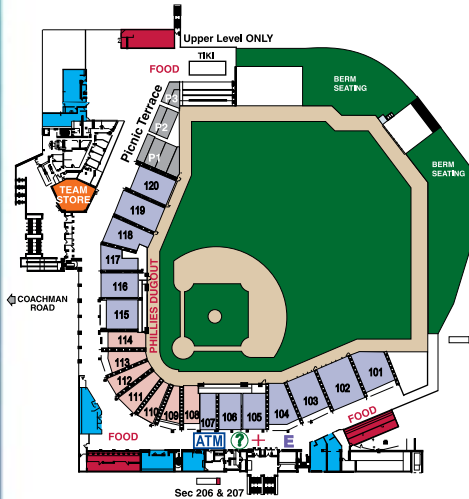

BAYCARE BALLPARK INFORMATION



ANNOUNCEMENTS

PA and video board announcements can be arranged for a nominal fee by visiting Guest Services behind Section 106 before the end of the second inning.

ATM

The ATM is located on the first base side of the concourse behind section 105.

BAGS & BACKPACKS

Bags can be no larger than 16"x16"x8" and will be subject to inspection upon entry in accordance with Major League Baseball security regulations. Guests may discard or return the prohibited items to their vehicle.

BATS

Full-size baseball bats are prohibited from entry by guests to the ballpark.

BERM SEATING

Berm seating is limited and ticketed. Blankets are permitted to be brought into the park for berm seating. Chairs, folding chairs, camp chairs, and the like, are not permitted to be brought into the park.

CHILD TICKETS

Children 13 and younger qualify for the child's ticket price. For children 4 and younger, please see the BayCare Box Office or a ballpark gate attendant for a complimentary ticket.

CUSTOMER SERVICE & ADVANCE TICKETS

The Customer Service/Advance Tickets window is located on the first base side of the main concourse behind Section 106. Guests can report problems, check for lost and found items and claim prizes at this location. Tickets for future games may also be purchased here.

FIRST AID

The First Aid office is located on the first base side of the main concourse behind section 106. Guests can either report to this office or contact an usher if in need of medical assistance.

FOOD AND DRINK POLICY

No food, bottles, coolers or cans may be brought into the ballpark. The Threshers reserve the right to search any medical or diaper bags entering the ballpark.

FOUL BALLS

Any foul ball hit into the stands may be kept. Guests are not permitted on the field or to reach into the playing area. Foul balls may be dangerous, so please be alert at all times and aware of the potential hazards.

GATES OPEN

Ballpark gates will open one hour prior to scheduled game time.

HANDICAPPED SEATING

Disabled seating is available all throughout the ballpark. Limited wheelchair seating is available through the ticket office in person or on the telephone. One companion seat is available for purchase with each wheelchair space. An elevator is available for disabled use on the first base side of the stadium (South Parking Lot). Drop-off is available on the West Side of the ballpark (no elevator access here). Please contact an usher for assistance entering and exiting the ballpark.

KIDS ZONE

The left-field concourse features a playground and Kids Zone for our younger guests.

LOST AND FOUND

Located at Customer Service behind Section 106.

SENIOR TICKETS

Seniors 55+ may purchase discounted tickets.

SMOKING

Smoking is prohibited in most areas of the ballpark. Special smoking sections are marked. Smoking is permitted only at the Tiki Pavilion in left field. For resources to help quit smoking, call 1-877-U-CAN-NOW (1-877-822-6669).

TEAM STORE

The Threshers Team Store, Diamond Outfitters, is located next to the ballpark's west entry, and features hats, apparel and collectibles to satisfy Threshers fans of all ages. Merchandise available 24 hours a day on-line at ThreshersBaseball.com.

TIKI PAVILION

The Frenchy's Tiki Pavilion is located beyond the left field wall. It features a variety of mixed drinks, beer and wine for guests 21 and over. Seats in this section are first-come, first-serve during Threshers season.

WEAPONS

Firearms, weapons, knives, tasers and other dangerous or hazardous devices or substances (collectively "weapons") are prohibited at BayCare Ballpark, unless carried by an on-duty police officer or otherwise expressly approved by The Threshers. Anyone bringing such a weapon to the premises must return it to their vehicle immediately.

AARON BARRETT MANAGER

Born: Evansville, IN

Resides: Santa Rosa Beach, FL... Former pitcher. Entering his fifth year in the Phillies organization and his first as a manager. Joined the Phillies player development staff midseason in 2022 as bullpen coach/assistant pitching coach for Lehigh Valley (AAA) and rehab pitching coordinator.

Had the responsibilities of minor league complex pitching coordinator added to his title for the 2024 and 2025 seasons. Originally selected by the Washington Nationals in the ninth round of the June 2010 draft out of the University of Mississippi, where he earned a bachelor's degree in liberal arts. Pitched 11 seasons, including parts of four in the majors with Washington (2014-15 & 2019-20), before ending his career with Lehigh Valley in 2022.

SHAWN WILLIAMS BENCH COACH

Born: Salt Lake City, UT

Resides: Palm Harbor, FL... Former infielder. Debut season as Threshers bench coach. Named the Florida Complex League (R) manager in 2023, his fifth managerial stop in the Phillies system. Returned as FCL manager 2024-25.

Previously served as manager for Reading (AA, 2019-22), Clearwater (A, 2017-18) and Lakewood (A, 2015-16) after joining the Phillies player development staff in 2014 as

manager for Williamsport (A). Also spent April 2014 as a fill-in bullpen catcher for the Phillies. Served as a player/coach for Williamsport in 2013. Played four seasons (2007-10) in Tampa Bay's minor league system and also played independently in the American Association (2006), Can Am League (2010-11) and Atlantic League (2010 & 2012). His father, Jimmy Williams, managed the Toronto Blue Jays, Houston Astros and Boston Red Sox and was the Phillies bench coach for two years (2007-08).

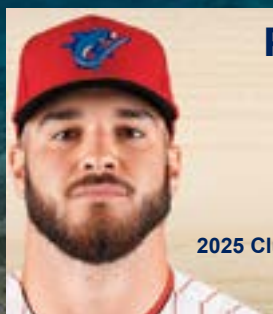

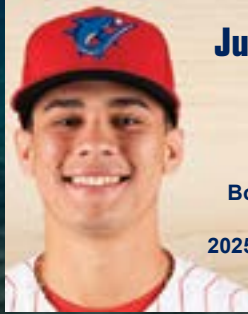

HOW TO KEEP SCORE

Scoring Basics...

Different fans have different methods of keeping a scorecard, and many use their own notations. But here's a simple method...

If the hitter grounds out to shortstop, for example, write in "6-3," which shows the shortstop threw him out at first base. If the hitter flies out to left field, write a "7."

If the batter gets a hit, write in the hit according to which base he reached. Each corner of the box represents a base, with the lower-right corner being first.

If he singles, put a "-" in the lower right. If he doubles, write a "-" in the upper right, and so on. For a walk, use "BB" in the lower right. As the runner advances, mark the appropriate symbol in the appropriate corner.

If a runner scores, put a circle at the bottom of the box, and inside the circle put the symbol of the play and/or the player that drove him in. For example, if the No. 5 hitter drives in two runs with a single, mark his single in the bottom right of his box and mark a circle with the number "5" in it in the boxes of the runners who score (Some people like to use uniform numbers here, so you can tell who did what, even after lineup changes).

At the end of each inning, total the hits and runs for that inning only. At the end of the game you'll be able to add the innings total to get the game score.

Player Spotlight: Robert Phelps

Robert Phelps' Journey Through Multiple Schools to Turn Pro

Few things have shaken up college athletics more than the transfer portal. At the beginning of the 2018 school year, the portal was introduced to help student athletes change schools with more ease and less penalties to their eligibility and playing time. Whether players choose to enter the portal because they aren't getting the playing time they desire or their school wasn't the right fit, the transfer portal has allowed many college athletes to continue playing sports with an easier ability to transfer and get on the field before a new season begins. Robert Phelps is an example of someone who utilized the transfer portal to find his ideal school to become a launching board for his dreams of playing professional baseball.

Phelps played his first baseball game at 5 years old and won the MVP award in his Pittsburgh-based Little League. It was pretty clear from the first time that he laced up his cleats that Phelps was going to be a star. "After we had won the game, I went to school the next day and my gym teacher, who was really close to my family, told me that he found out about my MVP performance on ESPN," said Phelps of his first baseball game as a child.

“Being the five-year old I was, I believed him, so I remember going home that night and I watched ESPN all night trying to wait until my name came up, and it didn’t so I realized pretty late.” Phelps got over the joke very quickly and remains friendly with that gym teacher today. But even though Phelps’ highlights were not on ESPN that day, that interaction added fuel to his fire as he began to pursue his dream of becoming a professional baseball player.

Growing up in Pittsburgh, Phelps lived close to PNC Park where the Pirates play. With friends and family, Phelps would attend as many Pirates’ games as he could at the stadium; he just loved to be around a baseball field as often as he could. “I’ve always loved baseball, and being around it is so amazing,” said Phelps of the love for the game he developed as a child. “Just being able to go to that field so many times brought so many memories with it.”

Phelps played multiple other sports as a child, starting out as a swimmer, basketball and soccer player in addition to baseball. Baseball was always his true love, and the work he put in made that very evident. Phelps’ mom would throw ping pong balls and other balls made of softer material for hitting and fielding practice in the parking lot across from their house to help him train as a kid.

Phelps began playing travel ball starting primarily at second base and was an exceptional defender from the start. With one mid-game switch, he quickly added shortstop to his arsenal of positions as well. “I remember there was a specific game where our shortstop...made two errors in one inning and the coach, who was his dad, switched me and him,” says Phelps of how he began to play shortstop. “So, I went to shortstop and he went

to second base. Ever since that day, I really just played shortstop.” Shortstop became his primary position, but Phelps showed the ability to play anywhere in the infield at every level.

After beginning his high school career in the Dominican Republic, Phelps was getting recruited heavily based off his summer ball. He hadn’t even played varsity baseball in high school before getting enough attention from college and professional scouts with his travel teams. He quickly earned two Division One commitments before turning 18, decommitting from Kent State and Ole Miss before ultimately deciding on the community college route to begin his next steps with baseball. It is rare to see a player decommit from a division one school but Phelps bet on himself that his talent was enough to warrant more offers to get back to the highest level of college baseball.

By his standards, Phelps didn't have a great freshman season at Riverside City College. He didn't hit a home run for what ended up being his only collegiate season without a long ball and hit .252 with 19 RBIs at Riverside. "My freshman year was...just a tough situation. Me and the team just didn't work out, and it wasn't the best fit for me," said Phelps of his first collegiate season. "I went to work all summer, got a job at a restaurant downtown and didn't touch a bat or a baseball." Though he was taking a break from baseball, Phelps still knew that he wanted to play college baseball at a different school, and his ticket back in came from a surprising source.

Phelps had befriended a man named Rueben Livingston when he committed to Kent State. Rueben was a corner infielder who also decommitted from Kent State, and ended up at Harford Community College. Phelps saw this on social media, and, on a whim, decided to message his friend to ask about the school. The

next day, Phelps was on a zoom call with the coach, and he committed shortly after that.

He had not heard of Harford before messaging Rueben, but Phelps called the decision to go to Harford one of the best moves he ever made. "Even if you weren't playing, we all wanted to win," Phelps said of his time at Harford. "We wanted to see everyone succeed; it was just the coolest thing. And, I think for me, it just brought my swagger back." Phelps' 2024 season at Harford was one of the best throughout his college career, hitting .373 in 48 games with nine more walks than strikeouts in 2024, nearly leading the Fighting Owls to a championship. His stellar season earned him his return to Division One that Phelps so coveted, and he committed to West Virginia for the fall of 2024.

Unfortunately for Phelps, the competition at West Virginia was even stiffer than expected, and he was unsure that he'd be able to get enough playing time to allow big league scouts to check him out. Knowing West Virginia was not the right fit, Phelps decided to transfer schools again, but this time there was one problem; he could not play in 2025 for a Division One school once he re-entered the portal. Phelps had to go outside of the NCAA to get some playing time in what he hoped would be his final collegiate season before turning pro.

"We had visited another school right before going to see Reinhardt, but once I got there, I could just see myself going there and thriving," said Phelps of his decision to transfer from Division One West Virginia to NAIA Reinhardt. In the past ten years, 155 players have made it from the NAIA have been selected in the MLB Draft, with a smaller percentage completing the journey and turning

pro. Phelps, once again, bet on himself to succeed, which he did at Reinhardt in spades. He set career highs across the board in his lone season at Reinhardt and was ready for the next step.

Phelps still had some eligibility remaining in school, and his status as a draft pick was not certain. He was playing summer ball in Edmonton, Alberta, Canada and had only spoken with the Seattle Mariners. Two days before the draft, Phelps' mother recommended that he should come back home. He had a visit scheduled at Marshall University shortly after the MLB Draft and decided to come home to be with family.

He returned from Marshall the Sunday of the MLB draft, back home with his family for the Draft's second day. "I remember the night before, going to bed praying to God, just please give me the right opportunity..." said Phelps of his thoughts on draft day. He woke up on the second day of the draft late, not planning to watch any minute of coverage. The first call he got was from the Phillies Director of Player

Development, who said that they were thinking of signing Phelps as a non-drafted free agent. Shortly after, his prayers were answered, and Phelps was taken by the Phillies in the 19th round of the 2025 MLB Draft.

Phelps had the draft coverage off and found out via the flood of congratulatory messages that filled up his phone after the Phillies' pick was made. With his whole family surrounding him, Phelps' dreams had come true, and he was a Phillie. Four different colleges, and countless uncertainty and adversity, but the first step to becoming a big leaguer had been completed.

"There were a lot of times when I wasn't in the right situation or around the right people," said Phelps, reflecting on the journey that made him a professional baseball player.

"There are a lot of people that don't get the opportunity that I have right now, so to be able to take it every single day and... fall back on the right people helps me realize how much of a blessing this is." Phelps is just getting started, still in the midst of his first full season as a professional, but it is already quite clear that he is not going to take this opportunity for granted.

Player Spotlight: Camron Hill

After Attending his Dream School, Camron Hill is Living His Dream

A person's choice of college often sets them up for the rest of their life. Oftentimes that is reliant on how someone spends their time in school, but sometimes simply being in the right place surrounded by the right people is enough to make a lasting, positive impact on one's life. For many people, narrowing down a list and trying to find one perfect place is not easy, but a lucky few have an easy time making such an important decision. For Threshers pitcher Camron Hill, his choice of school was, almost literally, waiting at his doorstep, and his choice to stay local for college helped him live out his dream as a professional baseball player.

Baseball has always been a part of Hill's life. He was the first member of his immediate family to play baseball much past little league, and he has been playing baseball almost his whole life. "My first set of friends were my teammates, just spending all those long summer days at the park," said Hill of his beginnings playing baseball. Like most players, Hill began playing all around the diamond, beginning primarily at first base because of his height. His mother, father and sisters all turned into athletes, and Hill followed suit. The more positions he played, adding outfield to his list of positions during middle school, the more his athletic abilities came to light.



Hill's height kept him mostly at first base, but before long it was impossible to overlook how strong his arm was. By the time he got to high school, Hill knew that he wanted to have a future in baseball. He decided to switch to pitching around the start of his high school career when he turned 13. "My performance at the plate wasn't the best, so I just thought 'I'll just put the bat down before it gets taken away from me,' and I just put my all into the pitching," Hill said of his decision to give up his days as a position player. The extra pitching training sessions in addition to his hitting training proved to be a lot to handle, and Hill felt that staying on the mound full time would accelerate his development and keep his training focused on pitching. One year later, college offers began rolling in.

Hill grew up in Georgia, a hotbed of high school sports talent. Most children with sports fans in their family in Georgia are somewhat indoctrinated to the two local universities, UGA and Georgia Tech. Hill grew up as more of a Georgia Tech fan with the school being so close. Before high school, he would frequently pass the GT campus while driving, since he only lived between 20 and 30 minutes away.

Furthermore, his little league team would frequently attend games there to watch high level college baseball. Until he stepped on campus, Hill didn't know all that much about Georgia Tech. As soon as he stepped on campus for a recruiting visit, he fell in love with the school.

At this point, Hill was playing travel ball for Team Elite in Georgia, one of the top prep baseball travel teams in the country. In his junior year of high school, he committed to Georgia Tech as one of the top pitchers in the state. "It definitely took a huge weight off my

shoulders, being in high school and getting that commitment under my belt," said Hill of his early commitment to Georgia Tech.

"I got a big confidence boost whenever I went out on the field for travel ball with all the other players who had commitments because I was committed too." Hill chose Georgia Tech partly because it was so close to home, he certainly enjoyed having his family come to every one of his home games throughout his collegiate career. He also chose Georgia Tech to get a good education both on and off the baseball field, and of the elite schools like Auburn and North Carolina that were recruiting, he felt he would get the most complete education at a school so close to home and close to his heart.

Once Hill got to college, Georgia Tech turned out to be everything he had hoped. He appeared in 18 games in each of his first two seasons as a Yellow Jacket and became an integral part of Georgia Tech's pitching staff. But just as important as his playing time was,





so was his development and his education on the baseball field. “I really felt like [Georgia Tech] did a number to my development, being able to pitch in different situations because I started, came out of the bullpen and closed some games,” said Hill of how his hometown university aided his development as a pitcher.

“I just became an all-around better pitcher, not just at one rille or one facet of pitching, just being able to make pitches whenever or whatever the situation calls for.” Hill was mostly a starter in high school, recruited to Georgia Tech as a top three left-handed pitcher among his entire recruiting class, and he relished the ability to enter games in different situations. After three seasons as a Yellow Jacket, Hill felt ready to take the next step in his baseball career.

Big League dreams are a constant among minor league players, and Hill is no exception. Long before he secured a baseball scholarship, Hill had dreamed about pitching in the major leagues. “Honestly, once I committed to Georgia Tech, [turning pro] was obviously the next step,” said Hill of his goals as a baseball player. That goal never left his mind, going into every pitching appearance with the thought of dominating and gaining an edge of his opponents.

By his junior year at Georgia Tech, Hill’s dreams began to approach reality. Hill played for Cotuit in the Cape Cod League in 2023 and returned to one of the top leagues for potential MLB prospects in 2024 with Cotuit. In two seasons in the vaunted Cape Cod League, Hill combined for a 3-2 record against elite prospects. He didn’t go to the Draft Combine or any pro days, so Hill just had to hope for the best. “I didn’t go to the combine, so I didn’t really get a lot of calls or anything from teams,” said Hill of his draft process in 2024. “I just had to see how it all played out on draft day.” Hill had stayed in Georgia for the entirety of his prep and collegiate career, and he knew that was probably going to change at the next level.

Being from Georgia, the Atlanta Braves were Hill’s hometown team as a child. Hill himself followed guys like Chipper Jones and Craig Kimbrel who helped him develop his love for baseball. Unless someone is a top pick, it is rare that a player knows where they will be drafted until the pick is in. Hill heard rumblings that he would be picked on the second day of the draft but was just hoping for the best. According to Hill, it virtually came down to his hometown Braves and the Phillies, who ended up drafting him, in the eighth round.

The Braves had the pick right before the Phillies in that eighth round, and there was a moment that Hill thought he was headed to his hometown team. “I was definitely excited about the chance to go to my hometown team, but everything happens for a reason and I’m happy to be wearing that “P” on my chest,” said Hill of his feelings on being drafted by the Phillies. He never felt a rivalry with the Phillies growing up, as the Braves were bigger rivals with the Mets for much of his childhood, but now he is striving to become rivals with his hometown team as he climbs the rungs of the Phillies’ minor league ladder.

Hill’s family, however, remained loyal to their hometown team while still supporting him in his major league dreams. Now that Hill is on the other side of this rivalry, he has prepared

himself for the friendly family rivalry that followed. “There’s always a bit of trash talk when the big clubs play against each other,” said Hill of the family dynamic when the Phillies and Braves play. “I’m looking forward to those games so I can come back to my family and say ‘oh, we got you guys today!’”

Only two levels of the minor leagues overlap for the Phillies and Braves, with their High-A and Triple-A teams playing in different divisions of the same league at their respective level, but Hill’s hometown pride has turned into motivation as well as some good-natured ribbing with his family members. But underneath all of that is a desire not just to play against his family’s favorite team, but to play against every MLB team in a long career with the Phillies.

Player Spotlight: Will Vierling

Will Vierling has Major League Lineage, but he is Forging His Own Path as a Pro

So much hard work, training and preparation goes into creating a major league talent, and there are so many unpredictable factors that can change everything in a short amount of time. Even if someone is born into the game or has a relative that went to the big leagues before them, there are no guarantees in baseball. That's why Threshers' catcher Will Vierling, cousin of Phillies draftee and current Detroit Tiger Matt Vierling, is not relying on anyone but himself to achieve his goal of reaching the major leagues.

Baseball has always been a part of Will Vierling's life, playing tee ball at his local YMCA in Wisconsin. His parents gave him a

toy bat as a baby, and he began swinging away. By the time he turned five, Vierling had begun to play organized baseball. "Baseball was just kind of a sport I always leaned towards," said Vierling of his beginnings playing baseball. "I played a bunch of other sports like basketball and soccer, but baseball was always the one that I gravitated towards." Vierling was always a great athlete, but there was always something about baseball that had captured his heart.

Young players who are just starting in baseball don't always find a fit at a position so quickly, but that was not the case for Vierling. Even if his first start at catcher was unplanned, he picked up one of the most important positions in baseball rather quickly while in Little League. "When I was around seven years old, we didn't have a catcher, so my dad threw the gear on and stuck me behind the plate," said Vierling of learning to catch for the first time.

"I wasn't half bad at it, and I was also one of the only kids who wasn't scared of the ball, so after that I just fell in love with it because being involved with every play makes it a lot more enjoyable." Vierling's love of the game was able to flourish, and he was able to touch the ball on every play while keeping a bat in his hand. By this point, it became overwhelmingly clear to Vierling that baseball was going to be a big part of his life.

Once he got to high school, Will's cousin Matt had already turned pro. Though Matt was from a different part of the country, Will was now able to rely on his older cousin as a shoulder to lean on and a beacon of advice as Will Vierling advanced his professional career. By the time

Vierling began playing high school ball, he was starting to learn and master some of the defensive aspects of the game and was eager to learn more of the nuances of the catcher's position.

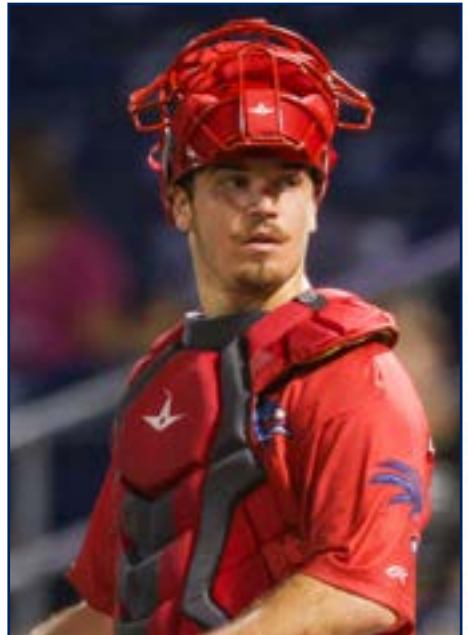
Catching always came naturally to Vierling, and consistently catching in Little League after he turned seven certainly helped him learn the position with ease as he grew older. "Early on, I kind of knew that this could be something I could do for a long time," said Vierling of his goals of playing collegiate and professional baseball. "It's always been my goal to play professionally; it has always been what I wanted to do." There was no doubt in his mind about his next step, and Vierling was ready to take that step in one of the most important and difficult positions to play in the game of baseball.

Vierling had a chance to turn pro straight out of college, talking to several teams, including the Phillies, before he made his first college commitment. He wanted to turn pro as soon as he possibly could, but college baseball ended up as his best option. "My mom always wanted me to go to college and get a degree. My dad just wanted me to play because he knew I loved it," said Vierling of his family's influence on him playing college baseball.

"But I had a couple looks out of high school, and nothing really came of it, so I ended up going to school for a couple of years." Vierling began playing his college ball at Louisville before transferring to Murray State. Despite his initial desire to go pro out of high school, Vierling loved his college experience, crediting his college experience as part of what made him the man, and baseball player, that he is today.

After a successful 2025 season at Murray State, Vierling knew that he had a chance to turn pro despite the fact that he had some eligibility left. His 2025 season at Murray State was historic, as he helped the Racers to their best record in program history and their first ever Men's College World Series bid after making the regionals for the first time in 22 years. He was confident in the fact he would be drafted, but sparse communication with MLB teams throughout the process made Vierling uncertain where he would end up.

The Phillies were one of the teams that spoke with Vierling after high school, but he admitted that he was surprised when they called his name in the eleventh round of the 2025 Draft. Seven years after his cousin, Matt, was drafted, Will became the second Vierling to be selected by the Philadelphia Phillies in the MLB Draft.

Through college and even more so during the draft process, Will relied on his relationship with his cousin Matt a lot more, as he was learning the ins and outs of being a professional baseball player. “Matt helped me out a lot when I was in the college recruiting process and especially when I got drafted by the Phillies,” said Will Vierling on his relationship with his cousin, current Tigers outfielder Matt Vierling. “Since he got drafted by the Phillies as well, Matt was really helpful telling me what was going to happen, what to expect, and things that would be good and what not to do.”

Matt was also one of the first people to reach out to Will after the 2025 Draft and has continued to provide advice throughout Will’s professional career so far. They even got a chance to catch up during a Spring Training game when Will was up with the Phillies against Matt’s Tigers. Coming into the Phillies organization, Matt still knew enough about the people in the organization to help Will acclimate his new employer and begin to navigate the difficult career that comes with professional baseball.

However, there are still some things that Matt couldn’t prepare Will for, like catching harder pitches from some elite arms. When Will began his career with the Threshers in August of 2025, one of the first pitchers he caught, Marty Gair, consistently averaged a fastball above 96 miles per hour. “Before getting to the pros, I hadn’t really caught that much above mid-90’s, so that was cool,” said Vierling of his “welcome to the pros” moment last season. He quickly learned to get used to the extra contact that comes with being a catcher, but especially now, Vierling is officially embedded in the professional ranks.

Will hopes to bring the Vierling name into the same category of baseball families like the

Boone’s, Naylor’s and Acuña’s by joining his cousin Matt in the professional ranks. While his primary focus is working hard and getting better in his first full season as a professional, that family achievement is certainly not lost on him. “It’s not every day that you’re going to see something like that,” Vierling said about having family ties in the major leagues. “I’ve always thought it would be really cool to have someone in my family that plays baseball professionally, so having that become a reality is really cool.”

Step one has been accomplished, and there are now two members of the Vierling family in the professional ranks, both drafted by the Philadelphia Phillies. Regardless of that family connection, Vierling is forging a path independent of his cousin Matt. Matt’s former manager, Shawn Williams, is Will’s current bench coach on the Threshers, and the pair haven’t really discussed the fact that Williams is now coaching a second Vierling. There are certainly some similarities between the journeys that Matt and Will Vierling have taken to get to professional baseball, but Will Vierling is intent on making his own path and hoping to cross paths with his cousin again, and hopefully soon in the major leagues.

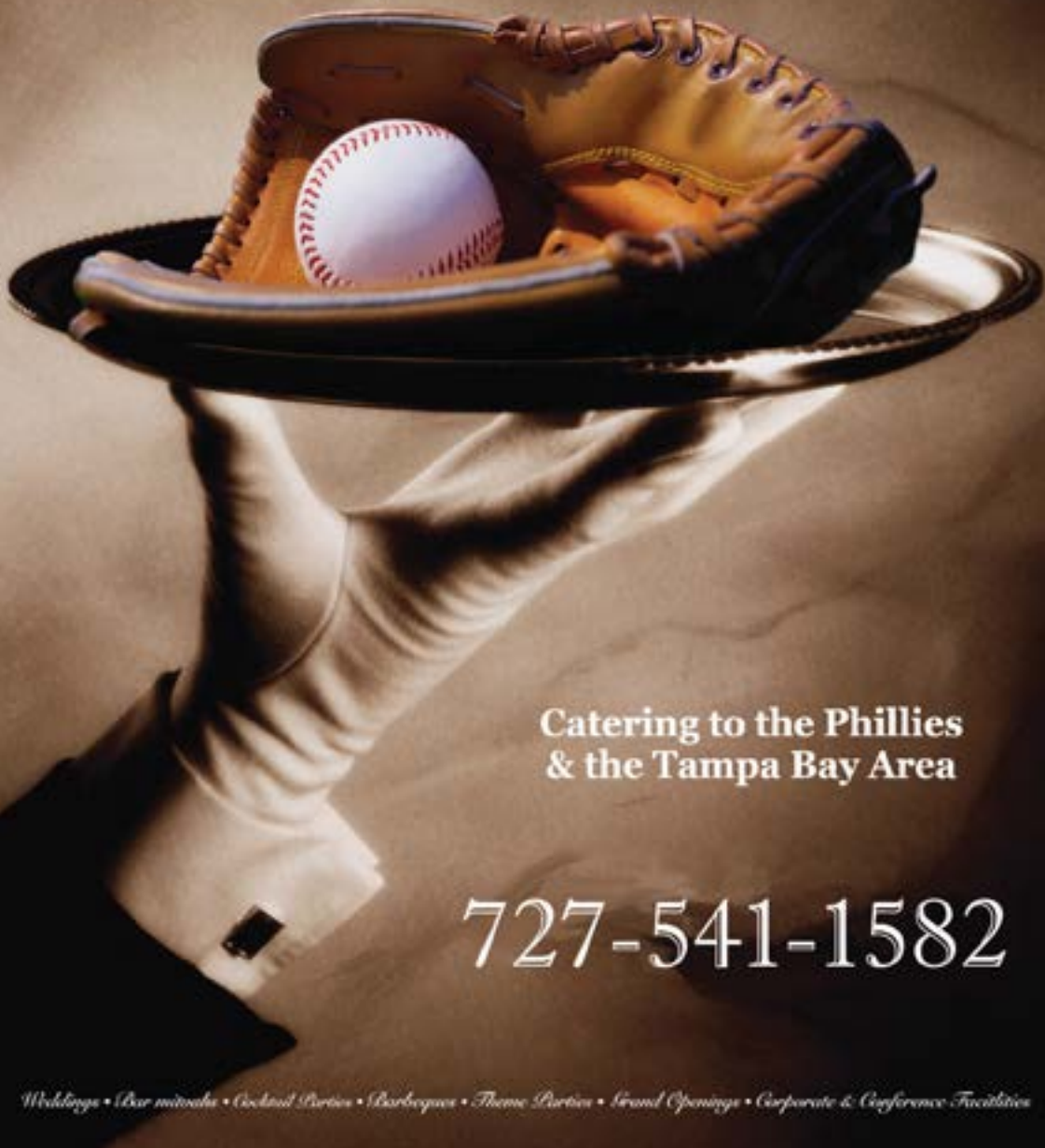
