Before joining Toronto, Kim spent seven seasons with the Texas Rangers in several scouting roles, culminating as Director, International Scouting. A native of Pottsville, PA, Kim also had a six-year international professional playing career as an infielder, which included stops in the Netherlands, China, Australia, Spain and Venezuela. He played one season of collegiate baseball at D3 Middlebury before transferring to Vanderbilt, where he played under Tim Corbin. In 2008 while playing in Venezuela, Kim slept on a mattress in the bathroom in the locker room to save money and learn Spanish.

Cory Riordan | Pitching Coach Year with Toronto: 5 | Year with D-Jays: 3 | Born: Killingworth, CT

Cory Riordan enters his third season as Dunedin's Pitching Coach, after he held the same role with the FCL Blue Jays in 2021-22. He joined the Blue Jays organization in 2020, where he spent the 2020 shutdown assisting with the club's pitch design framework. Riordan pitched collegiately at Fordham University and went on to play 13 professional seasons, spending time with the Colorado Rockies and Detroit Tigers organizations, reaching as high as Triple-A. He also spent time in the independent Atlantic League, and played internationally in South Korea and Taiwan, and three winter ball seasons in Venezuela and the Dominican Republic.

Nash Knight | Hitting Coach Year with Toronto: 2 | Year with D-Jays: 2 | Born: Denton, TX

Nash Knight enters his second season with the Dunedin Blue Jays and Jays' organization. Under Knight's guidance in 2024, Dunedin ranked among the Florida State League leaders with 101 HR (3rd), 34 3B (T-1st), and a .359 SLG (3rd). Knight made the transition to coaching following a seven-year playing career where he spent six seasons in Toronto's farm system, reaching as high as Triple-A. He also spent time with the Rangers and Twins in his final season on the diamond 2022. A Dallas Baptist University product, Knight hit .245/.350/.352 while playing in 556 career minor league games. Knight suited up for Dunedin in parts of two seasons, playing 105 career games at TD Ballpark in his career, notably playing all nine positions in a game on Spet. 2, 2018 for a team managed by Casey Candaele. Was a member of 2017 FSL Co-Champion Dunedin team which was managed by current Toronto skipper John Schneider and included future big leaguers including Vladimir Guererro Jr, Bo Bichette, Lourdes Guriel Jr, Jordan Romano, and Ryan Borucki. Majored in kinesiology at DBU. Brother, Austin, has coached at DBU, Texas A&M, and most recently coached in the Mariners organization.

Ashley Stephenson | Position Coach Year with Toronto: 3 | Year with D-Jays: 1 | Born: Mississauga, ON.

Stephenson is in her first season as Position Coach, after she spent the prior two seasons with the High-A Vancouver Canadians in the same role, helping to claim a 2023 Northwest League championship. Inducted to the Canadian Baseball Hall of Fame in 2024, Stephenson has enjoyed a storied multi-sport career. Initially a star hockey player at the collegiate level at Wilfrid Laurier, she claimed four conference titles and a CIS National Championship, before joining the pro ranks in the original National Women's Hockey League and the Canadian Women's Hockey League, On the diamond, Stephenson starred for Canada's women's national baseball team from 2004 to 2018. She was twice named the team's MVP, earned an All-Star nod at third base in the 2008 IBAF World Cup Tournament and won the 2011 Baseball Canada Jimmy Rattlesnake Award, which was renamed in her honor. Vigil joins Dunedin for his first season as a Position Coach. A former catcher, Vigil enjoyed an 11-year professional playing career. He spent 10 seasons in the Miami Marlins farm system before finishing with the Blue Jays in 2021, where he hit .275 in 34 games between Double-A New Hampshire and Triple-A Buffalo. Overall, Vigil played 550 career minor league games, where he hit .251. He began his coaching career as a bench coach for the ACL Mariners in 2022 before returning to the Blue Jays system, where he spent the past two seasons as a rehab

Antonio Caceres | Ast. Pitching Coach Year with Toronto: 25 | Year with D-Jays: 1 | Born: Cotul, DR

Caceres spent the past three years as the Pitching Coach for the FCL Blue Jays. A lifelong member of the Blue Jays organization, Caceres was signed out of the Dominican Republic by Toronto when he was 17. He played in their minor league system from 1995-1998, before he transitioned to a pitching coach role in 2000. He's spent the past 24 years working as a pitching coach at the lower levels of the farm system, mentoring stars over the years including Aaron Sanchez, Noah Syndergaard, Joe Musgrove, Jordan Romano, Daniel Norris, and Roberto Osuna. Has served as Pitching Coach under Dennis Holmberg for 10 seasons, also working under current Blue Jays coaches Brent Lavallee, Jose Mayorga, Cesar Martin, Dallas McPherson, and current Miami Marlins Manager Clayton McCullough.

- Last time out: yielded three runs in 4.2 frames despite not allowing a hit until the 5<sup>th</sup> inning, when all three runs came across. Cates did not allow a hit over his first 16 batters faced. Two of the three runs to Cates name scored following his exit. Cates was handed his first loss since April 30.
- Over his last 13 games (11 starts), Cates has posted a 2.03 ERA in 57.2 innings with 58 strikeouts.
- He's allowed one earned run or less in 10 of his last 13 appearances.
- Cates' splitter has become near impossible for hitters to square up, as the offering has just a .163 average against and 36.2% whiff rate since the start of June.

**2025:** Fired five shutout frames vs. CLR in professional debut on 4/6, the Sunday of opening weekend. Over his next five starts from 4/12-5/6, Cates went 0-2 with a 9.35 ERA and opponents batting .310 against him over that stretch. Then, over his following seven appearances (five starts) from 5/11 to 6/19 Cates yielded one run or less in seven consecutive outings and posted a 1.47 ERA spanning 30.2 innings with 31 strikeouts and opponents' batting .192 during that time.

**COLLEGE NOTES:** Began collegiate career with two seasons at JUCO College of Southern Nevada as a two-way player. Was honored as All-Region 18 First Team as a freshman in 2022. Pitched to a perfect 5-0 record on the mound in 12 appearances, starting eight across 46.0 innings and posting a 3.91 ERA, while batting .310 in 43 games. As a sophomore at CSN in 2023 Registered a career-high .358 batting average for the Coyotes with 1 HR and 30 RBI. Also pitched 57 IP with a 4.11 ERA over 12 GS, going 5-3 with 54 K. Transferred to the University of Nevada Las Vegas for his junior year. Focused solely on pitching and cemented himself as the Rebels' Friday night starter, earning All-Mountain West 1st Team. Posted a 4.08 ERA with 107 K in 90.1 IP over 14 GS, leading the Mountain West in K. Allowed only 15 walks during the season, tied the lowest mark among qualified pitchers in the Mountain West and ranked sixth among NCAA DI pitchers during the season in strikeout-to-walk ratio on a 7.13 mark. Set the single game UNLV strikeout record with 12 K in 7 IP vs. Fresno State on 3/28. Led the UNLV Rebels team in wins, games started, innings pitched and strikeouts during the 2024 season.

**CAREER NOTES:** Selected in the 7th round (217th overall) by the Toronto Blue Jays in the 2024 MLB Draft, signed for \$222,500. Besides Toronto, the Houston Astros, Texas Rangers and San Diego Padres expressed interest and invited him for workouts. Austin was drafted on a Monday and was in Florida by Friday.

**PERSONAL NOTES:** Said he considered being a two-way player at the D1 level but significantly improved on the mound once he gave up hitting. Added that he misses the grind of playing both sides of the ball. His JUCO conference used wood bats, so would have loved to use metal bats. Enjoys golfing, put himself as the third best golfer on the team to begin the season behind Peyton Powell and Khal Stephen. Favorite player growing up was Greg Maddux, rooted for the Astros. Lists favorite non-baseball athlete as David Goggins. Coming out of Coronado High School in Henderson, NV., Cates originally committed to play ball at the University of Hawaii, but shifted his commitment to stay close to home at the College of Southern Nevada. Jacob Sharp, acquired by the Blue Jays from the Mariners in last year's Yimi Garcia trade, is also a UNLV alum.

**2025:** Began season working as a reliever for Dunedin, throwing 11 IP out of his first three games out of the bullpen without allowing an ER, yielding only 7 H with 10 K and 1 BB. Batista was moved into the starting rotation for his first start of the season on April 23 @TAM. Named Florida State League Pitcher of the Week for May 6–11, 2025. Batista earned his first win of the season on Saturday, May 10 against Fort Myers, striking out a career-high nine batters over five shutout innings. He allowed just four hits and one walk, fanning six of the final nine batters he faced and keeping the Mighty Mussels from advancing a runner past second base.

2024: Opened season with FCL Red Sox, pitching to a 3.92 ERA over eight appearances (five starts) with 23 K in 20.2 IP, before he was dealt to the Blue Jays ahead of the 2024 Trade Deadline on July 27th along with SS Cutter Coffey and SS Eddinson Paulino in in exchange for C Danny Jansen. Toman added It was great practice to have cameras all around, especially just to help allow him be comfortable and be himself once he got to pro baseball. Tucker was teammates as an amateur with Brandon Berriera at the two-week PDP program in Cary, NC at the Team USA headquarters, where the top prospects lived a pro baseball life. Toman played against Manuel Beltre at 14 years old, and the two were roommates to begin their pro careers together. Grew up a Red Sox fan, favorite player was Robinson Cano. Has a very good relationship with hitting coach Nash Knight. Has given credit for his defensive development to former defensive coordinator (now infield coordinator) Danny Solano current infield coordinator and former Dunedin manager Donnie Murphy.
