GOATED REMATCH: The Somerset Patriots and Hartford Yard Goats meet tonight for the first time since the 2024 Eastern League Northeast Division Series on 9/17 and 9/19. Somerset swept Hartford in the Yard Goats' first ever Eastern League playoff appearance in the best of three series.

HARTFORD'S HORROR: Over the Somerset Patriots' first four seasons as the Double-A affiliate of the New York Yankees, they have yet to lose a series to the Hartford Yard Goats with eight series wins and four series splits, plus their sweep of Hartford in the Eastern League Playoffs last year. The Patriots are 51-20 all-time against the Yard Goats with 122 home runs in 71 games. All-time at Dunkin' Park (dating back to 2021), the Patriots are 29-8 with 66 HR in 37 games, the 2nd-most of any Eastern League team at any visiting ballpark (RIC @BOW, 67 in 48 games). In 2024, the Patriots homered 26 times in 17 games against the Yard Goats, their most against any Eastern League team in 2024.

SOMETHING ABOUT SOMERSET: Among 27 active players on the Somerset Patriots' Opening Day roster, 16 have already spent time with the Patriots at some point during their career. Among that group, the roster contains 12 players that ended last season with the Patriots.

CAM THE MAN: Cam Schlittler commences his 2025 season today, after being named the Yankees' 2024 Kevin Lawn Award winner for Minor League Pitcher of the Year. Splitting the year between High-A Hudson Valley and Double-A Somerset, Schlittler led all Yankees minor leaguers with 154 K in 120.2 IP. Following the season, he was named the High-A South Atlantic League Pitcher of the Year, in addition to being named an SAL Post-Season All-Star.

RAFA RAKES: Rafael Flores returns to Somerset, after spending the entire second half of the 2024 season with the Patriots. Flores was honored as the Yankees' 2024 Kevin Lawn Award winner for Minor League Position Player of the Year and he was also Baseball America's Yankees Minor League Player of the Year. Flores slashed .279/.379/.495 with 21 HR and his .874 OPS led all Yankees minor leaguers.

JONESING FOR MORE: After spending the entire 2024 season with the Somerset Patriots, Spencer Jones returns to the Patriots after being named an Eastern League Post-Season All-Star and three-time Eastern League Player of the Week. Jones led all Yankees minor leaguers with 78 RBI, 53 XBH and 218 TB in 2024.

2025 SOMERSET PATRIOTS COACHING STAFF

RAUL DOMINGUEZ: Manager (3rd year)

Raul Dominguez enters his third consecutive season as manager for the Somerset Patriots, 11th overall as a manager and 19th coaching in the Yankees organization. He led the 2023 Patriots to a Double-A best record of 84-53 and a +211 run differential, which ranked first among all MiLB teams. Under his leadership, the Patriots finished with the Eastern League's top record in both halves of the season and clinched their second straight playoff berth. In 2024, Dominguez led the Patriots to their third consecutive playoff berth and their second appearance in the Eastern League Championship Series with an overall record of 75-62. Dominguez's Patriots erased a 6.0-game deficit in the final 30 games of the regular season by going 22-8 to end the campaign and clinching the Eastern League Northeast division's second half title with a second half record of 43-25. Before joining Somerset, Dominguez spent the prior two seasons (2021-2022) as a defensive coach for Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre. He previously served as defensive coach for Trenton (2018-2019) and Tampa (2017). He gained prior managerial experience with the GCL Yankees East (2016), DSL Yankees 1 (2011-15) and DSL Yankees 2 (2009-10). An outfielder during his playing career, Dominguez spread four minor league seasons for with the Yankees between the DSL and the GCL. He began his coaching career in 2008 with the DSL Yankees 2, after spending 2007 as a Yankees' tryout scout in the Dominican Republic.

MIKE FRANSOSO: Hitting Coach (1st year)

Hitting coach Mike Fransoso enters his first season as a Double-A coach in Somerset and with the Yankees organization. He spent the past five years as a member of the Seattle Mariners organization, most recently with the Double-A Arkansas Travelers as the team's hitting coach. On 8/13/24, Fransoso took over as the Travelers' interim manager and led the team to clinch a second-half playoff berth en route to winning the 2024 Texas League Championship. He also previously served as the hitting coach for High-A Everett (2023), Class-A Modesto (2022) and the AZL Mariners (2021). During his playing career, Fransoso played for the Somerset Patriots in 2018 and 2019 when the team was independent. Prior to his stint playing for the Patriots, he spent three seasons in the Pittsburgh Pirates organization after being a 27th round pick of the team in 2013 MLB Draft out of the University of Maine.

PETER LARSON: Pitching Coach (1st year)

Pitching coach Peter Larson enters his first season in Somerset and with the Yankees organization. He spent the past six seasons as a member of the Minnesota Twins organization, including the last two with the Triple-A St. Paul Saints (2023-2024). For Minnesota, Larson also previously served as the pitching coach for Double-A Wichita (2022) and Low-A Fort Myers (2019). In 2020, he was slated to be the pitching coach for Low-A Cedar Rapids, before the Covid cancellation of the minor league season. His first season with the Twins, he served as the minor league rehab pitching coach (2019). Prior to his professional career, Larson worked as a pitching coach at the collegiate level for Fordham University (2018) and the University of Albany (2017). He also served as an assistant coach for Siena College (2016) and King University (2015).

DEREK WOODLEY: Defensive Coach (1st year)

Derek Woodley enters his first season in Somerset and his third with the Yankees organization. He spent the last two seasons as the defensive coach for High-A Hudson Valley (2023-2024). Following the 2024 season, he represented the Yankees at the Arizona Fall League as an extra coach for the Salt River Rafter. Prior to joining the Yankees organization, Woodley spent 30 seasons as a college baseball coach, racking up over 300 wins and most recently as the head coach for Defiance College for 15 seasons from 2008-2022. He also served as the school's athletic director from 2019-2022.

UZIEL VILORIA: Defensive Coach (1st year)

Uziel Viloria enters his first season in Somerset and in the Yankees organization. He began his coaching career in 2024 as a coach in the Phillies organization. During his playing career, Viloria signed with the Phillies as an international free agent in 2019 and went on to play 112 games in four seasons as an infielder in the organization (2019-2023), making it as high as High-A Jersey Shore.

2025

Earned non-roster invite to MLB Spring Training with the Yankees, when he pitched in five games (four starts) and posted a 4.41 ERA with 13 K over 16.1 IP.

2024

Began the season with 17 games started in High-A Hudson Valley and went 6-4 with a 2.60 ERA and 108 K in 86.2 IP. Over his first eight starts, he went 3-1 with a 1.77 ERA and 50 K in 40.2 IP. On 6/23, he made a spot start for Triple-A SWB vs. BUF, going 1.2 IP and allowing 4 ER with 3 K, 4 BB and 3 HBP. Upon returning to High-A, he pitched six more games for the Renegades before being promoted to Somerset on 8/6. At the time of his promotion to Double-A, Schlittler led the SAL with a 2.60 ERA and a .191 BAA, while ranking among the league leaders with a 1.13 WHIP (2nd), 82.6 IP (6th) and 108 (T-2nd). As a result, he was named a SAL Post-Season All-Star and the SAL Pitcher of the Year. Once joining the Patriots, Schlittler appeared in seven games (five starts) to end the regular season and went 2-4 with a 4.45 ERA in 32.1 IP with 13 BB and 43 K. By the end of the season, Schlittler led all Yankees minor leaguers with 154 K and ranked among the organization leaders with a 3.36 ERA (2nd), 8 W (3rd), .218 BAA (3rd), 120.2 IP (6th), 23 GS (T-6th) and 1.27 WHIP (7th).

2023

Schlittler began the season in extended spring training, before splitting time between three levels of the Yankees organization, totaling a 4.11 ERA in 13 starts (14 games) with 50 K in 46 IP. After pitching in seven games for the FCL Yankees, he had a 5.68 ERA in five starts at Tampa and then a 4.76 ERA in two starts at Hudson Valley.

College

Spent three seasons at Northeastern University, where he pitched to a 14-9 record and career 2.62 ERA in 182 IP with 180 K. During his freshman year (2020), he started vs. the Boston Red Sox in the annual Huskies vs. Red Sox exhibition game at Jet Blue Park in Ft. Myers, FL to open Spring Training where he threw a shutout inning, retiring Jarren Duran, Marco Hernandez, and Rusney Castillo. As a redshirt freshman (2021), he led the Huskies on the mound with an 8-1 record in 13 starts, 1.88 ERA, and 85 Ks in 76.2 IP, earning CAA Co-Rookie of the Year and Rookie All-American Honors. In his final college season as a redshirt sophomore (2022), he posted a 3.53 ERA in 15 starts, placing third in the CAA in strikeouts with 85. At Northeastern, Schlittler was teammates with fellow members of the Yankees organization RHP Thomas Balboni Jr. and RHP Sebastian Keane.

Personal Notes

Attended Walpole High School (MA) in his hometown, where he played varsity basketball and was a three-time baseball state champion. Cam's father, John, is the Police Chief in Needham, MA and played both baseball and football at D1 Stonehill College in Easton, MA. Schlittler was signed by the Yankees' Northeast Area Scout Matt Hyde, who also signed Anthony Volpe and Ben Rice.

Began his first full season with Single-A Fayetteville in the Astros organization. After allowing 1 ER in 10.0 IP (0.90 ERA) with 14 K and 1 BB, he was transferred to High-A Asheville on May 11. In 18 relief appearances for Asheville, Austin went 2-0 with a 2.70 ERA, 3 SV, 32 K and 6 BB. On July 30, he was traded to the Yankees and assigned to High-A Hudson Valley. In 10 games to end the regular season with the Renegades, he went 3-0 with a 1.29 ERA over 14.0 IP with 19 K and 2 BB. During the post-season for Hudson Valley, Austin spread five perfect innings across three appearances.
