HIGHLIGHTS
A WILL DESERVED PROMOTION: The Yankees promoted No. 7 prospect Will Warren from Somerset to Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre on Wednesday. He was initially promoted to Somerset on May 29, 2022 and went 7-6 with a 4.02 ERA and 83 K's in 94 IP pitched in 18 games started in an Eastern League Championship winning campaign. Warren concluded his time in Somerset with wins in back-to-back starts over 12 consecutive scoreless innings, posting a 2.45 ERA in 29.1 IP with 39 K 's this season. TOP OF THE RANKS: Following the graduation of Anthony Volpe, Somerset's roster now features four of the Yankees' top five prospects per MLB Pipeline; Jasson Dominguez (No. 1), Austin Wells (No. 2), Everson Pereira (No. 4), and Trey Sweeney (No. 5).

LOCKED IN: Yesterday marked Brandon Lockridge's third straight game with both a hit and stolen base. Since 4/27, Lockridge has been on base in 13 straight games, the longest onbase streak of any Patriot this season. Across the streak, he is 16 -for-38, slashing .421/.521/.711 with 6 XBH, 9 SB, 10 R, and 6 RBI. EVER (SON) LASTING: Yankees No. 4 prospect Everson Pereira's two-hit performance yesterday, which included a solo home run in the 3rd inning, marked his second straight multi-hit game and seventh multi-hit game of the season. Pereira now has a 981 OPS over his last eight games, with $10 \mathrm{H}, 4 \mathrm{HR}, 6 \mathrm{R}$, and 8 RB over that span. OFFENSE GALORE: Over the first two games of the six-game set between the Patriots and Fightin' Phils, the two teams have combined for 34 R on 41 H including 7 HR , an average of 1.88 runs per inning. Somerset's 14 R scored on Tuesday in a 14-10 win were their most since 4/18 vs. New Hampshire.

PITCH SELECTION: Fastball (94-96), Changeup (upper 80s), Slider (low 80s), Cutter
2023: In his second start of the season and at the Double-A level on 4/12/23@BNG, Fitts struck out a ca-reer-high 10 batters, which was the most he had struck out in a game since high school. Fitts earned his first Double-A win in his fourth start of the season on 4/26/23 @HBG with six shutout innings.
2022: Split his pro debut season between Single-A Tampa and High-A Hudson Valley, winning Pitcher of the Week honors three times en route to being named a MiLB.com Yankees Organization All-Star in 2022. Began the season with 17 GS in Tampa, going 3-8 with a 5.01 ERA ( $79.0 \mathrm{IP}, 73 \mathrm{H}, 93 \mathrm{~K}, 17 \mathrm{BB}$ ). Won his first Florida State League Pitcher of the Week award on $6 / 27 / 22$, after going 6.0 IP with 6 K , BB and allowing just one hit on $6 / 25 / 22$ vs. CLR. During his final week with Single-A Tampa, won FSL Pitcher of the Week for a second time on $8 / 8 / 22$, following another 6 IP, 0 R, 1 H, 7 K performance on $8 / 5 / 22$ vs. CLR. Promoted to Hudson Valley on $8 / 9 / 22$. Earned South Atlantic League Pitcher of the Week honors after he took a perfect game into the eighth inning on $8 / 27 / 22$ vs. HIC ( 8.0 IP, ER, $2 \mathrm{H}, 0 \mathrm{BB}, 7 \mathrm{~K}$ ). Struck out a career-high nine batters in his penultimate start of the season on 9/1/22 vs. JS. Across 5 GS to end the season in Hudson Valley, Fitts went $4-0$ with a 0.55 ERA (2 ER in 33.0 IP) with a 0.61 WHIP and .152 BAA. Cumulatively on the year, he went $7-8$ with a 3.70 ERA and his 0.98 WHIP was the lowest of any qualifying Yankees minor leaguer in 2022.
2021: Did not pitch following the 2021 MLB Draft.
College: In three seasons at Auburn (2019-21), went 6-6 with a 5.23 ERA in 40 appearances ( 14 starts). Heading into his junior season at Auburn, he was named Second Team Preseason All-America by D1 Baseball, Third Team Preseason All-America by Baseball America and was named to the Golden Spikes Award Preseason Watch List.
Personal Notes: Attended Helena High School (AL) and was named a 2018 Rawlings-Perfect Game Honorable Mention All-American, after posting 102 K with a 1.68 ERA as a senior. Named a 2017 Perfect Game Underclass High Honorable Mention All-American, after he missed most of the season with an injury, but Helena won the AHSAA 6A State Championship and finished No. 1 in a national poll. Named All-Shelby County Honorable Mention as a sophomore. Brother, Trevor, played baseball at Mississippi State, before becoming an assistant coach at Austin Peay and now at the Tigers' High-A affiliate in West Michigan. Fitts grew up a Washington Nationals fan from the point that Stephen Strasburg debuted with the team, because he admired Strasburg growing up. Career Notes: Selected by the Yankees in the 6th round of the 2021 MLB Draft.

## RAUL DOMINGUEZ: Manager (1st year)

Dominguez begins his 1st season as manager for the Somerset Patriots, 9th overall as a manager and 17th overall coaching in the Yankees organization. He spent the past two seasons (20212022) as a defensive coach for Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre and was assigned to the same post for 2020, before the minor league season was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Dominguez becomes the 5th manager in Patriots franchise history and the 3rd since becoming the Yankees Double-A affiliate. He succeeds 2022 Eastern League Manager of the Year Dan Fiorito. Dominguez also previously served as the defensive coach for Trenton (2018-2019) and Tampa (2017). The Panama City, Panama native has managerial experience with the GCL Yankees East (2016), DSL Yankees 1 (2011-15) and DSL Yankees 2 (2009-10). From 2012-2015, his teams finished at least 10 games over .500, including reaching the DSL semifinals in 2012 and 2015. An outfielder during his playing days, Dominguez signed with the Yankees as an undrafted free agent in 2001 and spread four minor league seasons for New York between the DSL and the GCL. He then began his coaching career in 2008 with the DSL Yankees 2, after spending 2007 as the Yankees' tryout scout in the Dominican Republic. \ggg Assistant coach bios on next page. \ggg


## GRAYSON CRAWFORD: Pitching Coach (1styear

Grayson Crawford begins his 1st season with Somerset after making his professional coaching debut as the pitching coach for Single-A Tampa in 2022. Under his guidance, Tampa's Yordin Calderon hurled a seven-inning no-hitter for the Tarpons in his Single-A debut on May 25, 2022. Prior to joining the Yankees, Crawford coached in high school and college from 2010 on, most recently serving as pitching coach for two seasons at Lipscomb University (Nashville, TN)

## JAKE HIRST: Hitting Coach (2nd year)

Jake Hirst returns for his 2nd season in Somerset and 5th with the Yankees. Under his guidance in 2022, the Patriots slugged a franchise record 205 HR, which led all Double-A teams and ranked 3rd in MiLB. The team also led the Eastern League in TB $(1,984)$, SLG $(.445)$, and OPS
 Somerset, he severed as hitting coach for Hudson Valley (2021) and the GCL Yankees West (2019-2020).

## AARON BOSSI: Defensive Coach (2nd year)

Bossi returns for his 2nd season in Somerset. Under Bossi's leadership in 2022, Patriots infielder Jesus Bastidas was awarded a Minor League Gold Glove for his work at second base. Additionally, with Bossi leading Somerset's base-running program in 2022, Somerset paced all Eastern League teams with 205 stolen bases. Bossi made his coaching debut as Hudson Valley's defensive coach in 2021 and prior to that helped assist rehabbing players at the Yankees minor league complex.

Sweeney went undrafted out of St. Xavier and EIU was the only college to offer him a scholarship. In high school, he hit . 389 as a senior with 41 RBI and 18 SB en route to leading St. Xavier to a Kentucky State Baseball Championship. His name is Trey because he's the third child in his family, which is also why he chooses to wear No. 3. Upon signing his $\$ 3$ million bonus after being drafted, the only major purchase he made was a new set of golf clubs--while he bats left-handed, he golfs right-handed. Sweeney combined with Max Burt to come up with Somerset's 2023 "Patriot" themed home run tradition of wearing a tri-fold hat and using a feathered pen to sign a scroll in the dugout after each homer.

Entering the 2023 season, Wells has been recognized by Baseball America for being the "Best Power Hitter" in the Yankees minor league system.

2021: In Wells' pro debut season during 2021, he combined to hit .264/.390/.476 in 103 games with an OPS of .886, 16

Wells spent two seasons with the University of Arizona Wildcats, playing in 71 games and hitting .357 with a 1.036 OPS with $7 \mathrm{HR}, 74 \mathrm{RBI}$ and 85 R. Among his honors while at Arizona, Wells was first named Pac-12 Freshman of the Year in 2019, when he was also a Freshman All-American honoree per Collegiate Baseball, Baseball America, NCBWA and Rawlings. In 2020, Wells was a Collgiate Baseball Second-team All-American and was named to the Buster Posey National Collegiate Catcher of the Year Award watch list (top NCAA catcher). During the summer of 2019, Wells played in the Cape Cod League with the Yarmouth-Dennis Red Sox. In 42 regular season games, where he was named a Cap Cod League All-Star starter, after hitting . 308 with 7 HR, 26 RBI and 23 R. Wells was named a 2019 Cape Cod League Outstanding Pro Prospect.

## Personal Notes

Wells spent his preps career at powerhouse Bishop Gorman High School in his hometown of Las Vegas, combining to hit. 428 with 87 RBI and 85 during his preps career. He was named team captain and Most Valuable Player as a junior and senior. As a junior, Wells was the 2017 Nevada Gatorade Player of the Year. Upon graduating high school, Wells was originally selected by the Yankees in the 35th round of the 2018 MLB Draft. After electing to play college ball at Arizona, the Yankees selected him again in the first round of the draft two years later, 28th overall. For the second consecutive season, Wells is living with close friend and former teammate Anthony Volpe's family in Watchung, New Jersey.

Selected by the Yankees in the 1st round of the 2020 MLB Draft, making him the fourth Yankees catcher chosen first round of the MLB First-Year Player Draft since its inception in 1965, joining Anthony Seigler (2018), David Parrish (2000) and Thurman Munson (1968).
