YESTERDAY: The Flying Squirrels beat the RubberDucks, 5-3, at Canal Park. Jairo Pomares hit an RBI triple to give the Flying Squirrels a 1-0 lead in the second. In the bottom of the second, Cooper Ingle drove in two with a double to move Akron ahead, 2-1. Justin Wishkoski tied the score with a stand-up, RBI triple in the fifth and Victor Bericoto followed with a two-run homer for a 4-2 lead. In the seventh, Turner Hill hit his second double of the game, this one to score Wishkoski and extend the lead to 5-2. The RubberDucks closed the score to 5-3 in the bottom of the seventh with a run-scoring groundout by Cameron Barstad. Tyler Myrick retired the final four batters of the game to close his seventh save of the season.

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels play the finale of a six-game road series against the Akron RubberDucks, Double-A affiliate of the Cleveland Guardians. This is Richmond's final trip to Akron this year. The RubberDucks swept a three-game series at The Diamond to open the season from April 4-6 and took five-of-six at Canal Park from April 22-27. The Flying Squirrels host the RubberDucks from August 26-31. The Flying Squirrels have already clinched their second consecutive series victory. It is the first series win in Akron from the Flying Squirrels since winning four-of-six from XX and the second since sweeping a three-game series from July 25-27, 2016.

PACKING THE HOUSE: Last year, the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A teams in average (6,595) and total (435,295) attendance. Among the 120 MiLB teams, the Flying Squirrels were 10th in average attendance. It was the third straight year the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A clubs in average and total attendance, which had not been done prior to 2022. Last year's total attendance is the highest since 2013 (434,769) and the fourth-highest average in team history. April 4 marked the 15th consecutive Opening Night sellout, marking every home opener in franchise history to date. This year, the Flying Squirrels are averaging 6,622 fans per home game, which ranks seventh among all 120 MiLB clubs. Their average of 7,290 in the season's first month was the highest April attendance in franchise history.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS are 8-3 in their last 11 games and tied for first place in the Southwest Division Second-Half standings. Their six-game win streak from July 4-10 was their longest winning streak since picking up seven consecutive wins from Sept. 2-9, 2023. It was the 17th time in franchise history the Flying Squirrels have won six-or-more straight games. In the last eight games since July 1, the Flying Squirrels lead the Eastern League in batting average (.268), hits (73), triples (4), walks (38), stolen bases (17) and OBP (.362). Of Richmond's 53 losses this season, 29 of them have been by two runs or less (19 by one, 10 by two). Their 19 one-run losses are tied for the most in the EL with Reading.

THE RUBBERDUCKS have lost seven-of-eight games after winning their previous five straight. Last weekend, they dropped all three games at home against the SeaWolves. They swept their three games in Erie to begin last week. The RubberDucks finished the first half in second place in the Southwest Division, two games behind Erie. Akron's roster features three players ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Gaardians prospects, including SS Angel Genao (No. 2), C Cooper Ingle (No. 8) and OF Kahlil Watson (No. 22). There are three Akron players ranked in MLB.com's top-30 Guardians prospects, including Genao (No. 2), Ingle (No. 8) and Watson (No. 29).

STRONG ARMS: Since June 18, the Flying Squirrels have posted a 3.00 ERA (63 ER/189.0 IP) in 22 games, which is second-best in the Eastern League. The Richmond bullpen has posted a 1.71 ERA (17 ER/89.2 IP) in that stretch. In their last 11 road games since June 17, the Flying Squirrels have posted a 2.32 ERA (26 ER/101.0 IP).

FOR RICHMOND: Left-hander Seth Lonsway makes his 17th start of the season and the fourth of his career against the RubberDucks. He started the series opener on Tuesday and allowed one run over 4.1 innings, working around four walks with three strikeouts. Lonsway has faced the RubberDucks three times in his career, both at Canal Park. On Jul 21, 2024, he allowed one unearned run over 4.1 innings. Earlier this year on April 26, he threw 5.1 scoreless innings and allowed one hit. For the season, Lonsway ranks sixth in the Eastern League in innings pitched (79.2), ninth in ERA (3.50) and 10th in strikeouts (74). In his first eight starts this season through May 20, Lonsway went 2-2 with a 2.40 ERA (11 ER/41.1 IP). Lonsway was selected by the Giants in the sixth round of the 2021 MLB Draft out of Ohio State. He joined the Flying Squirrels last June and went 2-1 with a 1.38 ERA in six outings before his season ended in August. For more on Lonsway, see page two.

FOR AKRON: Right-hander Tommy Mace makes his 17th start of the season and the 10th of his career against the Flying Squirrels. He pitched to open the series on Tuesday night and was charged with a loss after allowing three runs in 4.2 innings. For the year, Mace is tied for first in the Eastern league in wins (9) and ranks fifth in BAA (.208), 10th in ERA (3.63) and eighth in innings pitched (79.1). For his career, Mace is 4-2 with a 2.20 ERA (12 ER/49.0 IP) in nine starts against Richmond dating back to 2023. He spent all of 2024 with Akron, going 8-7 with a 3.71 ERA. He finished the year ranked fifth in the Eastern League in ERA, tied for first in games started (27), fourth in innings pitched (145.2), seventh in BAA (.236) and fourth in WHIP (1.22). Mace was selected by the Cleveland Guardians in the second round (69th overall) of the 2021 MLB Draft out of the University of Florida.

DON'T RUN ON RICHMOND: The Flying Squirrels' catching unit of **Adrián Sugastey**, **Zach Morgan** and **Onil Perez** have combined to catch 45 stolen base attempts this season, which is tied for first among the 30 Double-A teams and leads the Eastern League. Sugastey leads all Double-A catchers with 32 runners caught stealing. Sugastey has the second-most runners caught stealing by a catcher in a single season in franchise history, trailing **Jackson Williams** (35 - 2013). For his career with Richmond, Sugastey's 45 runners caught stealing for his career is fourth-most in franchise history, four behind **Brandon Martorano** (49).

SUGEY SHOW: At the plate. **Adrián Sugastey** is batting .311 (14-for-45) with two homers, a double, nine RBIs, six walks and four runs scored over his last 13 games since June 21. His eight-game hit streak was snapped on Friday night, which as the third-longest active streak in the league. For the season, Sugastey is second on the team with 31 RBIs and second with eight homers, which is a new career high.

TAKING THE JAIRO: Jairo Pomares hit his team-leading ninth homer of the season on Thursday night, a three-run blast in the sixth inning. It gave him the team lead in home runs and RBIs for the season. Pomares is now tied for 14th in franchise history with 21 career homers, including his team-leading 12 home runs in 2024. On Saturday, he tripled in his 34th RBI of the year.

WHAT CAN BROWN DO FOR YOU?: Vaun Brown is batting .323 (10-for-31) over his last 11 games since June 27, raising his season average from .192 to .241, posting a 10-game on-base streak (one game as a pinch-runner with no plate appearance). In that stretch, he has two doubles, eight walks, five stolen bases and four runs scored. Last Sunday afternoon in the finale in Bowie, he went 3-for-3 with a double and a walk, scoring twice. He has walked in eight consecutive games, which is tied for Ricky Oropesa (July 24-31, 2015) for the longest walk streak in franchise history.

KING OF THE HILL: Turner Hill has reached base in nine consecutive games since July 3, batting .323 (10-for-31) with two doubles, two triples, a homer, seven walks and six RBIs. On Saturday night, he went 3-for-4 with two doubles and a walk. Despite not starting his season until May 27, Hill is tied for second in the Eastern League with five triples this year.

SAVING THE DAY: Tyler Myrick recorded his seventh save of the season on Saturday night in Akron. It was the 19th save of his Richmond career, which sits seventh on the franchise's all-time list, one behind sixth-place Cody Hall (20). Myrick has converted all three of his save attempts since July 1 over four appearances.

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, Diego Velasquez is ranked tied for fifth in hits (80), sixth in OBP (.370) and tied for fifth in walks (45). Turner Hill is tied for second in triples (5). Seth Lonsway is tied for sixth in innings pitched (79.2), ninth in ERA (3.50) and 10th in strikeouts (74). John Michael Bertrand is first in innings pitched (90.2) and fifth in ERA (3.28). Jack Choate is sixth in strikeouts (83). Joe Whitman is ninth in strikeouts (78). Tyler Myrick is tied for fifth in saves (7).

TOP SKIPPER: Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 235 wins in his career, which is a new franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23. From 2011-2013, **Dave Machemer** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship.

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster features five players are ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including Diego Velasquez (No. 7), Joe Whitman (No. 8), Jack Choate (No. 24) and Sabin Ceballos (No. 29). John Michael Bertrand is rated as having the best control in the Giants system. Adrian Sugastey is ranked as the top defensive catcher. Aeverson Arteaga is rated as the best defensive infielder and best infield arm. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features five Richmond players, including Whitman (No. 7), Velasquez (No. 15), Arteaga (No. 16), Ceballos (No. 23) and Choate (No. 27).

THIS DATE IN RICHMOND

1906: The Richmond Lawmakers that year, beat the Roanoke Tigers (Highlanders), 1-0. Frank Still (called Colonel Franklyn Leslie Still in the Richmond Times-Dispatch) threw a no-hitter and allowed two baserunners. 1960: The Richmond Virginians beat the Columbus Jets, 4-0, at Parker Field. Art Ceccarelli struck out nine in a shutout. Ken Hunt brought in the park your runs of the game with a grand slam in the sixth beat the Columbus Jets, 4-0, at Parker Field. Art Ceccarelli struck out nine in a shutout. Ken Hunt brought in the only four runs of the game with a grand slam in the sixth inning after a 12-pitch battle. The homer won free groceries for the fans in attendance. 1962: The Richmond Virginians beat the Atlanta Crackers, 1-0, at Parker Field. Don Lock hit a solo homer in the second inning for the only run of the game. Jack Cullen allowed seven hits and eight strikeouts in a shutout. 1992: Team USA beat the Korean national team at The Diamond, 11-7, in an exhibition at The Diamond preparing for the Barcelona Olympics. Michael Tucker, a South Boston, Va., native Longwood grad, went 4-for-4 with two doubles, four runs scored and two stolen bases for Team USA. Korea's Sang-Soo Kang slid wide into second at and kicked at shortstop Nomar Garciapara, causing the benches to clear. Sang-Soo was initially ejected, but Korean manager Sung-Min Cho pulled his team off the field. After a 15-minute meeting, Sang-Soo was allowed back into the game for what was quoted as "diplomatic reasons," allowing the game to be continued. The slide was in retaliation to a hard slide in the first inning by Phil Nevin. Jason Varitek was the USA designated hitter and went 1-for-4. 2018: The Flying Squirrels beat the Trenton Thunder, 7-6, in 10 innings. The Flying Squirrels broke a 4-4 tie in the top of the 10th with RBI singles by C.J. Hinojosa, Dylan Davis and Aramis Garcia. The Thunder plated two runs in the bottom of the 10th, but Sam Wolff struck out Wendell Rijo to end the game. The Flying Squirrels led, 4-1, entering the eighth before the Thunder rallied to tie game and force extras. Davis finished the night with three hits.
