ABOUT SUNDAY: Brooklyn ended an already fruitful week with a bang, beating Jersey Shore 18-1 on Sunday in the series finale to complete the six-game sweep. 3B **William Lugo** went 4-for-6 with a home run, four RBIs, and four runs scored. Every other starter in the lineup reached base safely at least once. SS **Shervyen Newton** drove in four runs, while OF **Stanley Consuegra** and C **Matt O'Neill** each plated three runs. LHP **Nathan Lavender** struck out seven over 3 1/3 innings of relief, but RHP **Jeffrey Colon** truly put a bow on the day, fanning nine batters in the final five innings to earn the save.

HOW GOOD A WEEK WAS IT?: In the six-game sweep in Lakewood, NJ, the Cyclones outscored the BlueClaws 53-18 and finished the head-to-head matchup having won the final 13 matchups.

SHERVYEN FOR PRESIDENT: INF **Shervyen Newton** won the South Atlantic League's Offensive Player of the Week Award for his week in New Jersey against the Phillies High-A farm club, going 9-for-23 (.391) with three doubles, three home runs, 10 RBIs, and eight runs scored in the six-game sweep.

ON THE PLUS SIDE: Brooklyn sits 62-58 which is four games better than .500 for the first time since all season. The previous high water mark came on April 22 when the team was 8-5. At Brooklyn's lowest point, the Cyclones were nine games under at 22-31 on June 10.

DIVISION ON THE LINE: Including today, the Cyclones have 12 games remaining and two series: six games vs. Wilmington, and six games at Winston-Salem. Brooklyn is vying for a playoff spot with a second half division title in the North Division of the South Atlantic League, sitting in second place just a half game behind first place Hudson Valley.

PEROZA PRODUCING: Since July 9, INF **Jose Peroza** has a OPS of .913 over his past 40 games with

vs. WILMINGTON: The Washington Nationals affiliate comes back to Coney Island for the final meeting of the season. The Blue Rocks, from Wilmington, DE are 12-9 against the Cyclones in 2022. Wilmington hosts four of Washington's Top 30 prospects, according to MLB Pipeline: No. 10 OF Jeremy De La Rosa, No. 27 LHP Mitchell Parker, No. 29 LHP Evan Lee, and No. 30 C Drew Millas. a 27-game on-base streak. The 22-year-old Venezuelan has been on base in 38 of the past 40 games, hitting .327 with a .416 OBP. In August, Peroza is tied for the league league with 32 hits and nine doubles.

CRACKING THE CRABS: OF **Alex Ramirez** leads all Mets minor leaguers with 125 hits, sitting 11 hits ahead of 3B **Brett Baty** who has stopped accumulating minor league hits, now playing third base for the New York Mets. Ramirez also leads the organization with seven triples. The No. 4 Mets prospect is having a breakout season with a .784 OPS and 11 of his 16 career home runs and 67 of his 102 RBIs.

JT JOLTING: Since returning from injury on August 17, 1B **JT Schwartz** is hitting .310 with a .851 OPS, going 13-42 with four doubles, a home run in 10 games. Coincidentally, Schwartz's first game back from injury was also the day he fell from the No. 19 spot in MLB Pipeline's Top 30 Mets list to being out of the ranking.

MASTERS OF THEIR DOMAIN: The Cyclones have allowed the fewest runs in the league and the fourth-fewest in Minor League Baseball, having allowed 477 runs in 120 games (4.0 runs/game).

TONIGHT: Santos faces Wilmington for the fifth time in 2022.

AGAINST THE ROCKS: Santos has posted a 4.50 ERA in 18 innings against the Washington Nationals this season, allowing 17 hits.

INNINGS EATER: Santos ranks second in the Mets organization with 104 innings pitched, sitting one inning behind leader and teammate Dominic Hamel. Last year, Junior tossed 96 innings as a career high,

HIGH-RANKING MEMBER: Santos ranks as the top pitching prospect on the staff, ranking No. 16 according to *MLB Pipeline* and No. 17 according to *Baseball America*.

BREAKOUT: The 20 year old pitched with Low-A St. Lucie in 2021, tossing 96 innings which doubles the workload he turned in in 2019 (40.2 IP) and 2018 (45). This season marks the second full season assignment for the righty.

VALUED MEMBER: Santos signed with the Mets in 2018 for \$275,000 out of Santiago in the Dominican Republic.

OPENING DAY STARTER: Junior Santos made Brooklyn's Opening Day start in Wilmington, Delaware on Saturday evening. It was Santos' fourth Opening Day and first Opening Day start since 2018 when he pitched for the DSL Mets against the DSL Angels. In that outing, he struck out six over three innings of one-run ball.
