YESTERDAY: The Flying Squirrels lost to the Sea Dogs, 9-3. Portland scored three in the first with an RBI single and Ronald Rosario hit a two-run homer. In the second, Tyler McDonough hit a two-run homer for a 5-0 Portland lead. In the bottom of the third, **Jose Astudillo** hit a two-run single to cut the deficit to 5-2. In the top of the sixth, Brooks Brannon hit a two-run homer. **Sabin Ceballos** singled in a run in the eighth to close the score to 7-3. Will Turner opened a 9-3 lead with a two-run single in the top of the ninth.

POSTSEASON BOUND: The June 12 win clinched the Eastern League Southwest Division title for the Flying Squirrels, locking in a postseason berth. The Flying Squirrels will play the second-half division champion in the Division Series. Game 1 will be at the home of the second-half champion on Tues., Sept. 15. Game 2 and, if necessary, Game 3 will be at CarMax Park on Thurs., Sept. 17 and Sat., Sept. 18. If Richmond advances to the EL Championship Series, Game 1 will be at CarMax Park on Sun., Sept. 20. This year marks the fifth postseason appearance in franchise history and the first since 2023.

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels face the Portland Sea Dogs, Double-A affiliate of the Boston Red Sox, for the first time this season. The Flying Squirrels are 25-17 against teams from the Northeast Division this year, including a 15-13 record at CarMax Park. Richmond is looking to avoid its first four-game losing streak of the season.

RECORD YEAR: The Flying Squirrels' 10-game win streak from April 4-15 was the longest in franchise history, surpassing an eight-game win streak from May 5-13, 2021, also beginning with the second game of the season. The 71-51 record is the best in team history through 122 games, ahead of a 68-53 record in 2014. Richmond has won eight series, split 10 and lost three so far this year. After opening the season with a 27-7 record through May 13, the Flying Squirrels are 44-44 in their last 88 games since.

RELENTLESS: In their 71 wins this year, the Flying Squirrels have come from behind in 35 of them. In 24 of the wins, Richmond has taken the lead in the eighth inning or later. The Flying Squirrels have 11 walk-off wins at CarMax Park this season, including at least one in all but one home series. **Diego Velasquez** has three walk-off hits this year, all in 10th innings. **Drew Cavanaugh**, **Parks Harber** and **Dayson Croes** each have two walk-off winners this year. Richmond has four wins after trailing by five-or-more runs this season. The Flying Squirrels are batting .280 in the ninth inning this year, which leads the EL and is seventh in MiLB. The Flying Squirrels have won 29 one-run decisions this year, the most in the EL. They are 10-1 in extra innings.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS won the Southwest Division first-half title by seven games over second-place Erie. For the year, Richmond is tied for second among all 30 Double-A teams in batting average (.266), first in sacrifice flies (51), fifth in hits (1081), fifth in doubles (215) and tied for fifth in triples (29). The team has combined for 116 homers this year, surpassing 12 of the franchise's previous 15 season totals. On Aug. 18 at Chesapeake, the Flying Squirrels set new single-season record for stolen bases, passing 168 in 2014. On August 26, the Flying Squirrels recorded their 50th sacrifice fly of the season off the bat of **Lisbel Diaz**, passing 49 in 2012 for a new team record. The Flying Squirrels are on pace to set offensive single-season franchise records for batting average, runs, total bases, RBIs, OBP, SLG, OPS and sacrifice flies. Richmond's No. 9 batters have combined to hit .310 this year, which leads the minors. The Flying Squirrels have scored 10-or-more runs 12 times this year, passing 2023 (11) for the most in a season in franchise history. The Richmond pitching staff has thrown 10 shutouts this season, which is first in the Eastern League, second in Double-A and tied for fourth in MiLB.

THE SEA DOGS are in fourth place in the Northeast Division second-half standings, 5.0 games behind first-place Reading. After losing Tuesday, they have won three straight. The Portland roster features six players ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Red Sox prospects, including OF Justin Gonzales (No. 2), 2B/SS Henry Godbout (No. 5), 2B Yoelin Cespedes (No. 14), 3B/1B Jack Winnay (No. 21), LHP Hayden Mullins (No. 23) and 2B Mason White (No. 28). MLB.com's top-30 Red Sox prospects list features eight Portland players, including Gonzales (No. 2), Godbout (No. 6), Cespedes (No. 14), Winnay (No. 23), White (No. 26), Mullins (No. 27), OF Miguel Bleis (No. 28) and C Johanfran Garcia (No. 29).

FOR RICHMOND: Left-hander **Greg Farone** makes his 24rd Double-A start and his first against the Sea Dogs. He last pitched on Sunday and allowed three runs over 5.1 innings in a no-decision against the Baysox on the road. Farone was Richmond's Opening Day starter on April 4 at Erie in his Double-A debut and allowed one run over 4.2 innings. He had eight strikeouts, tying the franchise record for the most strikeouts on Opening Day. He pitched his first professional season in 2025 and split the year between Low-A San Jose and High-A Eugene. He made 12 starts for San Jose, going 2-1 with a 3.73 ERA. At the time of his promotion in June, he ranked third in the California League in strikeouts (73). Farone closed the year with 11 starts at High-A, going 4-2 with a 4.25 ERA. Farone began his college career at Herkimer College in New York, where he led the team to the program's first NJCAA national title in 2022, going 7-0 with a 1.65 ERA and was named the NJCAA Division III Player of the Year and MVP of the World Series. He transferred to the University of Louisville for the 2023 season and pitched at the University of Alabama in 2024 before being selected by the Giants in the seventh round of that year's MLB Draft. **For more on Farone, see page two.**

FOR PORTLAND: Left-hander Michael Sansone makes his sixth Double-A start and 13th appearance of the season. He last pitched last Saturday against Reading and allowed one run on two hits over six innings in a no-decision. Sansone signed with the Rays as a non-drafted free agent in 2022 out of Fairfield. He signed with the Red Sox as a free agent in April 2024. He has also made nine appearances (eight starts) for Triple-A Worcester, going 2-4 with a 6.10 ERA.

SABIN SURGING: **Sabin Ceballos** had his third two-homer game of the season last Wednesday night and added a homer on Tuesday. He has 10 walks over his last 11 games dating back to August 14. Ceballos has 65 walks this season, the fourth-most in a season in franchise history. He is one walk behind Hayden Cantrelle (66, 2023) for third place on the list. In his career, Ceballos has worked 112 walks, which is tied for fourth-most in Flying Squirrels franchise history with Ricky Oropesa (112, 2013-16). He is 11 walks behind Diego Velasquez (123, 2024-26) for a tie for third on the all-time franchise list.

CROES CONTROL: **Dayson Croes** is batting .357 (20-for-56) with 19 singles, a homer, six RBIs and three walks over his last 13 games since August 13, raising his season batting average at Double-A from .237 to .266. He went 3-for-3 in the first game of this week's series on Tuesday with two walks and a sacrifice. He combined for three hits and two walks in his first five plate appearances on Wednesday, reaching base in eight consecutive plate appearances. Croes has picked up three hits three times in his last seven games since August 21.

TOP SKIPPER: Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 331 wins in his career, which is a franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23, 2025. From 2011-2013, **Dave Machemer** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship. Of Richmond managers since 1954, Pelfrey is second in wins behind Eddie Haas (1968, 1981-84), who had 351 wins.

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, **Charlie Szykowny** is tied for third in triples (4), tied for seventh in hits (109) and ninth in total bases (180). **Sabin Ceballos** is sixth in walks (64). **Maui Ahuna** is ninth in stolen bases (28). **Diego Velasquez** is fourth in batting average (.295) and fifth in OBP (.384). **Jonah Cox** is tied for first in triples (5) and tied for 10th in stolen bases (27). **Tyler Vogel** is first in saves (15) and tied for third in wins (9). **Trystan Vrieling** is first in shutouts (1), tied for first in complete games (1) and fifth in ERA (4.23).

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster features four players ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including **Gavin Kilen** (No. 10), **Trevor Cohen** (No. 12), RHP **Miguel Mendez** (No. 20), and RHP **Yunior Marte** (No. 27). Jordan is rated as the organization's best athlete. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features five Richmond players, including Kilen (No. 6), Cohen (No. 14), Mendez (No. 16), **Jancel Villarroel** (No. 18), Marte (No. 24) and **Lisbel Diaz** (No. 29).

MISC NOTES: **Tyler Vogel** is the first Eastern League reliever to reach 15 saves in a season since Portland's Luis Guerrero (18) in 2023. He now has the fifth-most saves in a season in franchise history, with **Heath Hembree's** 17 saves in 2011 next on the list. Vogel is also seventh in franchise history in career saves with 21, trailing **Josh Osich** (2013-2016) and **Tyler Myrick** (2023-2025) for a tie for fifth with 22. His nine wins this season are the second-most as a reliever in team history, trailing Edwin Quirarte (11, 2014). // **Lisbel Diaz** hit his first Double-A homer on Friday and his 25th overall this season between Low-A San Jose, High-A Eugene and Richmond, which is tied with Bo Davidson, who also homered on Friday, for the most in the Giants organization this year. // **Ryan Vanderhei** is 2-0 with a 1.05 ERA (3 ER/25.2 IP) in his last 18 outings since June 20, allowing three earned runs and five total runs in that stretch with 27 strikeouts and a .186 BAA. // There have been 47 Flying Squirrels alumni who have played in the majors this year (plus **Donovan Walton**, who had previous MLB experience before playing in Richmond), including 25 with the Giants. // The Flying Squirrels' series win over the Baysox last week was their first since going 5-1 against Akron from June 23-28 at CarMax Park and their first on the road since going 4-1 at Hartford from April 14-19. Richmond had split four consecutive series prior to last week. // The Flying Squirrels are three runs shy of matching the franchise record for runs in a season (658, 2023). They are one RBI shy of matching the single-season RBIs record (604, 2023).

THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

1954: The Richmond Virginians beat the Montreal Royals, 8-7, at Parker Field. Down a run in the ninth, Jack Mayo singled to center for his third RBI of the game, tying the score. With two outs, Allen Barbee hit a single to center field that scored Russ Kerns to win the game. **1958:** The Richmond Virginians beat the Miami Marlins, 4-3, at Parker Field. In the bottom of the 15th inning, Deron Johnson hit a one-out, bases-loaded single to left to plate the walk-off winning run. Jim Coates threw five scoreless relief innings from the 10th through 14th. **1976:** The Richmond Braves beat the Tidewater Tides, 5-4, at Parker Field with a 10th-inning, walk-off single by Jim Breazeale. **1993:** The Richmond Braves beat the Toledo Mud Hens, 4-3, at The Diamond. In the bottom of the 10th, Mike Kelly won the game with a two-out, solo homer. **2014:** The Flying Squirrels beat the Binghamton Mets, 2-1, at The Diamond to clinch the Western Division regular-season title for the first time in franchise history. Mario Lissos recorded his 76th RBI of the season, which still sits tied for the most in a season in Flying Squirrels franchise history.
