Tonight's Game

The Clippers will send RHP **Triston McKenzie** to the mound tonight, trying to stay above .500 on the road (current series is third road series loss; went 18-4-3 in 2019). Toledo will counter with RHP **Pedro Payano**. The Clippers are 20-22 (.476) against right handers this year. Payano has pitched against the Clippers twice in his career, going 1-1 with an 8.38ERA (9.2IP, 12H, 9R, 9ER, 4BB, 12K).

vs. the Mud Hens

Columbus went 14-9 against the Mud Hens in 2019, snapping a two year losing streak (7-13 in 2018, 10-13 in 2017), while posting a margin of 4.6 in wins (seven by 4+) and losing by an average of 5.6 (six by 4+). Of the last 22 played between the two, 11 have been decided by at least five runs. **Nolan Jones** has hit .316 (18x57) with 2HR and 10RBI against Toledo this season (17G).

Cooling Off

The Clippers came into Toledo as the hottest team in the IL (14-6), but have lost four of five to the Mud Hens, scoring three runs or fewer in each of the losses. Through 52G, they have scored fewer than four 24 times (three shutouts, only team in IL with zero games with a single run). Friday night's 7-run outburst was the 15th of the season with at least seven (12th in the last 23G).

Power Outage

Coming into the final game of the series, the Clippers have just 3HR in the first 5G and are in danger of their lowest series output this season (had 4HR in 5G at Louisville in the season opener). In the previous trip to Fifth Third Field (5/18-5/23), the Clippers had 9HR, including 7HR over the last 3G. The 57K so far in the series represent the 4th most in a series this year (66K vs. Nashville, 5/25-5/30).

Getting the Call

Alex Call was promoted from Akron Tuesday and has gone 5x20 with 2HR in 5G. Call used a hot June (.329, 27x82) to climb into the top ten of the EL batting race (9th, .310) and also populated the top ten in OBP (10th, .389), doubles (7th, 13), runs (6th, 34) and steals (2nd, 12) at the time of his call up. His 2HR game Wednesday night was his second of the month (6/4 vs. Erie) and fourth of his career.

Missing Again

Following a 7G hit streak from 6/18-6/25 (.346, 9x26, 5K), **Daniel Johnson** is 3x26 with 15K in his last 7G (all with multiple strikeouts). The current multi-K streak is the longest of the season for Johnson and the third one of at least 4G this year (5/27-5/30 and 6/13-6/17). He ended the month of May with seven multi-K games in eight tries (5x35, 21K) and struck out at least once in 19 straight from 5/11-6/1.

Work to Do

Owen Miller is batting .236 (13x55) since returning from a three week stint in Cleveland, picking up his first 3-hit game Friday (had five 3-hit games before promotion). He was hitless in four straight from 6/18-6/22 (14AB) and saw his average sink to .324 on 7/1 (season low). Miller is 4PA short of qualifying for the batting title and adding them as hitless AB would place him 5th (would rank 4th in OBP).

Take Two

The double from **Nolan Jones** last night was his IL-best 19th of the year (**Oscar Mercado** is 5th, 13). Jones is slugging .595 over his last 25G, collecting 14 doubles, a triple, 3HR (6XBH through first 26G) and only 21K (had 43K in first 26G). Thanks to his current tear, he is on pace for 43 doubles, a number that would set the franchise record (42 by **Kurt Bierek** in 1999; Bierek played in 135G).

Double Struggle

Gavin Collins and **Tyler Krieger** are starting together for the fourth time since 5/29 vs. Nashville. Following that game, they have hit a collective .086 (7x81) with Krieger going 4x40 and Collins 3x41. The Clippers are 3-3 when they start together, as they hit .225 (9x40) when starting with each other (.108, 12x111, without). Both players are 0x5 in the current series (Krieger has most recent hit, 6/26).

Bullpen Bashers

The Clipper bullpen got tagged for 3ER last night (had given up at least 4ER to the Mud Hens in four straight, from 6/20-7/2), and now has a 5.67ERA (74.2IP, 47ER) against Toledo (4.26ERA, 162.2IP, 77ER against all others). Toledo has scored a total of 28 runs from the 7th inning on against Columbus in only 17G, while all others in the IL have scored 38 runs from the 7th inning on in 35G.

This Date in Clipper History

7/4/1982

In a double header at Syracuse, Clipper pitcher **Lynn McGlothlen** broke **George Bell's** jaw with a pitched ball. The fireworks started when Syracuse pitcher **Jackson Todd** retaliated by throwing two pitches at **Otis Nixon's** head, inciting a bench clearing brawl. The Clippers and Chiefs split the double header with Columbus taking game one 8-1 and Syracuse prevailing 9-1 in the second game.

Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 years since the move downtown, Huntington Park has ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game, totaling 2.25 per contest (1,763HR, 783 games). In 2019, HP averaged over three per game for the first time ever (seventh time averaging over a pair), as the Clippers surrendered a record 127HR and just missed out on triple digits themselves (97HR was second highest team total). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (967 to 925).

Record Destruction

The Clippers broke the established mark for homers in a season (182 in 1983) on 8/7/19 and finished with a total of 213 (most in the IL). From 5/14-6/2, they homered in 20 straight games (44HR total) and they had seven straight multi-HR games from 6/14-6/21 (22HR). On the mound, they broke the record for homers allowed (156 in 1998) on 7/31/19, giving up 198 for the year (2nd most in the IL).

Ain't Over 'Til It's Over

From 2014-19, no team had more come from behind victories than the 210 posted by Columbus and no team produced a better winning percentage when trailing than the .353 of the Clippers (Scranton/WB was 2nd in win percentage, .338, and wins, 192). This year has seen the Clippers go 10-28 (.263) in games in which they trail, ranking 10th.

Get What You Pay For

Columbus was the last team in the IL to play free baseball this season, playing 85 straight games, including the postseason, between extra-inning rumbles on 7/31/19 vs. Louisville (11-8 loss in 11) and 6/26/21 vs. St. Paul (6-4 loss in 10; two straight extra-inning losses following nine straight wins, 8/21/18-7/3/19). The regulation-inning streak was the longest for Columbus dating to the 1984 season (as far back as the day by day records go) and 45 straight to start the season was also a record.

Trending Downward

The current staff ERA of 5.11 is on pace to be the worst in franchise history (5.08, 1983) and anything over 4.71 will mark the fifth straight season in which the ERA has gotten worse. From 2011-16, the Clipper staff turned in a sub-4.00ERA five times in six seasons (zero such seasons from 1993-2010), including the best two ERAs of the past 32 years (3.33 in 2015 and 3.65 in 2016). The 5.76ERA at Huntington Park is by far the worst ever (5.29 in 2019, only time ERA has ever been over 5.00 at HP).

Doing Damage

In 2019, the Clippers ranked tied for 5th in the IL with 112RBI with the bases loaded, while carrying a .252 average (10th, 36x143, 4HR). In both 2017 and 2018, the Clippers led the IL in RBI with the bases loaded (243RBI total) and paced the circuit in grand slams (16 total, no other team had more than eight).

Free Swingers

After three straight seasons leading the IL in strikeouts, the Clipper lineup is threatening for a fourth, as they currently rank 5th (509K, 37 off the pace, St. Paul). The 2019 squad obliterated the franchise record, as they struck out 95 more times than the previous high (1,392; each of last three seasons rank among franchise's three worst, totalling 3,979K in 422G). While the record appears safe due to the truncated schedule, this year's version is averaging 9.79K per game.

That's More Like It

In 2019, the Clippers were 50-30 (.625) when playing errorless baseball, while turning in a 31-29 (.517) mark with at least one error. Contrary to logic, in 2018 they actually had a worse winning percentage when playing mistake free (.514), than when committing at least one error (.530). The Clipper defense finished 1st in 2019 (.983) after falling to 6th in the IL in 2018, ending a run of three consecutive seasons ranked among the top three (2015-17 resulted in the three best seasons in franchise history).

One On, No Out Success

When the leadoff batter of an inning reached base in 2019, the Clippers plated him nearly 60% of the time (over 51% only once in the last six seasons, 55% in 2016). Getting more than one base was a specialty of Clipper hitters, as they led the IL with 136XBH to lead off the inning, including 54HR (led the IL, had 28 leadoff homers in 2018). From 4/13-4/20/19, the Clippers hit 16 leadoff doubles over 72 innings, including four straight innings in a win at Louisville on 4/15/19.

Good Baseball

Oscar Mercado advanced a runner with a sac bunt on 6/26 vs. St. Paul and the runner came around to score in the loss (3-1 when advanced runner scores). During 2019, the Clippers struggled in the bunt department, but when the advanced runners scored, they were 7-1. During 2018, Columbus was 23-2 in games in which a run was scored after a good bunt attempt.

International Accolades

Bobby Bradley was named International League Player of the Month for May 2019, reaching base in 24 of 25 games during the month while hitting .302/.374/.740 with 12HR (led IL) and 28RBI. **Brandon Barnes**, **Eric Haase**, **Josh Smith** and **Asher Wojciechowski** were named to the 2019 IL All-Star Team and Bradley, Barnes and Haase were selected to the postseason squad.

Manager Profile

Andy Tracy makes his Clippers debut in 2021, following **Tony Mansolino's** championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; **Gene Michael**-79, **Joe Altobelli**-80, **Frank Verdi**-81, **Bucky Dent**-87 and **Mike Sarbaugh**-10). This season marks Tracy's second year as a manager (first with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 54-74 (.422), 24-28 with Columbus (.462).

At Long Last:

On 6/6 at Indianapolis, McKenzie made his Triple-A debut, over two years after it was expected. Following a dominant run in Double-A during the 2018 season, McKenzie missed the entirety of 2019 after suffering a strained right rotator cuff in spring training and then a strained right pectoral later in the summer. McKenzie then debuted in the Major Leagues in 2020, pitching in 8G, and made the opening day roster for Cleveland to start 2021. After a rough start, he was optioned to Columbus on 5/22, but was recalled on 5/26 (**Zach Plesac** injury) before he could pitch for Columbus. McKenzie was optioned a second time, on 5/27, but was recalled on 5/31 (double header) before suiting up with Columbus. He was optioned a third time on 6/1 and when he started on 6/6, he became the second Clipper this season to debut in Triple-A after his MLB debut (**Andres Gimenez**).

Boring Day for Fielders:

On 5/1 at Chicago (AL), McKenzie pitched to 11 batters and not one of them put the ball in play (in the field, at least), as he mowed down the White Sox with 3K in the 1st inning. The 2nd inning was much rockier though, going: walk, strikeout, strikeout, walk, walk, walk, grand slam, strikeout. In the Majors, over 46% of the outs recorded by McKenzie came via the strikeout (59 of 127) and 20% of batters faced drew a base on balls (8HR allowed led to a three true outcome rate of 56%). That trend continued into Triple-A, as McKenzie saw three true outcomes to the first eight batters faced of his 6/17 start vs. Toledo (HR, BB, BB, BB, K, K, K, K).
