RHP KARL KAUFFMANN (4-6, 7.34) vs. LHP JACKSON WOLF (2-8, 7.76)

TODAY'S GAME: Albuquerque and El Paso meet for the fifth and final series between the two clubs in 2024 ... The Isotopes have won one set, split two and lost one over the first four series played against the Chihuahuas ... Karl Kauffmann is scheduled to toe the rubber for Albuquerque while Jackson Wolf is slated to start for El Paso.

SERIES RECAP: With the doubleheader sweep by Salt Lake, the Isotopes and Bees split the opening series of the second half, snapping Albuquerque's two-series winning streak. The club moves to 2-9-3 on the year over 14 series played.

DOUBLEHEADERS: The Isotopes fall to 74-84 in doubleheaders all-time and 32-36 at home after getting swept by Salt Lake. It's the 22nd time the club has been swept and 11th at home. Albuquerque hadn't been swept in a doubleheader since Sept. 7, 2022, vs. El Paso.

VS. SALT LAKE: It was the eighth all-time doubleheader against the Bees and fifth since 2019. Second time the Bees have swept the Isotopes in team history (other: July 27, 2019, in Albuquerque) ... Salt Lake claimed the season series, 7-5, and have won two-straight season series over the Isotopes (2023: 9-6).

PERFECT GAME BID: In Game 1 Sunday, Salt Lake pitchers Ryan Langford, Ryan Miller and Kenyon Yovan combined to spin 5.1 perfect innings—the longest perfect game bid in Isotopes Park history (previous: 4.1, Memphis' Jamie Garcia, Sept. 9, 2009, Game 1 of the PCL American Conference Finals).

DOUBLE-DIGITS: The Isotopes permitted double-digit runs in two-straight contests for the sixth time this season after allowing 11 runs Friday and 13 in Game 1 Sunday (last: May 30-31 vs. Oklahoma City, 11-2 and 14-5).

ATTENDANCE: Over 45 openings, Albuquerque has tallied the third-highest total attendance in all of Minor League Baseball (296,330) and highest in the Pacific Coast League.

9TH INNING RUNS: The Isotopes allowed eight runs in the ninth inning of Game 1, tied for the most tallies permitted in the ninth in 2024 (also: March 31 vs. El Paso).

OPPOSING STARTER: In Game 2 Sunday, Salt Lake's Reid Detmers fanned 11 Isotopes, tying the most by an opposing starter in 2024 (also: Ryan Wroblecki, June 22 at Oklahoma City).

MARGIN: The 13-2 loss in Game 1 Sunday was the eighth time in 2024 the club lost by double-digits (last: June 2vs. Oklahoma City, 13-2).

MR. JONES: Over Greg Jones' last eight games since being sent to Albuquerque, slashing .371/.421/.714 with five multi-hit games, a double, triple, three homers and five RBI.

ON BASE STREAK: Greg Jones' 21-game on-base streak in starts ended after striking out four times in Game 2 Sunday, compiling a .314/.392/.570 slash line with five doubles, a triple, five homers and nine RBI. Additionally, his eight-game hit streak was snapped

T-BONE: Trevor Boone swatted his fourth homer of the year Sunday, second-straight and third in his last seven games. Has hit homers in back-to-back games for first time since May 28-29, 2022, with Single-A Fresno.

STOVIE: Hunter Stovall's season-high 11-game hit streak came to an end in Game 1 Sunday. During the stretch, he slashed .400/.462/.622 with seven multi-hit games, four doubles, two homers, 10 RBI and six walks. It was his longest hit streak since a 12-gamer with Double-A Hartford (Aug. 23-Sept. 7, 2022).

HIS NAME IS DREW: Drew Romo belted his 10th homer in Game 1 Sunday, his third since June 22 (eight total games) ... Four of his 10 homers came in June.

TAKE FLIGHT: Jimmy Herron's seven-game hitting streak ended in Game 1 after going 0-for-4. During the stretch, he slashed .290/.313/.419 with a double, homer and five RBI.

JC: Julio Carreras tripled in two runs in Game 2 Sunday for his third multi-RBI game of the year and first since May 25 at Salt Lake ... Swiped his 20th bag of the season June 19, establishing a new career high.

VANDY: Connor Kaiser connected on a two-run walk-off double Friday night in the 11th inning for a 12-11 win over Salt Lake ... His three RBI Friday established a season-high.

PCL LEADERBOARD: Drew Romo is 7th in average (.302) ... Sean Bouchard is T-5th in triples (5) ... Julio Carreras is T-6th in SB (20) ... Greg Jones in T-*th in stolen bases (19).

TEAM STATS: Offensively in MiLB, the club is 1st in triples (.39), and total bases (1,352), 2nd in hits (784), slugging (.476) average (.276), 3rd in OPS (.831) and 7th in runs (476).

TWO OR FEWER: The Isotopes were held to two runs or fewer for the 20th time in Game 1 Sunday, seventh in June and first since getting blanked at Sacramento June 9.

NUCLEI NOTES

SKIPPER: Pedro Lopez enters his 20th year as a minor league manager and second guiding the Isotopes, the eighth manager in club history ... Spent 2021 as Albuquerque's hitting coach and 2022 as its bench coach ... Notched his 1,000th career managerial victory June 4, 2023 at Salt Lake, 7-1. Managed in the Texas Rangers (2001-05, 2007) and New York Mets (2011-19) organizations while claiming the 2014 Eastern League Championship with Double-A Binghamton. Lopez was drafted in the 21st round by the San Diego Padres in the 1988 MLB Draft and spent 13 years in the minor leagues, reaching Triple-A on four occasions.

HOMETOWN KID: Jordan Pacheco begins his third season as the Isotopes hitting coach ... An Albuquerque native and 2004 graduate of La Cueva High School, Pacheco then attended the University of New Mexico (2005-07), where he was one of the most prolific offensive players in school history (.384, 59 2B, 25 HR, 145 RBI) ... Drafted by Rockies in the 9th round in 2007 and made his MLB debut with Colorado in 2011.

CHRIS MICHALAK: Begins his second season as Isotopes pitching coach ... Pitched for the Albuquerque Dukes in 2000, followed by stints with the Isotopes in 2004 and 2008 ... Started second-to-last game in Dukes history, giving up two runs in 6.0 innings during Game 4 of a PCL First Round playoff series at Memphis Sept. 9, 2000 ... Appeared in 61 Major League games (24 starts) over five seasons with the Arizona Diamondbacks (1998), Toronto Blue Jays (2001) Texas Rangers (2001-02) and Cincinnati Reds (2006) ... 12th round selection by the Athletics in 1993 ... Has been in the coaching ranks since 2009, including stops as the pitching coach for the Hagerstown Suns (2010-11), Potomac Nationals (2012-13) and Harrisburg Senators (2014-17). He was also the Minor League pitching coordinator for the Miami Marlins from 2018-20 and coached in the Washington Nationals organization from 2021-22.

MICHAEL RYAN: Enters his first year with the Rockies organization as the Isotopes bench coach ... It's his second stop in Albuquerque after the former outfielder played in 33 games for the club and hit nine homers during the 2008 campaign. He and Michalak were teammates on that squad for four days in late July ... Entered the coaching ranks in 2012 as a coach for the Double-A Altoona Curve (Pirates). He then managed in the Pirates organization at three levels for seven seasons with stops at Single-A West Virginia (2013-14), High-A Bradenton (2015-16) and Double-A Altoona (2017-19), while winning the Florida State League in 2016 and Eastern League in 2017. Ryan compiled a 221-197 managerial record with Altoona—the most wins for a manager in Curve history ... He also managed in the Cubs organization (High-A South Bend, 2021 and Double-A Tennessee, 2022-June 2023) ... A 5th round draft pick by the Minnesota Twins in 1996, played in 149 MLB games over parts of five seasons with the Twins (2002-05) and Angels (2010) ... Last Angels player to wear 27 prior to Mike Trout's call-up in 2011.

SPLIT-SEASON PLAYOFF FORMAT: For the second-straight year, the Pacific Coast League will use a split-season format to determine playoff participants. With one 10 team division, the first half winner (concluding June 23) will host the second half winner (beginning June 25) in a three-game set. The winner will then face the International League champion for the Triple-A Championship in Las Vegas, NV, Sept. 28.

BALLS AND STRIKES: The Automated Ball-Strike System (ABS), now in its third year in the Pacific Coast League, will be used for all Monday-Thursday games while the Challenge System, second year in the PCL, will be used for all Friday-Sunday contests. Each team has three challenges per game, retaining one for each successful challenge.

- 2019 D1 Baseball Third Team All-American
- Appeared in 48 games (34 starts) for the Wolverines from 2017-19, compiling a 19-10 record and 2.99 ERA
- His 12 wins in 2019 tied him for the program record in a single season with Rich Stoll (1982-83) and Tommy Henry (2019)
- Came within one out of a nine-inning complete game shutout on May 31, 2019 against Creighton in an NCAA Tournament game

- ♦ Made 16th start of season June 26 vs. El Paso and earned third win of season, second-straight and third in last four starts ... Spun 5.0 shutout frames and allowed just one hit and three walks with six punchouts ... Was the third Albuquerque starter to work at least 5.0 scoreless frames in 2024 (also: Tyler Danish, May 1 vs. Round Rock, 5.2; Noah Davis, June 7 at Sacramento, 5.0) ... Induced six groundout and one flyout over 19 batters faced with a season-high 14 swings and misses ... Retired eight of first nine hitters (error) ... Worked around two bases in both the third and fourth ... Fanned three in the fifth
