**REACHING BASE: INF Michael Massey** becomes the first Storm Chaser this season to reach base in 15 consecutive games, a streak spanning parts of three series. The streak began on June 16 and is tied for the sixth longest active streak in the International League. During the streak, Massey is reaching base at a .388 clip with 19 hits and four walks. Massey has failed to reach base in only one game with Triple-A Omaha after coming to the club from Double-A Northwest Arkansas. **INF Nick Pratto** has an on-base streak that is just one game behind Massey's at 14-games, looking to hit the 15-game benchmark today.

**LAUNCHING IT :** Omaha comes into today needing two homers to tie a team-best for home runs in a series. The last time that the Storm Chasers hit 12 long balls in a series was during the third series of the season against Memphis. The Chasers have 10 homers this series which is the most through the first five games in a single series. Omaha has had nine through the first five games of a series twice, most recently at Iowa. All three times that Omaha has recorded 10 homers in a series were on the road against Memphis, Louisville, and St. Paul this week. The Chasers have recorded half of their homers this week in the first inning, more than in three total series this season. Omaha hit three homers in the first on Thursday, the most long-balls in an inning this season.

**SCORELESS STREAKS:** Three Omaha relievers hold the longest active streaks for games without allowing an earned run in the International League. **RHP Andres Núñez** threw 11 innings yesterday to move his scoreless streak to 15 games (18.0 innings) and tie **RHP Colten Brewer** who on Friday threw his 15th consecutive game without allowing an earned run (14.2 innings). **LHP Foster Griffin** is on a 12-game scoreless streak and is tied with Charlotte's Brandon Finnegan for third longest active streak in the league. All three Storm Chasers are behind **RHP Brad Peacock** who had an 18-game streak of not allowing an earned run that was snapped mid-June at 20.0 innings. Peacock's streak stands as the longest in the International League this season.

**CROSSING THE PLATE: INF Nick Pratto** has scored a run in six consecutive games, a streak that is tied with Columbus' Will Brennan for longest active streak in the International League. Pratto has two homers, five RBIs, and five walks during the streak. Pratto has been on base 10 times, scoring eight times during the streak that started last Sunday against the Clippers.

**FOR OMAHA: LHP Drew Parrish** heads to the mound to make his fifth Triple-A start after starting the season with Double-A Northwest Arkansas. Parrish went 6.0 innings on Tuesday, getting the bookend starts this series. In the game, he allowed a career-high tying seven hits, but made it through six complete innings and allowed just two earned runs with two strikeouts for his first quality start for the Storm Chasers. Parrish has now thrown five quality starts between the two levels, going a combined 3-0 in those starts. Opponents are better against Parrish early in the inning, with his opponent batting average dropping with each out recorded. With no outs, Parrish allows a .357 batting average and a .250 average with one out. With two away in an inning, opponents hit just .190. Parrish was drafted out of Florida State in the eighth round by the Royals in 2019, moving up to Triple-A in just his third professional season.

**FOR ST. PAUL: RHP Aaron Sanchez** toes the rubber for his fifth start with the Saints. Sanchez started the season in Washington's organization at the Triple-A level before moving up to The Show. Sanchez was designated for assignment at the end of May, electing free agency rather than the outright assignment back to Rochester. The Twins signed him a week later and assigned him to St. Paul. In his last start, Sanchez went 5.0 innings, allowing three earned runs on five hits with five walks and three strikeouts. The 2010 34th overall pick was drafted by the Toronto Blue Jays and made his MLB debut in July of 2014. Sanchez was traded to the Houston Astros in 2019 before signing with the San Francisco Giants in 2021.

### PARRISH NOTES

- Transferred to Triple-A Omaha on June 3, looking to make his first appearance above the Double-A level.
- Named Double-A Texas League Player of the Month of May, winning two straight weekly awards during the month
- Has pitched 5.0 or more innings in each of his last eight starts with Double-A NW Arkansas. Four of his last six were quality starts.
- Finished the 2021 season with Double-A NW Arkansas. Had 5-4 record across 18 appearances with 17 total starts.
- Split the 2021 season between High-A Quad Cities and Double-A NW Arkansas. Started the season with High-A Quad Cities, tossing 15.2 innings of scoreless ball, allowing just three walks with 23 strikeouts.
- Played for Team USA in the 2021 WBSC Olympic Baseball Qualifiers, appearing in one game for the U. S. Threw 2.0 scoreless innings out of the bullpen to earn the win against Canada and helped Team USA qualify for the Tokyo Olympics.
- Went 3-0 in nine games (four starts) for the Burlington Royals with a 2.52 ERA in 2019. He struck out 39 strikeouts with just four walks in his first season as a professional. Did not allow a run in five of his nine appearances with Burlington.
- Drafted in the eighth round of the 2019 MLB Draft by the Kansas City Royals/
- Made two trips to the College World Series with Florida State (2017 & 2019). Went 8-5 with 112 strikeouts across 17 appearances with 16 starts in final season with FSU. Started and ended his season with memorable games. He pitched 5.0 innings in a combined no-hitter against Maine, getting the start in the 10th no-hitter in school history. Went 8.0 scoreless innings in his final game of his FSU career, helping the Seminoles beat No. 5 Arkansas in CWS opener.
