### RHP CHASE SILSETH (0-3, 10.22) vs. RHP PETER LAMBERT (0-1, 5.59)

**TODAY'S GAME:** The Isotopes claimed yesterday's matinee, 6-1, to take a 2-0 series lead over Salt Lake ... Albuquerque has won four of its last five contests over Salt Lake in the Duke City and 18 of 23, dating back to 2021 ... Peter Lambert is slated to start for the Isotopes while Farmington, NM, native Chase Silseth is expected to take the hill for the Bees.

**SERIES:** Albuquerque has won the first two contests of a series for the first time since Sept. 12-13, 2023 at El Paso. The last time it had taken place at home was May 23-24, 2023 vs. Round Rock.

**DUBS:** The Isotopes have won five of their last six contests and 10 of 13.

**DINGERS:** Albuquerque belted one homer yesterday and have homered in 13-straight games (24 during stretch), the longest streak since May 18-June 2, 2023 (14).

**ON THE BOARD:** Albuquerque has scored first in four consecutive games, tying their season-high reached on two previous occasions (also: April 2-5, April 14-18).

**HITS ALLOWED:** Albuquerque tied a season-best by allowing just five hits yesterday (also: April 18 at El Paso, June 18 at Oklahoma City). The five hits allowed are the fewest they have relented in a home game since the 2023 season finale vs. Oklahoma City (four).

**FIRST INNING TALLIES:** The Isotopes have plated runs in the first inning in three-straight games, their longest streak since April 13-17 vs. Sugar Land, at El Paso.

**KEEPIN' IT 100:** For the year, the Isotopes have tallied 103 home runs and 106 stole bases. No other MiLB or MLB team has reached triple digits in both categories yet in 2024.

**TOPES STARTER:** Karl Kauffmann became the third Albuquerque starter to work at least 5.0 scoreless frames in 2024 (also: Tyler Danish, May 1 vs. Round Rock - 5.2; Noah Davis, June 7 at Sacramento - 5.0). His one hit relented is the fewest for an Isotopes hurler (min. 5.0 IP).

**DAY BASEBALL:** The Isotopes improved to 8-9 in day games this season, including 5-2 at home.

**ATTENDANCE:** Over 41 openings, Albuquerque has tallied the fourth-highest total attendance in all of Minor League Baseball (267,951) and second-highest in the Pacific Coast League (most: El Paso, 42 openings, 272,402).

**MR. JONES:** Greg Jones stole second and third base after walking in the second inning yesterday, the seventh time this season he has registered multiple thefts with Albuquerque ... Over his last four games since his demotion from Colorado, he is 7-for-17 with a homer, one RBI, five runs scored and four stolen bases.

**STOVIE:** Hunter Stovall increased his hitting streak to nine games with a 2-for-4 showing yesterday, including an RBI single. Stovall is 15-for-36 with four doubles, two homers and eight RBI during the stretch. He owns the second-longest active hit streak in the PCL (longest: Will Wagner, Sugar Land - 10) ... It's his longest streak since Aug. 16-27, 2023, also nine).

**BIG WILLIE STYLE:** Willie MacIver mashed his eighth homer of the year yesterday, a three-run blast ... Has four homers since June 12 ... Recorded his second three RBI game of the season (also: June 12 vs. El Paso).

**TAKE FLIGHT:** Jimmy Herron went 2-for-4 yesterday, his eighth multi-hit performance of the 2024 campaign and fourth in the last 10 contests dating back to June 15 vs. El Paso.

**HIS NAME IS DREW:** Drew Romo has drawn a walk in consecutive games for the first time since Aug. 31-Sept. 3, 2023 with Double-A Hartford (three-straight).

**GRANNY:** Grant Lavigne has a hit in three-straight games for second time in June (also: June 15-20, four games) ... Belted his 11th homer of the year Tuesday and fourth since June 18 (eight games). Recorded his second homer off a lefty. Tallied his second three RBI game of the year, a season-high (also: May 7 at El Paso).

**JC:** Julio Carreras swiped his 20th bag of the season last Wednesday, establishing a new career high.

**PCL LEADERBOARD:** Drew Romo is 7th in average (.301) ... Aaron Schunk is 2nd in doubles (24), 9th in XBH (33) and 10th in hits (80) ... Julio Carreras is 6th in SB (20) ... Greg Jones in 7th in stolen bases (19).

**TEAM STATS:** Offensively in MiLB, the club is 1st in triples (35), and total bases (1,287), 2nd in hits (747), slugging (.476) average (.276) and OPS (.833) and 6th in runs (452).

**ERROR 404:** Julio Carreras has 15 miscues on the season while teammate Grant Lavigne (16) has the most errors of any Triple-A players.

## NUCLEI NOTES

**SKIPPER:** Pedro Lopez enters his 20th year as a minor league manager and second guiding the Isotopes, the eighth manager in club history ... Spent 2021 as Albuquerque's hitting coach and 2022 as its bench coach ... Notched his 1,000th career managerial victory June 4, 2023 at Salt Lake, 7-1. Managed in the Texas Rangers (2001-05, 2007) and New York Mets (2011-19) organizations while claiming the 2014 Eastern League Championship with Double-A Binghamton. Lopez was drafted in the 21st round by the San Diego Padres in the 1988 MLB Draft and spent 13 years in the minor leagues, reaching Triple-A on four occasions.

**HOMETOWN KID:** Jordan Pacheco begins his third season as the Isotopes hitting coach ... An Albuquerque native and 2004 graduate of La Cueva High School, Pacheco then attended the University of New Mexico (2005-07), where he was one of the most prolific offensive players in school history (.384, 59 2B, 25 HR, 145 RBI) ... Drafted by Rockies in the 9th round in 2007 and made his MLB debut with Colorado in 2011.

**CHRIS MICHALAK:** Begins his second season as Isotopes pitching coach ... Pitched for the Albuquerque Dukes in 2000, followed by stints with the Isotopes in 2004 and 2008 ... Started second-to-last game in Dukes history, giving up two runs in 6.0 innings during Game 4 of a PCL First Round playoff series at Memphis Sept. 9, 2000 ... Appeared in 61 Major League games (24 starts) over five seasons with the Arizona Diamondbacks (1998), Toronto Blue Jays (2001) Texas Rangers (2001-02) and Cincinnati Reds (2006) ... 12th round selection by the Athletics in 1993 ... Has been in the coaching ranks since 2009, including stops as the pitching coach for the Hagerstown Suns (2010-11), Potomac Nationals (2012-13) and Harrisburg Senators (2014-17). He was also the Minor League pitching coordinator for the Miami Marlins from 2018-20 and coached in the Washington Nationals organization from 2021-22.

**MICHAEL RYAN:** Enters his first year with the Rockies organization as the Isotopes bench coach ... It's his second stop in Albuquerque after the former outfielder played in 33 games for the club and hit nine homers during the 2008 campaign. He and Michalak were teammates on that squad for four days in late July ... Entered the coaching ranks in 2012 as a coach for the Double-A Altoona Curve (Pirates). He then managed in the Pirates organization at three levels for seven seasons with stops at Single-A West Virginia (2013-14), High-A Bradenton (2015-16) and Double-A Altoona (2017-19), while winning the Florida State League in 2016 and Eastern League in 2017. Ryan compiled a 221-197 managerial record with Altoona—the most wins for a manager in Curve history ... He also managed in the Cubs organization (High-A South Bend, 2021 and Double-A Tennessee, 2022-June 2023) ... A 5th round draft pick by the Minnesota Twins in 1996, played in 149 MLB games over parts of five seasons with the Twins (2002-05) and Angels (2010) ... Last Angels player to wear 27 prior to Mike Trout's call-up in 2011.

**SPLIT-SEASON PLAYOFF FORMAT:** For the second-straight year, the Pacific Coast League will use a split-season format to determine playoff participants. With one 10 team division, the first half winner (concluding June 23) will host the second half winner (beginning June 25) in a three-game set. The winner will then face the International League champion for the Triple-A Championship in Las Vegas, NV, Sept. 28.

**BALLS AND STRIKES:** The Automated Ball-Strike System (ABS), now in its third year in the Pacific Coast League, will be used for all Monday-Thursday games while the Challenge System, second year in the PCL, will be used for all Friday-Sunday contests. Each team has three challenges per game, retaining one for each successful challenge.
