FIRST HALF CHAMPS!: With the win over Hill City on June 7, the FredNats secured the Carolina League North's first-half title, the only first-half championship in Fredericksburg history. The title is the first for the franchise since the Potomac Nationals' 2018 win.

YOU'RE CALLED UP!: Tuesday's transaction brought a first for Fredericksburg's second-half, as Rafael Ramirez Jr. was called up to High-A Wilmington for the first time in his career. Ramirez becomes the first FredNat position player to be called up for the first time to High-A since Eli Willits, Jack Moroknek and Jacob Walsh, who were sent up right after the FredNats clinched the first-half title on June 9.

THE MILKMAN: After a dominant year in the Pioneer League with the champion Oakland Ballers, Noah Millikan signed into affiliated baseball this year. Coming from the same independent league as FredNat 1B coach Anthony Ray (who coached first for the Rocky Mountain Vibes last season), Millikan was the third Baller picked up by Washington over this past year, joining former FredNat Grant Manning and current FredNat Adam Bogosian. Millikan played briefly for the Winnipeg Goldeyes (American Association) this season prior to signing.

SUPERMAN OR THE COWBOY?: With a dealer's choice of nicknames, veteran FredNat Cristhian Vaquero has rejoined the club, added to the active roster on Sunday. Vaquero, who was signed for nearly \$5 million in 2022, began the year in High-A before rehabbing and then getting sent outright to the FCL. Vaquero has played 221 games in a FredNat uniform in his career, the most in club history.

DRAFT SIGNINGS: Washington signed 18/20 picks from the 2026 draft, missing just two high school draftees from the 16th and 17th rounds. The class was highlighted by college bats Chris Hacopian (Texas A&M) and Chase Brunson (TCU) in the top two rounds. The 2026 draft class should bring a late-season lift to the FredNats in a matter of weeks. The earliest draftee to ever debut in Fredericksburg was Dylan Crews, playing his first Single-A game on August 5, 2023.

HOME STRETCH: 35 games now remain in the regular season for the FredNats as they look to defend their second-half title from last year. The rest of the season is an even split between home and road series for the FredNats, who are guaranteed to host game two and three (if necessary) of both the division and league championship series.

ABOUT WILSON: Single-A affiliate of the Milwaukee Brewers, the Wilson Warbirds relocated from Zebulon, North Carolina in the offseason, where they were previously known as the Carolina Mudcats since 1991. Previously a Double-A club until joining the Carolina League in 2011, the team was previously affiliated with six other MLB clubs. The team is owned and operated by the Milwaukee Brewers, with notable recent Milwaukee alumni including Carolina League MVP Jackson Chourio and current no. 1 prospect by both MLB Pipeline and Baseball America, Jesus Made.

A RECORD BREAKING SEASON: Clinching a title on June 7 with a win against Hill City, the FredNats followed their title by winning their 46th game of the first half the following Wednesday, besting the 1982 Alexandria Dukes' 45-20 first half to break the franchise record.

ANOTHER RECORD FALLS: The FredNats broke another record during their last homestand, as the fastest team in franchise history to 50 wins. The previous record (as far back as game-by-game data exists to 2004), was set by 2013 Potomac, who needed 80 games. The record since relocation belonged to the 2024 team, who needed 85 games, with 2026 FredNats Austin Amaral and Travis Stehle winning games 49 and 50.

ABOUT LAST YEAR: The FredNats finished last season at 65-64 overall, winning the North division's second-half title to advance to the playoffs for the second straight year. The FredNats' season ended in a 2-0 series loss to Hill City in the Division Series.

FREDNATS BASEBALL NETWORK IS BACK: Once again, all 132 FredNat games this season will be broadcast live on the FredNats Baseball Network, with Luke West Poley and Adam Gotkin beginning their first seasons calling the action in Fredericksburg. Home games are broadcast on MiLB.tv and the Bally Sports Live App to go along with the audio-only stream at frednats.com/broadcast or the MiLB App. For road games, the radio broadcast is available at the same link. In addition, all FredNats games preceded by a 20 minute pregame show and postgame coverage following each night of action.

A LASTING LEGACY: The Fredericksburg Nationals adopt the franchise history of their predecessors in the Carolina League dating back to 1978...the Alexandria Dukes (1978, 1980-83) and Alexandria Mariners (1979) played at Four Mile Run Park in Alexandria, Virginia...the Prince William Pirates (1984-1986), Prince William Yankees (1987-1988), Prince William Cannons (1989-1998), Potomac Cannons (1999-2004) and Potomac Nationals (2005-2019) played at G. Richard Pfitzner Stadium in Woodbridge, Virginia...the franchise has won six Carolina League championships, as the Dukes in 1982, as the Yankees in 1989, and as the Potomac Nationals in 2008, 2010 and 2014. The franchise won its first league title as the Fredericksburg Nationals in 2024, defeating the Kannapolis Cannon Ballers and winning the title at Virginia Credit Union Stadium. The franchise has appeared in the Carolina League playoffs in three out of the last four seasons, and are playoff bound again in 2026 after the team's first-half division title.

Chris O'Neill - MANAGER

1st Season | Previously: Hitting Coach/Recruiting Coordinator, Virginia Commonwealth University

O'Neill, 36, joins the Nationals organization after two seasons (2024-25) as a hitting coach/recruiting coordinator at Virginia Commonwealth University. Prior to that, he served as an assistant coach and assistant recruiting coordinator at George Washington from 2022-24.

O'Neill is credited with helping fuel major offensive surges at both VCU and George Washington, as both schools set offensive records and contended for Atlantic 10 championships under his watch. O'Neill spent the 2021 season as the director of operations at Duke University and prior to that, he served as an assistant coach at Bucknell University (2020), Marshall University (2018-19) and the University of Maryland-Eastern Shore (2017).

This season will be O'Neill's first time managing since he led the Grand Lake Mariners (Great Lakes Summer Collegiate League) in the summers of 2016 and 2017. A Pennsylvania native, he received his Bachelor's degree in Education from King's College in 2012. O'Neill and his wife Kate have two boys, Easton and Callum.



Luke Dziados - PITCHING COACH

Dziados (D-Zay-Dis), 27, comes to the Nationals organization after spending the last two years as a pitching trainer at Driveline Baseball in Tampa, Fla. He capped his college pitching career at Villanova University in 2023 after pitching at Binghamton University from 2018-20. Dziados earned his Bachelor's degree from Binghamton in 2021 and also earned a Graduate Certificate in Leadership from Villanova in 2023.

Scheiner, 30, played seven seasons (2017-23) in the Phillies and Mariners organizations. A native of San Mateo, Calif., Scheiner was drafted in the fourth round of the 2017 First-Year Player Draft by the Phillies out of the University of Houston.

1st Season | Previously: Player Development Assistant, California State University, Northridge

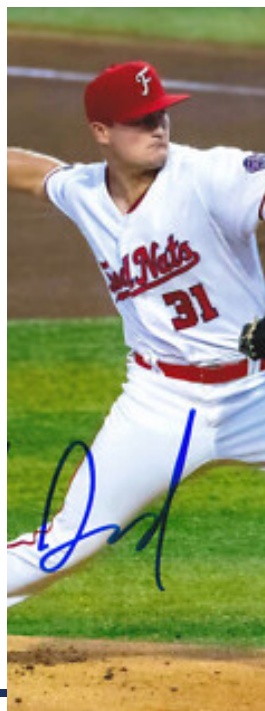

FredNats Career:

Brad Lord, drafted by Washington in the 18th round of the 2022 MLB Draft out of the University of South Florida, made his professional debut in Fredericksburg at the start of the 2023 season. Lord split time between the rotation and bullpen, starting eight games, and appearing in relief ten times. He threw to a 4.38 ERA across 61.2 innings, with only 18 walks. Lord was promoted to High-A after the all-star break.

Current Success:

Lord, now in his second big league season, saw a meteoric rise through the minor leagues after being promoted from Fredericksburg. He appeared in just one game in Wilmington in 2024, then split the rest of the season between Double-A Harrisburg and Triple-A Rochester. Lord then started the 2025 season in Washington and has appeared in 75 MLB games, mostly as a reliever. Lord has a career 4.20 ERA in the Majors and a 1.27 WHIP.
