

ZOZO EMERALDS CAMPS SOCIAL DISTANCING GUIDELINES

We are excited to provide a safe and enjoyable camp experience, and ask that all campers, staff and spectators follow these general guidelines.

Disclaimer: Participants, parents, family members and spectators in the baseball & softball camps, and activities related to these camps, do so with the knowledge of risk and potential exposure to COVID-19 involved in attending, observing, and participating in this camp and agree to assume any and all inherent risks to their personal health.

General

- 1. Campers, staff, and spectators will be required to wear a mask while on the camp ground, unless they are actively participating in a drill or game. Masks will be required before and after the camp until fully exiting the facility. It is the responsibility of each family to provide their own masks.
- 2. Anyone entering the area (campers, staff and spectators) will be required to sign a waiver.
- 3. There will be one designated entry and exit point allowed for campers, spectators, and staff to safely practice social distancing.
- 4. Registration: All campers and spectators will be asked to adhere to social distancing guidelines while waiting to register. All participants entering the camp will have their temperatures taken, and recorded. Any participant whose temperature reads above 100 degrees will be denied access.
- 5. No chewing tobacco, smoking or spitting seeds at any time.
- 6. Campers, staff, and spectators will respect and comply with these guidelines or they may be removed from the camp.
- 7. All campers, staff and spectators will respect and comply with these guidelines or they may be removed from the camp with no refund.
- 8. Please note that due to the facility restriction the number of campers, staff and spectators cannot exceed 100 people. If the number of people at the camp is approaching that number, spectators will be asked to leave.
- 9. Athletic Trainer: there will be an athletic trainer on-site for the camp.
 - a. Campers will enter the tent one at a time for treatment.
 - b. Should an injury occur, the athletic trainer will assess and triage the individual.
 - c. Only one parent or guardian will be allowed in the tent with the injured camper.
 - d. A mask will be placed on the camper if possible (non-facial or head injury).
 - e. The area will be wiped down between individual treatments.

Campers

- 1. All campers <u>MUST BRING THEIR OWN EQUIPMENT</u> (i.e. glove, bat, helmet, shoes (rubber spiked cleats/turfs), batting gloves, masks, catcher gear etc.). There will be no sharing of equipment between campers. Failure of a camper to bring their own equipment will mean they can watch, but not play with no refund.
- 2. Minimum physical distance of six (6) feet shall be kept when possible, especially during instructions and breaks.
- 3. Campers may remove masks while participating in drills or a game.
- 4. **Campers must bring their own water**, there <u>WILL NOT</u> be a central water source for campers to refill their water.
- 5. Physical contact between players will be limited as much as possible.
- 6. Campers, in particular pitchers, should not lick their fingers and should make every effort to minimize their hands touching their face.
- 7. No spitting.
- 8. No huddles, handshakes, high 5's or fist bumps.
- 9. Campers will respect and comply with these guidelines or they may be removed from the camp with no refund.
- 10. It is recommended that campers bring their own hand sanitizer and sunscreen.

Spectators

- 1. Only two spectators per player will be allowed on-site throughout camp.
- 2. Any spectator entering the camp will be expected to have their temperatures taken and recorded, as well as sign a waiver.
- 3. Because of the increased health risk and for their safety, we ask that those high risk individuals consider not attending the camp.
- 4. The attendance of children who are not playing in the camp is discouraged.
- 5. Spectators will be required to wear a mask at all times, including children over the age of 2.
- 6. Spectators will be required to provide their own mask.
- 7. Spectators will maintain a six-foot distance while entering and exiting the park.
- 8. Seating will not be made available for spectators. Any seating must be brought by those staying to watch.
- 9. Spectator's areas will be pre-determined. Please avoid congregating in groups.
- 10. Upon completion of camp, all spectators will pack up chairs, supplies and exit the park immediately.
- 11. Spectators will respect and comply with these guidelines or they may be removed from the facility.

Staff

- 1. Staff must wear a mask at all times when in the park. Exceptions include during instructions and demonstrations.
- 2. Staff will be provided with hand sanitizer, disinfectant wipes, masks and gloves.
- 3. Staff will regularly wipe down and sanitizes surfaces and items at the registration table.
- 4. Each team will have a designated Point of Contact person who will.
 - a. Wipe down the tents and equipment prior to the campers entering and leaving the camp.
 - b. Properly dispose of any sanitizing materials.
 - c. Wipe down game balls between innings. Each group will have their own set of game balls. Balls will be cleaned between games, and continually sprayed during the camp.
 - d. Retrieve the bat for each camper that is not able to retrieve their own (hit, walk, ect), and then wipe it down before returning it.
 - e. Ball prep must be done by the point of contact with gloves.
 - f. Clean the bases every inning.
- 5. If staff approach umpires, they will maintain a six-foot social distance.
