## ALBUQUERQUE ISOTOPES (27-31) AT EL PASO CHIHUAHUAS (30-29)

Thursday, June 5, 2025 • 6:35 p.m. (MT) • Southwest University Park • El Paso, TX

**RHP ANTHONY MOLINA (1-5, 8.04) vs. LHP KYLE HART (2-0, 2.29)**

**TODAY'S GAME:** The Chihuahuas evened the series at a game apiece after a 14-4 triumph last night, ending Albuquerque's three-game winning streak ... The club has won eight of its last 11 and 11 of 18 ... Anthony Molina is expected to start for the Isotopes while Kyle Hart is slated to take the hill for the Chihuahuas.

**RUNS ALLOWED:** Albuquerque allowed 14 runs Wednesday, tied for the third-most relented in a contest in 2025. It's the first time the club has permitted double-digit runs since May 18 vs. Tacoma (11).

-It's the most runs surrendered in a game to El Paso since May 7, 2024 (15).

**BIG INNING:** The Isotopes permitted nine runs in the fifth inning last night, tied for the second-most in a frame this season (also: April 1 vs. Salt Lake, 8th inning). It's the second time Albuquerque has surrendered nine-plus to El Paso in an inning in 2025 (also: April 18, 10 runs in the fifth inning).

**HITS RELENDED:** The Isotopes allowed 17 hits yesterday, tied for the second-most in a game in 2025 (also: May 16 vs. Tacoma).

**MARGIN:** The 10-run margin of defeat last night is the highest since losing 11-1 on April 16 at Reno. It's the third time in 2025 the club has lost by double-digits (also: April 1 vs. Salt Lake, 15-1).

-It's the eighth time since 2021 the club has lost to the Chihuahuas by 10-plus runs (last: May 7, 2024, 15-5).

**RISP:** Over the first two games of the series, the Isotopes have gone 1-for-15 with runners in scoring position.

**GIDP:** Albuquerque grounded into three double plays last night for the third time this year and second in their last five games. The Isotopes have 50 GIDP on the year, the third-most in Triple-A.

**LOSS:** The Isotopes scored four runs on 11 hits Wednesday, the first time the club recorded a loss with at least 11 knocks and four runs or fewer since July 28, 2023, vs. Sacramento, 15-4.

**STARTER:** Bradley Blalock tossed 4.0 innings and allowed eight runs on 10 hits and two walks with three punchouts yesterday. The eight runs permitted are tied for the second-most in a game this season (three times).

**OPPOSING STARTER:** El Paso's Matt Waldron tossed 5.0 innings of two-run ball last night. 16th time this year and fifth in the last seven games an opposing hurler has held the Isotopes to two runs or fewer (min. 5 IP).

**RIT:** Ryan Ritter extended his career-long hit streak to 18 games last night, longest active in MiLB tied for the third-longest in the PCL in 2025. During the streak he is slashing .443/.489/.987 with 10 doubles, three triples, nine homers and 29 RBI ... The last Isotopes to tally a longer hit streak was Daniel Castro's 24-gamer from April 6-June 7, 2018.

-During hit streak leads MiLB in average, hits, total bases, doubles, homers, RBI, OPS and slugging ... Has 24-game on-base streak, longest active streak in PCL ... Has 13 multi-hit games in his last 17 contests and team-leading 20 in 2025 ... Has an extra-base hit in 15 of his last 17 contests ... Has increased batting average from .218 to .305 during streak.

-Since May 1, slashing .381/.441/.886 with 11 doubles, three triples, 12 homers and 33 RBI after hitting .224 over first 26 games. During stretch, leads all of MiLB in slugging, OPS, total bases, extra-base hits, tied for 1st in home runs, RBI.

**YF:** Yanquiel Fernandez belted his ninth homer of the year and recorded his third three-hit game of 2025 yesterday (last: April 23 at Reno) ... Registered two extra-base hits in a contest for the sixth time this season (last: May 30 vs. Sugar Land). Ended a three-game hitless streak.

**BIG MIKE:** Michael Toglia went 2-for-4 with a double last night, his first two-hit game since May 14 at Texas ... Has double in two-straight for first time since August 13-16, 2024, (three-straight).

**WARMIN' UP:** Warming Bernabel singled and is 5-for-11 in his last three games. Has a hit in eight of his last 10 contests (13-for-35 with four doubles and five walks).

**THE VET:** Austin Nola made his return from the Injured List Tuesday after missing 21 games and went 1-for-4. Has a hit in eight of his last nine contests.

**STERLIN:** Sterlin Thompson is slashing .381/.487/.683 with six doubles, two triples, three homers and 12 RBI in his last 17 games. Has 11 hit-by-pitch, the most in the PCL.

**AMADOR:** Adael Amador has a hit in 12 of 15 games with Albuquerque.

**PCL LEADERBOARD:** Ryan Ritter is 1st OPS (1.048), slugging (.635) and XBH (32), 2nd in homers (16) and total bases (129), T-2nd in runs (44) and RBI (45), 6th in OBP (.413), T-6th in triples (3) and hits (62) and T-8th in walks (34) ... **Warming Bernabel** is T-5th in doubles (16) ... **Sterlin Thompson** is T-6th in triples (3) ... **Julio Carreras** is 10th in stolen bases (11).

## NUCLEI NOTES

**SKIPPER:** Pedro Lopez enters his 21st year as a minor league manager and third guiding the Isotopes. He is the eighth manager in club history ... Spent 2021 as Albuquerque's hitting coach and 2022 as its bench coach ... Notched his 1,000th career managerial victory June 4, 2023 at Salt Lake, 7-1 ... Managed in the Texas Rangers (2001-05, 2007) and New York Mets (2011-19) organizations while claiming the 2014 Eastern League Championship with Double-A Binghamton. Lopez was drafted in the 21st round by the San Diego Padres in the 1988 MLB Draft and spent 13 years in the minor leagues, reaching Triple-A on four occasions.

**CHRIS MICHALAK:** Begins his third season as Isotopes pitching coach ... Pitched for the Albuquerque Dukes in 2000, followed by stints with the Isotopes in 2004 and 2008 ... Started second-to-last game in Dukes history, giving up two runs in 6.0 innings during Game 4 of a PCL First Round playoff series at Memphis Sept. 9, 2000 ... Appeared in 61 Major League games (24 starts) over five seasons with the Arizona Diamondbacks (1998), Toronto Blue Jays (2001) Texas Rangers (2001-02) and Cincinnati Reds (2006) ... 12th round selection by the Athletics in 1993 ... Has been in the coaching ranks since 2009, including stops as the pitching coach for the Hagerstown Suns (2010-11), Potomac Nationals (2012-13) and Harrisburg Senators (2014-17). He was also the Minor League pitching coordinator for the Miami Marlins from 2018-20 and coached in the Washington Nationals organization from 2021-22.

**MICHAEL RYAN:** Enters his second year with the Rockies organization as the Isotopes bench coach ... The former outfielder played in 33 games for the Isotopes and hit nine homers during the 2008 campaign. He and Michalak were teammates on that squad for four days in late July ... Entered the coaching ranks in 2012 as a coach for the Double-A Altoona Curve (Pirates). He then managed in the Pirates organization at three levels for seven seasons with stops at Single-A West Virginia (2013-14), High-A Bradenton (2015-16) and Double-A Altoona (2017-19), while winning the Florida State League in 2016 and Eastern League in 2017. Ryan compiled a 221-197 managerial record with Altoona—the most wins for a manager in Curve history ... He also managed in the Cubs organization (High-A South Bend, 2021 and Double-A Tennessee, 2022-June 2023) ... A 5th round draft pick by the Minnesota Twins in 1996, played in 149 MLB games over parts of five seasons with the Twins (2002-05) and Angels (2010) ... Last Angels player to wear 27 prior to Mike Trout's call-up in 2011.

**AARON MUNOZ:** Takes over as Isotopes hitting coach after Jordan Pacheco was named one of two new hitting coaches for the Colorado Rockies on May 12 ... Began the 2025 season as the hitting coach for the ACL Rockies ... Spent nine seasons (2016-2024) as the Rockies bullpen catcher ... Was Isotopes bullpen catcher in 2015 ... Originally drafted by the Blue Jays in the 34th round of the MLB Draft ... Played parts of four seasons in the Minor Leagues (2011-14), making it to Double-A.

**SPLIT-SEASON PLAYOFF FORMAT:** For the third-straight year, the Pacific Coast League will use a split-season format to determine playoff participants. With one 10 team division, the first half winner (concluding June 22) will host the second half winner (beginning June 24) in a three-game set. The winner will then face the International League champion for the Triple-A Championship in Las Vegas, NV, on September 27.

**BALLS AND STRIKES:** The Challenge System, in it's third full year in the PCL, will be used exclusively for every game this season. Under this system, the home plate umpire will call balls or strikes while each team has the opportunity to challenge the umpire's call with two challenges per game, retaining one for each successful challenge.
