LAST TIME OUT

The Ems posted their first shutout win of the season on Tuesday night, a 7-0 win over the Dust Devils to start the six-game series in Pasco, WA. Emeralds starting pitcher Kai-Wei Teng fired his best outing of the season thus far, throwing 5.0 scoreless innings with a season-high seven strikeouts. Diego Rincones had a game-high three hits and Carter Aldrete smacked his first home run of the season, a two-run blast in the eighth inning.

TONIGHT'S STORYLINES

LHP Seth Corry, the 5th overall prospect in the Giants system per MLB.com, will be making his third start of the season, and it comes on the heels of a dazzling performance his last time out. On the other side, RHP Robinson Pina, the 16th ranked prospect in the Los Angeles Angels system, will be making his third start. Pina has only allowed one hit over two starts, but he's walked eleven batters in just 3.2 total innings of work.

Kilian Is Killing it

Eugene's Opening Night starter, RHP Caleb Kilian,

allowed 2 hits, 0 ER, 0 BB while posting 9 K's in just 4.0 innings of work in his Emeralds debut. The 8th rounder out of Texas Tech followed his stellar debut outing with the Ems by firing 5.0 IP with 2 hits, 1 ER, 0 BB and 5 K's in Sunday's series finale in Spokane. In his home debut, Kilian finally showed he just *might* be human, going 5.2 IP with 8 K's while allowing 4 hits, 2 ER, and his first walk of the season, snapping a streak of 14.2 IP to start the year without issuing a base-on-balls. After a rough first outing to start the 2021 season, LHP Seth Corry bounced back nicely on Thursday against the Hops, firing 4.0 IP with 3 H, 1 ER, 3 BB and 8 K's, ending his outing by striking out the side and five of the final six batters he faced. Thursday marked the 5th time in his pro career that he's notched 8 K's in an outing.

#14 Seth Corry (LHP)

PITCHES: Fastball, Curveball, Changeup

BIO: #5 ranked prospect in the San Francisco Giants system per MLB.com. South Atlantic League's Most Outstanding Pitcher in 2019 after leading the SAL in ERA (1.76, 2nd in the Minors), strikeouts (172, 4th), strikeout rate (12.6 per nine innings, 5th), whiff rate (34%, 5th) and opponent average (.171, 3rd). Corry's 1.76 ERA and 172 K's in 2019 led all of Single-A ball. Rated to have

the best curveball in the SF Giants system in 2020 by Baseball America. All-state safety in football in high school (tore ACL playing football as a junior). Signed for \$1 million as a third rounder after originally committing to play at BYU. His signing bonus was nearly \$450,000 over slot. During senior season at Lone Peak, Corry went 8-1 with a 1.90 ERA and 97 K's in 52 innings. Corry has three solid or better offerings, highlighted by an upper-70s curveball with downer action that he often commands better than his fastball. His heater usually operates in the low 90s and tops out at 96 mph with armside run, though he worked at 93-95 in shorter stints during instructional league. He made significant improvements with his changeup in 2019, which helped him do a better job of keeping right-handers in check. Corry finished strong in 2019 once he developed a better and more consistent tempo in his delivery, reducing his walk rate to 2.6 per nine innings in the second half from 6.2 earlier in his career. He does throw with some effort but has the athleticism to make it work. He elicits comparisons to a young Matt Moore, who like Corry repeated Rookie ball and needed time to learn to harness his stuff.

#26 Robinson Pina (RHP)

Height: 6'4 Weight: 180 lbs Acquired: 9th Round (2019)

Notes: The Angels weren't able to spend more than \$300,000 on any player during the 2016-17 international signing period, the second of two years they were so hampered for going over their 2014-15 bonus pool. Looking for bargains, they were able to find the projectable 18-year-old Pina for just \$50,000 in February 2017. He made his United States

debut in 2018, pitching mostly in relief, before making a very successful move to full-season ball and the rotation in 2019, striking out 12.2 per nine in the process. As Pina has added strength to his 6-foot-4 frame, he's thrown gradually harder, averaging right around 93 mph and touching the mid-90s at times throughout his breakout in 2019 with good life and high spin rates up in the zone. He throws a hard curve with a good, sharp break, and while he can still gain consistency with it, it's worked as a strikeout pitch. His splitter gives him an effective offspeed offering and a third at-least average pitch in his arsenal. With a three-pitch mix and a strong, projectable frame, Pina has all the components of a big league starter. He does have to find more consistency in both finding the strike zone (career 4.6 BB/9 rate) and commanding his stuff in the zone. His stuff might tick up more in shorter relief stints, but the Angels aren't ready to stop developing him as a starter just yet.
