Today's Game

The Fightin Phils are back home from a two-week road trip and continue a six-game series against the Akron RubberDucks, Double-A affiliate of the Cleveland Guardians. It is the second-of-six matchups between the teams this season, with all six at FirstEnergy Stadium. Akron won the 2024 season-series 8-4.

Game 107 Recap

The Fightin Phils rallied for a comeback win over Akron on Tuesday night, 11-9, for their sixth-straight win. Wil Crowe started for Reading and allowed seven runs on six hits over 4.1 innings of work. From there though, the bullpen locked it down. Jayden Estanista allowed one-earned run over 1.2 innings of work, then Eiberson Castellano and Jack Dallas did not allow a run over an inning each of work. The offense battled back from deficits of 4-0, 6-1 and 7-2. Reading plated a run each in the third and fourth, then four runs in each of the fifth and seventh innings, before tacking on an insurance run in the eighth. Reading got a solo home run from Caleb Ricketts in the fourth inning and a two-run shot to straightaway center field from mDylan Campbell in the fifth. Reading took the lead for good, and for the first time, in the bottom of the seventh. Felix Reyes doubled home Aidan Miller and then Zach Arnold drove in three runs with a double to right-center to put Reading on top. Tommy McCollum did allow a run in the ninth, but finished off Akron for his seventh save of the season.

Winning Ways

The Fightin Phils are currently riding a six-game winning streak, dating back to last Wednesday at New Hampshire. Reading's six-game winning streak is their longest since July 31 to Aug. 7, of the 2019 season. If the R-Phils win on Wednesday, it will be the first seven-game winning streak since Reading won eight in a row from Aug. 4-12, of the 2018 season. The Fightin Phils won five-of-six games last week at New Hampshire. The last time the Fightin Phils won five games in a series was Aug. 13-18, of last season, also against New Hampshire.

Playing Like "A Milli-on" Bucks

Phillies No. 2 Prospect Aidan Miller was named Eastern League Player of the Week on Monday. Over six games last week, Miller slashed .385/.469/.692 (1.161 OPS), with 10 runs, five doubles, a home run, four RBI and was a perfect six-for-six in stolen bases. Miller enters play today with an Eastern League best, and Phillies organizational best, 46 stolen bases on the season. He is the first Fightin Phil to swipe 40+ bags in a season since Quintin Berry in 2009. If Miller is to reach 50 over the next 29 games, he would be the first Reading player to steal 50-or-more in a season since Jose Leiva swiped 50 in 1987.

Dashing DeMartini

Carson DeMartini stole two-more bases on Tuesday night, to raise his Double-A total to 26, which ranks as tied for eighth most in the Eastern League this season, despite DeMartini not making his Double-A debut until June 10. Between Jersey Shore (A+) and Reading this season, the 2024 fourth round pick has swiped 44 bags, which is second in the Phillies organization, behind Aidan Miller.

Caleb Cruising

Caleb Ricketts set a season-high, and matched a career-best, with four base hits on Tuesday night. It was the fourth time in Ricketts' career he had four hits in a game, with the last coming on June 8 of this season, when he was rehabbing with Clearwater (A). Ricketts has been red-hot in August; over eight games, Ricketts is slashing .378/.378/.568 (.946 OPS), with seven runs, four doubles, a home run and six RBI.

The Five Hit Club

Felix Reyes and Bryson Ware each turned in a career-high five hits in Saturday's 16-1 trouncing over New Hampshire. Their five hits in a single game was the first time a R-Phil had done that since Luke Williams on July 18, 2019. It was the first time two Fightin Phils had five hits in a single game since Cesar Hernandez and Darin Ruf each had five on Apr. 17, 2012, at Richmond.

Swiper "Yes" Swiping

The Fightin Phils turned in a season-high 10 bases in Thursday's game. It marked the first time since at least 2005 that the R-Phils stole 10 bases in a game. Since July 29, the Fightin Phils lead the Eastern League with 41 stolen bases, which is 15 ahead of second place over that span. Reading ranks third in the Eastern League with 142 stolen bases on the season, after stealing 152 bags all of last season.

This Day in Baseballtown History

August 13, 2012: At Reading, Darin Ruf's third multi-homer game of the season lifts the R-Phils to an 8-4 victory over Trenton and into a tie for second place in the Eastern Division.

Ducks on the Pond

Akron has a 62-46 overall record and 19-21 mark in the second half, which is fifth in the Southwest Division. The RubberDucks took five-of-six games against Chesapeake at home last week, winning the first five and dropping the finale. After this week, Akron returns home and welcomes New Hampshire. Akron's roster features five of the Guardians Top 30 prospects: Angel Genao (3), Khal Stephen (7), Ralphy Velazquez (10), Alfonsin Rosario (13) and Jacob Cozart (18).

Duck on the Bump

Righty Rorik Maltrud makes his 14th start of the season, and he is 2-3, with a 4.71 ERA (22 ER, 42.0 IP). Maltrud last started on Thursday vs Chesapeake, allowing two runs over four innings of work. He split last season between Lynchbug (A) and Lake County (A+), going 8-5, with a 3.44 ERA over 24 appearances/19 starts. The 25-year signed with Cleveland as an undrafted free agent out of Missouri, where he pitched at in 2023.

- Participated in Spring Breakout Game on March 14 vs Pirates
- Began season with Reading (AA), as he was transitioning back to starter after spending all of 2024 as relief pitcher
