (171-for-566) with 16 HR while Sox pitchers are 15-2 with a 3.12 ERA (52 ER in 150 IP). The WooSox 5-game winning streak from July 29 – August 2 came to an end on August 4. Worcester's recent 6-game winning streak (July 22-26) was their longest since their club-record 9-game winning streak last year from June 1-11, 2025.

Close Encounters – 10 of the last 21 WooSox games have been decided by 1-run with the WooSox going 7-3 in those. Furthermore, 16 of the last 31 WooSox games have been decided by 1-run (Sox winning 11 of those 16). Worcester is 19-15 in 1-run games.

Defense Wins Championships – Worcester has committed just 2 errors in their last 13 games.

Daydream Believer – The WooSox come into play today with a 28-16 record in day games compared to a 32-32 mark at night

Home Show – This current 12-game homestand is the longest for the WooSox this season and their only one this year to feature two different opponents. Worcester has played nine extended homestands of 12 games or more - featuring two series each – since they were born in 2021 (not including this current homestand). They have had three different 13-game homestands (one winner & two losers) and six 12-game homestands (four winners & two losers).

This Season vs. Lehigh Valley – The WooSox lead the 2026 season-series over the IronPigs by a 7-4 margin (4-1 here at Polar Park and 3-3 in Allentown, PA. The teams split a 6-game set in Allentown, PA from June 16-21. After this week/weekend, which is Lehigh Valley's only visit to Polar Park this season, the teams will eventually play another 6-game set in Allentown from September 8-13 to close out the WooSox 2026 road schedule.

Pigs in a Blanket – Worcester has beaten the IronPigs 60 times in their last 98 meetings dating back to September 11, 2021.

Series Matters – The WooSox – up 4 games to 1 in this 6-game set vs. Lehigh Valley – have thus clinched this series and are 11-7-2 in their 20 series thus far...11 wins, 7 losses, and 2 splits. Last year, Worcester went 8-9-10 in their 27 series played... 8 wins, 9 losses, 10 splits. Including this series, the Sox have seven 6-game series remaining this year (4 at home and 3 on the road). Worcester has 19 home games left at Polar Park (including today) and 18 away games remaining.

Homer Haven – Worcester has homered in 38 of their last 52 games since June 4 for a total of 56 HR. The WooSox are 45-19 when they homer in a game this season, however, they are next to last in the International League with 102 HR on the year.

Ups and Downs – Worcester has been a streaky team over the last 2½ months. The WooSox had a 5-game losing streak from May 19-23, a 4-game winning streak from May 26-30, a 5-game winning streak (June 4-9), a 4-game losing skid right after that (June 10-13), a 3-game losing skid (June 18-20), a 5-game losing streak (June 23-27), and right after that a 4-game winning streak from June 28 – July 2. In July the WooSox had another 4-game winning streak from July 5-9, recently a season-best 6-game winning streak from July 22-26, and even more recently a 5-game winning streak (July 29 – August 2).

Plead the Fifth – Worcester endured their third 5-game losing streak from June 23-27. They also had 5-game losing streaks from May 19-23 (all at home vs. Rochester) and from April 14-18 (all in Nashville). Worcester's longest losing streak all of last year was also 5 games (April 25-30, 2025). They have not lost 6 straight since a 6-game losing streak from May 22-28, 2024. Their longest losing streak in their 5½-year history came in 2022 when they lost 10 consecutive games from May 5-15, 2022. The WooSox – who recently owned a season-high 6-game winning streak (July 22-26) – also had 5-game winning streaks from July 29 – August 2, from June 4-9 and from March 31 – April 5 all in St. Paul, Minnesota. Their club-record is a 9-game winning streak last year from June 1-11, 2025.

Highs and Lows – The WooSox are currently a season-best 12-games over .500 at 60-48. They have been exactly .500 a total of 13 times this season. The WooSox dipped to a season-low 4-games under .500 on June 27 at 36-40. Their low point last season was 4-games below on April 11 at 4-8. They have not been 5-games under .500 since August 16, 2024 (56-61).

Weather or Not – The WooSox have had 5 games cancelled due to inclement weather (4 in the 1st half and 1 in the 2nd half) and 5 others postponed this season. Overall they have lost 4 home openings and 6 road openings due to inclement weather. Last year the WooSox set a new club record for most home games either postponed or cancelled in a single season with 9, along with 2 other road games postponed, for a total of 11 PPD.

A History-Making Month – July of 2026 will be a month to remember in both Red Sox and WooSox Nation. The Boston Red Sox, under a certain former WooSox manager, had their best month in their nearly 126-year history going 21-4 in July. Meanwhile, the Worcester Red Sox might not have been able to equal their big brothers in Boston, but they matched the best month in their almost six-year history finishing with a 16-7 record this July.

The End of a Very Fine July – The WooSox finished 16-7 in July to tie for the best month in Worcester club-history. The 2021 WooSox also went 16-7 (.696) during September of their inaugural season. Worcester's winningest month ever in terms of victories was July of 2024 when they went 18-10 (.642). Worcester batters hit .270 this July (199-for-737) with 23 HR while Sox pitchers had a 4.72 ERA during the month (103 ER in 196.1). The Sox out-scored their opponents, 145-113 in July. Furthermore, Worcester's 145 runs scored in July were the most of any club in the 20-team International League and their 40 stolen bases during the month were 2nd most in the league (Jacksonville had 45 SB).

July Leaders – **Kristian Campbell** led the WooSox in batting in July with a .379 average in 19 games (22-for-58) with 4 2B, 2 HR, 11 RBI, 13 walks (tied for most on team), and 15 runs scored (to lead the club). **Mickey Gasper** was next with a .367 average in 18 games (22-for-60) with 6 2B, 2 HR, 10 RBI. **Andrew Knizner** at .327 in 15 games (18-for-55, 6 2B, 2 HR, 13 RBI) and **Braiden Ward** at .322 in 17 games (19-for-59, 3 2B, 2 3B, 1 HR, 6 RBI, 12 SB) also had excellent Julys. **Vinny Capra** and **Brett Harris** led the team with 14 RBI apiece. **Tyler McDonough**, sent to Double-A Portland on July 28, batted .357 in 14 games with 3 HR & 12 RBI. On the pitching side, **Angel Bastardo** went 4-0 with a 2.45 ERA in 9 relief appearances in July while **Tyler Uberstine** was 1-1 with a 1.88 ERA in 8 games.

June Tune – The WooSox went 11-13 in June suffering their second straight losing month. The WooSox went 10-15 in May after a 17-12 mark in March/April. Worcester pitchers had a 4.65 ERA in June (109 ER in 211 IP) while batters hit .245 (197-for-805) with 26 HR. The Sox were out-scored by their opponents, 124-109 in June.

Final June Leaders – OF **Allan Castro** (.305 in 22 games) led the WooSox in batting in June followed closely by INF **Mikey Romero** (.300 in 19 games). Romero led the team in HR (5) while Castro led the club in RBI (14). Among regular pitchers, RHP **Oswaldo Berrios** was 2-1 with a 0.57 ERA in 7 games while RHP **Wyatt Olds** was 1-1 with a 0.93 ERA in 9 games in June.

May We Skip the Month – Worcester's 10-15 record in May was the second worst month they have ever had behind only a 10-16 month of July during their inaugural season of 2021. Worcester has been remarkably consistent in their history and more recently since August of 2024 they have had just three losing months in their last ten months. The WooSox went 15-10 this April.

Monthly Team Stats for May – Worcester hitters batted .235 this May (193-for-823) with 41 doubles, 4 triples, and 22 HR in 25 games while WooSox pitchers had a 4.85 ERA (118 ER in 219 IP) with 29 HRA. The Sox out-scored by their opponents, 126-110.

Monthly Individual Leaders for May – WooSox May leaders offensively included: **Anthony Seigler** at .344 in 18 games in May with 3 HR & 14 RBI and **Nate Eaton** at .289 in 19 games with 6 2B, 1 3B, 2 HR, 9 RBI. On the pitching side: **Tommy Kahnle** made 11 scoreless relief appearances in May covering 11 shutout innings; **Alec Gamboa** was 1-2, 1.89 in 5 G, 3 GS; **Eduardo Rivera** was 3-0, 2.20 in 8 RA; and **Noah Song** was 1-0, 2.25 in 7 RA.

An Enjoyable April – After going 2-2 to begin the season from March 27-31, Worcester posted a winning April going 15-10. The Sox finished April alone in 1st-place in the International League East Division. The 15 wins this April equal the most Worcester won in any month last season when they went 15-10 in June and 15-13 in August.

April Stats Leaders – As a club the WooSox batted .252 in April with 19 HR while Sox pitchers had a 4.63 ERA with 24 HRA. Worcester out-scored their opponents during the month, 127-122. **Vinny Capra** led the Sox in average in April hitting .322 in 18 games with 7 2B, 2 HR, 13 RBI, and a team-high 18 runs scored. **Matt Thaiss** (.324 in 11 games with 2 HR & 11 RBI), **Nate Eaton** (.301 in 23 games with 5 2B, 1 3B, 3 HR & 10 RBI), and **Kristian Campbell** (.294 in 23 games) all enjoyed fine Aprils. Leading pitchers during the month were **Payton Tolle** (2-0, 0.82 in 2 GS) and **Jake Bennett** (2-0, 1.00 in 4 GS) while **Tayron Guerrero** was the best out the bullpen posting a 1.13 ERA in 7 relief appearances with 2 saves.

A Winning Tradition – The 2025 Worcester Red Sox went 76-73 to post a winning season for the fifth time in as many years of existence (and for the fourth year in a row under former manager Chad Tracy). Worcester finished 41-33 during the first half last year and then 35-40 in the second half. Overall the 2025 WooSox went 40-34 at home compared to 36-39 on the road. The Pawtucket Red Sox posted five straight winning seasons just once in their 47 years as Boston's Triple-A affiliate – that coming from 1996-2000.

How the WooSox Have Won - The 2021 WooSox had a 74-54 record during their abbreviated inaugural season, the 2022 WooSox finished 75-73, the 2023 club posted a 79-68 mark, the 2024 team matched that win total going 79-71, and as mentioned the 2025 squad went 76-73. Heading into this season, the WooSox were 383-339 all-time for a .530 winning pct. including a 195-168 record at home compared to a 188-171 mark on the road.

Fun Fact – Of the 301 players who have played for the Worcester Red Sox in their nearly 6-year history (up to today), a total of 219 of them have played in the Major Leagues (73%) including 148 with the Boston Red Sox (49%).

Portland Sea Dogs Update – The Double-A Portland Sea Dogs (21-17)/(56-50) were 14-0 losers at New Hampshire last night. Michael Sansone (3-2) suffered the defeat – 5 IP, 9 H, 6 R, 6 ER, 1 BB, 3 SO. Enough said about that game.

WOOSOX ROSTER MOVES – None today to announce as of this morning. The WooSox will soon add RHP **Greg Weissert** who was optioned from Boston on Friday.

Weissert, 31, tossed 1.0 inning of relief in Thursday night's game against the White Sox. The right-hander has pitched in 48 games for Boston this season, going 3-2 with a 3.97 ERA (20 ER/45.1 IP) and 44 strikeouts. Selected by the New York Yankees in the 18th round of the 2016 First-Year Player Draft, the New York native owns a 3.43 ERA (79 ER/207.0 IP) with 192 strikeouts in 211 career Major League games with the Yankees (2022-23) and Red Sox (2024-26).

On Friday, the Boston Red Sox signed eight-year Major League veteran reliever **John Brebbia** and assigned him to Worcester. The 36-year-old righty, who was born in Boston and pitched at Sharon, MA High School, was released by Colorado this past Tuesday (August 4). He pitched in 3 games for the Rockies this season – 4.1 IP, 7 H, 5 R, 5 ER, 0 BB, 2 SO and worked in 13 games for Albuquerque (AAA-Colorado) going 0-1, 1.62 –16.2 IP, 17 H, 4 R, 3 ER, 1 BB, 19 SO. He also pitched in 15 games for St. Paul (AAA-Minnesota) this season going 1-0, 6.20 – 20.1 IP, 22 H, 14 R, 14 ER, 10 BB, 26 SO.

Brebbia began last season with the Detroit Tigers, pitched for the Gwinnett Braves of the IL, and the Atlanta Braves before being designated for assignment on September 8, 2025. He was added to the WooSox roster last September 13 but came down with an illness and did not pitch for the remainder of the season.

John was born in Boston and split his high school career between Sharon High School (a small town about 30 miles south of Boston) and later Wellington High School in Florida. He was chosen by the Yankees in the 30th round of the 2011 June Draft out of Elon University. In 379 career Major League games (358 in relief) he has a 16-22 record with a 4.12 ERA including 416 SO in 382.2 IP. He pitched for St. Louis from 2017-19, San Francisco from 2020-23 (and had one of his best seasons in 2022 when he appeared in 76 games (11 starts) and went 6-2 with a 3.18 ERA for the Giants), the White Sox & Atlanta in 2024, Detroit & Atlanta in 2025, and Colorado in 2026.

Worcester has made a total of 185 player moves thus far this season. The all-time Worcester (and Pawtucket) franchise-record is 281 player moves in 2024.

The WooSox went three consecutive days without a player transaction from May 30, May 31, and June 1 (although they did not play on June 1) for only the second time all year. Just after their season-opener, Worcester did not make a move during four straight days from March 28-31. Otherwise, they have not gone more than back-to-back days without making a player transaction all season.

The WooSox have used a total of 63 players already this season (41 pitchers and 22 position players). RHP John Brebbia will be #64 when he first appears. The all-time Worcester (and Pawtucket) franchise-record is an incredible 84 players used during the 2024 season (47 pitchers and 37 position players).

Furthermore, 18 different WooSox players have been promoted directly from Worcester to Boston this season (not counting rehabbers). The lucky list: RHP Zack Kelly, RHP Tyler Uberstine, LHP Tyler Samaniego (three times), RHP Jack Anderson (twice), LHP Eduardo Rivera (twice), LHP Payton Tolle, OF Nate Eaton (twice), LHP Jake Bennett (twice), LHP Alec Gamboa (five times), C/INF Mickey Gasper, INF Nick Sogard (twice), RHP Tyron Guerrero, INF Anthony Seigler (twice), RHP Tommy Kahnle, INF Tsung-Che Cheng, INF Brett Harris, RHP Brayan Bello, and LHP Raymond Burgos. In addition, the WooSox had their manager, Chad Tracy and hitting coach, Collin Hertzler both promoted to Boston for those same roles with the Red Sox on April 26.
