Fort Wayne TinCaps (54-66) at Dayton Dragons (65-55)

RH Connor Lehmann (3-4, 8.64) vs. RH Christian Roa (2-2, 3.86)

Today's Game: The Dayton Dragons (affiliate of the Cincinnati Reds) met the Fort Wayne TinCaps (affiliate of the San Diego Padres) in the last game of a six-game series and the final game of the season.

2021 Season Series: Dayton 16, Fort Wayne 8. (At Dayton: Dragons 10, TinCaps 2).

Last Game: Sunday: Dayton 5, Fort Wayne 3. Juan Martinez hit a three-run home run and Matt McLain added a two-run inside the park homer. Dragons pitchers did not issue a walk as Spencer Stockton earned the win with four scoreless innings.

Last Series vs. Fort Wayne: The Dragons went 6-0 in the series (Sept. 14-19) and outscored Fort Wayne 46-23 (scoring 7.7 runs per game) while batting .289 with a team ERA of 2.45. They committed nine errors in the series.

Previous Series at Lake County: The Dragons went 3-3 at Lake County (Sept. 7-12). They scored 26 runs (4.3 per game) while batting .202 with a team ERA of 3.74. They committed five errors in the series.

The Dragons roster includes eight players ranked among the top-20 prospects in the Reds organization. In the recently-updated *MLB.com* rankings, Matt McLain is the #4 prospect in the Reds system; Mat Nelson is #10, Michael Siani is #12, Lyon Richardson is #14, Christian Roa is #15, Bryce Bonnin is #16, Ivan Johnson is #17, and Allan Cerda is #18. In the mid-season update of Reds top-10 prospects by *Baseball America*, McLain is #4, Nelson is #11, Bonnin is #13, Roa is #14, and Johnson is #15. Siani was listed by *Baseball America* as the "Best Athlete" and "Best Defensive Outfielder" in the Reds organization entering the season.

High-A Central League Playoffs: Major League Baseball has announced that leagues at three classifications, including the High-A Central League, will conduct playoffs in September. The top two teams in each league, regardless of division, will meet in a best-of-five series.

Playoff Race: The Dragons were eliminated from playoff contention on Saturday when Cedar Rapids defeated Peoria, leaving the Dragons two games behind the Kernels with one game to play. The Dragons finished the season as East Division co-champions with Lake County.

The Mythical First Half Division Title: The Dragons were the winners of the "Mythical First Half" East Division title. Note that the league is not utilizing a split-season format in 2021. There is no First Half or Second Half, and no First Half championship race in 2021 in the High-A Central League. The Midwest League was split into two equal halves for every season from 1988-2019, and from 1956-1981. The league did not play a split season from 1982-87.

Best in a Decade: The Dragons final winning percentage of 2021 of .542 was their highest in a season since the 2011 season, when the Dragons went 83-57 (.593) with a team that featured Billy Hamilton, Tucker Barnhart, and Donald Lutz.

First Round Fever: Matt McLain is the latest first round draft pick to play for the Dragons. Recent first round picks to play for the Dragons, with their draft year, have included Nick Lodolo (2019), Jonathan India (2018), Hunter Greene (2017), Nick Senzel (2016), Tyler Stephenson (2015), Nick Howard and Alex Blandino (2014), Phillip Ervin (2013), Nick Travieso (2012), and Robert Stephenson (2011). Every Reds "true" first round pick (selected within the first 30 picks of the draft) over the last 11 drafts has played for the Dragons except 2020 first rounder Austin Hendrick, who is currently at Low-A Daytona.

League and Organizational Leader: Jacob Hurtubise led the High-A Central League and the entire Cincinnati Reds organization in On-Base Percentage at .413. This mark was ninth in all of Full-Season Minor League Baseball (120 teams). Hurtubise also led the Reds organization in runs scored with 77 and stolen bases with 39.

Late Season Lift: Allan Cerda, who played in 21 games with the Dragons after being called up from Daytona in August, led the Reds organization in 2021 in extra base hits with 44 (12 with the Dragons). He finished third in the Reds organization in home runs with 17 (three with the Dragons).

- Jacob Hurtubise hit .419 (18 for 43) over his last 16 games, collecting 12 walks with five strikeouts.
- Juan Martinez batted .370 (10 for 27) with one home run and four doubles over his last seven games.
- Allan Cerda went 9 for 20 (.450) in the final series with three doubles and a home run.
- Stevie Branche since joining the Dragons: 13 G, 21 IP, 8 H, 3 ER, 11 BB, 32 SO, 1.29 ERA, 2-0, 1 Sv.
- Vin Timpanelli over his last 11 relief appearances: 13 IP, 2 H, 3 ER, 4 BB, 26 SO, 3 Sv. Opponents were 2 for 43 with 26 Ks.
- Spencer Stockton over his last four relief appearances: 8.2 IP, 4 H, 0 ER, 4 BB, 13 SO, 2-0.

Team Notes

- Sunday's win gave the Dragons a season high for most consecutive victories (6) and marked their first sweep of a six-game series this season.
- The Dragons led the High-A Central League in team ERA in the month of September, at 2.98 (18 games). They also led the league in lowest opponent batting average (.186) and strikeouts (198 in 154 innings).
- Dragons pitchers broke the club record in 2021 for most strikeouts per game. They averaged 10.3 strikeouts per game this season (1240 SO in 120 G). The previous club record was 9.2 per game in 2011 (1,292 SO in 140 G).
- Dragons pitchers also broke the club record for most walks per game. They averaged 4.8 walks per game (573 BB in 120 G). The previous club record was 4.3 per game in 2005 (600 walks in 139 games).
- Dayton held at least a share of first place after 63 of the 120 games they played this season.

You can follow the Dragons through various media outlets in 2021. Every home and road game will be broadcast on radio on WONE 980-AM. Games are also available at wone.com, on a mobile device through either the Dragons mobile app or the iHeart Radio app, or on HD Radio on 104.7 HD 2 WTUI. Additionally, the Dragons will televise 25 home games on Dayton's CW (Channel 26, available on Spectrum Cable channels 13 and 1013; available on DirecTV and Dish Network channel 26). All 60 home games are available on MiLB TV (subscription required through milb.com).

Dragons Manager/Coaches:

Jose Moreno is in his first season as Dragons manager and his second year in the Reds organization. The 2021 season is Moreno's 22nd year as a coach, instructor, or coordinator in professional baseball. As a manager, he has won three league championships with affiliated clubs, guiding his teams to titles in 2002, 2007, and 2010. Moreno also led his teams to back-to-back championships in the Venezuelan Winter League in 2019-20 and 2020-21.

Moreno was a catcher in Cleveland Indians and Baltimore Orioles farm systems.

Wapakoneta, Ohio native **Brian Garman** joins the Dragons in 2021 as pitching coach. Garman was slated to serve as the Dayton pitching coach in 2020 before the season was canceled. He served as a pitching coach in the Los Angeles Angels system for the previous two seasons, working at Rookie-level Orem (Pioneer League) in 2019 and Advanced-A Inland Empire (California League) in 2018. Garman pitched at Wapakoneta High School and the University of Cincinnati before being drafted by the Milwaukee Brewers in the 17th round in 2010. He spent four years as a pitcher in the Brewers system, reaching the Double-A level.

Hitting coach **Daryle Ward** returns to the Dragons in 2021 after serving in the same position in Dayton in 2017-18. He is in his sixth year in coaching in the Cincinnati Reds organization. He served as the hitting coach with the Goodyear Reds in the Arizona League in 2016 and with the Chattanooga Lookouts in 2019. He was slated to return to Chattanooga in 2020 before the season was canceled. Ward played professionally for 22 seasons from 1994-2015. He spent seven full seasons and parts of four others in the Major Leagues, primarily as a left fielder and first baseman. His father, Gary Ward, was a Major League All-Star selection with both the Twins and Rangers as part of a 12-year Major League playing career.

Darren Bragg returns to the Dragons in his 15th year as a coach or instructor in the Reds organization. He will serve in a newly named position within the Reds organization, carrying the title of development coach. Bragg was the Dragons hitting coach for two seasons in 2007-08, helping the club to the playoffs in both years as he worked with future Reds Todd Frazier, Zack Cozart, Chris Heisey, Drew Stubbs, Juan Francisco, and others in Dayton. Bragg served as the Reds minor league outfield coordinator from 2009-18 before returning to a coaching assignment with an individual team. He was the bench coach at Double-A Chattanooga in 2019 and was slated to fill the same role with Daytona in 2020 before the minor league season was canceled. Bragg spent 11 years as a player in Major League Baseball from 1994-2004, appearing in 916 big league games with nine teams
