AND THE AWARD GOES TO: Just days after winning Player of the Week honors, **1B Vinnie Pasquantino** was named the International League Player of the Month for May. Pasquantino hit .320/.393/.804, playing in all 26 Storm Chasers games during the month. He led the International League in five batting categories: home runs (12), RBIs (35), runs scored (27), slugging percentage (.804), and OPS (1.197). He also ranked in the top five in hits with 31 and doubles with nine. Pasquantino hit homers in consecutive games twice during May and ended the month on a three-game home run streak.

RIDING A HOT STREAK: Omaha **OF Brewer Hicklen** had a 2-for-4 game last night. He had a solo homer and three total RBIs including a two RBI single in the seventh to give Omaha the lead for good and propel the Storm Chasers to the 4-1 win. Hicklen played two games for Kansas City last week, before being returned to Triple-A Omaha. In his last game before being called-up, Hicklen went 4-for-6 in Omaha's 19-0 win at Louisville. In Omaha, Hicklen holds the second best batting average on the active roster at .272 and leads the active roster with 11 stolen bases while not yet being caught.

MAKING A CALL TO THE BULLPEN: The Storm Chasers' bullpen holds the fourth best ERA in Triple-A. Relievers for Omaha are 17-6 this season with a 3.33 ERA through 50 games. Omaha has given up the second fewest walks in the International League this season while no reliever has had more than two walks in any single outing, while the bullpen has 225 strikeouts to just 76 walks. Over the last 11 games, relievers have given up six earned runs in 32.2 innings for a 1.65 ERA with 47 strikeouts and just 15 walks.

STARTING HOT: The first man up for Omaha has gone 5.0 or more innings in seven of the last eight games. Four starters have gone 6.0 or more innings with three of those outings being quality starts. The Storm Chasers have had five quality starts on the season, with three of them coming in the last five games. The starters have struck out 40 with just 11 walks with a 3.59 ERA during the last eight games.

LAUNCHING THE LONG BALL: Omaha has hit a home run in five consecutive games hitting eight total long balls in that span. That streak is tied for the third longest active streak in the International League. **OF Brewer Hicklen** has hit one while **INF Nick Pratto** and **OF Nate Eaton** have each hit two. **INF Vinnie Pasquantino** has hit three homers over that span. The Storm Chasers are 4-1 during this streak.

ODD SERIES START: Despite winning two of the first three games this series, Omaha is hitting just .133 as a team (13-for-90). The Storm Chasers have recorded just two hits in 10 attempts with runners in scoring position. Omaha has a scoring average of 4.9 runs per game this season but are scoring just 3.0 runs per game during this series.

FOR OMAHA: **LHP Austin Cox** takes the mound for his ninth start of the season, facing Indianapolis for the second time this year. In his most recent start, Cox went 5.0 innings while allowing three earned runs on nine hits and two walks with two strikeouts. Cox went 4.0 innings the against Indianapolis on April 4, allowing four earned runs with four strikeouts and no walks. The Macon, Ga. native played college ball at Mercer University. In his final season with the Bears in 2019, Cox was named the team's Friday night starter, earning a 7-4 record in 17 starts with 124 strikeouts over 87.2 innings. Cox was drafted in the fifth round of the 2018 MLB Draft, making professional debut with the Burlington Royals in the Rookie-level Appalachian League. He split time during the 2019 season between Lexington and Wilmington, earning Pitcher of the Week honors in early June with Lexington. In 2021, Cox was initially assigned to Double-A Northwest Arkansas and was promoted to Triple-A Omaha in September of that year

FOR INDIANAPOLIS: **RHP Bryse Wilson** is the first man up today for Indianapolis, making his second start since being optioned to Triple-A from MLB Pittsburgh. In his only Triple-A start this season, Wilson earned the win at St. Paul, going 6.0 innings while allowing four earned runs on six hits and one walk with eight strikeouts. Wilson holds a record of 0-3 with a 7.53 ERA in eight games with five starts, recording 14 walks with 24 strikeouts. Hillsborough, N.C. product was drafted in the fourth round (109th overall) of the 2016 MLB Draft by the Atlanta Braves out of high school. Wilson made his debut in The Show on August 20, 2018, facing off against the Pittsburgh Pirates, earning the win. On July 30, 2021, Wilson was traded from Atlanta to Pittsburgh.

- Became first Storm Chasers starter to complete 5.0 innings on 4/12 vs. LOU, allowing one run on four hits with three strikeouts and three walks in 5.0 innings
- Allowed five runs (four earned) in season debut on 4/7 (1) @ IND, striking out four and walking none across 4.0 innings
- Earned non-roster invite to 2022 Major League Spring Training, throwing 2.0 perfect innings with three strikeouts
- Enters 2022 as the No. 19 prospect in the Royals organization per MLB Pipeline
- Spent most of 2021 season with Double-A Northwest Arkansas before finishing the year with Triple-A Omaha and making his Triple-A debut
- Made 2021 debut on 5/26 vs. San Antonio after dealing with arm soreness to start the season
- Posted a 5.06 ERA in five Double-A starts in June before recording a 1.80 ERA in five starts in July
- Earned Double-A Central Pitcher of the Week honors with a 7.0-inning complete game on 8/4 @ Arkansas
- Exited game on 8/11 vs. Frisco in the third inning and did not pitch again until 9/10 @ Wichita
- Made final Double-A start in Game 1 of Double-A Central Championship Series, when he allowed three runs on six hits in 4.0 innings
- Made Triple-A debut on 9/26 vs. Indianapolis in Omaha's home runale, recording his first Triple-A strikeout in a scoreless inning before allowing five runs on three homers in second inning of relief
- Allowed five runs on five hits while walking three, hitting two, and striking out two in 3.0 innings in first Triple-A start on 10/2 @ Iowa
- Earned South Atlantic League Midseason All-Star honors in 2019 with Low-A Lexington, earning a promotion to High-A Wilmington in the second half of the season
- Helped Blue Rocks win 2019 Carolina League Championship, throwing 12.0 scoreless innings with 14 strikeouts across two postseason starts
- Spent first professional season with rookie-level Burlington, posting a 3.78 ERA across nine starts
- Pitched three seasons at Mercer University (2016-2018), the same college as fellow Royals minor leaguer and current teammate Brandon Barker
- Became the fifth-highest drafted player in school history in 2018 when he was drafted in the fifth round (152nd overall) of the 2018 MLB Draft
- Recorded the second-best strikeout rate in Division I in 2018 (12.7 K/9) and led the Southern Conference in starts (17)
- Attended Presbyterian Day School, the same high school as fellow Royals minor leaguer LHP Richard Lovelady
- Was a two-sport athlete in high school, lettering in baseball and football and serving as captain of both teams
