TODAY'S HEADLINES

LAST GAME'S RESULT -The St. Paul Saints scored six runs in the eighth inning to come back and win 9-4 on Friday night against the Toledo Mud Hens. The Saints got a three hit performance from Jake Cave, who snapped an 0-17 skid. Mark Contreras slugged his fourth homer of the season and collected two RBI while Jose Miranda also had two RBI. Jake Petricka, Trevor Megill, Tyler Bashlor, and Yennier Cano combined to pitch 5.1 shutout innings of relief and strike out seven.

WE DON'T NEED NO STINKIN' HITS: The St. Paul Saints scored nine runs on Friday night, but only one of the nine runs came by way of a base hit, Mark Contreras' solo homer in the third. The other eight runs came on a sac fly, wild pitch, three bases loaded walks, an RBI fielder's choice, a throwing error, and a bases loaded hit by pitch.

RUNNIN' WILD: On April 22 the St. Paul Saints gave up a franchise record seven stolen bases to the Toledo Mud Hens, but managed to win 9-4. The previous high was five on July 4, 2021 vs. Omaha Storm Chasers, a game the Saints lost 10-6.

LOOKING FOR SOMEONE TO PICK ME UP: The St. Paul Saints have had all kinds of issues getting big base hits with runners in scoring position. On Friday night they were 2-20 (.100). Overall, the Saints are hitting just .212 (38-179) with runners in scoring position.

THAT WAS FAST: The St. Paul Saints played their fastest game in franchise history on April 21, a 2:07 contest at Toledo. Their fastest game in 2021, their first as a Triple-A affiliate, was two hours and 19 minutes on August 5 at CHS Field against Louisville when Hunter Greene was dominant in a 1-0 Saints loss. The fastest nine inning game in the 30-year history of the Saints was September 3, 2004 at Winnipeg. The Saints lost that game 1-0 in one hour and 52 minutes.

MAKING HIMSELF RIGHT AT HOME: Jose Miranda enjoys hitting at Fifth Third Field. Last season, Miranda hit .314 (16-51) with a homer and five RBI in 11 games. He's 5-17 in this series and doubled in the first three games. It's the fourth time in his career he doubled in three straight games.

THEY'VE (UN)EARNED IT: The St. Paul Saints have taken advantage of errors in their first three series. Louisville, Indianapolis & Toledo have combined to commit 24 errors in 15 games. The Saints have scored 89 runs in the first 14 games, with 16 of those 89 being unearned runs.

HOLDING SERVE AT HOME: The Saints have started to feel more and more comfortable at CHS Field. After not winning their first four series at home in 2021, going 0-2-2, the Saints have not lost their last eight home series. In beating Indianapolis three-games-to-two in their opening homestand they are now 6-0-2 in their last eight home series

AN ACTUAL NO-HITTER: The St. Paul Saints were no-hit by the Indianapolis Indians on April 13 at CHS Field. It's the first nine inning no-hitter against the Saints in franchise history. Last season, the Saints failed to collect a hit in game one of a doubleheader against the Iowa Cubs in Iowa on July 11. By Major League Baseball logic, the seven inning no-hitter doesn't count as a no-hitter. They deem it a "notable achievement," so technically it's the first time the Saints have been no-hit. It was also the first ever no-hitter at CHS Field since it opened in 2015.

DOUBLE YOUR PLEASURE: The St. Paul Saints slugged seven doubles on April 10 at Louisville, setting a franchise record for most doubles in a game. While the Triple-A franchise is only a little over a year old, it's still an impressive feat. The old record was five, done twice last season. They also tied a franchise record with 11 extra base hits (June 10, 2021 vs. Omaha).

TWINS UPDATE - Bailey Ober pitched 5.0 innings allowing one run and striking out six as the Minnesota Twins scored two in the eighth for a come from behind 2-1 win over the Chicago White Sox.

LAST START: 4/17 vs. IND...pitched 3.0 hitless, shutout innings of relief while walking two and striking out one...received the win in a 5-1 Saints victory.

START PRIOR: 4/10 @ LOU...pitched 4.2 innings of relief allowing two runs on three hits, giving up one home run, while walking one and striking out four...received the win in a 15-6 Saints victory.

ALEXANDER THE GREAT: While guys like Cole Sands and Dereck Rodriguez go by their middle name, Alexander González goes by a nickname, Chi Chi. Nickname was given to him by his Great Uncle when he was six-years-old. None of the children in the González family go by their given name, they all go by nicknames. His older sister Lily is Niña and his other sister, Erika, goes by Nene.

FAMOUS CHI CHI'S: Chi Chi González is not the only famous Chi Chi in sports. Of course, many people know Juan "Chi Chi" Rodriguez, the first Puerto Rican to be inducted into the World Golf Hall of Fame, but how many people know Federico Emilio "Chi Chi" Olivo, who pitched three seasons for the Milwaukee Braves (1961, 65-65) and a season for the Atlanta Braves (1966). Other famous Chi Chi's are Govinda Arun Ahuja, a Bollywood actor, comedian, dancer, and former politician, who was given the nickname Chi Chi meaning "little finger" in Punjabi. There is also Chidi "Chi Chi" Osondu, a Nigerian-American record producer and songwriter who frequently collaborates with Lil Baby. Finally, there is Rafael "Chi Chi" Quintero, a CIA operative against the Cuban led Fidel Castro's regime.

ROOKIE'S RAVE REVIEW: In his first Major League start on May 30, 2015 with the Texas Rangers, González dominated the Boston Red Sox. For the first five innings he kept the Red Sox hitless. He finally gave up a leadoff single in the sixth inning to future Hall of Famer, David Ortiz. González recorded two more outs before departing and going 5.2 scoreless. The 5.0 hitless innings was the longest such streak to begin a career for a Rangers pitcher since 1992.

AND FOR AN ENCORE: Following his 5.2 scoreless innings in his first Major League start, González went out in start number two and promptly threw a complete game shutout against the Kansas City Royals on June 5. He became the first Ranger since Len Barker in 1976 to toss a complete game shutout in one of his first two Major League games. Per Elias, González set a Rangers franchise record by beginning his career with 14.2 consecutive scoreless innings. The streak ended with one out in the first inning of his third start on June 11 at Oakland, but that would be the lone run he allowed in his 7.0 innings of work that night.

MAKE IT STOP: Upon joining the Colorado Rockies in 2019, González proceeded to lose six straight decisions while the Rockies lost each of his first nine starts and each of his first 10 appearances. He went 0-6 with a 7.29 ERA (42.0 IP, 34 ER) over that span. He was the first pitcher in franchise history to have the team lose each of his first eight starts. It was the longest such streak in MLB since the Reds lost each of Cory Reed's first 14 starts, June 18, 2016-September 4, 2018. The streak finally came to an end on September 10 vs. St. Louis when he went 6.0 innings allowing one run on four hits while fanning four in a 2-1 Rockies victory.

CAFE ARCANGEL: In 2021 with the Rockies during Spring Training he wanted to make Cuban coffee for his teammates. He learned to make coffee from his Mom while growing up in South Florida. He would make the coffee and deliver a cup to any locker of a player that wanted one. The shot led to a conversation, some gossip and updates on camp, life and the person behind the number. The pandemic made it difficult to deliver the cups of coffee, so instead of delivering the coffee player to player, he set up a shop at his locker. He would then take orders and drop them off at players lockers. However, the Cuban coffee wasn't for everyone as it's very strong and sugary.

- Allowed a home run in 14 of 18 starts and at least one home run in 11 straight from May 19-September 2 for the Rockies in 2021
- Missed the final month of 2021 from September 8-October 2 due to a right oblique strain
- Went 2-0 with a 1.65 ERA (27.1 IP, 5 ER) in five appearances (four starts) in September, 2019 and posted the fourth-lowest ERA in the National League that month
- Made his second relief appearance of the season September 22, 2019 at Dodger Stadium and earned a win. He pitched 5.0 innings and allowed two unearned runs on two hits with one walk and eight strikeouts. The eight strikeouts were a career high and the second most by a Rockies reliever in franchise history (most: nine, Bruce Ruffin, September 14, 1993, game one vs. Houston).
- Started for the Rockies on June 25, 2019 vs. San Francisco. Became the first pitcher to start for the Rockies that made his debut for another team since Tyler Chatwood in 2017, a span of 382 games
- Signed a Minor League deal with the Colorado Rockies on December 4, 2018
- Made two rehab stints with the AZL Rangers and Spokane Indians in 2018. Appeared in three games, two starts, allowing two hits across 10.0 innings with eight strikeouts
- Missed the entire 2017 season due to "Tommy John" surgery on right elbow
- Named the Texas Rangers 2015 Minor League Pitcher of the Year
- Threw a complete-game shutout on June 5, 2015 vs. the Kansas City Royals, his second career start, allowing three hits with two walks and two strikeouts
- Named a Carolina League Mid-Season All-Star with Myrtle Beach and was named an MiLB.com Organization All-Star in 2014
- Originally selected in the 11th round by the Baltimore Orioles in 2010 out of Boca Raton (FL) Community College, but did not sign
