YESTERDAY: The Flying Squirrels dropped the first game of the season to the SeaWolves, 7-6. **Greg Farone** started in his Double-A debut and struck out eight over 4.2 innings, allowing one run on a first-inning homer. **Dylan Hecht** followed him with 11 scoreless innings and two strikeouts. **Adrián Sugastey** gave the Flying Squirrels a lead in the second and scored on a single by **Scott Bandura** to open a 3-1 lead in the second inning. The SeaWolves moved back ahead with a three-run homer by Andrew Jenkins in the bottom of the seventh, part of a six-run frame to open a 7-3 Erie lead. **Turner Hill** hit a two-run double in the eighth and scored on a double by **Jonah Cox** to pull the Flying Squirrels within a run.

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels play the second of a three-game series against the Erie SeaWolves, Double-A affiliate of the Detroit Tigers, to open the 2026 season.

STARTING OFF: With Friday's loss, the Flying Squirrels fell to 6-10 all-time on Opening Day since the franchise's first season in 2010. They are 1-7 when opening a season on the road (compared to 5-3 at home). Richmond is 3-8 all-time when opening against an American League affiliate and 2-3 when opening against an Eastern League Western/Southwestern Division opponent.

MEET THE TEAM: This year's season-opening Flying Squirrels roster including 19 players who have previously played in Richmond. There are nine players who are making their Richmond debuts, including **Maui Ahuna**, **Charlie Szkowny**, **Mitch White**, **Darien Smith**, **Greg Farone**, **Logan Martin**, **Cesar Perdomo** and **Dylan Carmouche**. Each of the newcomers are set to make their Double-A debuts. Of the 28 players, 11 were acquired by the Giants in the MLB Draft, five were signed by the Giants as international free agents, five were signed by the Giants from independent teams, four were acquired via trade and three were signed as non-drafted free agents.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS went 56-79-1 in 2025, which was sixth in the Eastern League Southwest Division. They went 21-46-1 in the first half before posting a 35-33 record in the second half, finishing 3.5 games out of first place in the division.

THE SEAWOLVES were 84-54 in 2025, the best record in the Southwest Division and the second-best mark in the Eastern League. They won the division's first-half title, qualifying for the postseason for the fourth consecutive season. Erie also reached the Eastern League Championship Series for the fourth straight year, but lost to Binghamton in three games. The SeaWolves' 2026 rosters features one player ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Tigers prospects, SS John Peck (No. 15). Erie's roster also features two players ranked in MLB.com's top-30 Tigers prospects list, including Peck (No. 15) and 3B/1B Izaac Pacheco (No. 21).

FOR RICHMOND: Left-hander **Joe Whitman** makes his first start of the season after starting 26 games for the Flying Squirrels last season. In his first Double-A campaign, Whitman ranked tied for second in the Eastern League in games started, fifth in strikeouts (124) and eighth in innings pitched. He was named EL Pitcher of the Week for a perfect outing against Somerset on May 3 at The Diamond, retiring all 18 batters he faced while recording 10 strikeouts. He also recorded 11 strikeouts at Binghamton with five scoreless frames pitched on May 21. Whitman closed his season with seven scoreless innings on September 12, tying the longest outing of his career. Whitman was selected in the second round of the 2023 MLB Draft by the Giants out of Kent State, where he was the MAC Pitcher of the Year that season. Before transferring to Kent State near his hometown of Akron, Ohio, Whitman pitched at Purdue. Entering 2025, Whitman was ranked by Baseball America as the No. 8 Giants prospect and No. 7 by MLB.com. *For more on Whitman, see page two.*

FOR ERIE: Right-hander **Kenny Serwa** makes the fourth start of his career against the Flying Squirrels. Last year, he went 2-0 with a 2.25 ERA (4 ER/16.0 IP) in three starts against Richmond, including back-to-back five-inning, scoreless start in August at UPMC Park. In his first affiliated season, Serwa began 2025 with High-A West Michigan and went 3-1 with a 2.75 ERA in 10 outings (five starts). He was promoted to Double-A on June 5 and made 17 starts for the SeaWolves, posting a 6-6 record with a 3.95 ERA. Serwa began his college career with one season at NCAA DII St. Joseph's (ind.) College before spending three seasons at SIU Edwardsville. He then pitched one season at the University of Central Florida before spending his final college season at Dayton in 2022. Serwa pitched in independent baseball with the Billings Mustangs in 2022, did not pitch in 2023 and spent the 2024 season with the independent Chicago Dogs.

BOTTOMS UP: The 6-9 hitters in the Richmond lineup combined to reach base eight times in Friday's season opener, going 6-for-14 with three doubles, five RBIs and two walks with five runs scored. **Diego Velasquez** went 1-for-2 with two walks and scored twice. **Turner Hill** was 2-for-4 with a double, two RBIs and two runs scored. **Adrián Sugastey** had a two-run double and scored a run. **Jonah Cox** went 2-for-4 out of the ninth spot in the order and added an RBI.

FARONE IN THE ZONE: In his Double-A debut, **Greg Farone** threw 4.2 innings on Friday night and allowed one run, a solo homer in the first, and three hits with no walks. He recorded eight strikeouts, which tied the Flying Squirrels franchise record for the most Opening Day punchouts. He evened the mark previously set by Dan Slania in 2017 and matched in 2022 by Jake Dahlberg.

DON'T RUN ON RICHMOND: The Flying Squirrels' catching unit of **Adrián Sugastey**, **Zach Morgan**, **Onil Perez** and **Drew Cavanaugh** combined to catch 74 stolen base attempts last season, which ranked first among the 30 Double-A teams and led the Eastern League by 20 over Hartford (54). Sugastey led all Double-A catchers with 50 runners caught stealing. He set a franchise record for the most caught stealing in a season in Flying Squirrels history, passing **Jackson Williams'** mark of 35 set in 2015 with his 36th on July 26 against Portland. For his career with Richmond, Sugastey's 63 runners caught stealing for his career is the most in franchise history, passing Williams' (2010-11, '15) previous mark of 59.

SECOND-HALF SABIN: In his last 20 games of the 2025 season from August 9 through September 6, **Sabin Ceballos** hit .382 (26-for-68) with three homers, seven doubles and 18 RBIs. For the season, he was second on the team with 47 RBIs. In his last 43 games of the year from July 3 through September 6, Ceballos hit .311 (46-for-148) with six homers, 11 doubles and 27 RBIs.

TAKE A WALK: **Diego Velasquez** worked 70 walks last year, which was the second-most in a season in Flying Squirrels franchise history, passing Hayden Cantrelle's 2023 mark (66). Jacob Heyward set a the record with 80 walks in 2019. Velasquez was second in the Eastern League in walks last season, trailing only Reading's Aidan Miller (73).

TOP SKIPPER: Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 270 wins in his career, which is a new franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23, 2025. From 2011-2013, **Dave Machemer** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship.

PACKING THE HOUSE: In 2025, the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A teams in total (446,679) and average (6,768) attendance for the fourth consecutive season. The average attendance was the highest in the franchise's history. Tuesday's inaugural game at CarMax Park has been sold out for more than a month, marking the 16th consecutive home-opener to sell out for the Flying Squirrels.

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster features three players are ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including **Bo Davidson** (No. 3), **Diego Velasquez** (No. 24) and **Joe Whitman** (No. 25). **Adrián Sugastey** is rated by Baseball America as the top defensive catcher in the Giants organization and **Jonah Cox** is rated as the top defensive outfielder. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features three Richmond players, including Davidson (No. 7), **Maui Ahuna** (No. 20) and Whitman (No. 26).

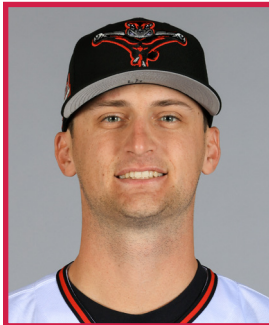
THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

1971: The Atlanta Braves beat the Washington Senators, 2-0, in an exhibition game at Parker Field in front of 9,140. Twenty-year-old Mike McQueen pitched for Atlanta and allowed one hit, a single by Curt Flood, with nine strikeouts. Denny McLain started for Washington and allowed one unearned run over eight innings. Orlando Cepeda drove in Ralph Garr in the seventh for the game's first run. **1974:** The New York Yankees and New York Mets began an exhibition at Parker Field that was called early because of rain with the Mets leading, 5-3. Thurmon Munson hit a three-run homer in the top of the first inning to give the Yankees an early lead. In the third, the Mets jumped ahead with an RBI single by Wayne Garrett and a three-run triple by Cleon Jones, who later scored on a single by John Milner. Rain stopped play in the top of the fourth. **2019:** The Flying Squirrels beat the Hartford Yard Goats, 1-0, on Opening Night at The Diamond. Logan Webb started for Richmond and threw five scoreless innings, allowing two hits with five walks. Fernando Abad, Melvin Adon and Sam Wolff finished the shutout.
